### Saracens suffer first defeat

## Gibson seals derby glory

WEALDSTONE mantained their promotion push with a 2-1 win over rivals Harrow Borough at Grosvenor Vale on Monday.

The Stones have enjoyed the better of recent derbies and their form continued after Watford youngster Billy Gibson scored twice to sink Boro.

The 19-year-old midfielder, on-loan from the Hornets, was brought down in the area after a dominant start to the game by Wealdstone. He picked himself up and slotted in the penalty but Boro equalised whe Rocky Baptiste set up

Dean Fenton five minutes before the break.

Wealdstone regained the lead seven minutes into the second half when Gibson cut inside and managed to squeeze the ball into the net.

Boro had a header from Dewayne Clarke disallowed but their pressure went unrewarded as they lost their second match of the festive weekend.

Stones boss Gordon Bartlett said: "I felt we dominated them for the first 35 minutes. We hit the woodwork and had three or four great chances.

"They should have been dead and buried but when they scored the game changed. It gave them a good opportunity and sowed the seeds of doubt in our heads."

Bartlett has been impressed with the immediate impact made by Gibson with the Ryman Premier club and may consider extending his loan spell at the club beyond the middle of next month.

He added: "Billy showed his confidence to pick the ball up and score the penalty and also showed great feet for the second goal.

"He is technically very talented and I hope that we can help him on his learning curve to becoming a professional footballer."

Boro boss David Howell said: "We have played them three times this

season and there has been nothing between the sides. It could have gone either way.

"Wealdstone have managed to get the major decisions go in their way. They've been a bit more fortunate than us but it hopefully it will even out over the

"If we had gone on to equalise then it would have been deserved and no-one would have complained."

The Stones conceded a late equaliser in their 3-3 draw at Ashford Town (Middlesex) last weekend. Wealdstone will try to get the better of them this Saturday when they play their first match in the New Year.
