Stones boost play-off hopes with United win

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett has thanked the club's supporters after they helped his team revive their Ryman Premier play-off hopes.

The Stones have been on a dreadful run since Christmas but victories in the last week at Cray Wanderers and against Hastings United have put them firmly back in contention for promotion.

Bartlett said: "Full credit to the

Bartlett said: "Full credit to the players for their work ethic but a big thank you must go to the fans. They sung their hearts out and played their part. The fans woke us up and we're all in this together.

"The last two games we have got back to what we were doing in the early part of the season, in terms of our energy levels and confidence

"It is an enormous week and I'm very satisfied with the start. We've won two games but it's important that we extend that run. The mentality is getting back to being positive again and it has given us a great platform."

Wealdstone produced a superb second-half fightback to win 3-1 at Cray on Saturday, with goals from Danny Spendlove, Callum Martin and Jamie Osborne.

Bartlett added: "I was most pleased with the character we showed in the second half when we played very well. I always felt comfortable about the situation because I felt we could turn the game around."

Wealdstone earned their first home win in 2010 on Tuesday night with a priceless 1-0 victory over in-form Hastings United.

Ryan Ashe's first-half penalty was enough to take Bartlett's side up to sixth and the manager thinks winning half of their remaining 14 league games will be enough to seal a play-off spot.

Howell faces battle to hold on to Clarke

HARROW BOROUGH manager David Howell is confident about keeping Dewayne Clarke despite Boreham Wood putting in a seven-day approach for the striker.

It is the third time their Ryman Premier rivals, who host Boro on Saturday, have tried to lure Clarke to Meadow Park but he has turned them down on two previous occasions.

Clarke was sent off in Tuesday night's 1-1 draw at Canvey Island after pushing a player over in the dying seconds.

"I would like to think we can keep him," Howell said. "They could offer him a king's ransom but he says he is quite happy here. He's obviously disappointed and frustrated with the sending off.

"He has speed and ability and a good understanding with Rocky Baptiste, who I call the Andy Cole and Dwight Yorke of non-league football."

Howell has responded to the interest by putting in a seven-day approach for Wood attacker Greg Morgan.

Boro fought back to earn a valuable point at Canvey Island when substitute Kurt Morlese scored a last-gasp header.

It was his second goal in a week after he came off the bench to score in the disappointing 2-1 home defeat to Bognor Regis Town on Saturday.

Howell, whose side play AFC Wimbledon tonight in the London Senior Cup, said: "It was a very similar match to the Canvey Island match. We started brightly but then lost our way. In the second half we battered them and should have won the game."
