Carshalton defeat ends Stones' play-off bid

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett blamed his side's failure to reach the play-offs on a punishing run-in.

The Stones played their last nine matches in 20 days and his team ran out of steam losing their final match 4-1 at home to Carshalton Athletic on Saturday.

Bartlett said: "It was a game too far. They were just worn out and their legs were gone.

"The attitude has been absolutely outstanding all season but the backlog of fixtures took its toll. There was nothing left in the tank. The brain was functioning but the body wasn't able to.

"We had 20 matches in 40 days and the last ten came in the last three weeks. Looking at Carshalton, they hadn't played all week and they had to get a victory to stay up. They were also offered a substantial sum of money to stay up."

Å nightmare first half at Grosvenor Vale ended their playoff hopes with Carshalton, who staved off relegation, taking a 3-0 lead. Greg Nogyi pulled one back but another away goal ended the contest before half time.

Bartlett is refusing to be downbeat despite their near miss in the league. The manager has faith in his squad and believes their achievements this year bode well for next season.

He said: "The amount of games is the reason we fell just short but there are so many positives after reaching a cup final, going on the FA Cup run and finishing sixth in the league.

"I'm pleased to have maintained the record of having done as well or better in 14 of the 15 seasons I've been here.
"There is a great atmosphere

"There is a great atmosphere around the place and our crowds have gone up. It all bodes well but we can't take anything for granted. Carshalton lost in the play-off final last year and needed to win on the last day to stay up so no team has any divine right.

"There are not many negatives and we could harp on about missing out but we are building on the positives. The target next year will be to reach the play-offs."

Bartlett is already planning his squad for next season and does not envisage too many changes. One player who has left the club is Reece Yorke. The 17-year-old defender has agreed a one-year deal with League Two side Barnet.

The manager added: "I want to keep the nucleus of the squad together and I think I probably will. There won't be wholesale changes but I know what I want. There are two are three players that I want to bring in."

Goals from Kurt Morlese and Clayton Dixon fired Boro into the final at Earlsmead on Monday against Bromley.

"The players have been fantastic and it's the best squad we have had," he said. "We've got some good youngsters and we are moving forward as a club.

"The players keep asking me about the double and a few have caught wind of it. But I don't want to dampen spirit ahead of the cup final."
