## Borough boss steps up striker search

manager Dave Anderson admits his priority is to bring in a target man.

The new boss takes charge of his first Ryman Premier game on Saturday at Metropolitan Police but he is focused on beefing up his attack.

Anderson said: "I think we need a front player. We are missing a target man but then so is half the country. I'm still speaking to a few people at the moment but there is nothing to announce

Boro enjoyed a superb season last year when they reached the play-offs and the first round of the FA Cup but the squad has been radically overhauled this summer.

Only about seven of the squad remain but Anderson has moved quickly to revamp his side.

Charlton goalkeeper Nick Pope has arrived on a threemonth loan while midfielders Lee Wootton and JJ Bates have joined from Dagenham and Redbridge.

Anderson added: "Harrow Borough supporters are

very level headed.
"They had success last season but they also understand that there is no guarantee of this.

"It is a major rebuilding project but we are going about it as professionally and quickly as possible.

"I would like to think we will be playing some good football and entertaining the fans soon."

Boro finished their preseason campaign with a 2-1 win over Brentwood Town and 4-0 victory at Ware on Saturday.

Former St Albans City manager Anderson expects a frenetic pace in their league opener but is hoping his side can hit the ground running.

He said: "Every game in the Ryman Premier League is competitive. That hasn't changed in 25 years.

"We're playing at one of the best surfaces in the league and it will be 100 miles per hour for the first two or three games.

"Every game we compete in we want to win. This is the start of the league campaign and everyone wants to get points on the board.'

### Stones set for season opener

Bartlett moved quickly to sign the striker when he discovered he was available and his arrival has increased optimism about their chances this year.

Promising midfielder Alex Dyer has also agreed a new contract despite interest from Doncaster.

After Wealdstone's opener at Grosvenor Vale, they face a trip to Carshalton Athletic on Tuesday
