Stones boss slams 'unacceptable' defeat

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett labelled his side's performance as "unacceptable" after they were dumped out of the FA Cup by Beaconsfield SYCOB.

The Stones boss could not hide his disappointment after their limp 2-0 home defeat which ended their hopes of a cup run.

Bartlett said: "I think the manner of the performance was disap-

"It was very lacklustre and there was no conviction. We have paid a very big price.

The FA Cup and league were our two main targets and we have just thrown one of them away. We never got going at all and have paid the ultimate price.

"It was an opportunity for a financial reward and I just can't put my finger on what happened.

"We just had no conviction about us. We were comfortably the better side in the first half but we still didn't have any shots of consequence.

"When they scored their tails went up and we didn't ask any questions of their back four or goalkeeper.'

The Stones boss warned his side about the possibility of an upset before the game but they still misfired badly.

He added: "We said before the

game the FA Cup has no respect for league positions or ability and over the 90 minutes we didn't perform well enough.

"They were hungrier than us and that is not acceptable. We know our fans have put their hands in their pockets and I feel sorry for them because we have let them down. It is bitterly disappointing.

"Everybody was shocked and I haven't slept well over the last few nights. But all we can do is deal with it and put things right.

"If we had gone down fighting then there would have been no complaints but I didn't see any fight from us."

A bad week got even worse on Tuesday night when the holders were dumped out of the Middlesex Charity Cup after losing 1-0 at home to Ashford Town.

The Stones face a difficult trip to AFC Hornchurch on Saturday in the Ryman Premier and Bartlett is expecting a decent response to their setbacks.

He said: "We have to bounce back from it. There is no point crying about it.
"It will be a very difficult game

against a big strong side. I expect a response from the players. We will use the defeat to get a reaction out of the players.'
