Anderson braced for Pope's exit

HARROW BOROUGH manager Dave Anderson admits it will be a tall order finding a replacement for goalkeeper Nick Pope.

The Charlton shot stopper has made a big impact during his spell with Boro but he will head back to the Valley in five weeks at the end of his loan.

Anderson cannot extend the deal and is convinced the youngster, who saved his second penalty of the season in Tuesday's 2-2 draw at Wingate & Finchley, can look forward to a successful professional career.

Anderson said: "I would love to keep him for the next ten years but that isn't going to happen. I think he will be a football league keeper and we have five weeks to replace him.
