Striker boost for Stones

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett hopes Scott Fitzgerald can rediscover his predatory instinct after cutting short the striker's loan spell at Hemel Hempstead Town.

The former Watford man was sent on loan to the Southern League Premier side at the start of September to improve his match fitness after an operation in the summer.

He was recalled for Saturday's FA Trophy match against Tooting and Mitcham United and the 31-year-old got on scoresheet in a comfortable 3-0 win.

Speaking about his decision to send Fitzgerald to the Tudors, Bartlett said: "It was always in our hands. We sent him out to get fit and score some goals. Getting him back is a gamble but hopefully it might start working again.

'He had to undergo an operation in the summer and we didn't feel like we could provide the number of games that he needed.

"We've called him back and hopefully he can get back to his best and to what we expect. It hasn't all been plain sailing with Scott.

"Look at his track record. I hope he will bring a lot of his experience of scoring goals and live up to his reputation."

With Wealdstone already eliminated from other competitions this season, Saturday's

win kept alive their hopes of a potential cup run.

It also provided a much needed boost after the penalty shootout defeat at Leatherhead in the League Cup.

"It was a very important result," Bartlett said.
