# 'We hope we'll be in the game at half-time'

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett insists his depleted team have the belief to go to Newport County and keep their FA Trophy semi-final alive.

The Stones will be missing six players for Saturday's trip to the Conference side but their manager has backed them to return from the first leg with a positive result.

Connor Smith, Chris O'Leary and Alan Massey are all suspended while Alex Dyer is injured and Dominic Sterling and Tom Pett are cup tied.

Bartlett said: "Missing six players doesn't make it any easier going to a Conference side. They wouldn't be two leagues above us unless they had some damn good players.

'We hope that we will be very much in the game at half time, win, lose or draw. We want to be in a competitive situation when we come back to Grosvenor Vale.

"The players are very upbeat and the belief stems from the fantastic run we've been on of late. We will go there and give it our best shot.

"All we can do is try and get as many things right and hope that they have one or two problems because it will be the little things that make the difference.'

The Stones received an unexpected message this week when current England boss Stuart Pearce sent

them a good luck email. Pearce played 242 times for Wealdstone between 1979 and 1983.

Bartlett admitted: "It was a very pleasant surprise and a lovely ges-

"He is such a genuine, honest guy and it was typical of the man. He remembers his roots even now that he's England manager.'

Wealdstone reached their first final of the season with a 2-0 Middlesex Senior Cup win at North Greenford United on Tuesday. David Hicks and Scott Fitzgerald fired them to a final with Hampton & Richmond Borough on Easter Monday.

Bartlett believes his team may have a bit of history on their side because the last time the Stones went to Wembley in the Trophy they also reached the final of the Middlesex Senior Cup.
