North breaks leg in Stones' Canvey defeat

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett admitted their 3-1 defeat at Canvey Island paled into insignificance after a horrific injury to goalkeeper Jonathan North.

The Stones were stunned in the first half on Tuesday when North suffered clean breaks of both the tibia and fibula bones in his right leg following a collision.

North had an operation yesterday [Wednesday] and is expected to

be out of action until the new year. Bartlett said: "We are all bitterly disappointed but all our thoughts are with Jonathan. The result pales into insignifance after what happend with Jonathan.

"He is a young, fit lad and has been absolutely fantastic for us this

"We are probably looking at the new year but I don't want to put a time frame on it.

"The lads' reaction was one of shock and the players were very subdued after the incident. The match was stopped for about 25 minutes and no-one wants to see that on a football pitch."

Wealdstone's play-off hopes were dealt a significant blow after the defeat but came out of the match with real credit after a dominant performance which warranted much more.

The hosts found themselves 2-0

up at the break and Wealdstone conceded a third against the run of play. Substitute Connor Smith pulled one back but the unlucky Stones had nothing to show for their performance.

Bartlett added: "The response the players gave in the second half once they got over the shock was an absolute credit to them. The football we played at times was outstanding and they showed their character.

"We had 14 shots in the second half but their keeper was outstanding and it summed up our bad luck on the night.

"We were so dominant but the fact is we lost and our play-off chances have taken a dent. But we're Wealdstone and we don't do anything the easy way."

The Stones fought back from 2-0 down to claim a 2-2 draw at home to East Thurrock United on Satur-

day.

The visitors were reduced to ten men in the second half and Wealdstone capitalised with goals from Richard Jolly and Alex Dyer clinching a point.

Wealdstone face a difficult trip to Bury Town this weekend.

Bartlett added: "Bury are a good

side and are currently in the playoffs so we have to go there and win at places like that. We will have to be fired up to get a result there on Saturday.

The Reds did equalise after 56 minutes when Jones again turned provider and steered the ball in for Simeon Akinola to fire through a crowd of players from 12 vards.


But Aveley regained the lead in the 74th minute when a long throw was knocked down and Kayan Kalipha hooked a shot over his shoulders and past Bon-
