The athlete told the Liverpool Echo: "I'm disappointed not to make the final.

"But if anything it makes me even prouder of what I did last time (when he finished ninth in Beijing) but I wanted to go to the final and do even better.

thought suited me, but I did feel as if I was going as hard as I could go. "The Bird's Nest was incredible.

although I ran even better there, but this is even better - the crowd and the noise they made.

"I think the way the heat was going the noise would have gotten me through to the final but that would have been them not me.

"I feel like I've had a great season, but sometimes it doesn't happen.
