### Strauss retires from cricket

ENGLAND captain Andrew Strauss has announced his retirement from professional cricket. The Middlesex batsman made the shock announcement at a press conference on Wednesday. The 35-year-old led England to two Ashes wins and to the top of the world rankings. He scored 21 Test centuries over 11 years.

## Finn strikes in loss to South Africa

STEVE FINN picked up a wicket in England's 80-run one-day defeat to South Africa in Southampton on Tuesday. The Middlesex bowler finished with figures of one for 59 as the tourists closed on 287 for five. But England were dismissed for 207 as South Africa surpassed them at the top of the rankings. The next match is tomorrow at The Oval.

### Saracens set for opening match

SARACENS will start their Premiership campaign at Twickenham this weekend against London Irish. The Men in Black won the title two seasons ago and will be looking to regain the trophy after a semi-final defeat last year. England international winger Chris Ashton is in line to make his league debut for Sarries.

# Stones are beaten for first time this season

WEALDSTONE's unbeaten start to the season came to an end after losing 1-0 at Lewes in the Ryman Premier on Monday.

The Stones were without star midfielder Alex Dyer through injury and his creative and probing abilities were missed as Gordon Bartlett's side produced a disappointing performance.

Wealdstone had plenty of possession but offered very little in the final third.

Meanwhile, Bartlett has offered striker Shabazz Baidoo the chance to relaunch his career with the Stones.

The 26-year-old was a youngster at Arsenal and he burst onto the scene at Queens Park Rangers as a teenager.


Baidoo left Loftus Road in 2008 and immediately joined Dagenham & Redbridge.
