The two teams were on terms for just four minutes as the Trawler Boys quickly regained the lead.

Ainsley whipped a cross into the front post where Frew was able to get in front of his marker and fire past Banks.

Only heroic defending from Lee Chappell stopped the visitors extending their lead as he headed Francis' effort off the line.

Wealdstone pushed forward late on in a bid to rescue a draw but they could not find their way through the Lowestoft defence.
