Bartlett said: "It was a very open game but we gave away two goals. To be two down in 19 minutes was not the best start against one of the top sides in the league but what a fantastic way to win a game.

"We needed a spark but we are up near the top of the league without getting into

"I suppose it has got to be one of our best league wins to turn it around. I had calls from other managers who think we'll now be one of the favourites this vear.

The Stones boss, whose side won 1-0 at Bognor Regis Town on Saturday, continued: "It's the best we've played this season and it's encouraging that we're near the top of the league and we haven't really performed yet prior to the game.

"I believe this has been a slow start per-

formance wise but the difference is we've been getting results this season."

In other news, defender Alan Massey has left the club after signing for Conference Premier side Braintree Town.

Bartlett said: "I'm bitterly disappointed as a football manager because I want my team to do well. But we've seen a young boy turn into a man and he

deserves his opportunity.

"We would welcome him back with open arms if the situation arises. But it is another example of a player from here going on to bigger and better things.

Harrow Borough sunk by Wingate

HARROW BOROUGH squandered a lead as they slumped to a 2-1 defeat at Wingate & Finchley on Tuesday night.

Dave Anderson's side were in

total control in the first half and deservedly led 1-0 but they threw away the advantage in a disappointing second half.
