Stones close in on the top

With just two minutes on the clock, Chris O'Leary played the ball inside to the former Watford man who prodded through to Richard Jolly. The striker had timed his run perfectly as he beat the offside trap before confidently side footing past Cray keeper Grant Hall to

give his side the perfect start.

It could have been 2-0 just five minutes later; Nathan Webb laid the ball off to Wes Parker 20 yards from goal. Parker's driven effort took a deflection before being palmed round the post by Cray's veteran substitute keeper Hall. first choice stopper Andy Walker was injured in the warm up.

In a fast-paced opening, the Wands had an opportunity to level on 12 minutes and probably should have. Billy

Stones keeper Rikki Banks almost handed Vines a chance to make amends five minutes later, the Wanderers striker hit a weak header at goal which Banks almost fumbled into his own net. The keeper would have been relieved to see it bounce just wide of the post.

Stones grabbed their second of the afternoon with 19 minutes on the clock. Peter Dean played the ball inside to Jolly, who slotted it through to Dyer and the former Northampton Town man clinically slipped the ball past Hall to continue his recent rich vein of form in front of goal.

Cray responded and Alex Stavrinou

hit a spectacular volley from the edge of the box which was unfortunate to

dip just wide of the upright.
Webb came close to adding a third on 38 minutes, but he could only lash over when well placed after an effort from Jolly had been deflected into his path following a neat passing move.

Wanderers almost pulled a goal back on the stroke of half-time when Mark Willy met a corner with a first-time effort which was cleared by a combination of Banks and Lee Chappell.

The home side began the second period on the front foot, and only another great block from the well-placed Chappell denied Vines as he bore down on goal after Dyer had lost possession in the middle of the park.

Despite Cray enjoying more of the ball at the start of the half, a crucial third goal arrived for Stones on the hour mark.

Sloppy play gifted Chris O'Leary possession and after a determined run he was able to pick out Jolly at the far post, the deadly marksman expertly fin-ished into the far corner from the tightest of angles for his second of the game.

There was very little action of note in either 18-yard box following the goal, with the home side enjoying more of the ball but failing to trouble Banks as Stones defence was resolute.
The visitors defended so

well that Cray didn't register an effort on target in the second half until the 82nd

minute, when substitute Laurent Hamici hit a 25-yard effort which was straight down the throat of Banks

At the other end, Brooks almost added a fourth on 86 minutes, curling a low effort at goal from the edge of the box which Hall did well to save at full stretch.
