### Harrow celebrate Middlesex Cup win

HARROW Lawn Tennis Club won the Middlesex Cup after victory over David Lloyd Hampton in the final. Harrow won the first round convincingly 6-0 on sets. In the second round, a championship tiebreaker was required with the score at a set each. Harrow triumphed 10-6 on points to seal the win.

# Stones facing fixture pileup in title race

WEALDSTONE face a brutal run of five games in ten days which could prove pivotal in their hopes of challenging for the Ryman Premier Division title.

The Stones were due to host promotion rivals Concord Rangers on Saturday but it was postponed due to a waterlogged pitch. It has been rearranged for Thursday, March 28 leaving a fixture headache for manager Gordon Bartlett.

Wealdstone travel to Hampton & Richmond Borough on Saturday before a trip to play-off contenders Margate on Tuesday.

Bartlett's side then face Concord two days later before the short trip to Wingate & Finchley the following Saturday. Their hectic schedule continues on Easter Monday when they host Harrow Borough in their derby clash.

Wealdstone are currently ten points off leaders Whitehawk but have three games in hand. With the game against Rangers, who are level on points with them, to come their next fortnight could go a long way to determine their promotion hopes.

The club have offered free entry to Under-16s for all remaining home games this season in a bid to attract bumper crowds.

Stones chairman Howard Kraiss said: "We are delighted to offer free admission to all U16s for our remaining home matches this season.

"We've worked hard to successfully attract more young people this season and with every home game likely to be critical, we want to encourage as many home supporters as we can to be there and get behind the team.

"Hopefully this offer will see not only U16s who have started watching us but also new people who want to give us a try."

Meanwhile, in the Thames Valley Counties Women's League, Wealdstone Under-18 Girls were beaten 3-1 at home to Reading.

Claire Holden scored the consolation for the Stones but it was not enough to deny the Royals.

## Harrow reach Panathlon final

HARROW powered to victory in the West London Panathlon final beating off the challenge of Hammersmith & Fulham, Ealing and Hillingdon to qualify for the London final in June.

The West London final took place at Featherstone High School in Ealing, with 102 disabled children from 15 schools taking part in six sports to see who would go forward to the London-wide final.

Harrow, represented by Shaftesbury, Whitmore, Kingsbury High, won boccia, table cricket, kurling, polybat, and athletics field and races.

Hillingdon came second while Ealing and Hammersmith & Fulham were tied in third.

Paralympians Helen Turner and Louise Sugden presented medals to the successful panathletes and inspired the children with tales of London 2012.

Janine Edwards, from Whitmore school in Harrow, said: "We had a fantastic day and are delighted to be going home in first place again. Our hard work has paid off and we are back in the London Final in June."

Panathlon is a charity which provides multi-sport competition for over 3,000 disabled children each year, predominantly across London and the south-east.

Back in April 2012, Panathlon Challenge participants were the first disabled athletes on the track in the Olympic Stadium, taking part in an official test event ahead of the main games.

Panathlon founder Ashley Icton said: "With excitement still fresh from the London Paralympics, we are delivering real legacy to thousands of disabled children in London, competing at their very own version of the Paralympics.

"We would like to thank our main funding partners for the huge part they play in bringing sport and activity into the lives of these children."
