Borough target one more win

HARROW BOROUGH boss Dave Anderson believes his side need one more win to ensure Ryman Premier Division safety this season.

The Reds picked up a crucial 4-2 home win over Enfield Town at the weekend which has eased their relegation fears as they moved up to 17th in the table.

Anderson, whose side travel to second bottom Hastings United this evening, said: "I think that we're one win away from being safe. But even if we get that then we won't rest on our laurels and start to relax.

We are in a reasonable position but we're looking to get three to six points as quickly as possible. If we can get to 40 points then we should be OK so the sooner we get the result the more it will ease the pres-

Boro opened the scoring after just six minutes when Saheed Sankoh latched onto a clearance and fired the ball into the net.

Liam Hope netted the equaliser for Enfield Town before Boro regained the lead in the second half.

Simeon Akinola rounded the keeper and set up Sankoh who netted his second of the game.

Anderson's side made it 3-1 in the 72nd minute when substitute Rob Wolleaston sent Akinola clear and he fired past Noel Imber.

Hope headed home again for the visitors before Wolleaston was sent clear and he smashed in Boro's fourth goal.

Anderson said: "If I'm being honest Enfield were better than us in the first half. But in the second period I thought we played well and it was a big three points.
