Bartlett said: "As each game goes past your worries increase. I was very confident going into the last two games that we could win them but we haven't and that's bound to cause

He added: "As a group we have underachieved. We are making changes every week and nobody has played to their potential or ability yet.

"Nobody can hide from the criticism because we have not done well enough.'

The Stones were beaten 2-1 at Hayes & Yeading United on Saturday despite a goal from Scott McGleish and followed this up by losing by the same scoreline at home to Bath

City on Tuesday.

Their midweek opponents went into the game below Wealdstone in the table but it was a night to forget for the Stones.

McGleish was sent off for a second booking after a challenge on Dan Fell and the side could only manage a late consolation through substitute Michael Malcolm.
