Bartlett keen to bring Calcutt back to Stones

The on-loan Stevenage striker suffered the injury during Monday's win at Chelmsford City and faces between two to three months on the sidelines.

Bartlett said: "It was totally innocuous. The hospital said it's probably about eight weeks so you're looking at ten to 12 weeks until he gets fit.

"It was only a short-term loan but we were looking to extend it. He did very well and we were very keen to extend it so we

will revisit that when he is fit.

"He is a great lad and I feel very sorry for him. Now he has to be strong and get over

it. The good news is it was a clean break."

The manager added: "He fitted in so well and everybody likes him. He was just beginning to find his feet and do well here so it's a shame.

Wealdstone picked up a valuable 2-0 win at Chelmsford this week which moved them four points clear of the bottom of the Conference South relegation zone.

Bartlett's side got off to a superb start after a stunning strike from Elliott Godfrey in the third minute.

The Stones sealed the points in the second half when Shaun Lucien netted from close range.

Bartlett said: "I'm very pleased after the last few weeks when we have deserved more than we got.
