Wealdstone boss Gordon Bartlett says there was "no doubt" in his mind Tuesday's Conference South clash at Hemel Hempstead should not have started and described the half which

He said: "Two of our management staff could not make it so our prepa-ration was not the best. Despite the fact we said we know they start very well we found ourselves 2-0 down due to our inability to defend properly.
