## Baker plans to build Borough

HARROW Borough manager Steve Baker has provided supporters with an update ahead of the upcoming season, explaining the situation with several players and when the new campaign might begin.

Baker claims he is looking to sign some new names to his squad in preparation for the 2020/21 season, which he thinks may begin in October.

He also revealed that the majority of his squad have informally agreed to stay and play for Borough.

“So far apart from our Fulham “loanies” from last season and George Fenton all of last years squad are back in training and have verbally committed for next season,” he wrote.

“As and when players are officially signed you will be the first to know.

“I am looking to add 3 or 4 new faces, however given the current unknown situation this is slightly harder than normal.

“As I’m sure you are aware we are awaiting news from the FA and Southern League regarding a re-start date and its strongly rumoured that early October could be a possibility. Whilst nothing has been confirmed this would be welcomed news.”

Baker also revealed that he had been arranging pre-season friendlies and was simply waiting for those to be given the green light before he could reveal any dates or names of opponents.

He said: “I do have a few pre season games agreed so far and will release a full fixture list once we get the go ahead.

“In the meantime please continue to keep safe and when the time is right get back behind the club and the boys.”

# Cawley joins Wealdstone

WEALDSTONE have completed their fourth signing of pre-season, while also tying down two players to new deals, as they begin preparations for their life in the fifth tier of English football.

Following their promotion to the National League as National League South champions, Stones have ramped up their efforts to ensure next season is a success and the addition of defender Jack Cawley is a further signal of intent.

Cawley joins Dan Wishart, Charlee Hughes and Danny Parish as a new arrivals at the club after he signed from Concord Rangers.

The 27-year-old centre-back played against Wealdstone last season in the FA Trophy and is the son of Peter Cawley who was part of the Wimbledon squad to win the FA Cup back in 1988.

Speaking to the Stones’ website about his move, Cawley said: “It’s a club I know a lot about and played against last year, it’s a great team and I’m excited to join.”

Also committing their future to Wealdstone for the upcoming season are Jacob

Mendy, and George McLennan, both of whom have signed new contracts with the club.

Mendy has agreed to stick around for two more years, while McLennan’s new deal is for one extra season.

Speaking after signing for another two campaigns, Mendy said: “This is what I wanted, I’m so delighted to have signed. I had a great time here last season and can’t wait to play here again [next season].”

McLennan said: “It’s a great opportunity [to play at Wealdstone] again, I really appreciate Dean [Brennan] giving me another chance.”

Stones boss Dean Brennan said on McLennan: “George is a top left-back, he is proven at National League level where he won the league with Cheltenham.

“He has worked really hard to get back fully fit from his injury last season.”
