MENTAL HEALTH CAMPAIGN SUPPORTED BY HARROW

HARROW Borough have welcomed a joint declaration from the UK football family signifying its support for building a mentally healthy environment at every level of the game, as a lasting legacy of the Heads Up camnaism

The campaign will culminate with the FA Cup Final on Saturday, August 1, which will have mental health as a background theme.

The Mentally Healthy Football declaration will see the sport recognising that mental health is as important as physical health, and championing a "team approach" on the issue

The declaration has been signed by senior figures from the sport, including the FA, the Premier League, the English Football League (EFL), Scottish FA, Wales FA, Irish FA, League Managers Association (LMA), Professional Footballers Association (PFA), Professional Game Match Officials Limited (PGMOL) and League Football Education (LFE).

Football Education (LFE). Steve Baker, Harrow Borough manager, said: "This declaration is very well timed. I've been all-too-aware these last five months that I am in charge of a squad of players who love being part of a team and who would normally be bouncing banter off each other two or three times a week when they come together for training or matches.

"For some, the lockdown has meant physical loneliness which they may not have experienced before, which can of course quickly have mental side-effects. It's been important to keep in touch with every one of our group, not just to check that they are keeping in shape physically, but to ask about their mental health and offer support and friendship."
