HARROW Borough will start their Southern League season with an away trip to Truro on Saturday, September 19.

The fixture list was announced at the end of last week and shows that Borough will have a difficult start to the upcoming campaign, as they face the side who were top of the table when football ground to a halt back in March due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Truro is also the furthest Harrow will have to travel this season, making the tie that little bit more difficult.

Things will not get much easier in the two games following, with home games against Salisbury and Chesham either side of an away game against the Metropolitan Police.

Those home fixtures see the Reds against two other sides pushing to-wards the top of the table before the Covid-19 outbreak cancelled the remainder of the Southern League season.

Prior to their league campaign starting they could be in action twice, with the preliminary round of the FA Cup pencilled in for the weekend prior.

That game will see Harrow travel to face either Langney Wanderers or Bethnal Green, depending on who comes out on top in that tie.
