Danny Green opened the scoring for Wealdstone after nine minutes as he slotted under Archie Mair following a quick free-kick from Alex Dyer, while Alex Kiwomya almost responded for the visitors when he fired wide. Wealdstone doubled their lead nine

Wealdstone doubled their lead nine minutes before the break as Ross Lafayette found the bottom corner. Mair then made a couple of good saves to deny the home side a third.

Harry Isted kept out Kairo Mitchell's effort early in the second half before Jacob Mendy's fierce low shot made it 3-0 with 66 minutes gone.

Mitchell grabbed a consolation goal for the visitors from a Kiwomya cross with 10 minutes to go.

It was a win that provided the perfect tonic to the weekend's performance when Jake Hyde and Jack Earing scored second-half goals as Halifax hit back to beat

Stones 2-1.

DENNON LEWIS PLEASED WITH 'SIX POINT' GAME WIN

DENNON Lewis described Wealdstone's 3-1 win over King's Lynn on Tuesday evening as "massive" as Stones put some distance between themselves and the drop zone.

Following a defeat to Halifax at the weekend, Stones recovered well and doubled the gap separating them from the bottom three from three points to six.

Lewis told the club YouTube channel that the win was a result of hard work and getting the basics right.

"We've been working hard. Obviously results haven't been going our way for some period of time but I think now that everyone's coming together as a team working hard, which is the main thing that we're doing," he said.

"We're trying to do the basics right and obviously it starts with hard work on the pitch.

"The main thing at the moment is three points, so it doesn't matter if it's a 1-0 win or if it's a 3-1 like tonight. We showed that we can play. They made it quite a difficult game for us. We're just happy to get the three points and then to get those three points on the table, against them, especially in a six point game, it's massive for us."

"We know it hasn't been hasn't been good enough in terms of the chances that we was conceding and as a team and as a collective, it wasn't good enough in terms of the performance we was putting in, especially when we're coming comfortably at half time thinking that we're in the game and the next minute it could be 4-1. Stu's got us together now and we're moving in the right direction."
