Stones in 4-0 loss to Weymouth

TERRAS COMFORTABLY COME OUT ON TOP

WEALDSTONE fell victim to a 4-0 drubbing at the hands of Weymouth, who boosted their hopes of climbing up the Vanarama National League table following the win.

The Terras took the lead midway through the first half thanks to Josh McQuoid, who headed home Sean Shields' cross from close range. McQuoid almost doubled his tally for the day in the 35th minute but he dragged his shot a yard wide of the target.

Weymouth made it 2-0 after 58 minutes, with Shields again the provider. This time his cross was deflected into the path of Brennan Camp, who smashed home a volley. The impressive Shields deservedly got himself on the scoresheet in the 83rd minute with an impressive finish. Shields then rounded off the scoring moments later after McQuoid's shot was cleared off the line.

Wealdstone will take on Solihull Moors on Tuesday at 7.45pm.

Late winner denies Stones

WEALDSTONE fell to a narrow defeat at The Vale against fellow National League strugglers Woking, with a late goal stealing all three points for the visitors.

Moussa Diarra scored the only goal of Tuesday night's game four minutes from time to move 10 points clear of danger.

Diarra tapped home after the Wealdstone defence could not cope with Woking substitute Jonte Smith.

Dennon Lewis had Wealdstone's best chance but he shot straight at Woking goalkeeper Craig Ross as they went down to a third straight defeat.

Manager Stuart Maynard made three changes to the side beaten 4-0 by Weymouth on Saturday, with Daniel Bowry, Connor Smith and Danny Parish returning to the starting line-up, and new signing Craig Fasanmade on the bench.

Stones defender Jack Cawley curled over the crossbar in the fourth minute.

Jacob Mendy's 18th minute corner to the far post reached Riley Harbottle, who drew a save from Woking's Craig Ross.

Despite pressure resulting in a string

of corners in an 11 minute period, the Stones could not score and it was 0-0 at half time.

Lewis came on just after the break and had an instant impact, heading just wide with his first touch after a cross from Bowry.

A minute later, the forward was slid through by Parish, but shot high.

Woking came close in the 52nd minute as Max Kretzschmar passed to Malachi Napa, with the attacker firing just over Harry Isted's crossbar.

In the 70th minute, Stones' Lewis hit a low driven strike, but Ross saved.

With six minutes remaining, Kretzschmar managed to beat Wealdstone's off-side trap.

It looked as though the Stones were going to hang on, but Diarra pounced in the box and tapped home a late winner for the visitors in the 86th minute.
