Stones release six players

WEALDSTONE REVEAL RELEASED AND RETAINED

SIX players have been released by Wealdstone as they begin their preparations for next season's National League campaign.

Michee Efete, Connor Smith, Danny Green, Dan Wishart, Moses Emmanuel and Jerome Slew have all parted ways with the Stones following the expiry of their contracts.

The news was announced on the club website as Wealdstone released their list of released and retained players.

It read: "We thank all six players for their efforts whilst at the Stones, especially Michee, Connor, Danny and Moses for their fantastic efforts in helping the club win the National League South last season."

The list confirmed that nine players had been retained, including Jake Askew, Jack Cawley, Ashley Charles, Dennon Lewis, Jacob Mendy, Jerome Okimo, Danny Parish, Michael Phillips and Connor Stevens.

Additionally, Craig Fasanmade has joined the club, while academy players Elijah Hearn and Tecane Shrowder also remain at the club, having made two first-team appearances a piece in the league during the recently-concluded campaign.

The future of Charlee Hughes, Alex Dyer, Nikola Tavares and Josh Meekings is yet to be decided with the club negotiating potential new deals for the quartet.

An announcement regarding the outcome of these negotiations is expected in due course.

Elsewhere, loan players Joseph Olowu, George Shelvey, Riley-Jay Harbottle, George Langston and Sonny Blu Lo-Everson have returned to their parent clubs.

Boro start season prep

HARROW Borough have announced a busy pre-season schedule as they prepare for their return to action in the Southern League South Premier Division when it commences later this year.

Ahead of the campaign's kick off on August 14, Boro will face 14 different opponents as they look to start the season on the front foot.

Their full pre-season begins on July 1 with a trip to face Virginia Water away from home before another away clash against Hertford Town just two days later on July 3.

On July 10 Harrow travel to Ashford Town for a third consecutive away fixture, ahead of a match against Potters Bar at a neutral venue on July 13.

Another away game at Spelthorne follows on July 15 before the first home match of Boro's 14 games on July 17 against Uxbridge.

A Queens Park Rangers Under 23 side will visit Harrow on July 21, while FC Romania will be hosting three days later in yet another away fixture.

Three more fixtures will be played throughout the remainder of July, with Hanwell Town visiting on July 27 and Bracknell Town the guests on August 31.

Between those two home fixtures will be an away match at Westfield on July 29.

With the start of the season edging closer, Harrow will play Hampton & Richmond Borough at home on August 3, followed by an away game at Wingate & Finchley on August 7 before bringing their pre-season to a close on August 10 back at home against Barnet.

The 14 matches will add to last week's trip to Staines Town in which Borough recovered from conceding a disastrous first goal to score five times and romp to a sensational victory.

Hoping to be involved in those matches will be Jordan Ireland, Marc Charles-Smith and David Taylor who will stay with the club this season.
