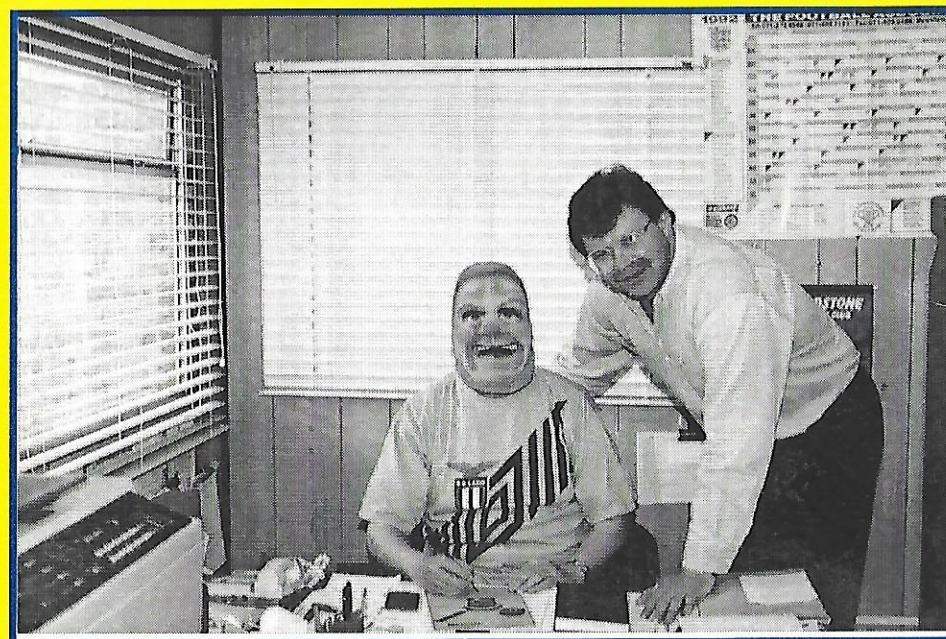

This afternoon we come to the end of another era in the 94 year history of Wealdstone Football Club as we stage our last ever game at Vicarage Road. As most of you know by now, from next season we shall be ground sharing with Yeading Football Club at their ground in Beaconsfield Road, Hayes. We have not enjoyed the happiest of times, resultwise, during our two seasons playing at Vicarage Road as can be seen from my article elsewhere in this programme. In fact our opponents have scored more goals than us in the 57 matches played here to date. We will have to win by at least six goals today if we are to finish with the goal difference in our favour. No doubt many of our visitors have raised their games when playing in this magnificent stadium and have found the playing surface a lot better than they normally play on. We would like to thank Les Simmons and Alec Hall for providing us with a splendid pitch to play on despite the fact that some Football League managers have found it necessary to whinge about the state of the playing surface in recent weeks.

WORDS FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen, may I take this opportunity of thanking each and everyone of you for the incredible support you have and hopefully will continue to give our Club in our time of crisis. There are many people I would like to mention but I am sure they are covered elsewhere in the programme. I would however like to thank my predecessor David Pollock for his relentless efforts at keeping this ship afloat and I am all too aware of the workload ahead.

When I joined the board last October, I could not have envisaged the enormity of the difficulties that have beset our beloved club, but I can assure you that you have a board that has shown great mettle and strength to rally to the cause. I am not a man to make promises I cannot adhere to but for as long as I am at the helm my board will fight tooth and nail to keep this club alive and kicking.

Our Administrator, David Buchler, has shown sensitivity and faith in all of us to steer us round the "Cape of No Hope" and into calmer waters. A lesser man would have shut this club down long ago. Wealdstone Football Club have no divine rights, therefore complacency must never creep in. I MUST turn the extreme financial problems of this club around, if I don't, the consequences are abundantly clear.

Plenty has been written and said regarding the ensuing fiasco over the sale of Lower Mead, however, since we turned semi-pro in 1971 this club has failed miserably to place itself onto a sound financial platform, this must change. The infrastructure of our club has improved with our commercial element and "Blue Ribbon" has been our lifeline. There are few clubs in non-league football that survive without bar income. The lottery is our substitute and its continuity will play a major role in our future. Please keep supporting it.

Ian Crossley and his aides have a great deal more to do and you can rest assured that during the close season they will be working furiously on sponsorship and fund-raising. In addition to this, we must raise our club's profile in both the local community and nationally and to this end I would like to welcome Andrew French into the fold. Andrew will have very much a free role to play alongside Steve Marshall.

We must improve our identity which has without doubt, been lost with the move to Vicarage Road. I have already started the ball rolling as far as looking into potential sites in the Boroughs of Harrow, Brent and Hillingdon. My dream to have somewhere we can call our own may, at this moment in time, be a long way off but if our litigation does bear the fruit we deserve then we must be ready to look at all our options.

Our move to Yeading for next season must be viewed as a positive one. We will return to a non-league stadium with superb facilities coupled with greater opportunities to develop our commercial income. What a change it will make to have a few beers with fellow supporters and players alike that we only ever seem to achieve on away trips.

The highlights of the season for me have been the "Walk to Fisher", the thrashing of Buckingham Town and not least, last weekend in Newport on the Isle of Wight. (Messrs. Patterson, Albert, Kemp and Kraiss - will you ever forget La Scala and Colonel Bogey's? AND Whyley was she K.C. registered?)

My thanks go to Dennis Byatt and the gang for taking on the job under restricting circumstances and I am sure they will be raring to go for the start of next season and instill the pride and passion that this famous club warrants.

Finally, feel free to come and talk to me, I am a very approachable man. Have a super summer and see you all back in August.

57 games later about to meet Andover in the final one. To their players, officials and supporters we extend a warm welcome to Vicarage Road and hope they enjoy their time in our company. This will be Andover's last match in the Beazer Homes League as they are resigning from the league at the end of this season. They have applied to join the Wessex League but the BHL may insist they join the Great Mills League instead. This has not been a very good season for the supporters of the Hampshire club with just 7 wins in their 41 league matches. At home they have failed to win since mid-November and in the subsequent 13 home fixtures they have failed to score in nine of them, including a 2-0 defeat when we visited them in March. At least Andover's supporters haven't suffered as much as those of Towcester Town in the Hereford Sports United Counties League (First Division), who lost their opening 28 league matches with a goal tally of 11 for and 185 against. Towcester then surprised everybody, and no doubt themselves, by picking up points in their next two games. A 0-0 draw v. Blisworth was followed by a 6-1 win over Cottingham, both matches at home. In their previous three matches they had conceded 41 goals at Higham Town (15-0), Olney Town (11-0) and at home to league leaders Ford Sports (15-0). Having seen the first two of these heavy defeats I decided to visit Towcester for their next home fixture against our chairman's other team, Bugbrooke St. Michaels. I put the mockers on their recent recovery as Bugbrooke proceeded to win the game by four goals to one.

Although we withdrew from the Capital League earlier this season I still see the occasional game. I recently visited Underhill to see Barnet v. Crystal Palace and was surprised to see former Stone, David Gipp, in the Barnet line-up. He told me he hadn't been playing regularly for any particular club this season. Barnet were surprisingly beaten 3-2, both their goals coming from former Stones, David Gipp and Tony Lynch. Another of our former players introduced himself at the Newport match last weekend. Keith Lawrence, who now lives in Shanklin on the Isle of Wight, played 40 times for us in league and cup matches in 1976 and 1977. A centre half, he scored three goals during his time with us, the first of these coming in our opening Southern League match at Margate in the 1976/77 season. We won the match 2-0, our other goal scorer was Stuart Woolgar. Keith enjoyed his time playing alongside the likes of John Morton, Danny Light, John Watson, Bill Byrne, Bobby Moss and George Duck!

As this is our last programme of the season I would like to thank those of you who have contributed articles for the programme. Thanks also to those of you who have bought a copy regularly. Especial thanks to Steve Marshall, the previous editor, on setting the standard earlier this season and to Neale Harvey and Sudhir Rawal for their articles which have made interesting reading in each issue, long may it continue. I feel a special word of thanks, on behalf of all Wealdstone supporters, should go to Andrew French and the Watford Observer for the splendid coverage they have given us during the past two seasons. They have certainly spoiled us and they will be sadly missed next season. We are unlikely to receive the same sort of coverage from the local Hayes paper. John Comfort does his best for us in the Harrow Observer but unfortunately we are no longer the senior club in Harrow. Thanks also to all you loyal supporters who have continued to support us since we left Lower Mead. There were many who didn't follow us to Watford and this has been reflected in our poor gate here. It has been particularly disappointing that Watford supporters, who do not follow their side away, have not come along to see us play. I honestly thought when we moved here we would pick up some local support but this has not proved to be the case. Let's hope we will fare better at Yeading and that you will continue to follow the Stones at our new "home".

Have a good summer, I hope the Middlesex cricket team have a better championship this season and England stuff the Aussies in the Test matches. We wish Andover well in their new league next season and hope it won't be too long before we meet each other again, in either the F.A. Cup or F.A. Trophy. I still can't get over that 5-1 defeat you inflicted upon us 20 years ago!

Hope to see you all at Yeading. Until then keep supporting all our various fund raising schemes.

All our best performances have seemed to be away from Vicarage Road. Anyway, enough of that.

Firstly, I would like to congratulate Allan Raven who ran his best marathon time of 3 hours 32 minutes in the London Marathon a fortnight ago and at the same time raised a considerable amount of money for the club. I do not know the exact amount but I believe it to be over £500.

Remember, eight years ago we did the "Double", in another four seasons let's see if we can do it again. To achieve this, we need your support more now than ever before.

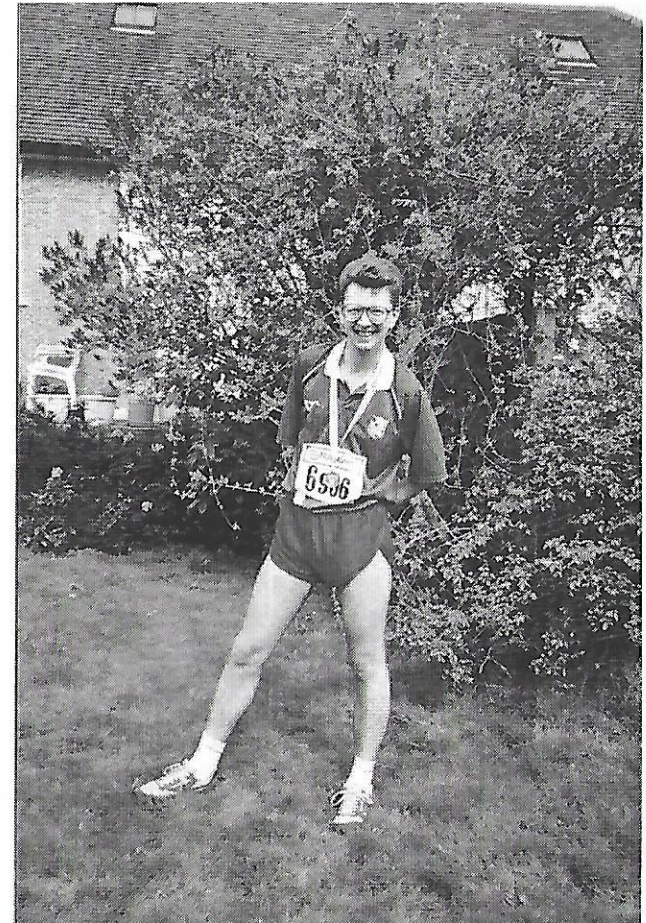

ANDOVER F.C.
CLUB HISTORY

Andover were first formed as a Club in 1883, moving to their old ground at the Walled Meadow three years later. In 1898 they accepted an invitation to join the expanding Southern League. This proved rather an unfortunate venture, as Andover finished bottom of the Second Division and soon returned to local football.

Andover were however one of the leading Clubs to form the Hampshire League and they became a major force in Hampshire football.

The period from the end of the war in 1945 to 1962 when Andover joined the Western League, saw them win 16 titles, including four Hampshire League Championships, four County Senior Cup wins and five victories in the Russell Coates Cup.

The end of the 1960's saw two consecutive second places in the Western League prompting the Club to apply for Southern League membership which was accepted. The Lions have struggled throughout their Southern League membership, with lack of money always a problem to those trying to run the Club.

In November 1989 the Test Valley Council moved the Club from their old Walled Meadow ground to the new Portway Stadium, which has far superior facilities, although further from the town centre.

MARTYN WRIXON - Young player, product of the Youth side.

STUART SULLIVAN - Another Youth team player, has had trials with several League clubs.

Both Daniel and Benjamin attend Alpha Preparatory School in Hindes Road, Harrow which used to overlook Lower Mead Stadium but now has Tesco's Car Park as next door neighbours. We hope that both boys enjoy their afternoon with us at our final match at Vicarage Road Stadium.

OUR RECORD AGAINST ANDOVER

There have been eight previous matches between Wealdstone and Andover, all but one of them Southern League matches. The one exception was our first ever meeting which took place at Andover's former Walled Meadow ground on Saturday, 30th September 1972. The match was a 1st Qualifying Round tie in the F.A. Trophy and turned out to be a real Roy of the Rovers affair. Wealdstone played for the first 25 minutes without goalkeeper John Barr who had been delayed in heavy traffic returning from holiday in Cornwall. Full back John Beyer started the match in goal and was beaten in the 1st and 20th minutes as Andover took a 2-0 lead. Our fortunes changed when John Barr eventually arrived and took over in goal. We turned the deficit into a 4-2 victory with a hat-trick from George Duck and a goal from Alick Brown to extend our unbeaten run to 10 matches.

Our first league meetings were also during the 1972/73 season. In December 1972 we met at Lower Mead in the Southern League (Division 1 South) and drew 2-2, both our goals being scored by Micky Brown. In the return fixture at the Walled Meadow a Bill Byrne goal earned us another share of the points in a 1-1 draw.

The following season 1973/74 we were to become league champions for the first time since joining the Southern League. However the visit of Andover to Lower Mead in November 1973 provided one of the most sensational results since we turned professional. Wealdstone went into the game having won seven of their ten league matches while Andover, who were to finish second from bottom, had won only three of twelve matches played. Taking full advantage of the gale force wind that was blowing Andover raced into a 4-0 lead with goals in the 4th, 13th, 20th and 25th minutes and held this lead at the half-time break. With the wind in our favour for the second half we thought, anything Andover can do we can do better. How wrong we were, it was the Hampshire club who scored again after 57 minutes to lead 5-0. Their goals had been scored by Ronnie Bolton 2, John Robson and Alan Moss plus an own goal from Chris Kinnear, the current Dover Athletic manager. In fact, we didn't find the net until five minutes from time when George Duck scored from the penalty spot to make the final score Wealdstone 1 Andover 5. Although it is now 20 years since this match was played it is still the one talked about whenever anyone mentions Wealdstone v. Andover encounters. The Hampshire club could not repeat this performance when we visited them in April 1974, Wealdstone gaining a convincing victory by 3 goals to nil with two goals from George Duck and one from John Henderson.

We did not meet again until the 1981/82 season. We had been relegated from the Alliance Premier League at the end of the previous season and so renewed fixtures with Andover in the Southern Division (there was no Premier Division that season). Andover made what turned out to be their very last visit to our former Lower Mead ground in March 1981, some ten years before we actually left that location. A hat-trick of penalties in the 17th, 21st and 66th minutes by Paul Bowgett plus a Robin Wainwright goal after 24 minutes gave Wealdstone a 4-0 win, Chris Plain being the unfortunate Andover keeper. In April 1982 we made our final visit to the Walled Meadow and in a poor game came away with a 1-0 win thanks to Gary Churchouse's goal after just four minutes. At the end of the season we had become league champions once again thereby regaining our place in the Alliance Premier League. Andover had the misfortune to finish second from bottom, their lowly position not being helped by gaining just one win at home, against Dover, all season.

With Wealdstone having spells in the Alliance Premier League, Gola League, GM Vauxhall Conference and Southern League (Premier Division) our two clubs did not meet again until eight weeks ago when we made our first visit to their new Portway Stadium for a Beazer Homes League (Southern Division) match. We made a perfect start scoring through Sean Adamson within two minutes of the start and this was followed ten minutes later by our second goal scored by Colin Tate. Wealdstone continued to create many good scoring opportunities but failed to add to those two early goals, the match ending 2-0 in our favour.

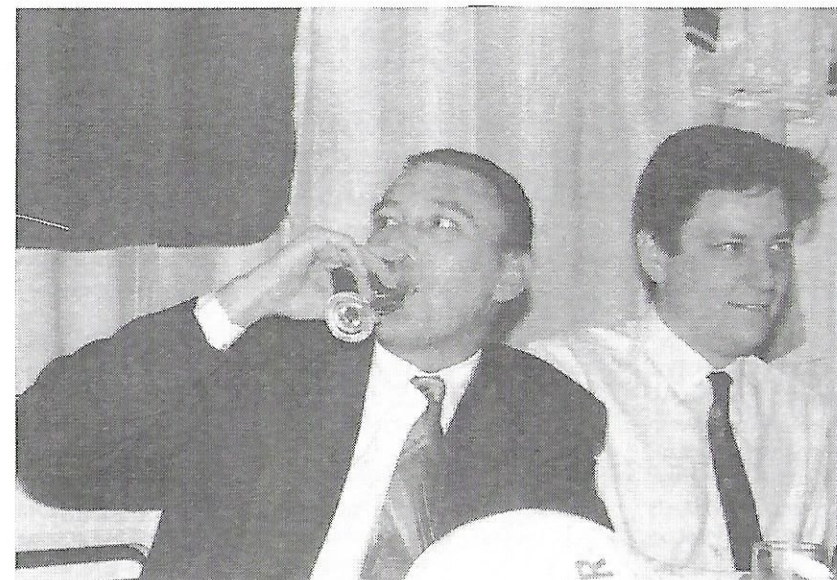

THE SUDHIR RAWAL COLUMN

I must admit that I've been looking forward to writing these programme notes - the very last ones at Vicarage Road - for the best part of two years.

We all came to Vicarage Road with great hopes. With cash available to build a team that would be capable of returning immediately to the G M Vauxhall Conference, success would then have lead to a huge increase in support - crowds well in excess of a 1,000 should have easily been attainable, but like everything else that has been associated with Wealdstone in recent times, those desires were dashed in a mire of financial calamity. The move away from this town and the ground can only be heartily welcomed and rejoiced at, except that this interlude in our travels has cost the club another £2m

The only sadness of leaving Vicarage Road is that our destination is Yeading rather than somewhere closer to home. I can't say I'm particularly enamoured by the decision but I do appreciate why it was made, and respect that it was made with the best intentions of the club at heart. I suspect that is the

reaction of most supporters.

The move to Yeading is in the right direction. It is to a non-league ground, it is in the county of Middlesex, but I'm afraid I have to bore you again and reiterate that this can never be the permanent home of Wealdstone Football Club, nor anywhere in its vicinity.

If Wealdstone can never return to Harrow or to an area that is perceived as being "Harrow" then it must set down its roots in an area which is easily accessible from the town. For example, Northwood and Ruislip are accessible from the Borough of Harrow, while Yeading and Hayes are not.

We are losing the next generation of supporters every year away, the excellent work of the Junior Stones and the Mini-Leaguers can not and must not be wasted. To do that would be criminal.

If we look at the move to Yeading in an ac commendatory manner, then it does not necessarily have to be that painful. We have all made sacrifices for the club over the last two

years, and will probably have to make more but if its in the best interests of the club then so be it. Hardships and inconveniences will have to be overcome.

Many of us thought that when we moved to Vicarage Road we would pick up considerable support from the locality. That certainly didn't happen and our crowds have reached rock bottom, being half of those seen at Lower Mead in the final season.

The possibility of picking up support at Yeading is questionable. Their crowds are actually lower than ours are now. For example, recently on a Saturday in February against Bognor only 110 bothered to attend at The Warren for a Premier division match. So in all eventuality, it means another couple of years of poor crowds, but at least the atmosphere should be considerably better. The Warren is a compact crowd with a covered end. So the peaceful couple of years enjoyed by Southern League goalkeepers and defenders are about to end.

I have to say that I've actually enjoyed this

season. A combination of new grounds, a good start and entertaining football for two thirds of the season have made it enjoyable

The standard of this division is appalling, which makes our final league position equally poor. We have had the ability all along, but to finish below sides that have infinitely less competence is galling

While the faire on the football pitch until the New Year was good, the most remarkable part of the season has been the superb rearguard action mounted by the supporters in keeping the club alive. Our fans have in the past quite rightly been accused of being apathetic, but everytime they have been asked to dig deep into their pockets to keep the club alive they have done exactly that. The *Walk to Fisher* was a unique and memorable event, the whole atmosphere of the day from the actual walk to lunch time in the *Ship Inn* to the match itself will live long in the memories of those that took part.

If one single factor describes this season accurately, then it has to be the determination, passion and pride displayed by the fans

The fund raising efforts have been phenomenal and while our home support has been appalling, our away support has at times been incredible. We've outnumbered home fans at Burnham, Fisher, Buckingham, Canterbury and Dunstable and made up around fifty per cent of the crowd at Havant, Andover, Erith, Bury and Fareham and have taken good support everywhere else apart from Ashford Bear in mind that almost half of our league matches away from Vicarage Road have been in midweek and excluding the distortion of the derbies between Sittingbourne and Gravesend, Stones have attracted the most to away matches of all the teams in the Southern division. This is even before the antics of Newport. How many other clubs have even managed to match our worst away support of the season, when visiting Vicarage Road? Maybe one?

If we can keep up the loyalty shown towards the club and the board continue with the measures that are wholly necessary to address our continuing financial problems, the club will emerge at the other end of the tunnel fitter, leaner and more able to deal with the future.

We have learnt from the events of the past two years that there are no free handouts in this world, no one will help the club without their own motives and that we, as supporters and officials, should be weary of everyone, whether from inside or outside

The club can re-emerge to reclaim its place in the non-league elite. It will not happen next year nor the year after, it will take time. But if it is done at the right pace, at our terms then the mistakes of the those wasted years since the double will not be made again

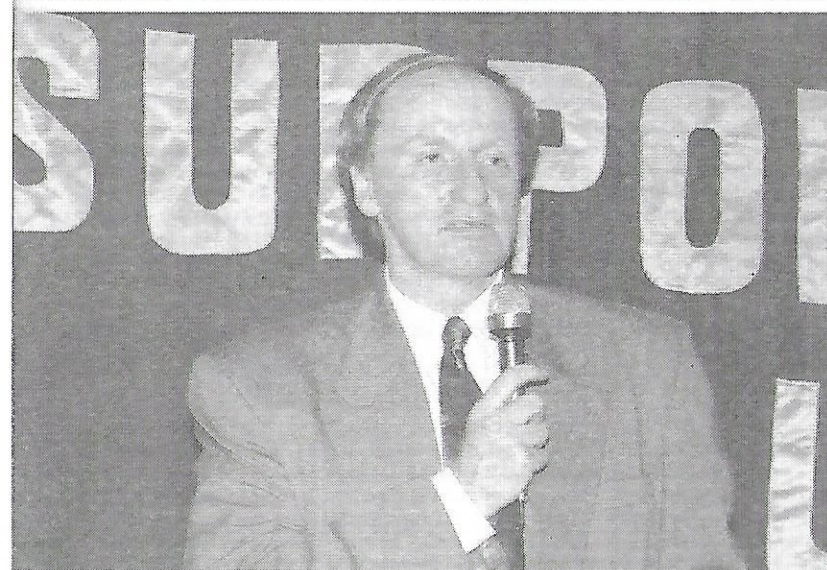
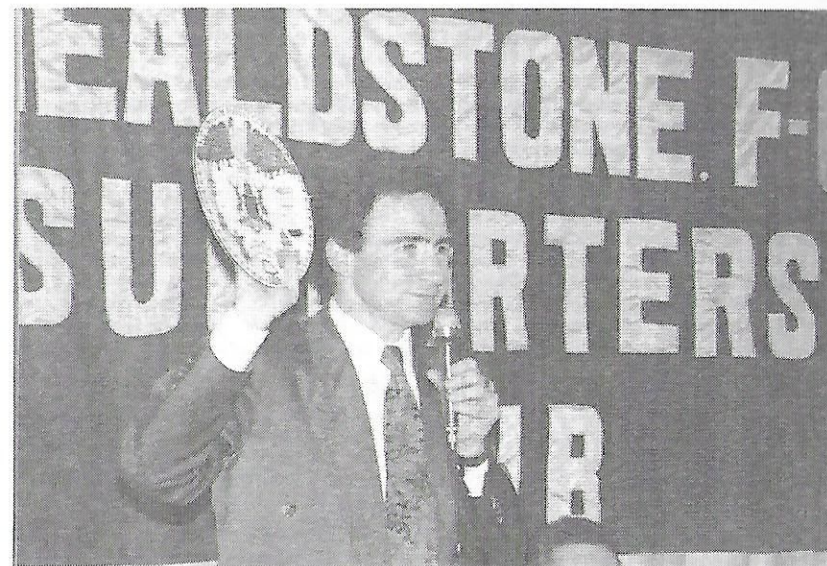
And when we do, there are a hell of a lot of scores to settle. That, in itself, will make it worthwhile alone.

'FAREWELL WATFORD'

Two short years ago when we played our last match at Lower Mead, I wrote in the programme that day about some of my happy memories over forty years of watching Wealdstone and said then what a very sad occasion the closing of Lower Mead was. I did however suggest that we were facing a new and exciting venture at Vicarage Road.

The truth is however that the whole thing has been nothing short of a total disaster. Apart from the financial implications, events on the pitch have left us with very little to cheer about. We lost our Premier Division status in the Beazer Homes League last season after being in a comparatively safe mid-table position at the turn of the year. Then this season, despite the constant threat of closure hanging over us, we were still optimistic at the start of this year of a swift return to the Premier Division when we were tucked into third spot at Christmas. Again our season has been turned upside down with a number of indifferent performances and a mid-table position is now our only realistic hope.

These two years have been like a bad dream, expecting to wake up and find the whole thing hasn't happened. From a personal point of view, the move to Watford suited me in terms of travel as I am only three miles down the road in Bushey Heath.

Had we been in the Conference playing in front of Wycombe type gates (5,000-6,000) things could have been so much different. The reality is the complete opposite. Relegation to a lower league, indifferent performances, have all led to a dwindling of our support to a hard core of around two hundred supporters. It is however the majority of those supporters who have dug deep into their pockets this season in order to help keep the club afloat and give our hard working Commercial Manager Ian Crossley their whole hearted support.

I would like to pay tribute to all those behind the scenes who have worked so diligently to keep the name of Wealdstone going as a football club despite so many set backs, without their work and sacrifice, Wealdstone would surely not be in existence today.

Like refugees looking for somewhere to settle, we are on the move again and the next stop is Yeading. In terms of location it cannot be ideal but in our present situation we do not have a lot of choice. With our small support now, we need to be in a ground where we can at least try and create a bit of atmosphere. The way back to the top is a long hard road but one day, deep down, we must all hope that the Gods will conspire to shine on us again, our financial problems are resolved and we can find a place to build our own Stadium like so many other teams have done in recent years.

As we depart from Watford and play our final match here today, may I say a sincere thankyou to all those at Watford who have given us a warm and friendly welcome to their club. Whatever we may think about the business side of the deal, a lot of people at grass roots have worked to make us feel welcome during our short stay here.

On behalf of my friends, colleagues and supporters, thankyou again.

We must now look to Season 1993/94 with renewed hope for our future. See you at Yeading.

Normally at this time of year I feel a twinge of sadness as another season comes to a close. For the last two seasons however, I have to admit that I couldn't wait for it to end. Our two seasons here at Vicarage Road have not worked out very well to say the least and memorable moments have been few and far between. Roy Couch may correct me but I reckon that we have played 57 matches here and won 24, of which just 18 were league games. On the basis that our two years in Watford have cost us over two million quid I reckon that each game here has cost us about £40,000, but we won't dwell on that too long or else we'll all end up in the funny farm! As I said, memorable games are very thin on the ground. From last season only Trowbridge, Gloucester and Hendon rated highly whilst this season only Gravesend and Solihull stick in the mind. Still we're not the only club in the world to have problems at the moment and now is not the time to feel sorry for ourselves. We head for pastures new in August where the green and pleasant land of Yeading awaits us. I took the opportunity of visiting The Warren a few weeks ago and can personally vouch for the standard of the facilities there. Don't get me wrong, it's not brilliant, but the people there will make us feel welcome and we will be better for a return to proper non-league surroundings. 300-400 people at the Warren will create more atmosphere than ten times that number here at Vicarage Road and maybe we can begin to influence results more than we have of late. There is much work to be done during the close season, not least of all by Dennis Byatt who now begins the task of building a squad on a reduced budget. A hard job, but we have no realistic alternative. Yes, it's been frustrating to be a Wealdstone supporter in our two seasons at Vicarage Road. We're still alive though and although as a club we could probably say that we're still in intensive care, the prognosis is for a steady recovery. It's not going to happen overnight though.

I have to echo Sudhir's thoughts in the latest Elmslie Ender about Andy French's coverage of Wealdstone in the Watford Observer. It has been consistently superb and is the one thing (and I mean the 'only' thing) I will miss about leaving. It's pretty certain that we will not receive anything like the coverage next season and I don't even know what newspapers exist around Yeading and Southall apart from the Harrow Observer. If the West London Press is still going, that may actually be our best bet although our current league status is hardly a plus point for us. We are really going to have to push ourselves if we are to gain any recognition next season. To Andy though, thanks for your efforts and let's hope you manage to get along to see us now and again in our new home.

Yokohama Marinos, Shimizu S Pulse, Kashima Antlers, Urawa Red Diamonds. You'd better get used to some of those names for they and six others are the teams that will kick off the new Japanese league two weeks today. As Arsenal and Sheffield Wednesday dust themselves down after wrapping up the English Premier league season at Wembley, Gary Lineker's Grampus Eight will begin a campaign that will ultimately conclude with Japan staging the 2002 World Cup Finals. That's what the Japanese think anyway! Lineker's presence in Japan will guarantee publicity in the English media and we may even get some TV coverage. 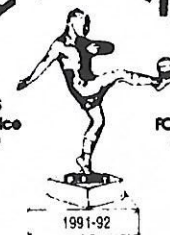

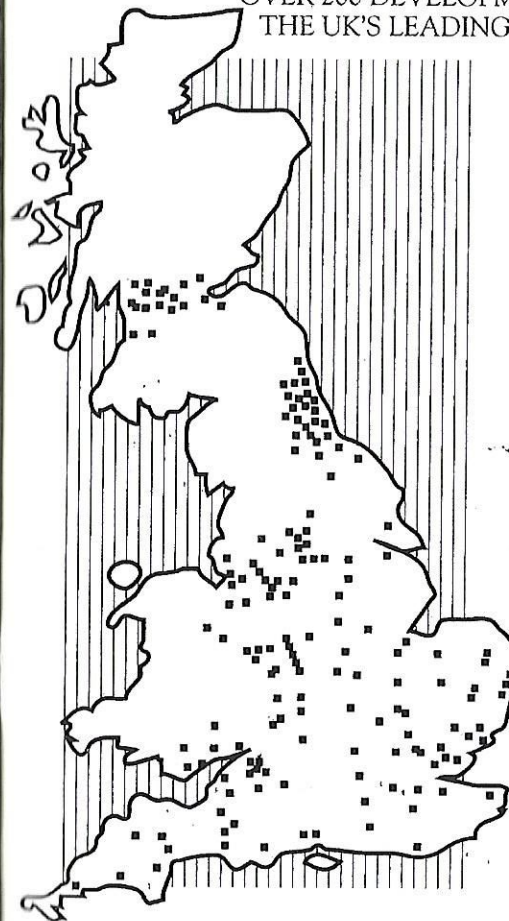
