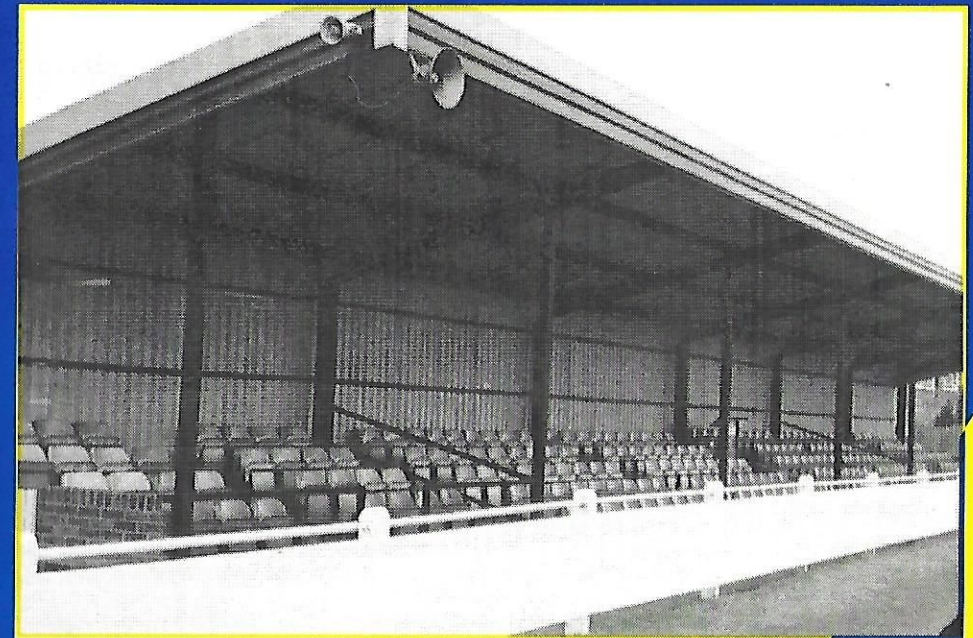

EDITOR'S COLUMN



Good evening to you all. Welcome to "The Warren" for our first match at our new home. Yes, I know we played Yeading here last week but we were the "away" side on that occasion. I don't know about you but to me the period between seasons seems to get shorter and shorter. This has been very true in my case. After seeing my final match of the 1992/93 season at Sandy Albion on the 24th May, I started this season as early as the 4th of July in the Isle of Wight, a break of just 6 weeks! I visited the Island for the Inter-Island Football Tournament and my season began with 9 games in just 3 days. By the time I had seen Jersey beat the Isle of Man 5-1 in the final at Newport's ground I had witnessed 13 games in just 6 days, one of which was a rest day, and seen 45 goals. In fact by the time I travelled up to Bugbrooke to see Wealdstone's opening fixture I had already seen 25 matches this season and over 100 goals!

What does this new season have in store for us I wonder. Only time will tell but I'm sure Dennis and his players will be hoping to be among the league leaders right to the finish. Let's hope we don't have the financial problems off the field that we had last season. Our preparations for the new season have seen us play four friendlies during which 22 players have been given the chance to show Dennis what they are capable of. Wins at Bugbrooke St. Michaels and Northampton Spencer, followed by a draw at Metropolitan Police were most encouraging. We were, however, quickly brought down to earth in last weeks friendly against our stable mates, Yeading, when we were beaten 5-0 here at The Warren. Personally I would have liked to have seen us have more friendlies to prepare us for the task ahead, I feel four isn't enough. St. Albans City, for example, played no fewer than 12 friendlies and 2 cup-ties, one in each of the East Anglian Cup and Herts Charity Cup, before their opening league fixture on Saturday.

With these notes being written before our match at Poole on Saturday I am unable to pass comment on our performance there. I'm sure whoever Dennis decided to play will have given of their best and hopefully got us off to a good start. Four of the players who took part in our final match last season against Andover have now left the club. Dave Venables and Sean Pearson have joined Stevenage Borough, Martin Blackler is believed to have gone to Chertsey Town and Johnson Hippolyte, who scored twice against us last week, has of course joined Yeading. Dave and Sean have already been among the goals. I saw "Venners" get one of Stevenage's goals when they beat a West Ham XI 3-1 recently, and Pearson (2) and Venables scored half of the goals in Stevenage's 6-2 win at Hertford Town in the Herts Charity Cup ten days ago. We welcome the new players who have joined us and hope they will enjoy their time at Wealdstone.

A warm welcome too, to our visitors this evening, Canterbury City. We trust their officials, players and supporters have had a good journey up from Kent and will enjoy what may well be their first ever visit to The Warren. We welcome also any Yeading supporters here this evening. If you are not going to watch your team when they are playing away why not come along and see us play here. With both Yeading and Wealdstone in different leagues you have the opportunity to see at least 42 different visiting clubs this season. This coming Saturday, 28th August, Wealdstone will be playing Margate here, kick off 3.00 pm. Please try and come along.

CANTERBURY CITY FOOTBALL CLUB

PEN-PICTURES - Season 1993-94

Joe RADFORD (Goalkeeper) - This highly-rated 30-year-old 'keeper joined the club in the summer of 1992 having spent the previous eight seasons with near neighbours Margate. Former clubs are Gillingham and Dover Athletic.

Nick FRIEND (Goalkeeper) - Young reserve team custodian who has returned to the club after spending a season at Dover Athletic. Made a number of first team appearances during his first spell at Kingsmead.

Kevin SMART (Defender) - Vastly experienced player now in his second season at the club. Made 80 Football League appearances for Plymouth Argyle and Wigan Athletic before serving seven seasons with Folkestone.

Paul GOLDEN (Defender) - A tough-tackling full-back signed during the summer from Margate with whom he spent last season. Former apprentice with Gillingham who was on-loan to Colchester United for a short period.

Darryl GRIFFITHS (Defender) - 22-year-old local player who came to the club in the summer of 1990 from Dover Athletic having made his way through their ranks into the first team squad.

Paul BAGLEY (Defender) - Consistent player now in his third season with the club. Previously appeared for a number of other East Kent clubs including Dover, Thanet United and Ashford Town. Chosen 'Players' Player-of-the-Year for the last two seasons.

Stuart REED (Defender) - A close season acquisition who began his senior career with Folkestone Town (1990) where he was a regular in the Beazer Homes League side. Joined Margate at the start of 1991 following the demise of the Folkestone club.

Peter GAME (Defender) - A quick, reliable player who has progressed into the first team squad following a number of impressive displays in the City reserve side. Currently the longest serving player at the club (five seasons).

Paul NEAT (Midfield) - Former Dover Athletic player who came through their reserves to play in the first team. A good attacking player signed three seasons ago who always features in the clubs list of leading goalscorers.

John LINEHAM (Midfield) - Strong-running midfielder now in the third season of his third spell at the club. John previously wore the colours of Folkestone Town, Dover Athletic and Thanet United.

Marc HALL (Midfield) - Signed during the summer of 1992 from Dover Athletic where he figured in their youth and reserve teams. Son of City manager Les Hall.

Mark BARNETT (Midfield) - Came to the club at the start of last season following his release from Ashford Town. Scorer of a number of important goals for both the first team and reserves.

Russell McVITIE (Midfield) - Graduated from the reserves into the senior side towards the end of last season as a result of injuries to several first team players. Previously played for Thanet clubs Margate and Ramsgate.

Meirion GEORGE (Utility) - A former student at Canterbury's Christ Church College who since joining the club during last season soon established a regular first team place. This 23-year-old Welshman can fill a number of left-sided positions.

Julian HOLMES (Forward) - A tall striker who joined the club during the 1991-92 season from Dover Athletic where he figured mainly in the reserves. One of the City's leading goalscorers last season with 15 goals.

Andy BIGGINTON (Forward) - A prolific front-runner who re-signed for the club in July 1993 from Deal Town having scored 30 goals for their Winstonlead Kent League Division One side last season.

Dean STONE (Forward) - Promising 20-year-old local player who is relishing the challenge of Beazer Homes League football this season. Dean looks to have a good future in the game.

Bill ROFFEY (Defender) - Made over 400 Football League appearances for Crystal Palace, Orient, Brentford and Millwall. Had three years in Portugal with Lexoes and a short spell with Barnet before retiring from senior football. Made a come back with Margate in Season 1991-92 before signing for City at the start of last season.

Steve WHITE (Forward) - A diminutive winger transferred to the club during the close season from Premier Division club Sittingbourne. This 20-year-old was previously on the books of West Ham United as a junior and has gained England Schools U.18 honours.

CANTERBURY CITY FOOTBALL CLUB

A SHORT HISTORY OF THE CLUB

Canterbury City F.C. successors to the pre-war Canterbury Waverley club, came into being at the start of the 1947-48 season but the revival of Kent League football in Canterbury came about in rather a different manner than with most other Kent clubs.

After the war, a local business firm formed their own football team known as Bretts Sports. Success came quickly and they won the Kent Amateur League. But it was decided that Canterbury needed something more than a good firm's side to represent it's City.

Following a meeting between members of the former Canterbury Waverley Supporters' Club and officials of Bretts Sports, it was decided to form a private limited company with Mr. William Brett as first chairman of the new club. Bretts placed their ground at the disposal of the new club and an application was made for admission to the Kent League.

After ten seasons at Bretts Corner, the club moved to it's present headquarters at Kingsmead Stadium. Canterbury had only one season in the Kent League on their new ground before the League was disbanded, so they joined the Metropolitan League. Support for the club dropped alarmingly, so it was decided in 1960 to join the Southern League in the hope that it would bring back the missing support.

Since joining the Southern League, Canterbury have made steady, if unspectacular progress and achieved their highest league position in 1965-66 season when they finished in seventh place in the First Division.

As a result of falling attendances, the club gave notice of withdrawal from the Southern League in December 1966. However, due to the efforts of both the Football Club and Supporters' Club committees Southern League football was maintained in the City.

Canterbury have reached the First Round Proper of the F.A. Cup on two occasions, in 1964 when they lost at home to Torquay United 0-6 and in 1968 when a last minute penalty at Swindon Town saw an unlucky exit on that occasion.

In recent years a number of improvements have been carried out at the Kingsmead Stadium complex which also stages greyhound racing. New floodlights, a new restaurant and an extension to the main stand along with general renovations throughout.

This evening Wealdstone and Canterbury City meet for the ninth time. The first match between our two clubs was 21 years ago during the 1972/73 season. That match, a Southern League, First Division South fixture, took place down in Kent on Saturday 25th November 1972 and resulted in a 1-1 draw. Derek Gozney scored our goal, his only one for the club. Four months later we recorded our first win against our visitors when they visited Lower Mead and were beaten 5-1, our scorers being Alick Brown 2, Micky Brown, Bill Byrne and an 'own goal'. This had been our first season in the Southern League First Division South and we finished in 8th place with Canterbury four places below us.

The following season, 1973/74, we were to win the first of the three league championships we have won since turning professional in 1971. Of the 38 league matches played that season we lost only five and Canterbury, who finished the season in 15th place, were responsible for one of them, beating us 3-0 on their home ground. We turned the tables somewhat winning the return fixture at Lower Mead 3-1.

We did not meet again until the 1981/82 season, when again we were to become league champions, Canterbury this time ending up in 20th place in the 24 team league. In October 1981 we gained a fine 5-0 victory over the Kent club at their Kingsmead Stadium, three of our goals being scored by Neil Cordice. Our other marksmen were Nigel Johnson and Paul Bowgett. When the two sides met again at Lower Mead the following March we completed a league "double" over the City when Robin Wainwright (33 mins.) and Neil Cordice (89 mins.) scored to give us a 2-0 victory.

A further ten years were to pass before our paths crossed once more last season. In September 1992 Canterbury City came to Vicarage Road and quickly got into their stride, Paul Neat scoring for our visitors after just three minutes. A goal by Dermot Drummy in the 36th minute enabled us to leave the pitch at half-time level at 1-1. We scored two further goals early in the second half to gain a 3-1 victory, thereby maintaining our 100% record in home matches against the Kent club. Sean Pearson gave us the lead after 56 minutes and this was followed nine minutes later by a goal from centre half John Finch, making his only appearance for us in the Beazer Homes League. When we visited the Kingsmead Stadium for the return league fixture in February of this year we turned in one of our worst performances of the season. Canterbury were lying fourth from bottom with just 5 wins from 25 league matches played whereas the Stones were in 6th place in the league table. We rarely looked like scoring and it came as no surprise when Paul Underwood gave the home side the lead after 26 minutes. Further goals from Paul Neat (48 mins.) and Graham Stonestreet (78 mins.) gave the home fans plenty to cheer about as Wealdstone went down 3-0. This win turned out to be the start of Canterbury's best unbeaten run in the league last season, a total of 6 matches

DOUG ELECTED TO F.A. COUNCIL

Beazer Homes League Chairman Doug Gillard was recently elected to the Football Association Council as the Representative for Division 10. Doug defeated the 'sitting' incumbent, Jim Thompson (Dartford) by 15 votes to 10 at the conclusion of the fourth ballot in a protracted election process after the challenges from Colin Boswell (Whitstable) and Derek Upton (Charlton Athletic) had been dismissed in earlier votes.
