## FROM THE EDITOR



GOOD AFTERNOON to you all, welcome to The Warren for the last time this season. For this afternoon's Beazer Homes League (Southern Division) fixture we welcome the official players and supporters of BURNHAM FOOTBALL CLUB, hope you have a pleasant few hours in our company. When the two sides met at Wymers Wood Road back in October our visitors gained a 3-0 victory with goals from Phil Surridge, Steve Norman and Kenny Hughes. We hope to reverse this scoreline this afternoon but it won't be easy as Burnham are currently having a reasonable run of results. A glance at our Current Form table in this programme shows that they have lost only one of their last six matches. Last Saturday they won 1-0 at Fareham to end a run of 12 away league matches in which they had picked up just one point, a 1-1 draw at Fisher. Three players have played for both clubs this season, Tony Anglin, Peter Augustine and Stuart Walsh. The first two were in the Burnham side that beat us 3-0 and Stuart had a couple of games for us before joining Burnham a few weeks ago. Tony may recall that when Burnham visited us in the Southern League Cup three seasons ago he scored one of his sides five penalties in the shoot out that decided the tie.

Our recent run of results has seen us more than double our points total for the season but the defeat at Dunstable was a bitter blow in our bid to finish above the Bedfordshire club. This now means that anything less than a win at Fareham on Wednesday will ensure we finish the season second from bottom of the league table. Thank goodness Canterbury and Dunstable have resigned and saved us from the prospect of playing in the Hellenic League next season against North Leigh, Tuffley Rovers and Rayners Lane!

The latest players to make their debuts for the Stones are Graham Meakin and Mark Drum bringing the total of players we have used in the league this season to 58. A grand total of 62 have now been used in the 51 league and cup matches prior to our visit to Fareham Town.

Our last home match saw us record our highest league score of the season when Bury Town were on the end of a 5-1 thrashing. Rod Brathwaite, after just 4 appearances, became our leading goalscorer in the league when he scored twice to add to the hat-trick he got in our previous home game. Unfortunately he was injured during the second half and has been sorely missed in our last few games. Graham Meakin opened his account for the Stones and two Bury Town players completed our scoring by putting through their own goal. It wasn't the first time we have been credited with two "own goals" in the same match. It happened in our final match of the 1976/77 season when we visited Chelmsford City for a Southern League (Premier Division) match. City players Binks (26 mins) and Loughton (38 mins) put the ball in their own net to give us 2-0 half-time lead. Jimmy Greaves, who will be guest speaker at our Sportsmans Dinner this coming Friday, was playing for Chelmsford that day and was prevented from reducing the arrears when his penalty kick was saved by Chris Lightfoot after 76 minutes. Greavsie did manage to get on the score sheet five minutes from time but it was too little too late to prevent us from winning by two goals to one.

Congratulations to Dermot Drummy on being voted the supporters 'Player of the Year' and players 'Player of the Year'. In my opinion he thoroughly deserved these honours in what has been a very bad season for the Stones. Dermot is one player you can rely on to give his all for the Club.

The Stones Predict-A-Score competition looks like going right to the final match before the eventual winners are known. I have enjoyed compiling this during the season and it

## THE ATHENIAN FOOTBALL LEAGUES 1912 - 1939

Mike Wilson has produced a 71 page book entitled "The Athenian Football Leagues 1912-1939 and includes a brief history of each League and all the results and tables plus much more.

This publication is available only from Mike Wilson, 27B Brailsford Road, Tulse Hill, London SW2 2TB and costs £4.95 plus 50 pence for packing and postage.

For your information, Wealdstone were elected to the Athenian League for the 1928-29 season and continued in that league until they joined the Isthmian League for the 1964-65 season. Wealdstone lost its first Athenian League match - a home fixture with Enfield - 3-4, but finished in 8th position out of 14 clubs. However, the Stones were the top goalscorers in the league that season scoring 81 goals in 26 matches. Wealdstone Reserves did much better by winning the Athenian League Reserve Section scoring 97 goals in the 26 match programme.

## A SHORT HISTORY OF BURNHAM FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1878, Burnham F.C. is the second oldest club in the county of Buckinghamshire. They played, with considerable success, in local junior leagues before before being elected to the Hellenic League in 1971. They won both the Hellenic League Premier Division title and the League Cup in the 1975/76 season.

Burnham were elected to the Athenian League in 1977 and were twice runners-up in that league before it folded in 1984. Burnham competed in the London Spartan League during the 1984/85 season and they achieved the "double" of the Premier Division and League Cup.

In the summer of 1985 Burnham amalgamated with Hillingdon Borough, who were about to fold having lost their ground for development, and played in the Southern League as Burnham & Hillingdon Football Club. They reverted to their former name of Burnham F.C. in 1987.

Burnham reached the quarter-finals of the F.A. Vase in 1977/78 and then the semi-finals in 1982/83, where they lost on aggregate to Halesowen Town. They competed in the F.A. Trophy from 1985 to 1991, reaching the third qualifying round in 1989/90, but have now reverted to the F.A. Vase. Burnham have twice reached the third qualifying round of the F.A. Cup.

The manager of Burnham F.C. is Barrie Gould, who was appointed to the post in January 1994. This was only the fifth managerial change at Burnham in the past 30 years. David Brown has recently returned to the club as coach and the physiotherapist is Colin Cooper. The reserve team, which plays in the Suburban League (West Division), is managed by Kevin Hill.

## BURNHAM F.C. - PEN PORTRAITS - 1993/94 SEASON

DAVID DYSON: Young goalkeeper recently signed after moving into the area. Previously with Wroxham in the Jewson League.

PAUL BRETT: Young defender in his fourth season at Burnham. Has recently returned to the team following a lengthy injury.

DAVID MUIR: Defender who has recently joined from neighbours Flackwell Heath.

STEVE NORMAN: Experienced defender who joined Burnham during last season. Previously with Windsor & Eton and Chesham United.

DARREN TOUGH: Central defender who rejoined Burnham this season after playing for Windsor & Eton.

MIKE TOMLINSON: Midfielder, previously at Aylesbury United.

JAMIE JARVIS: Powerful player in defence or midfield. In his fourth season with Burnham. Previously in youth football.

SHANE CHANDLER: Club captain. Competitive midfielder who joined Burnham in 1987 from Hungerford Town.

KENNY HUGHES: Former Reading youth player now in his fourth season at Burnham.

STEVE BUNCE: Prolific goalscorer who has progressed from youth team football at Burnham. Still only 20 years old.

STEVE JONES: Versatile player who has recently returned to Burnham.

## HOW ARE THE MASCOTS CHOSEN? by DAVID ALBERT

When all you supporters out there see two kids running out onto the pitch prior to a home match kicking off, beautifully decked out in a replica Wealdstone kit, having a kick around with the Wealdstone players, do you ever ask the question "Who are they? and Where do they come from?". You may even wonder whether they are actually going to take part in the afternoon's proceedings. Taking into account our performances on the pitch this season, anything is possible!!! Well, this article will give you the answers to all of these questions and more!!!

First of all the two mascots at every home match are members of the Wealdstone F.C. Mini-League Scheme which has now been operating for nearly four years. I have been organiser more or less since its inception and have seen it grow to be one of the most successful football schemes in the Harrow area.

Simply, the Mini-League is football for 6-8 year olds for enjoyment, with no pressure being put on them to perform well. Sessions take place every Sunday morning (August-December and March-July) and are held at the Old Lyonians Sports Ground in Pinner View, Harrow. A Registration Fee of £10.00 is paid at the beginning of the season and the weekly fee paid is £1.50 per child. If a child misses a session the £1.50 fee is still payable. This encourages regular attendance. Registration each Sunday morning is at 10.30 a.m. and we aim to kick off just after 11.00. Every week, from a draw, a player is placed into a team named either Wealdstone, Tottenham, Arsenal, QPR, Liverpool, Chelsea, Wimbledon or Watford and each team plays four matches. Each match consists of 6 minutes each way. Each team has a teamleader (a parent) who generally looks after the players. It is important here to point out that the teamleaders do not coach the players, they only encourage them. They ensure that a proper record of each match takes place, match scores and individual player scores.

At approximately 12.30 p.m. when all of the four matches are completed a presentation is then held in the Old Lyonians Sports Hall, where first of all all the scores are totalled up and given to me. I perform the presentation which involves giving any details of club news together with the actual presentation of a trophy to the team that scores the highest number of goals in the morning's four matches; a trophy to the individual player who scores the highest number of goals in the morning's four matches; man-of-the-match certificates given to a player from each team, adjudged by the team leader to have put in a lot of effort into the morning's four matches. We also perform a draw each week where, whoever is drawn out of a hat wins a ball and more importantly becomes a Wealdstone Mascot for the day at a Saturday home match, which I mentioned at the beginning of this article. The player who wins a ball is given a Saturday home match to be a mascot. On the allocated Saturday the mascot arrives at the ground at 1.45 p.m. and is met by Graham Smith and family who take them into the players dressing room where they get dressed into a Wealdstone replica kit, have their ball (that they won at a session of the Mini-League) signed by all of the players and they then have a kick around with the players prior to the start of the match. Complimentary tickets are given to the Mascots so that mums and dads and other members of the family can attend and, all in all, a great day out is had by all. Many of the mums and dads bring cameras and video cameras to record this special day.

Since we began operating the Mini-League, the only real problem we encountered, was that once members reached the age of 9, there was nowhere for them to go and they tended to join an under-10 football team in the Harrow area. This problem was resolved at the beginning of this season with the great help of Don Cross who has started an Under-10 and Under-11 squad under the banner of Wealdstone Juniors F.C. Many Mini-League members last season joined the Under-10 squad. They train every Saturday and Sunday morning unless a match is scheduled on one of the mornings. The Under-10 team are only playing friendlies this season but Don Cross intends to run three teams next season, Under-10, Under-11 and Under-12, hopefully in the Harrow Youth League, which is the prominent youth league in the Harrow area. We hope that this will be successful and this will only be the beginning of a proper youth policy which will in a number of years ahead enable players from 6-18 to play a part in the continued development of Wealdstone Football Club.

A scheme that I would like the board to consider for the start of next season would involve substantially reduced or even free admission for our opening home league game. This could act as both a reward for those who have continued to attend matches despite all our traumas and also be an opportunity to get people back into the habit of attending Wealdstone matches. Promoted in the right way and in conjunction with some attractive friendlies it could prove to be good publicity and reap rewards in the long term, who knows.

With the football season drawing to a close anyone who is interested in playing cricket this summer may be interested in joining Harrow Town CC who play in the Middlesex Cricketers League and are situated behind the 'Grosvenor Bar' in Rayners Lane. It is a good standard of cricket with excellent social facilities. The club also has a superb colts section and a thriving tennis club, details can be obtained by phoning 866 8733.

The Supporters Club would like to thank everybody who has stuck by the club this season, it could have been worse!! I hope all those who attended the recent awards dinner with Tony Gubba enjoyed themselves and congratulations to all those who won awards, Dermot Drummy (3), Nick Woolford, Val Shearer and Nick DuGard. I hope everyone enjoys their summer and any lost enthusiasm is regained during your time away from the club, and I wish the board and management a busy and productive time. Good luck Paul Rumens & Co., and Fred Callaghan & Co.

#### A VIEW FROM THE TERRACES

Three years ago when we said goodbye to Lower Mead, I contributed a few reflections in our final programme of that season. Last year, at the end of two disastrous and costly seasons at Vicarage Road, I again wrote a few thoughts. On this occasion we come to our final home fixture in our first season of ground sharing here at The Warren.

Without doubt, on the pitch we have experienced our worst possible season since turning semi-pro in 1971. With two fixtures to play, we are destined to finish in the bottom two. But with the resignation of two teams at the end of the season, we are saved the indignity of further relegation.

We have suffered on three occasions since 1971 relegation from various leagues. In 1980/81 we dropped out of the Alliance but returned the following season after becoming Champions of the Southern League (Southern Section). After remaining in the top flight for six seasons, we were down again at the end of season 1987/88, this time going into the Premier Division of the Beazer Homes League. Playing for four seasons in that Division we never achieved higher than eleventh spot and then of course came relegation at the end of 1991/92 season. So yes, we have suffered our bad times before, even in the 50's & 60's when I watching and following Wealdstone. But I do not think any of those poor seasons can quite compare with what we have seen this season. Many of our performances have been downright embarrassing.

I do not think that too many people would disagree that in my opinion this section of the Beazer Homes League is very poor in terms of the standard of football and I would only pick out four or five who have provided entertaining football, and yet in such a poor league we are going to finish twenty-first. I will concede that since we stopped a row of defeats at Braintree on March 26th with a 2-2 scoreline, we have at least seen some sort of restoration to sanity on the pitch.

Pre-Braintree our league record reads:-

Played 30 Won 2 Drawn 4 Lost 24 Goals For 28 Against 81 Points 10. since then up to and including last Saturday at Witney it reads:-

Played 9 Won 3 Drawn 3 Lost 3 Goals For 14 Against 9 Point 12.

What is quite remarkable of course is that despite our desperate position, the support at away games is something to behold. When you make midweek trips to Canterbury, Dunstable and Buckingham and find you are among a support of forty or fifty from Wealdstone, that sort of support deserves something better to watch.

However, enough of the gloom from on the pitch, off the field there is a hint of cautious optimism that there is just a chink of light at the end of the dark tunnel we have been in. If things do work out we still have a very long way to go. I am sure that what most supporters grave for apart from a decent team on the pitch, is to see us back in a ground we can call our own. I'm sure if the enthusiasm and efforts of our Chairman, Paul Rumens and his co-directors are anything to go by, we will one day achieve our goal. Apart from the aforementioned, there are so many others who are working hard to ensure our future. Our young hard working Supporters Club Committee, by no means the least, are playing their part to the full for the club.

After next Saturday, away to Weymouth, we as supporters can have a break, but behind the scenes the work to ensure the club's survival will go on. We must wish all those involved every success. I hope we will be back in bigger numbers next season.

N.B. Roy Couch asked a few weeks ago for some opinions on "Home" kick off times. I personally would like to see it at 7.45 PM for our midweek matches. And Roy, I hope you do not think I am stealing your thunder with some of those statistics.

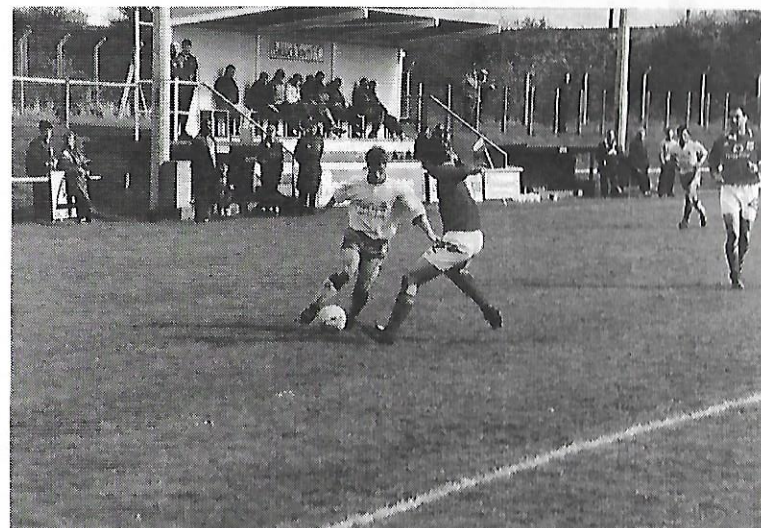

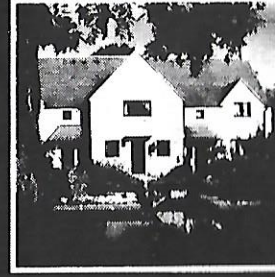
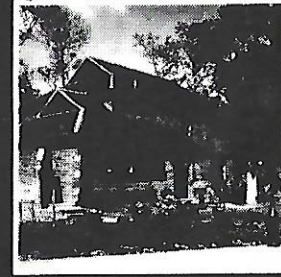
