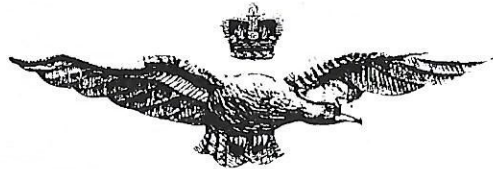

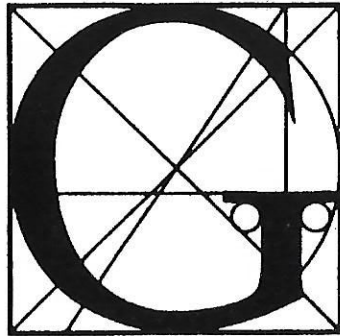

Welcome to the White Lion Ground for our last match of the 1995/96 season. Our visitors this afternoon are Harlow Town who look like finishing the season one place below us in the ICIS League (Division Three) table. To their players, officials and supporters we extend a warm welcome, hope you enjoy your visit and have a trouble free journey home later on. We also welcome the 'third team' here today, namely our referee Mr D.W. Cook, and his linesmen Messrs Bonner and Gilchrist. Enjoy yourselves gentlemen.

Harlow are expected to include two players who each played twice for us in 1988. They are Dennis and David Greene who played in a Capital League Presidents Cup match at Gillingham, and a Capital League match versus Welling United at Lower Mead. We lost 3-1 at Gillingham, David scoring our only goal, but beat Welling 5-0 with Dennis getting a hat-trick and David scoring one of the other goals. When we visited Harlow in December, Dennis scored twice as Harlow beat us 3-0 to bring to an end our run of six successive wins. It was also to be the first of four consecutive games in which we failed to find the net!

Well our bid for promotion finally came to an end last Saturday when Windsor & Eton beat Tring Town 4-0, thereby picking up the three points they needed to clinch that last promotion place. On the same afternoon we extended our unbeaten run to 12 matches when we drew at Hornchurch (now 13 after Tuesday's game v Epsom), our longest sequence undefeated in the League since early in the 1983/84 season in the Conference. Then we were unbeaten in our last 6 league matches in the 1982/83 season and the first 11 of the 1983/84 season, a run of 17 undefeated league matches.

A look back to the current season's league table after the New Years Day matches had us in FIFTH place behind Leighton, Horsham, Windsor and East Thurrock. It's ironic that since then we have won 14, drawn 5 and lost only 2 yet have moved up just one place in the league table. Such has been the consistency of the top three clubs that, despite our impressive record during these 21 games, we have not been able to dislodge them from their lofty positions. They have surely deserved to go up this season. At least we are assured of fourth place after Tuesday's win against Epsom & Ewell.

Although we are all naturally disappointed that we weren't one of the 'lucky three' you've got to admit this has been our best season for ages. We've won more league matches (23) than we did in our 'double' season (20) and more than in any other season since 1981/82 when we won 32 in a 46 Southern League programme. Our 67 league, cup and friendly matches have produced 237 goals (average 3.53 per game) with most of them going in at the right end for a change. The entertainment provided has been most welcome after several seasons in the doldrums, and for this we have to thank Gordon, Leo, Frank and the players making our visits (with just a few exceptions) most enjoyable.

What of next season? Hopefully Gordon will be able to start the 1996/97 campaign with most of the squad he has assembled during the last few months plus a few new faces to replace those we have not seen or heard of in recent weeks. I feel sure that with Horsham, Leighton and Windsor out of the way we must have an excellent chance of making the 'top 3' next time round. No doubt there will be other teams who will fancy their chances e.g. Wingate & Finchley, Harlow and Northwood to name just three, but if we can match the consistency shown by this season's promoted clubs then we should get the result we all want. Although the League will be our obvious priority I would still like to see us make more effort to win one of the County Cups. Defeats against the likes of Feltham and Hanwell Town are extremely hard to accept. Incidentally, we shall be re-entering the London Senior Cup next season. Kingsbury reached this season's final so why can't we next season? We are already in the process of arranging next season's pre-season friendlies and news of two appear in 'Steve's Sector' elsewhere in this programme.

The format for next season's ICIS League Division Three is still undecided. At the moment it is down to 16 clubs with Harlow, Leighton and Windsor promoted, nobody coming down from Division Two, and Cove and Harefield resigning. The latest news is that Tring Town who have had problems recently have now resolved them and will definitely be in our division next season. There is a possibility that Braintree Town, Concord Rangers and Thatcham Town could also be taking part in Division Three. Braintree's application to switch from the Beazer Homes League will be heard by the F.A. next week. Concord Rangers, currently third in the Essex Senior League, have some work to do on their ground before they can satisfy the League's 'C' grading but they hope to achieve this. Thatcham Town, who are the present Jewson Wessex League leaders, may switch with Cove.

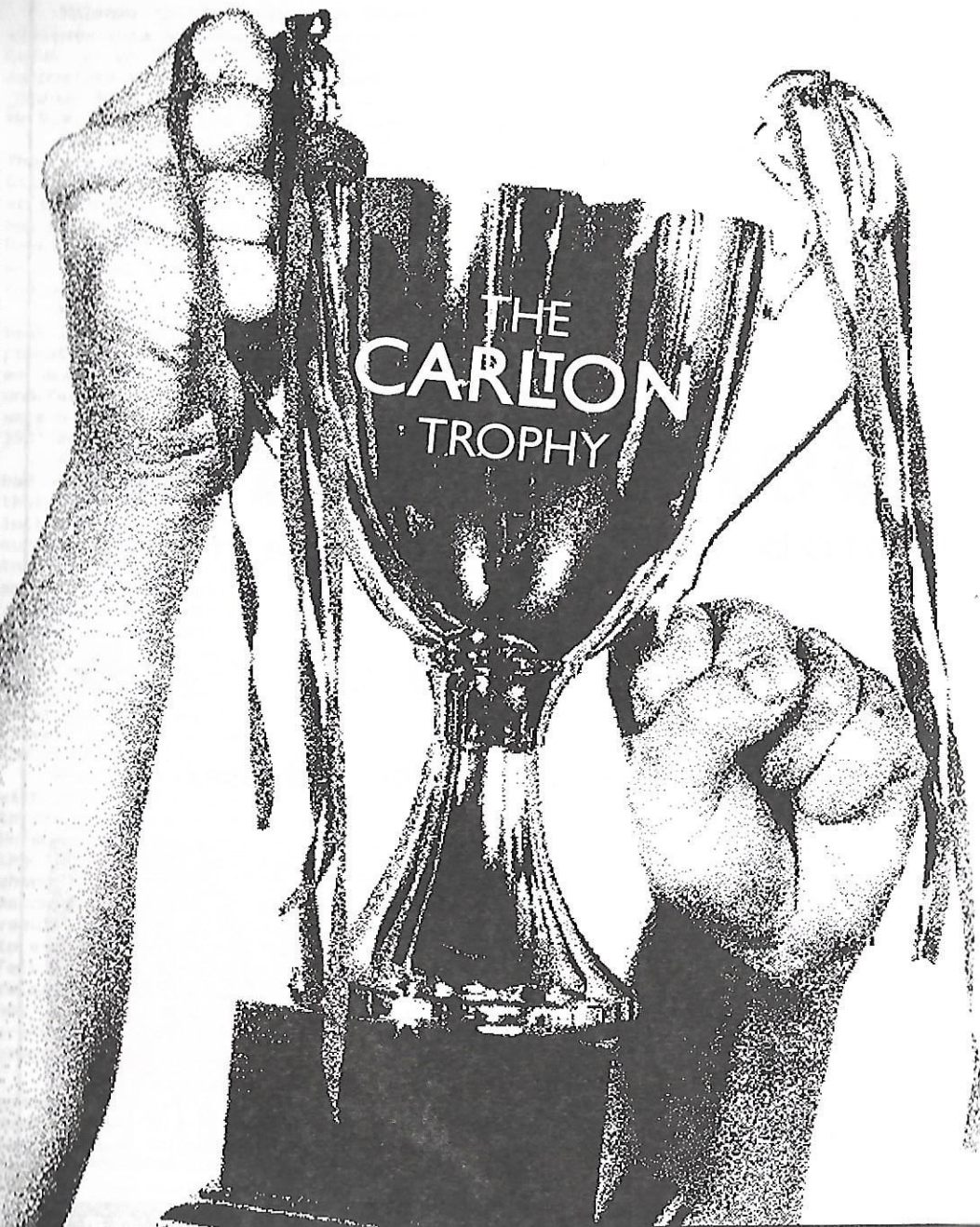

A REVIEW FROM THE TERRACES

Failure too hard a word - but what a disappointment!!!

Last August I wrote that "Fourth will be failure". Briefly, I felt that with a new proven management team, a reasonable budget and the best support in the division, a top three spot and promotion was a realistic proposition and in this context fourth would be "failure". Roy Couch, in his editorial capacity, added a postscript at the time saying that fourth would not reflect failure but disappointment. In reviewing this season (with three games to go and fourth spot looking likely), I have to say "failure" is too harsh a summary of events, and that Roy's "disappointment" is fairer and closer to the mark.

After an extraordinary 9-1 opening win on a sunbaked day at Cove some eight months ago we came down to earth fairly soon after - in October to be exact. One point from twelve in the last two weeks of that month saw us slide down the league, and although we recovered well to sit on the fringe of the promotion race we have never quite achieved the consistency needed to get in, and stay in, the top three. Perhaps Frank O'Brien's continual plea to "get closer" (tighter!) provides some of the answer as over 100 league goals scored is surely a commendable amount but maybe, on occasions, we have given the opposition too much room when they have had the ball. However, there have been some excellent league performances and, overall, the quality of football provided has been good, especially bearing in mind the state of some of the pitches we have had to play on (at this point I would congratulate the Edgware groundsman on the condition of their pitch throughout a difficult winter). Effort in the Cups rather flattered to deceive. Outstanding early wins against Grays Athletic (FA Cup) and Wivenhoe Town (Guardian Insurance Cup), both from higher divisions, and a 10-0 demolition of East Ham United in the FA Vase didn't really lead us anywhere and, later on, there were some indifferent displays in the County Cups which saw us make early and unsatisfactory exits against Feltham and Hanwell Town.

Chris Walton has surely won the 'Player of the Year' award with an effective mix of industry and skill, and perhaps the runner-up is Steve Croad, who has certainly made his presence felt and suggests that he doesn't suffer fools! Rob Tenkorang (no, I don't know the facts regarding his non appearances) has produced some excellent keeping, and both Lee Smart and Fergus Moore have taken the eye. Roy Marshall, Terry Hibbert, Ian Waugh and Lee Tekell have all made useful contributions, whilst up front Paul Sheldrick has clearly lead the way with over 30 goals, several of them extremely well taken, and yet, interestingly, he has been on the bench when many in the crowd have expected him to start. Steve Fraser and Lee Walker have also weighed in with some fine goals, and the latter mentioned certainly seems to enjoy the experience!

Off the field, the management team have probably suffered more than the fans as some vital points have slipped away, but Gordon Bartlett has still found time to smile in the heat of the battle and his programme notes indicate a balanced and honest appraisal when reviewing games played. The rest of his management team certainly display a commitment to the cause on match days judging by their contributions from the bench, whilst physio Alan Wharton has responded with great speed when players have been injured during a game (I have also noted that Alan is never slow to assist an opposing player when the situation arises and I believe he does the club great credit in this respect). Chairman Paul Rumens and his charming partner Lori scored their own big success with the arrival of Samuel, who I believe had his "footballing debut" at Edgware when we recently met Kingsbury Town. As the pressures mounted in the pursuit of vital league points, Vice-Chairman Nick Dugard told us to relax(!?) and Supporters Club Chairman Howard Kreis rightly emphasised the need for all supporters to control their behaviour irrespective of any disappointment. Steve Hibbert kept smiling and always found time to communicate, whilst Graham Smith, in a recent programme article, outlined the mundane but so vital jobs that have to be done week in week out by non paid volunteers to ensure that the club runs smoothly. And then, of course, there is the seemingly unflappable Kip Hewitt - a General Manager charged with leading our quest for a new home. I believe the chances are better than 50/50, but Kip has recently picked his words carefully (and quite rightly so). If the side just missed the top three, I believe Roy Couch, assisted by his brother Alan, compiles a programme that certainly reaches these heights when compared to the opposition (whilst on this subject, I am certainly impressed with the Northwood

HARLOW TOWN F.C.

Harlow Town Football Club were founded way back in 1879, playing their first match against Saffron Walden.

In the early years the club played in local leagues, mainly the Stansted & District and East Hearts League. In 1932 the club made it's first move towards becoming a senior club when it joined the Spartan League Division Two (East). After competing in this league for five years the club was granted senior status by the Essex County F.A. and the club competed in the F.A. Cup and the Essex Senior Cup for the first time. At this time Harlow had the smallest population of all the clubs competing in the Senior Cup: A far cry from today with a population of around 80,000.

The club did not play during the Second World War, re-forming in February 1946, they re-joined the Spartan League the following season. The club picked up it's first senior honour in the 1952-53 season, defeating Bletchley in the final of the Spartan League Division One Cup. In 1954-55 the club switched leagues, joining the more demanding London League. Six seasons was spent in this league, winning the League Cup in 1959-60.

In August 1960 the club moved grounds, away from their roots in the old town, moving into a new stadium at the Harlow Sportcentre. The improved facilities at the new ground brought a further switch in leagues for the start of the 1961-62 season, this time joining the Delphian League. After just two seasons in the Delphian League there became a massive restructuring of the non-league game with the Athenian League merging with both the Corinthian League and the Delphian League to create a new look three divisional Athenian League. Harlow

were placed in the bottom division (Division two), but won promotion at the first attempt, after finishing fourth.

Several season of mediocrity were spent before the club lifted it's first ever league championship in season 1971-72. The Athenian League Division One title was the prize and after just one season in the Premier Division the club were invited to join the expanding Isthmian League.

The first five seasons in the league were pretty uneventful but then things took off for the club in season 1978-79 under the guidance of manager Ian Wolstenholme. The Division One championship was won, a clear 14 points ahead of nearest rivals Harrow Borough. The club also made it's one and only appearance in the final of the Essex Senior Cup, defeating Tilbury 1-0 at Southend United's Roots Hall ground.

The following season, the first in the Premier Division, was dominated by an F.A.Cup run which saw the club go through from the preliminary round to the fourth round proper, defeating both Southend United and Leicester City along the way before bowing out in a pulsating fourth round tie at Vicarage Road, Watford. The home side eventually won 4-3 in front of the 'Match of the day' cameras, but not until we had given our hosts a scare or two, going in at the break 1-0 up. The cup run overshadowed our performance in the league, finishing in our highest ever placing of 11th. The next couple of seasons saw the club performing well in cup competitions, reaching the first round of the F.A.Cup in both season 1980-81 and season 1981-82, and

in both seasons the club reached the second round of the F.A.Trophy. However, league form was poor during this period and at the end of the 1981-82 season the club was relegated back to Division One. Manager Ian Wolstenholme resigned in March 1982, bringing to an end the most successful period the club has ever witnessed. Gwyn Walters took charge of the side and with a very young side lead the team to promotion back to the Premier Division at the first attempt, finishing as runners-up to Worthing.

A further two seasons were spent in the top flight before financial problems took the toll on the playing side as the club suffered successive relegations, finding themselves in Division Two (North) for the start of the 1986-87 season. The Division Two (North) title was won in season 1988-89, the East Anglian Cup was won in 1989-90, and the club reached the first round proper of the F.A.Cup for the first time in ten years in season 1991-92. However, the on the field success was overshadowed by the club's crippling financial position which had seen a proposed move to a new ground fall through, and at the end of the 1991-92 season the club were suspended from the league having had their Sportcentre ground closed in March 1992, playing their remaining home games at Bishop's Stortford, Stevenage and even Aveley.

The Isthmian League gave the club a year to sort out it's problems and at that stage it looked like the town would lose senior football. However, the club found a saviour and commenced playing football again in season 1993-94, albeit in Division Three, after being relegated two divisions by the league. In the club's first season back, promotion was missed by just one point.

HARLOW TOWN F.C. PLAYERS IN FOCUS

JEFF WOOD Goalkeeper - Now in his forty-second year but still playing as well as ever. Jeff originally made his Harlow debut in September 1975 before becoming a full time professional with Charlton Athletic in 1976. In an illustrious career Jeff has played all around the world, having collected honours in Finland, Malta, Hong Kong and Sweden. Returned to Harlow in September 1995 having spent last season with Erith & Belvedere in the Beazer Homes League.

DARREN HANCOCK Defence - A former England Schoolboy International who joined the club in March 1995 from Chesham United. A former Charlton Athletic junior who has played for GM Vauxhall Conference sides Welling United and Slough Town.

TONY COMERFORD Defence/Midfield - Joined the club in October 1995 from local Premier Division side Bishop's Stortford for who he made over 100 appearances. A local lad who has also played for Sawbridgeworth Town in the Essex Senior League.

DAMON SUNSHINE Defence - Another local lad, joining the club during the summer having gained previous experience with Bishop's Stortford, Ware, Saffron Walden Town and Witham.

MARTIN SEDGWICK Defence - Another player who has seen service at Bishop's Stortford before joining The Hawks during the summer. Martin has also played for Ware and is the latest Sedgwick to play for the club: his two uncles Eddie and Dickie having represented the club in the 1970's and 80's.

GARY DANCE Midfield - Manager Dave Greene's first signing when he took charge of the side in February 1995. A Local lad who has previous experience with Bishop's Stortford, Sawbridgeworth Town and Collier Row. Had previously made one substitute appearance for the club in the late 1980's.

IAN SMITH Midfield - Currently the club's longest serving player having joined in the summer of 1993 from Bishop's Stortford. A local player and a firm favourite with the fans, winning the supporters "Player of the Year" last season. Recently made his 100th appearances for the club.

PAUL SPURLING Midfield - Yet another local player, joining the club during the summer from Sawbridgeworth Town. Made his first team debut in October at East Thurrock, remaining in the first team squad ever since

NEIL MOORE Midfield - A local lad who is now in his second season with the club having made his debut on the opening day of the 1994-95 season. Neil has played in a variety of positions in his fifty-plus appearances for the club.

DAVE FEAREY Forward - Big strong centre-forward who joined the club during the summer months having spent last season with London Spartan League side St Margeretsbury. Has missed a lot of matches in the early part of the season due to injury and suspension.

DAVE GREENE Midfield/Forward - The club's Player/Manager who took over the job in February 1995. Although this is Dave's first managerial position he has a wealth of playing experience having represented, among other, Chelmsford City, Bishop's Stortford, Slough Town and most recently Woking. A local man who grew up in the Town and is looking to get Harlow back amongst the top sides in the ICIS League.

DENNIS GREENE Forward - Manager Dave's twin brother who joined the club in November 1995 from GM Vauxhall Conference side Dagenham & Redbridge. Dennis originally made his debut for Harlow in 1985 before embarking on a career which eventually took him to Wycombe Wanderers who he helped gain a place in the Football League in season 1992-93. Wycombe had paid his previous club Chelmsford City £15,000 for his services in February 1992. Dennis scored the winner on his return to the club and has since scored 28 goals in 29 appearances, including 11 in his last 6 games.

MANUEL LUQUE Defence - Signed in February 1996 from close neighbours Sawbridgeworth Town. A local lad who has also represented Bishop's Stortford.

SCOTT NIXON Midfield - Made a scoring debut in March after signing from Sawbridgeworth Town.

JOHN SCOTT Midfield - Another recent signing from local Essex Senior League side Sawbridgeworth Town. Also played for Bishop's Stortford for whom he won a Division One championship medal in 1994.

ANDY EDMUNDS Defence - Another recent signing joining the 'Hawks' from Bishop's Stortford. Made over 150 appearances for Bishop's Stortford after joining them from Enfield.

BEHIND THE SCENES

PETER GREENE Assistant Manager - Father of twins Dave and Dennis: Peter joined forces with his son Dave at the beginning of the season bringing with him a wealth of experience. In his playing days Peter played for Leyton, Dagenham, Bishop's Stortford and also had a short spell at Harlow. Peter also represented his country as an Amateur International and was a member of the British Olympic Team. Peter also played professionally in South Africa.

STEVE CAREY Coach - Another local man who joined the management team earlier this season. Steve gained experience in a career which saw him play for Charlton Athletic, Crystal Palace, Barking and Cambridge City. Steve is also registered as a player, but has yet to make an appearance.

MALCOLM RODDY Physiotherapist - Now in his third season as first team physio', having previously been involved with the club's reserve side. Took charge of first team affairs on a caretaker basis last season and remained unbeaten in his time in charge.

We named James Smith as our Man-of-the-Match and our team was Peter Last, James Low, Anish Patel, Tommy Lewis, Jamie Smale, Shane Enstone, James Kinsella, Stuart O'Niell, Mitchell Carter, Stevie Mileham and James Smith. Substitutes Neil Weaver, Aaron Hodgson and Andrew Patterson were not used.
