both clubs in recent years. Over the years Thame have proved to be a bogey team to us having won the last six matches between us. As if that wasn't bad enough, their forwards appear to have a liking for playing against us, as in those six games their goals for reads 4,4,4,4,3, & 4.

Last weekend we hopefully ended the jinx that Harlow Town have had over us for years when we won on their ground for the first time since Saturday, 8th September 1962. Yes it was 1962, the Non-League Paper got it wrong when they said 1966! Two Viv Evans goals had given us a 2-0 FA Cup win there all those years ago.

So what do we make of this season? A very good spell up to the New Year (helped no doubt by the fact that most of our league matches had been home games) was followed by a poor run of only 2 wins in 14 league games (10 of them away) from mid-February until early April. Our last three games have produced two wins and a draw and we naturally hope to avoid defeat today and in our final game next Saturday at Wivenhoe.

Overall I think we have done a lot better than we thought possible at the start of the season and hopefully we can continue to make further progress next season. The introduction of a Reserve Team this season to bridge the gap between our Youth teams and the first team has been a definite plus. I've been to more than half our youth games this season as well as watching the Reserves on several occasions. Many promising youngsters have been on view and if we can keep hold of them and continue with our Reserve side then the future on the playing side looks very good indeed. A lot of credit for this must go to Francis Joseph, Paul Lawrence and John Smith for the magnificent job they have done with the U/18's, U/19's and Reserves. Talking of the Reserves, if you are not going to Wivenhoe on Saturday for our final Ryman League match, why not pop along to Kingsbury Town FC to see the Reserves last game of the season against Chipstead, kick off 3.00pm.

We were hoping to gain our first ever home win over Northwood in a league match on Easter Monday, having failed on five previous occasions. Instead we had to settle for the fourth consecutive draw between us in the league here at Edgware but what a game it turned out to be. Four times we fell behind and four times we battled back to equalise, our final goal coming a minute from the end after Northwood had taken a 4-3 lead two minutes earlier. With the other results going Northwood's way the point they gained from this game was enough to ensure their promotion to the Premier Division for next season. However they still need a few more points to be declared league champions.

In the 18 seasons prior to this one only two players had scored 20 league goals in a season for us, Paul Sheldrick in 1995/96 and Keith Boreham in 1997/98. When Marvin Morgan scored our first goal on Monday he brought his total in the league this season to 20, joining Mick Swaysland who had reached this total back in February. This is the first time since we turned professional in 1971 that we have had two players each score 20 league goals in the same season. With the help of Roger Slater's excellent 'Wealdstone Football Club' book, I went back through our amateur days since 1945 and couldn't find a previous season where this feat had been achieved. When one considers all the great striking partnerships we've had during the last 50 or so years such as Dyke & Gaze, Mikrut & Wegryzk, Farrell & Evans, Duck & Byrne, Graves & Alan Cordice etc., it makes Marvin and Mick's achievement this season all the more remarkable. Congratulations to them both.

As many of you know by now this is my last programme as editor. I took over from Steve Marshall back in 1991 when we were groundsharing with Watford FC and I reckon I have now produced somewhere in the region of 350 issues in my 12 year stint. In recent years I have found the job far too time consuming so have now decided to call it a day and let someone else have a go. I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has contributed to the programme over the years and also thank those of you who have regularly purchased a copy. When I took over the programme cost 80p and, although the price has now almost doubled, I feel the content has improved dramatically and we now have one of the best programmes in the league. I do hope you agree.

Enjoy the summer break and I hope you will all return again next season and continue to purchase a programme.

## The walk to Oxford A Pantomime in 7 parts. by Wobs

The Cast: Trevor Davies as Lord TD, Pete Worby as Captain Wobs, Graham Jones as Graham "cabin boy" Jones, Steve Paull as Spaul, Paul Fruin as Buttons, Jon Smith as The Country Boy, Ray Kemp as Steven Spielberg, Doug Robinson as Nurse Deadly, Tony Short as Black Foot, Roge Slater as The Floating Chef



Scene 1: The cast assembled at 11.30 am on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> March at Newbold on Avon for a full dress rehearsal. Various costume changes were deposited by the canal bank together with Buttons' plentiful supply of provisions. Fortunately, both Captain Wobs and Dr Blues, anticipating food shortages brought along a fishing rod and kite respectively for hunting purposes.....

Steven Spielberg quoted "I'm not used to camcorders with dodgy instruction manuals. How can I work with this inferior equipment?"

The canal side setting, (opposite a sewage farm) was most pleasant (unlike Capt. Wobs' first of many trips to the toilet).

It backfired as bizarrely it was actually 7 miles before the lock was sighted. However, the breakfast cooked 2 hours earlier was still edible and suitably fortified the play resumed. The cast split up and the faster walkers including Dr Blues reached Fenny Compton by 4pm where they bravely entered The Wharf Inn and sample the local hospitality.

A touching tale (one of many) is heard from director Spielberg who as a young 13 year old was looked after by the older, wiser, experienced Black Foot and taken into local coffee bars after Wealdstone home matches. Later on the crew settled down to another disturbed nights sleep - no thanks to Dr Blues' incoherent ramblings about the landlords wife and nonsensical country boys/city boys debate (with himself).

## MANAGER'S VIEW

Good afternoon and welcome to our last home game of the season against Thame United. They have managed to put four goals past us in five of our previous six meetings so we need to change some history today. After our first win at Harlow since 1962 only last week I look forward to putting the record straight today as well.

I can't believe how quickly the season has flown by this year, especially when you think about the dreadful string of results since the New Year. You normally find things tend to drag when things go wrong but that's not been the case this year because we always believed we had the ability to come through. The spirit has never wavered and I am confident the difficult times we've experienced this season will stand us in good stead for next year.

As I reflect on this rather roller coaster campaign I know the club are once again in a far better and stronger position than this time last year. We started the season with a totally new look side and additions to our management team. We introduced a reserve side for the first time in years and added another 15 or so boys into our U/19 PASE scheme.

Today we can look with pride that our young side have produced some excellent performances and hopefully will finish in the top eight and that despite an incredible number of injuries which ruined our season just after Christmas. Not only have many of the Reserve players come into the first team but their run of positive results has continued which now leaves them with an outside chance of promotion in their first season. Both Youth sides have developed well as the season has progressed and our recent link up with Stanmore College is a major boost to the development of our youth set-up. Add all those positive aspects to the major news that the work on the new stadium will start in May and I'm sure you can understand why I am so excited about the future.

We have focused our attention on building solid foundations for the future and I believe we are now on the verge of something very special. It's a general attitude in this country that some supporters and the press like to dwell and highlight on the negative. Well our circumstances this season is no different because too many people have whinged and moaned about results without really looking at the larger picture and the reasons for our change of fortunes in the second half of the season. Yes, we are all disappointed but I have been amazed at some of the comments I have seen or heard this season.

On reflection I think most of us would have been delighted if we had achieved over 70 points at the start of the season and only had one player departing. If we can keep most of the players and add one or two during the summer who knows what next season could bring us.

With so many changes lined up it's important to have a good season next year and promotion looks like being a top eight finish. How many clubs will really be having a go for it next year? I suspect lots. Who will be in our division? Will it still be North and South or maybe East and West next season. Who is coming down from the Premier? With two northern sides up from Division Two and a lot of northern sides struggling in the Premier it could mean the likes of Marlow, Slough, Uxbridge or Yeading could move over. We will just have to wait and see what the future holds and who we'll be playing.

Despite my positive thoughts about the future we do have one problem at the moment and that's with a venue for our Reserve games. Kingsbury Town FC are having a Reserve side themselves next season which leaves us without a home. Frantic phone calls and meetings are now in progress and we hope we can overcome yet another problem before moving into our own home the following season. Any suggestions gratefully received because we don't want to lose the Reserves after such a promising first season.

By today we will probably be saying congratulations to both Northwood and Hornchurch although I hope we will have beaten the eventual champions on Easter Monday. At the time of writing I am very confident we can do it now we have most of our players back from injury. I can't deny that if those two do get promoted they will thoroughly deserve it, especially Northwood whose consistency has been incredible this season. Their workrate and desire not to lose is a valuable lesson if we want to achieve success next season. As for Hornchurch.... well it would just be nice to have that much money to buy success but I do wonder how long it will last.

Well it just leaves me to say a few thankyou's to Leo, Toni, Fred, Richard, Ricky,

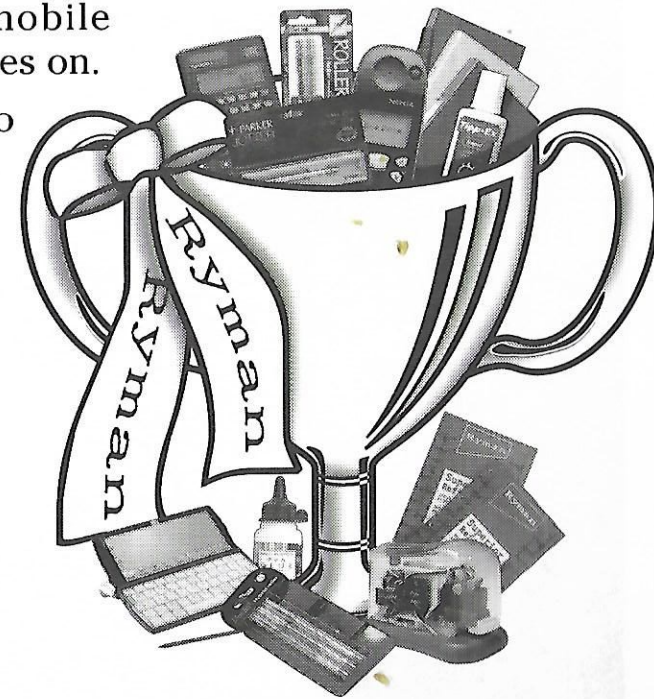

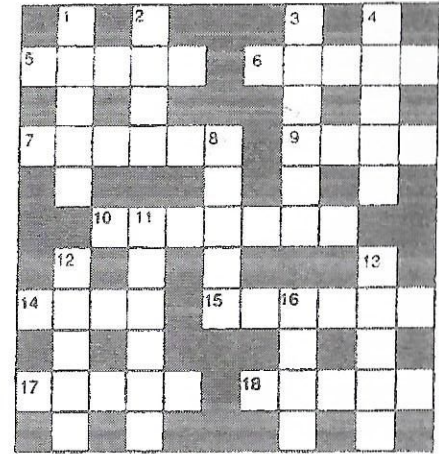

# TODAY'S OPPONENTS

By ROY COUCH

## A BRIEF HISTORY OF THAME UNITED F.C.

The Club was formed in 1883 making it one of Oxfordshire's oldest clubs. Its early years were spent in Oxfordshire Leagues and in 1906, 1909 and 1910 Thame won the Oxfordshire Senior Cup and the Senior League in 1907, 1908, 1910, 1930 and 1931. A switch to the Hellenic League then brought further success culminating in the Hellenic League title in 1961-62 and 1969-70, as well as being runners up in 1960-61, 1976-77 and 1980-81. The Oxfordshire Senior Cup was won in both 1976 and 1981 but a poor spell in the mid eighties preceded a crossing of the pyramid in 1988-89 to join the South Midlands League.

The Club finished runners up in both 1988-89 and 1989-90 before eventually winning the title in 1990-91. The Club received the green light to join the Diadora League in 1991/92.

The first season was relatively successful finishing in 8th place and also reaching the 2nd preliminary round of the FA Cup before losing to Salisbury. In 1992-93 the Club gained its sought after promotion by finishing runners up to all conquering Aldershot Town as well as beating Banbury United 2-1 in the final of the Oxfordshire Senior Cup to win the Cup for the fifth time.

1993-94 was also a reasonably successful year for the Club, finishing in 6th place in their first season in the Diadora Division Two as well as reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase before falling to Whitehawk by 3-2 in a match that could have gone either way.

1994-95 was perhaps the best year in the Club's history. The new facilities transformed Windmill Road into one of the top grounds in the Diadora League and on the field the Club went from strength to strength, winning the Division 2 Championship with 93 points - an 11 point margin.

In 1995/96 we reached the 3rd Round Qualifying in the FA Cup and the FA Trophy. In the league we finished a creditable 13th in our first ever season in the Isthmian League Division One. In the Oxfordshire Senior Cup we progressed to the final to play Oxford City but lost 2-1.

During June of 1997 Mr Andy Sinnott was appointed as first team manager. Andy had a very difficult 1997/98 season running on a dramatically reduced budget and it was no surprise when we were relegated into Ryman Division Two.

1998/99 season was totally different - all credit goes to Andy and all the players for bouncing straight back into Ryman Division One and for also putting together a memorable FA Vase run reaching the semi-finals.

1999/2000 saw the Club come within two points of achieving promotion to the Premier Division and off the field the Club erected a further covered stand, new turnstiles and achieved an 'A' grading helping to further their ambitions.

2000/2001 season the team lead the way for most of the season, putting together a club record of 12 consecutive league wins but a slump in form in the latter part of the season saw us finish in 5<sup>th</sup> place. A 3 - 1 win against Banbury United in the Oxfordshire Senior Cup ensured we finished up with some silverware and made up for some of the disappointment of missing out on promotion.

We finished mid table in 2001/2002 season but for the first time in the Club's history we retained the Oxfordshire Senior Cup after a 4-3 win over North Leigh played at the new Kassam Stadium in front of over a 1,000 spectators.

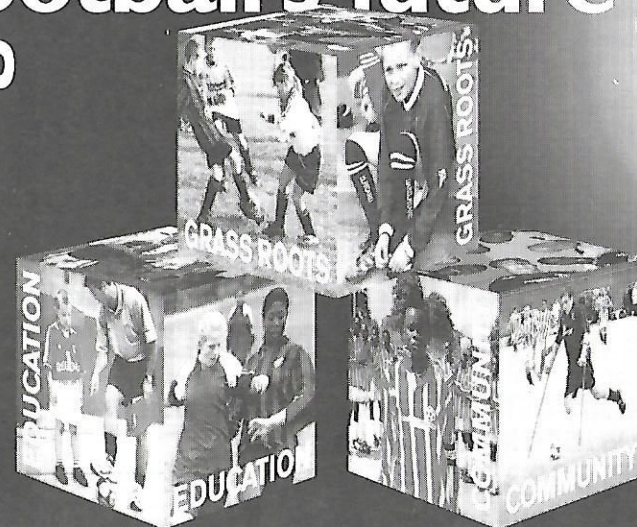

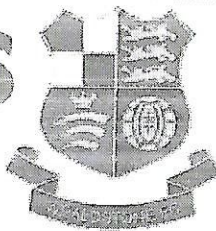
