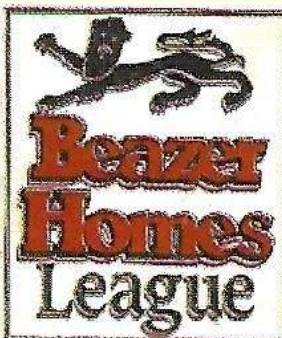

EDITOR'S NOTES



GOOD EVENING, welcome to The Warren for our first home league match of the 1994/95 season. For the third season in succession we are entertaining MARGATE right at the start of the league campaign. In 1991/93 the Kent club were our first opponents in the league at Vicarage Road and they won by four goals to one. Last season they were the second team, Canterbury were the first, to play us here in the Beazer Homes League winning on that occasion by three goals to one.

This season marks the 10th Anniversary of our famous "double" in 1984/85 when we won the GM Vauxhall Conference (known then as the Gola League) and F.A. Trophy. Since then we have had very little to cheer about, having failed to finish higher than tenth in the league, and being relegated twice, in the succeeding nine seasons. What has this season in store for us? Only time will tell but rest assured Fred and Steve are doing all in their power to make us one of the best sides in the division. Several new faces have joined us and we hope they will have a successful season. Others who might have been an asset to the Club have not fancied the long distances we have to travel to some of our away matches and have opted to join Diadora League clubs instead.

Last season we played in just four pre-season friendlies and were ill prepared for the league programme ahead. As a result we started with five successive league defeats and also lost at Harrow Borough in the F.A. Cup. This season we have had eight pre-season matches which have given Fred and Steve the opportunity to see 37 players in action. The four-team Arlington Gold Cup tournament at Aldershot Town, played over the weekend of 6th/7th August was well organised and gave us a valuable workout. On the Saturday afternoon we were beaten 2-0 by Farnborough Town of the GM Vauxhall Conference. In the evening the hosts, Aldershot Town, scrambled to a 1-0 win over Camberley Town. The following day we met Camberley in the play-off to decide 3rd/4th place. Francis Joseph gave us the lead in the 8th minute when he headed home Mark Wilson's cross and we held this advantage right up until the final minute. With only seconds remaining Tony Dixon scored to make it 1-1 and take the match into a penalty shoot-out. Although our first penalty, taken by Tommy Mason, was saved Lance Pedlar, Mark Hill, Vic Schwartz and Francis Joseph all scored to give us third place 4-2 on penalties. Barry Gartell saved Camberley's first and fourth penalty kicks. In the evening Aldershot met Farnborough in the final and Farnborough, who had played their first eleven against us, upset the Aldershot officials by playing only reserves and youth team players. Nevertheless they made Aldershot fight all the way and might well have won had they taken their chances. After 90 minutes the scores were level at 1-1 so extra time was played but no further goals were scored. Much to the delight of their fans Aldershot won the penalty shoot-out 4-2 thereby winning the Arlington Gold Cup. Although we failed to reach the final the Aldershot directors were full of praise for the immaculate state in which our players had left the dressing room after our matches.

Layne Patterson is hoping to arrange a similar four-team pre-season tournament in the Harrow area next August. He has approached Harrow Borough, Edgware Town and Rayners Lane and if they are interested a meeting between the four clubs will be arranged to discuss the proposed tournament. This sort of event adds a bit more interest to pre-season friendlies.

After our goal spree at Viking Sports our finishing in our final pre-season friendly against Rayners Lane was most disappointing to say the least. If we are to win matches in the season ahead we mustn't waste scoring opportunities such as we did in that match. Let's hope our forwards got their shots on target at Fareham and came away with a good result.

Have you entered the Stones Predict-A-Score competition yet? It's still not too late to

Next Saturday 27th August we make an early start in this season's F.A. Cup competition when we visit Tring Town of the Diadora League (Division Three). This Preliminary Round tie kicks off at 3.00pm and Tring's ground is in Cow Lane which is on the right hand side of the old A41 as you approach Tring from the Hemel Hempstead direction. The fact that we start in the Preliminary Round set me wondering when was the last time we started this early. I was surprised to discover that it was only two seasons ago when we entertained Iiptree United at Vicarage Road and won by two goals to one. Should we draw at Tring the replay will be here at The Warren on Wednesday 31st August, kick off 7.45pm. Admission prices will be £3.50 for Adults and £2.50 for Senior Citizens and Under 14's. Before this possible replay we travel to Baldock Town on Bank Holiday Monday 29th August for a Beazer Homes League match. Please note that this match will start at 3.00pm.

MARGATE CLUB HISTORY

Margate F.C. was formed in 1896. They played at various grounds, including Northdown Road and Margate College. They joined the Kent League in 1911/2 and after the Great War turned professional, using grounds at Dreamland Amusement Park and Garlinge. They were Kent League runners up in 1927/8, however, heavy debts caused the club to close down at the end of that season. The club was reformed in 1929 and moved to the new Hartsdown Park ground. The club then began its fine run in the F.A. Cup, which includes victories over Gillingham, Q.P.R., Crystal Palace, Bournemouth and Swansea City. Having won the Kent League in 1932/3, they joined the Southern League and were runners up in their first season. Margate became the nursery club to Arsenal in 1934, with many Arsenal players coming to Margate; they even played a home F.A. Cup tie at Highbury. This was the club's most successful period. In 1935/6, Margate reached the F.A. Cup 3rd Round, losing 1-3 to Blackpool. In that season they were overall Southern League and Southern League Central Section champions, Kent Senior Cup, Kent Senior Shield and Kent League Cup winners. The following season, they won the Southern League Midweek Section, but heavy costs saw the club return to the Kent League in 1937/8 where they finished as champions. Continuing heavy debts and the end of the Arsenal nursery arrangement caused the club to close down. Margate F.C. was reformed for the 1939/40 season, but war broke out again, however, they were reformed again after the war. Many honours were won in the 'Kent League Days', including the 'double' in 1947/8. Most of this success was under the management of Almer Hall, the former Brighton, Spurs and West Ham player, who was manager from 1950 until 1970. Having played in Amber & Black for many years, the club changed to Blue & White in the early 1950's. In 1959 Margate joined the expanding Southern League, again. In 1961 there was a sensational 3-0 win in the F.A. Cup 1st Round at Bournemouth, who, until then, were unbeaten at home in Division Three. Margate were Division One champions in 1962/3, but were relegated in 1965/6, returning as runners up the following season. The Southern League Cup was won in 1967/8, beating neighbours Ramsgate in a replay. They were also runners up in this competition in 1962 and 1975. In 1971 Bournemouth exacted revenge in the F.A. Cup beating Margate 11-0 at Deans Court, with Ted McDougall scoring a record 9 goals. The following season Margate reached the 3rd Round again, losing 0-6 at home to Spurs, before a record crowd of 14,500. Relegation was suffered in 1976/7, promotion as champions of Division One South followed, but the following season relegation again. In 1981, the club changed its name to Thanet United, hoping to attract sponsorship from a wider area. They finished bottom of the league in their first season and struggled to avoid relegation in the following two seasons. Promotion was narrowly missed in 1984/5, while in 1987/8 Thanet finished 5th. They again struggled in 1988/9 towards the end of which a new Board of Directors was appointed and the following season Thanet reverted to its more familiar name of Margate F.C. under a firm financial footing, hoping to see a return to the success of the 60's. This happened in 1993/4, under the leadership of Andy Woolford and Mark Weatherly when they beat Dover Athletic 2-1 to win the Facit Kent Senior Cup for the fourth time. Over 40 players have joined league clubs from Margate, culminating in March 1993 when Martin Buglione was transferred to St. Johnstone for a record club fee.

BILL ROFFEY (Player Manager) - Returned to Hartsdown this summer as manager, following a spell in charge of Canterbury City. As a player, he made over 400 League apps. for C.Palace, Orient, Brentford and Millwall. Spent 3 years in Portugal with Leixoes, before retiring from senior football, making a come-back with Margate in 91/2 and spending the last two seasons with Canterbury.

ANDY WOOLFORD (Coach) - Appointed joint manager in February 1993. Formerly a player with the club, he was also with Gillingham, Canterbury, Ramsgate, Chatham, Faversham and Sheppey, where he also coached. He was later manager of Faversham, assistant and caretaker manager of Sittingbourne and assistant manager of Tonbridge.

ANDY ALLON (Defender) - Signed at the end of March 1992 from Hythe. Formerly with Folkestone Town (3 spells), Dover Athletic and Ashford Town. Now 26 years old, he made his Southern League debut for Folkestone at the age of 14.

BOB BOLDER (Goalkeeper) - Signed from Charlton Athletic in July 1994. Started out with Deal, then Dover before moving to Sheffield Wednesday in 1977. After subsequent transfers to Liverpool and Sunderland he joined Charlton in 1986.

STEVE CUGGY (Forward) - Signed at the start of September 1993 for a club record fee, from Dover Athletic. Formerly a trainee with Sunderland, he has also played for Blyth Spartans and Maidstone United (13 League apps.)

JASON EEDE (Midfielder) - Signed in February 1994 from Sittingbourne. He was formerly with Lordswood, Gillingham and Gravesend.

JASON FENTON (Defender) - Signed February 1993 from Canterbury City. Formerly with Aylesford Paper Mills and Sittingbourne.

IVAN HAINES (Defender) - Began his career with Gillingham (51 League apps.). Joined Margate during the summer of 1993, after two seasons with Sittingbourne.

PHIL HANDFORD (Midfielder) - Signed March 1993 from Erith & Belvedere. A very experienced player, he made 48 League apps. for Gillingham, Wimbledon and Crewe Alexandra. He later played in the GMVC for Maidstone United and Welling United, before Sittingbourne paid £15,000 for him early in the 91/2 season.

PAUL HILL (Forward) - Ex Ramsgate on trial for pre-season friendlies.

LUKE HILLS (Goalkeeper) - Risen through the Youth Team, making his 1st team debut at Bury Town last season.

MATTHEW LEMIONE (Midfielder) - Signed March 1993 from Aylesford Paper Mills of the Kent County League.

PAUL MANNING (Midfielder) - Member of Millwall's F.A. Youth Cup winning team before joining Slough in November, 1993, after spells on loan to both Farnborough and Slough.

DANNY OWEN (Midfielder) - Released by Millwall at the end of last season, and persuaded by Bill Roffey to come for trials at Margate.

PAUL UNDERWOOD (Forward) - Originally Gillingham, Gravesend and Corinthian before becoming Margate's top scorer (26 goals) in 1990/1. Sold to Fisher '91/2 for a then record fee, but returned on loan later. In 1992/3 had a brief spell with Gravesend, before joining Canterbury City (top scorer). 1993/4 was spent in Portugal with 2nd Division side Varzim.

DARREN WALMSLEY (Forward) - Formerly a Margate Youth team member, before being loaned out to various clubs last season.

MARK WEATHERLY (Defender) - Began with Canterbury City, before joining Gillingham and making over 500 apps. between 74/5 and 88/9. After 1½ seasons with Hythe Town, he joined Margate in March 1991. After a spell as caretaker manager in November 1991, he took over as manager early in 92/3 (won Manager of the Month award), later sharing the role with Andy Woolford. Stepped down at the end of last season to concentrate on coaching.

This surely has to be one of the most important seasons in Wealdstone's history. Certainly, there has been far more close season activity surrounding the club than for many a year and interest is at a high level as we await crunchtime on the pitch. To put things in perspective it is worth remembering that just four months ago we were still awaiting the outcome of our court action, with the price of failure being almost certain extinction. We also had an appalling season, the worst in the history of the club, and finished second bottom. As I said in the last home programme in April, we should NEVER forget just how close we came to being relegated and but for the withdrawal of Dunstable and Canterbury we would now be facing an undreamt of status in the game. Since then however, our fortunes have taken a turn for the better. A successful conclusion to the court actions have produced a sum of money that, subject to a peaceful and sensible settlement to our domestic squabble, ought to be enough to secure our long term future. We've got a board of supporters who are totally committed to success and are slowly turning things around off the pitch. On the playing front, we have finally been able to give a manager the time and resources to encourage better players to the club. And, of course, we still have a loyal band of supporters who will back the players one hundred and ten percent home and away as long as they get as much in return. One only has to look back to the amazing scenes at Weymouth on the last day of the season to realise the importance of that support. What would it have been like if we had actually won something? So now, with things heading in the right direction off the pitch, we're all praying that we can have a real go at matters on the field itself. We've seen a lot of players in pre-season and a lot of encouraging football as well. Now let's hope Fred and Steve have got the eighteen or so quality players we need and that everyone is committed to giving it a go. It's been a long wait for some success chaps.

Couldn't argue with the World Cup could we? Loads of good games, positive football, plenty of goals (were you watching George Graham?) and worthy winners in Brazil, although the Italians couldn't resist reverting to their negative type in the final. My £30 went down the drain when Baggio got Italy out of jail against Nigeria and to this day I am totally convinced the 'Super Eagles' would have gone on to reach the Final if they'd held on for that extra minute and a half. They had loads more in reserve and players like Okocha and Yekini would really have been allowed to play with a lot more adventure against Spain and then Bulgaria. In the end though injuries, forcing the withdrawal of Amokachi and Amunike the goalscorer, probably made the difference. It was a great chance wasted as far as Nigeria were concerned and you wonder whether they will come again? The Irish? Well, the first game was truly magnificent and the pub I was in at Notting Hill Gate was probably similar to many thousands more around the country that night. Jam-packed and delirious would be my description. After that, I'm afraid uncle Jack made a bit of a pig's ear of the whole affair. His constant moaning and whingeing about the heat, the water and the officials must have had a psychological effect on his players. When you're in there against better teams you want to know all about how you can win, not how many reasons you can find for getting beaten. In the end, all the water in Lake Michigan wouldn't have stopped Pat Bonner letting in the second goal against Holland! A blooming good World Cup then and certainly not devalued in any way by England's absence, but then only the English thought it would be!

One legacy of the World Cup that worries me intensely are the new directives that have allegedly been given to referees regarding offsides against non-interfering players. I've seen absolutely no evidence so far of non-league linesmen allowing the attacking sides the advantage as they

push forward whilst other colleagues return from a previous attack. Without exception, players who have run through to challenge goalkeepers and are then on their way back after the clearance is made have then been flagged offside as the ball is knocked back for someone else to run on to from an onside position. Romario and Bebeto were allowed the advantage many times but how many times will players at our level be allowed the new freedom and what if they are occasionally? There'll be absolute pandemonium as referee's are surrounded by angry players. Once again, the FA will have to take the blame for confusion at the laws of the game. There has been so little publicity about the new law variations, other than what we saw in the World Cup, that most supporters are totally oblivious to them. Maybe Steve Hibberd could enlighten us all on what guidance referees and linesmen have been given, if any, regarding the interpretation. All I know is that having seen our first eight friendlies, there was no discernible difference. Answers on a postcard please!

Prediction time again. Didn't do to badly last time around with Gravesend and Sudbury in my frame. Kettering let me down in the Conference but I'll go for them again this year. Rushden and Cheltenham to slug out the Premier, whilst we challenge Witney and Waterlooville for Southern honours. Arsenal, Derby, Bradford and Doncaster for the top leagues. In the cups, Newcastle for the FA, Forest for the Coca-Cola and Kidderminster for the Trophy. Happy days.

AMENDMENT TO LAW III - NUMBER OF PLAYERS

FIFA has amended the above Law and this will effect the Beazer Homes League this season.

Law III(2)(b) and (c) identify that the Rules of a League or Competition shall state how many (if any) substitutes (0 to 5) may be nominated/designated and how many (0 to 2) may be used. In the Beazer Homes League this figure is 2.

New section (d) states that "Notwithstanding the limitation imposed in (c), a team may also use a third substitute provided that he is designated as a substitute goalkeeper, who may be used to replace only the goalkeeper", and as part of the Laws of the Game (not merely a League or Competition Rule) it permits a team to use a designated substitute goalkeeper additionally to the number of substitutes allowed in the League or Competition Rules (if any), ie: it offers a fundamental right to any team to use, if it wishes, a designated substitute goalkeeper.

FIFA has confirmed that this part of Law III (ie:(2)(d) "is intended to be mandatory. Accordingly, a substitute goalkeeper is permitted in addition to whatever number of substitutes is authorised by the Competition Rules".

The principle is that, apart from any substitutes allowed by League or Competition Rules, any team should always have the opportunity of replacing the person in the position of goalkeeper with another designated goalkeeper and not be disadvantaged by injury to the goalkeeper or by not being able to replace him for tactical reasons.

Furthermore, a goalkeeper ordered off the the field may also be substituted in this way. The second paragraph of Law III(2)(d) allows this provided the substitute goalkeeper replaces another player of the same team, to play as goalkeeper.

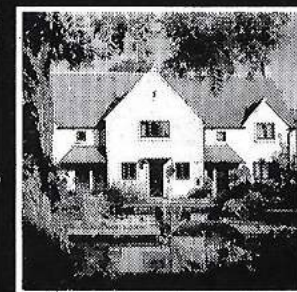
