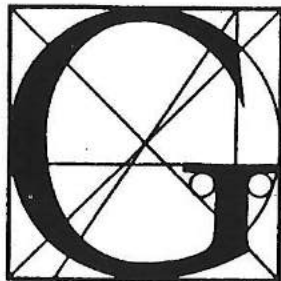

MANAGER'S REPORT

GOOD AFTERNOON to you all and welcome to our final home league match of the 1996/97 season. Today we welcome the players (especially former Stone, Graham Meakin), officials and supporters of Epsom & Ewell FC and trust they will have a pleasant few hours in our company followed by a safe journey home. This welcome is also extended to the 'third team' here today, namely our referee Mr Allen and his assistants Mr Durston and Mr Yeo. Hope you too enjoy your time with us.

Well we've finally achieved our number one target of promotion to Division Two despite our recent jitters, and subsequent defeats, at home to two of the other promotion hopefuls Harlow and Northwood. After losing to Northwood we still needed three points to go up. However, the very next evening dear old Flackwell Heath did us a great favour by beating Harlow 3-1 and so we were assured of promotion without having to kick another ball in anger. Having secured promotion we were hoping for a return to winning form at Kingsbury last weekend but it wasn't to be. A repeat of last season's goalless draw at Silver Jubilee Park meant that we failed to find the net for the third game in a row. Fortunately Braintree also drew 0-0 so we are still clinging on to top spot by the narrowest of margins.

However, congratulations to Gordon, Leo, Frank and the players on gaining promotion in only our second season back in the Isthmian League and we now look forward to the challenge that lies ahead in Division Two. When our management trio joined us in the summer of 1995 we had just transferred across the Pyramid from the Southern League. They were faced with the unenviable task of completely rebuilding the side as only three of that Southern League side, Rod Brathwaite, Marvin Hall and John Shanahan, were still with us when we began the 1995/96 league programme. Within four months they too had all departed to new clubs. A very good end to that season saw us just miss out on promotion at the first attempt when we finished in fourth place. Everyone at the Club was hopeful that this season we would go one better and we have done just that. Now we must aim to go up as champions. At the moment we still require three more wins from our last four games if we are to finish top and no doubt the players will do their best to achieve this.

Since Gordon and Leo joined us we have played (prior to Thursday's match at Leatherhead) 130 league, cup and friendly matches, winning 83, drawing 16 and losing 31. We have scored 305 goals in those matches and conceded 141. Including the current squad, Gordon and Leo have given 129 players (73 last season plus another 56 new faces this season) at least one chance to show what they are capable of, mainly in friendlies. One of these, Fergus Moore, is now about to make his 100th League & Cup appearance for us. If he played at Leatherhead on Thursday he will now have completed 99!

We trust that the 'lucky 14' selected to play this afternoon will give us the win all Stones supporters will be hoping for. Our visitors will be looking to avenge the 3-2 defeat they suffered when we visited them back in December, so we will have to play a lot better than we did in our last two home games. Like us, they are currently ground sharing, at Banstead Athletic FC, and they too hope to have a home of their own in due course. Epsom & Ewell were one of my tips to be involved in the promotion race this season but they have struggled to string a good run of results together and find themselves at the wrong end of the table. They did win five successive league matches during the December-February period but then lost the next six! Saturday's home win against Hertford was their first for nine matches. Our most recent signing, Stuart Miller, who joined us from the Surrey club will, no doubt, be hoping to score a goal or two against them this afternoon. We could certainly do with a few goals at the moment Stuart!

Although this will be our last match here this season (unless we draw at Leatherhead on Thursday) we do still have visits to Harlow, Clapton and Northwood to come. Your support at these games will be much appreciated by our players.

Finally, my thanks to Gordon Bartlett, Layne Patterson, Graham Sharpe, Howard Kraiss and Michael Vincent who have supplied copy for most, if not all, of our programmes this season. And thank you to all of you who have regularly bought a copy, I hope you've found them interesting.

Enjoy the summer break and we hope to see you all back for next season's assault on top three place in Division Two.

ROY COUCH (Editor)

Good afternoon and welcome to this afternoon's ICIS League game against Epsom & Ewell. These are my last programme notes of the season and I was looking forward to thanking everyone for all their hard work over a very successful season. Well, how things can change in a few weeks of football. As we travelled to meet Southall recently we had only dropped 8 points from 23 games and we were all confident the title was only a matter of time. How wrong you can be! 5 games later and we have dropped another 10 points with performances more in line with relegation candidates than championship contenders. Our 13 point lead at the top has been reduced to just one and Braintree certainly look to have the easier run-in.

It could have been so different against Harlow in the first half because we were comfortably the better side but we had four moments during that 45 minutes that affected so much. Bomber's mistake for the goal, Terry's hamstring injury, Stuart going round the goalkeeper and hitting the post, and then Ian Waugh being sent off before half-time. I think you would normally consider yourself unlucky if two of those incidents happened in 45 minutes, let alone four. Our second half display was awful and in the end we were fortunate to only lose 2-0. The Northwood match was very disappointing because I felt they outfought us and showed more desire to win. That coming from a team I had watched five times this year and felt had played some great football but looked a bit on the frail side. What did that make us on Tuesday?

The obvious question is why? I had put a lot of it down to pressure, but once we had achieved promotion last week I was sure that would lift the tension and we would be back to playing our passing game against Kingsbury last Saturday. Wrong! All we saw was another poor performance, particularly in the first half. Poor defending from the team, coupled with a lack of desire to score goals, left us scratching our heads as to the reason for this dreadful dip in form. Same players, same system... different results. Basically there is no excuse and we must work harder on and off the pitch in order to change the situation. That first goal is vital at the moment. We are still in the driving seat and still have a game in hand. It's a great position to be in but I must confess that judging by our current form the three wins we require for the title will certainly be a tall order.

I recently mentioned to the players that they had the opportunity of four great feelings from the games they had left this season. Promotion, reaching a Cup final, the Championship, and finally winning the Final. The first emotion was missed because of our losses against Harlow and Northwood, with promotion being achieved without kicking a ball. These notes are being written after the Kingsbury game so I don't know if we have achieved the semi-final win at Leatherhead. If we have, I know we will have played very well, because I was most impressed by Leatherhead when I watched them recently. As for the other two... we live in hope we can recapture that form of earlier in the season so that we can enjoy the 'buzz' of actually winning something.

I also remember saying in the dressing room that I hope the Braintree performance was not a 'one off'. Well eight league games later and I'm starting to think it was. So come on lads, in our last home game, prove to me and everyone else that it's not the case. Come out today and produce the type of performance that we can all remember during the close season until we come back here as a Division Two club in August. Obviously I cannot hide my disappointment as to our recent results, but that's only because of the standards that this same group of players achieved earlier in the season. We have heaped praise on them for most of the season and now they must accept some criticism and make every effort to turn the situation round.

It's amazing that despite being in the same week as gaining promotion, a poor performance really affects your weekend. These notes are being written at 5.30 on Sunday morning because I can't sleep trying to find some answers. It ruins the whole weekend... week in fact... second thoughts, it affects your whole way of life. It has even affected my two children recently. Both have been ringing up immediately after games and have ended up in floods of tears after both the Harlow and Northwood results. In fact it was Craig, my 6 year old, who phoned Flackwell Heath last week and enthusiastically told me of our promotion whilst I was sitting on the loo! Some way to celebrate!

Overall it's been a great season so let's not blow it now. We've had some excellent personal performances as well as good team displays, and I think 'Megaphone Mick' was

right in his recent programme notes when he mentioned so many players who are in contention for the 'Player of the Year' award.

To have a successful season I would like to thank those people around the club who you don't see putting on a shirt and performing for 90 minutes but contribute greatly towards the smooth running of both the club and team. Obviously a huge thankyou goes to my two management colleagues, Frank and Leo, for the continued hard work and commitment to the cause. Their enthusiasm, support and knowledge have been a major factor in the improvement we have shown this season. Also Alan our physio for his hard work, especially the extra nights he puts in! Then there is Pauline and Graham (kit), Layne (in addition to his duties, lots of running around signing players etc.), Joe (boardroom and assistant physio), Committee (general support given to the management and players), Peter (conscientious groundsman who has done a very good job), 'Mixer' (gatemanager), Roger (PA humour with the records played - some excellent, for his reports from his scouting missions, thanks Roger), Roy (excellent programme despite making me write programme notes!), and his brother Alan (for all sorts of tasks).

I felt your efforts against both Harlow and Northwood were a credit to you all, especially when the side had not performed. 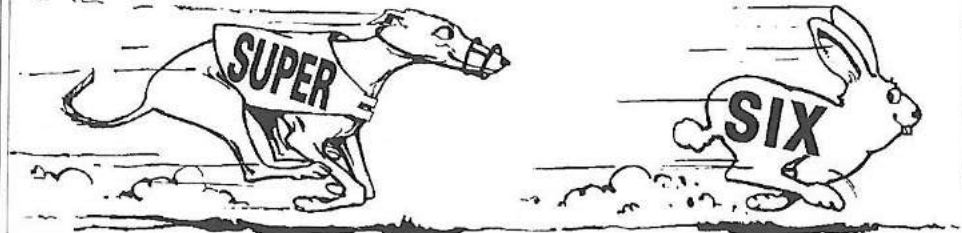

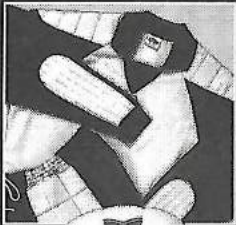

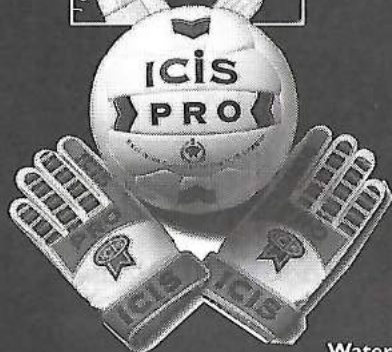

Still, as for Alex, who has enough players signed on to put out two completely different first teams if he wants, but still wants even more advantages over other teams, I'd just like to ask him why he will be taking his team away on a meaningless tour abroad in the close season if he really believes his lads can't cope with the workload they're under - poor pampered dears earning a fortune for doing what most of us lot have done for nothing for years - play football two or three times a week. Tough life - I bet they'd much rather get up every day and go into the office or down the pit, wouldn't they?

I suspect the big boys are going to be working away to get all sorts of rules changed in their favour over the next few seasons - the FA Cup, for example - what price would you lay me that within the next few seasons they manage to get seeding introduced into the competition? The big clubs hate the risk they take when they're drawn away against a minnow in the earlier rounds. Defeat at that stage can cost them a great deal of income.

It is, of course, donkey's years since a non-Premiership side won the Cup, but I just have a hunch that the big boys, mindful of the way the European Cup is now run entirely for the benefit of the glamour clubs, will begin lobbying for the added protection which would come with seeding. For example, keeping Premiership sides out of the draw until Round Four rather than Three, and then keeping the non-leaguers or lower division sides away from them in the 3rd or 4th Round. Maybe even allowing the current holders and runners-up exemption to Round Five, or guaranteeing them home draws next season. There would be huge objections from the romantics and the traditionalists, but in these days when cash is king they would be ignored and rejected.

So, now we know just why Wealdstone managed to lose at home to Harlow and Northwood in quick succession - it was my fault. At least, the Harrow Observer evidently thinks so, blaming Gordon's success in the William Hill 'Manager of the Month' Award - which sponsorship I arranged with the League on behalf of my company - for the dramatic slump which followed. I've come up with a better reason - we played crap!

Wasn't it an odd feeling, winning promotion without kicking a ball? It provoked something of a flat sensation - lacking that sense of elation and celebration which happens when you watch a team actually battle away and win the point or points it needs to clinch an honour. I couldn't quite summon up the necessary enthusiasm to open a bottle of bubbly, so I had a beer instead. Tasted good, though! And the champagne's still on ice for the title.

At the time of writing, we should have confirmed our promotion, but we haven't. Consecutive home defeats to Harlow and Northwood have seen to that, but because of our previous record this season, all is still to play for. Not only promotion, but the Championship and the Associate Members Trophy are still within our grasp. By the time you read this who knows? - we might be out of the cup and struggling to confirm our promotion. with just four fixtures remaining. Whichever way you look at it, and with apologies to the Suburban League side from a few years ago, it's a bloody long time since Wealdstone F.C. actually won something.

What did you do on the day Wealdstone won the F.A. Trophy ? I wasn't even at the game ! At the time I was still working at QPR and had only seen Wealdstone play about 15 times that season, and worse still I hadn't seen the team win. One of very few games I saw all of was the Trophy Semi-Final second leg at home to Enfield, when we lost 0-1, and although I bought a ticket for the final, some of the players were aware of my record during the season, and being superstitious bought my ticket off me and 'asked' me not to go to the final, so I didn't. (The second choice wasn't that bad, as I worked at QPR v Manchester United which QPR won 3-2 I think, but now, no-one and nothing would stop me going.)

I left Loftus Road at about 5:45pm and drove like a maniac to Lower Mead, only to park alongside Gary Waddock, who half an hour earlier was wishing everyone well in the Players Bar at QPR ! - although we know each other neither knew of 'the other's' interest in Wealdstone, or Gary's friendship with the Byatt's.

The noise as we entered the bar was incredible, and getting to the bar seemed to take an age, but that was helped by everyone passing round bottles of all shapes and sizes and offering drinks, and when I did get to the bar, I was immediately pulled behind to help serve the crowd, but not before I'd served myself as you can imagine. The only other memories of that day are Roy Davies' shoes on top of the Stand, and I believe Matthew Ansell streaking round the pitch at about 1:00am in the morning - the rest is just a blur and a feeling of great exhilaration. In fact I've never even watched the whole of the match on video, but I must have seen the goals fifty times.

There was the EGM called to discuss the future of the club and the involvement of the trustees, called for a Sunday morning, and almost as the meeting started Les Hobbs, a trustee, informing everyone that he had a boat to catch, and promptly leaving the meeting.

There were promises from incoming board members who were at the time to be the saviours of the club, only for the situation to change dramatically during their tenure.

There was the game against Yeovil, lost to goals scored by Ian Botham of all people.

The announcement of our move to Watford, and what that would bring to the club, and playing in the last actual game played at Lower Mead, between the SFC Wealdstone 1st team and reserves, I don't remember the score, but I do remember the emotion of that day.

The following day I sat in the empty ground with my then girlfriend, while she painted a water-colour of the scene, looking toward the Elmslie End. The original was presented to the board, and the supporters club sold fifty signed prints - I wonder where they all are now.

Personally, it brought me to the position of Tannoy Man along with Pete Worby. Steve Marshall rang just after the move had been finalised and asked us both to go to Watford to learn how to use the scoreboard and the massive sound system.

Not knowing what to expect, we were met by the FIVE people at Watford who regularly used the system, and were duly given our instructions. I don't think that all things considered we did too bad a job whilst we were there - we only upset a few of the neighbours with the volume and our choice of music (Believe me - that hasn't changed since either !), we even got a mention in the Watford Fanzine with a comment along the lines of "*....I just cannot imagine (the Watford Tannoy man) replacing the customary Chariots of Fire with Ian Dury's Sex and Drugs and Rock and Roll as the team come out.....*" Oh how things have changed. Not.

There was a threat of being reported to the league when the scoreboard suggested that the referee was heavily involved in the scoring the second Bashley goal in a 2 - 1 home defeat. Letters of apology were duly written.

There was Mark Fowlers face, trudging out after our first game at Vicarage Road, a 4 - 1 home defeat to Margate, with Shattered Dreams by Johnny Hates Jazz blearing out over the system, (the cynical type of comment which certainly developed at our next home, sharing with Yeading.)

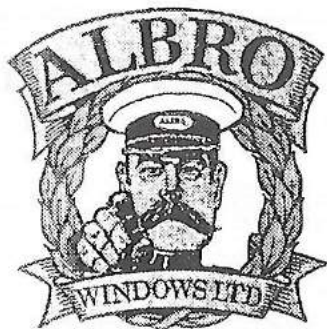

No. 10 **LEE WALKER** - (Striker)
 * Single - Girl Friend Helen
 * Birthplace - Clapham
 * Lives in Chelsea

Since leaving Millwall, where he played for the reserves during a Y15 stay of some four years, Lee has extended his footballing education via the Far East, the GM Vauxhall Conference, the Southern League and the Isthmian League.

First stop out of Millwall was a year in Hong Kong playing as a professional with Sing Tao. Lee described this "as very enjoyable" and I got the impression this comment also embraced the social scene, as well as the sporting one. Back home, Lee joined Slough Town (Conference) and during a two year stay he went on loan to Yeading where he first played for Gordon and Leo. Next stop was a little further afield - down to Bashley in Hampshire, "nobody told me that Bashley wasn't in London" said Lee, "but I stayed for nearly a season, which included a 2nd Round FA Cup tie v Swansea City when I hit the inside of the post." (Such is the narrow margin which determines fame Lee!!) Then came Chesham and Molesey, before arriving in the earlier part of last season at Wealdstone (and scoring on his debut at Camberley.) I remarked that, at 24, he had played for a high number of clubs (compared to Roy Marshall that is!!) and was there any particular reason for this. "Well I always say exactly what I think" replied Lee. I moved on.

Now completing his second season with the Stones, and although currently out of the side with a broken bone in his foot, Lee is more than happy at the club. His extrovert performances enable him to enjoy a good relationship with the fans who he thinks are great, but adds that "I never like to hear players slagged off by the crowd." This comment gives a clue to Lee's broader outlook on football (and no doubt life) - "That you look after your own and have local loyalties." It is not surprising that one of Lee's regular supporters is his father - "Although he never tells me what to do." Similarly, Lee supports the team where he lives and who are lighting up the Premiership with their exciting and attractive style of play.

It would appear that Lee (aided and abetted by Fergie) has another role within the side - something akin to an entertainments officer. I believe this has significantly contributed to enhancing team spirit and that players have had to respond to 'theme occasions' chosen by Lee! These have included such subjects as 'Best Flaired Trousers' - 'Seventies Ties' - 'Ladies Knickers' and 'Wigs'. Failure to meet the demands of these somewhat artistic (I use the word loosely) challenges evidently results in a system of fines (to Lee of course). The end product of all this is, I understand, that the fines proceeds will help pay for a 'Players End of Season Celebration' somewhere on the Lancashire coast - no doubt appropriate warning signs will be posted for any holidaymakers in the selected area!

When I questioned Lee on other interests, he quickly made it clear that watching TV was not a regular pastime. However, he tells me he is an avid reader and that Ken Follett is a favourite author.

Until recently Lee's job related to managing company run coaching courses (he already has a preliminary coaching badge), but he is currently 'resting' (apart from a little bit of labouring) and would ideally like to get back into a sporting career with direct contact with people which he undoubtedly enjoys. Perhaps an entertainments/sports officer on a cruise ship would fit in Lee?

Our interview came to an end 30 minutes before the East Thurrock home game as Lee had to go - "Sorry, must go, Gordon likes me in the dressing room before the game." So away he went - part of the motivation exercise no doubt - or was it to organise another theme occasion?

(Since giving this interview Lee has recovered from his injury and has recently resumed playing after missing ten games. - Ed)

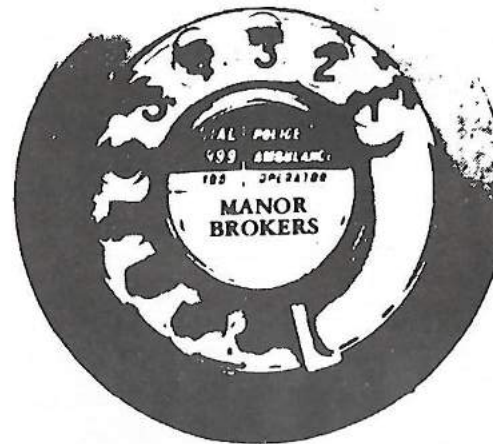
The home defeat by Harlow Town was a disappointment to everyone who had hoped that there would be something to celebrate at the final whistle, but it was not to be. With just one point needed from this game to guarantee promotion we managed to blow it, which I would say is typical Wealdstone, but that is more in a historic sense and not really in keeping with Gordon Bartlett's time here, as the supporters now come to matches almost expecting us to win every game, as opposed to losing every one which was the case a few seasons ago. The morning had already started badly for me football wise, as an early start at The Railway in Edgware saw Arsenal totally demolish Chelsea at Stamford Bridge in front of the Sky Sports cameras, still, never mind I thought, I had a party to go to at The White Lion Ground - wrong!! We didn't exactly make the best of starts, as only a couple of minutes into the game a harmless looking free kick to Harlow 40 yards from our goal was booted forward and somehow drifted over Darren Bonfield's head to gift our visitors the lead. We had been dealt a bad card from the pack, and unfortunately before half-time we were to be dealt three more. The first of these was when the creative Terry Hibbert pulled a hamstring and had to go off, the second was when new signing Stuart Miller found himself clean through with only the Harlow keeper to beat, and he managed the hard part as he calmly rounded the keeper, but the ball seemed to bobble up as he went to hit it and instead of hitting the back of the net the ball came back off the crossbar to deny us a certain equaliser. The third bad card turned out to be a red one, which was waved in the direction of Ian Waugh just before half-time. The referee appeared to only produce the card after severe protestation from two certain Harlow individuals who once played for the Stones a long time ago. The second half saw Wealdstone huff and puff but Harlow always looked more likely to score, and it didn't come as a surprise when they added their second goal to finish us off, and even the introduction of Lee Walker couldn't turn the tide. Looking back we were perhaps lucky to escape with just a 2-0 defeat, and this match ended our impressive sequence of consecutive home wins in the league since our rather fortuitous victory on the opening day of the season against Camberley. I must say that having a record of played three lost three against Harlow since the start of last season doesn't exactly fill me with much optimism for the return match there - I only hope the Wealdstone players can prove me wrong!

I think it must be a case of so near and yet so far, but at least the performance on this occasion (especially in the second half) was a lot better than the previous Saturday, as we threw everything apart from the kitchen sink at our opponents in the second half but gained no reward for our endeavours. Considering the above average attendance the atmosphere in the first half was muted to say the least, and at one point Gordon left the dugout to plead for more noise from the terraces, but everyone seemed to be to spread out around the ground. Northwood broke the deadlock with a good move which got round the back of our defence, and one of their strikers (who I was chatting to in the bar at our game at Kingsbury) calmly slotted the ball over the diving Bonfield. Oh dear, here we go again - deja vu anyone? We tried to get back into the match before half-time but were let down by a mixture of bad passes and bad luck. As I came out of the bar for the second half I found myself stopping in my tracks, had I come out of Mr Benn's changing room and 'as if by magic' found myself in another football ground? Certainly the ground looked the same, but as I looked to the far side I saw the covered terrace heaving with a mass of singing people - yes, this was more like it! This seemed to inspire our players, as they came forward at Northwood to try to get the equaliser, but couldn't find a way past their defensive blockade. Our best chance came when we had an effort cleared off the line, but this was to prove a false dawn, as disaster struck when our opponents broke away to score a goal that can only be described as comical - only no one was laughing. Two home matches to secure promotion both lost, I was beginning to wonder, would we ever go up.....

Lady Luck hasn't been on our side lately, but it was twenty four hours later when we weren't even playing - joy oh joy, promotion at last, thanks to Flackwell Heath's 3-1 victory over Harlow. Oh well, maybe losing to Northwood wasn't so bad after all, as hopefully it will ensure that they get promoted with us to deny our friends from Essex

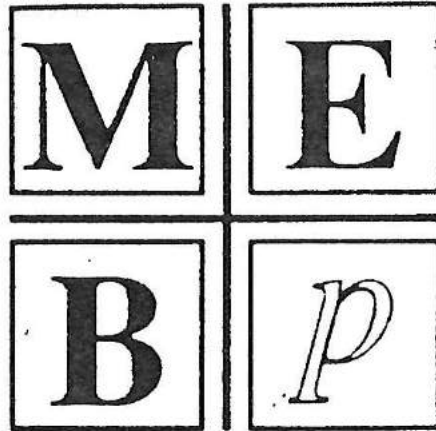

EPSOM AND EWELL FOOTBALL CLUB

The Club was founded in 1917 as Epsom Town F.C. and on reaching senior status they joined the Southern Suburban League and won the League championship at the first attempt without losing a game. In 1922-23 they reached the final of the Surrey Junior Cup, losing 2-1, (after a 1-1 draw), to Caterham Mental Hospital. In 1925-26 they were winners of the Surrey Senior League and again in 1926-27, also in the same season they were winners of the Surrey Senior League Charity Cup beating Egham Town 1-0.

They were elected to the London League in 1927-28, winning the League championship at the first attempt. They reached the final of the Surrey Senior Cup losing 3-2 to Redhill in 1928-29. In 1929-30 Epsom Town Reserves were winners of the Surrey Intermediate Cup beating Farnham Town Reserves 4-2 and in 1932-33 were winners of the Surrey Senior Shield, beating Woking 5-0.

In 1933-34 after beating Woking, Nunhead and Leytonstone, all clubs from the Isthmian League, Epsom Town reached the 1st round proper of the F.A.Cup for the only time in the Club's history, where they faced Clapton Orient from Division Three South of the Football League. The Times said of the match, "Epsom fought hard against Clapton Orient, Clapton were 3 goals up, one from a penalty, with less than 30 minutes left. Epsom scored two quick goals, (Marlow and Graves), and had a reasonable chance of drawing level before Morris made the game safe for the home team, Clapton visit Walsall in the 2nd Round." In the same season, Epsom Town Juniors won the Surrey Youth Cup beating Stoughton 6-3 after extra time. Remaining in the London League until 1949, Epsom failed to repeat the championship win of 1927-28, but they were runners-up in 1931-32, 1932-33, 1936-37 and 1937-38, at the commencement of 1937-38, they changed their name to Epsom F.C.

It was decided after hostilities started in 1939 that the Committee would devote its energies to the war effort instead of the running of a football club. During the period of the war, the West Street ground was let to a side who played under the name of Epsom Town. They reached the final of the Surrey Senior Emergency competition in 1943-44, losing to Tooting and Mitcham. In 1945 Epsom F.C. reclaimed their West Street ground and recommenced in the London League, whilst Epsom Town F.C. continued for one season in the Corinthian League, playing their home matches at Kings College, Lavender Avenue, Mitcham and later in the season, at Ruxley Lane, Ewell. Epsom Town F.C. was disbanded in 1946-47, but Epsom F.C. continued to compete in the Premier Division of the London League.

The Corinthian League was started in 1945 with 8 clubs, who, having competed on equal terms with Isthmian and Athenian League sides during the war, did not wish to return to the inferior London or Spartan Leagues. The size of the Corinthian League was expanded over the years and when Epsom joined in 1949 it was up to 14 clubs. Epsom took time to adjust to the higher level, finishing 13th in the first two seasons, but by 1952-53 had progressed enough to come 3rd with just 5 points less than champions Carshalton Athletic.

This was to be their highest position although they came 4th in 1956-57 and 5th in 1955-56. In 1953-54 after beating Addlestone, Malden Town and Dulwich Hamlet, Epsom lost to Corinthian Casuals in the final of the Surrey Senior Cup, 2-0, at Crystal Palace's ground, Selhurst Park. Despite finishing bottom of the Corinthian League in 1954-55, Epsom won the Surrey Senior Shield beating Carshalton Athletic 1-0. In 1956-57 Epsom were finalists in the Corinthian League Memorial Shield losing 2-0 to Maidenhead at Dorking's ground. Epsom Reserves were winners of the Surrey Intermediate Cup in 1957-58 beating West Byfleet 2-1. In 1958-59 Epsom finished 12th in the Corinthian League but the following year were winners of the Memorial Shield beating Maidenhead United 2-0 at Wembley F.C.

In 1960, Epsom F.C. merged with Ewell and Stoneleigh F.C. changing their name to Epsom and Ewell F.C. and finished 12th in the Corinthian League. In 1961-62 they finished in 15th position, but were re-elected at the end of the season. They again finished in 15th position the following year. Following the amalgamation of the Corinthian League with the Delphian League, Epsom were elected to Division One of the Athenian League for 1963-64 and finished bottom of the table with only 9 points from 26 games, conceding 104 goals, Letchworth and Worthing both scoring 9 against them, Letchworth scoring 7 in the return league match after Epsom had been leading 3-1 at half-time. Also in this bad season, Walthamstow Avenue won 8-0 in the F.A.Cup.

In 1964-65 Epsom were again bottom of the table and relegated to Division Two. This was the year in which the first rumours circulated that Epsom's West Street ground was to be sold to property developers. In 1965-66, ex-Burnley and Leyton Orient winger Jimmy Smith was appointed Epsom's new manager and Epsom had their largest gate for three years, 532 for the visit of Leyton in the Amateur Cup. They had finished in 9th place in the League. In 1966-67 Jimmy Smith resigned in September and Tony Williams took over, but Epsom had to wait until November for their first win, 6-3 over Eastbourne. Epsom's misconduct record prior to Williams' appointment sees them suspended indefinitely by the Surrey County F.A., the ban being reversed on appeal. Also in 1966-67 the Borough Council rejects planning permission for 99 flats to be built on the West Street ground.

In 1967-68, player-manager Tony Williams rejoins the R.A.F. and is succeeded by Dave Millery. Chris Kelly, a local 17-year old, made his debut and scored in the opening match of the season against Aylesbury. Epsom reached their first cup final for 8 years, but lost 3-0 and 4-0 to Edmonton in the two legs of the Athenian League Division Two Challenge Cup.

1968-69 saw Epsom finish in 14th position, one point away from re-election, manager Dave Fillery quits at the end of the season. Local schoolmaster Peter Norris was appointed manager in 1969-70 and over 700 saw Epsom narrowly lose 2-1 to Tooting and Mitcham at West Street in an Amateur Cup tie, they finished 15th in the league. In 1970-71 Epsom were forced to apply for re-election, finishing bottom of the table with 10 points from 30 games. Epsom's sagging finances are boosted by the sale of Wimbledon's floodlights, which had been donated to the club some years earlier, to Windsor and Eton. Peter Norris resigned in October 1971 and Epsom got only 4 points from their first 12 games, and eventually were forced to apply for re-election for the second consecutive season.

In 1972-73, Peter Kenchington was appointed player-manager, but left the club in November. The club never rose from the foot of the Athenian League, and a meeting was held in February to decide if the club should continue, they were not re-elected to the Athenian League at the end of the season.

Ex-Fulham player Pat O'Connell was then appointed as manager and the club was accepted back into the Surrey Senior League, this heralded a remarkable turn around. In 1973-74 Epsom were League runners-up and League Cup winners. The latter was the first trophy to be won by the club in 15 years. The following season they were League champions and again won the League Cup, they were also finalists in the League Charity Cup and their greatest triumph - they reached the final of the inaugural F.A. Challenge Vase competition, played at Wembley. Reigate Priory, Horley Town, Worthing, Eastbourne Town, Hornchurch, Adlestone and Stamford were all beaten before losing to Hoddesdon Town 2-1 in front of a 10,000 crowd.

Not surprisingly, the Athenian League were quick to offer the club their place back in Division Two. The club were promoted to Division One at the first attempt. During the 1975-76 season, Millwall signed two of Epsom's first team players, Trevor Lee and Phil Walker, they immediately became first-team players and helped Millwall gain promotion to Division 2 of the Football League.

In 1976-77 Epsom finished in 10th place and were Athenian League Cup finalists and with new floodlights installed they were invited to apply for election to the newly-formed Division 2 of the Isthmian League, this they did and were duly elected. This season also saw Epsom's greatest success off the field when they purchased the freehold of the West Street ground.

1977-78, their first season in the Isthmian League saw them finish as Division Two champions, Metropolitan Police joining them in Division One as runners-up, in 1978-89 they finished in 10th place, 1979-80, 9th and also winners of the Southern Combination Cup. This was also the season in which the start of the new Clubhouse was made and they acquired their first major sponsors, DURST, an international photographic company. The same season they also started the club's weekly ticket scheme, sadly it closed during the beginning of 1990.

In 1980-81, Epsom just missed promotion to the Premier Division, finishing 3rd, but the disappointment of missing out was allayed as they lifted the Surrey Senior Cup for the first time, beating Woking at Tooting and Mitcham's ground. Epsom finally attained Premier Division status when they finished runners-up to Windsor and Eton in 1983-84, in addition they also reached the Surrey Senior Cup Final, but lost to Sutton United. But then the bubble burst, after two seasons in the top flight, Epsom were relegated back to Division One at the end of 1985-86, and the following season were relegated again, to Division Two South.

Pat O'Connell had resigned as manager in 1981-82, and ex-player Adrian Hill took over, having taken us to the Premier Division he stayed for another season before leaving for Croydon. Another ex-player, and former reserve-team manager Alan Webb took over, but after relegation, player Ricky Kidd was appointed in his place during 1986-87, and although being relegated at the end of the season the team was beginning to build in strength and if the usual two teams instead of four had been relegated, Epsom would possibly still be in Division One.

At the end of season 1987-88, Epsom finished in 5th place in Division Two South and the following season, they finished 9th. Towards the end of season 1989-90, manager Ricky Kidd left the club by mutual agreement, and former manager Adrian Hill returned to the manager's seat. By this time it was too late to make any inroads into improving the squad, several players having departed when Kidd left, Epsom still managed to finish in mid-table.

Season 1990-91 saw Epsom finish just below the magic half-way line, and so became a founder member of the newly-formed Division Three, and at the end of season 1991-92 finished 9th. 1992-93 saw them finish 15th, and they played their last game at West Street having sold the ground to Wimpey Homes.

In season 1993-94, Epsom finished 10th, after being next to bottom at the end of January, and a site for a new ground was purchased at Banstead Road, Ewell, but their planning application was rejected, and Epsom currently groundshare with Banstead Athletic F.C., whilst they search for a new ground. 1994-95, a promising mid-season rally suggested a finishing position in the top half of the table, but injuries to key players, coupled with a late season fixture build-up, which ended in six straight defeats, saw them finish a disappointing fourteenth.

Last season, 1995-96, saw them on the verge of the promotion race, eventually finishing in seventh place, they achieved their record Isthmian victory, 11-1 over Tring Town.

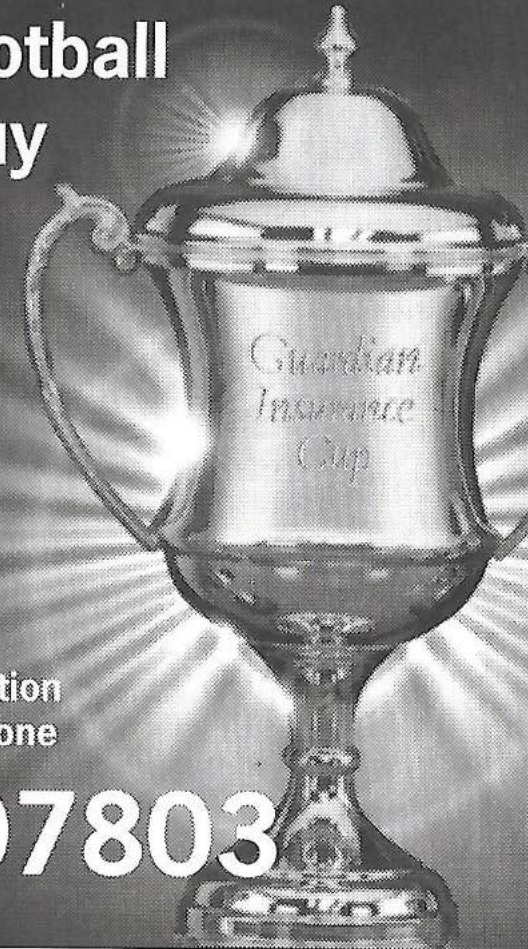
