# RYMAN FOOTBALL LEAGUE (DIVISION TWO) WEALDSTONE v. HORSHAM SATURDAY 25TH APRIL 1998, KICK OFF 3.00 PM

GOOD AFTERNOON ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the White Lion Ground for our last home game of the 1997/98 season. Today's visitors are the much improved Horsham FC and to their players, officials and supporters we extend a warm welcome. Hope you enjoy your time in our company and have a safe journey home later on. We also welcome our three match officials, Referee Mr C.N. Breakspear from Weybridge and his two 'linesmen' Mr L.J. Harvey (Walton-on-Thames) and Mr T.A. Kent (Caterham). Have a good game gents.

Although Horsham are currently placed 15th in the league table they are one of the 'in form' sides in our 'Last Six League Games' table. After just missing out on promotion last season they made a horrendous start to this season's league cempaign. By mid-January they were floundering second from bottom in the table having won only 3 and drawn 6 of 24 league matches played up to that point. Since then, with a change of management team, they have played another 16 league fixtures of which 10 have been won and 3 drawn (better than us, our last 16, 8 wins 4 draws) to ensure that the threat of relegation is now over. In fact they come here this afternoon having lost only one of their last ten league matches played on opponents grounds, and that was at Braintree. We will certainly have to be on top form if we are to repeat the 2-0 victory we achieved with goals from Stan Bowder and Brian Jones when we visited Horsham back in December.

The support and encouragement you gave the team from the moment they came out for the start of the second half at Tooting on Saturday, right up to the final whistle was truly magnificent. We will need that sort of support this afternoon and again on Tuesday when we play Edgware Town. The point gained at Tooting was thoroughly deserved after we had fought back from going 2-0 down in the opening 20 minutes. It might have been 3-0 had Noel Imber not made a terrific save from Conrad Kane's penalty kick in between the two goals he scored for the South London club. We dominated the second half and were rewarded with goals from Dennis Greene (73 mins) and Simon Garner (86 mins), and in those final four minutes we almost snatched a dramatic winner. With Bedford being held to a 1-1 draw at Hungerford it now means that we need another five points from three games to be absolutely sure of going up. Although Bedford's last two games appear, on paper at least, to be fairly 'easy' they do have to play two sides desperate to avoid relegation. Today they meet Tilbury at Bedford and next Saturday they visit Egham where they only managed a 1-0 win in the Vandanel Trophy a few weeks ago. Should they fail to gain maximum points from these two fixtures then for every point they drop we would need one less from our target of five. With Paul Lamb and Dominic Sterling back from suspension, and Chris Walton and Ian Waugh having recovered from recent injuries, Gordon will now be faced with the problem of who to leave out. Whoever plays let's get right behind them this afternoon.

With just three games left to play our popular Predict-a-Score competition is also heading for a tight finish. After having led the way for several months now, Dan Helen has been toppled from the number one spot by Edward Hibbs who now has a four point lead after correctly predicting we would draw 1-1 with Northwood and 2-2 with Tooting. The table at the back of this programme not only includes your predictions for today's game, but also for our games with Edgware and Marlow.

I hope you have enjoyed reading this season's programmes and have considered them value for money. It involves a lot of time and hard work, not only by me, but by the people who contribute to the programme. I would therefore like to thank Gordon, Leo, Graham, Layne, Howard, 'Megaphone Mick', 'Fingers' and Sarah for providing items on a regular basis. Thanks also to our occasional contributors, Nick Dugard, Steve Hibberd and John Burrows, who until he was taken ill several months ago, supplied his interesting 'JB Interviews' series from time to time. Although John is now home from hospital following major surgery he is still receiving treatment and has been unable to attend our matches for quite a while now. John has asked me to convey his thanks for all the cards, telephone calls and visits he has received, it has been very much appreciated. We hope that the summer months will help him to make a full recovery so that he can take up his place on the terraces again next season.

Fool that I am, I have decided to carry on as Programme Editor next season. It will be my EIGHTH season in this position having taken over from Steve 'Hughie' Marshall during our first season at Watford. Next season will also be my 25th as a contributor to

### MANAGER'S REPORT

When Frank, Leo and myself joined Wealdstone three years ago as normal looking fellas in their 40's, little did we know what was in store. Three seasons running we have been in the promotion shake-up and those little wobbles don't do your health any good at all. We missed out first season finishing fourth, left it to the final game to win the championship last season, and here we are into the last week of this season and we still don't know our destiny. I don't know what it's doing to you, but I know the three of us have aged about ten years since we arrived at this club and last Saturday did nothing to ease the pressure. Two nil down in twenty minutes and Noel had saved a penalty, it was hardly the start we were looking for against Tooting. However the lads responded well for the rest of the first half but despite a lot of pressure could not get the all-important goal before half-time. We needed to show a lot of character in the second half and what a difference you supporters made to the situation. The noise and backing you gave to the players was absolutely brilliant as they walked out to start the second half and you continued throughout the rest of the match. What an influence! You must take a lot of credit for the lift you gave the team and I'm sure you felt rewarded with the excellent performance which saw us fight back to get a draw and probably deserved to win.

That coupled with the Braintree game must be the best performance of the season so far and it comes as no surprise that in both instances the supporters sang their hearts out to help raise the players. Just think back to Grays away in the FA Cup two seasons ago, Wingate at home when we were 2-0 down at half-time and Northwood in the final game of last season. Your support is so influential, especially when things are not going the way we would like and a typical example was the recent game at Barking. Frustration and anger always creeps in and negative thoughts fill people's heads and then the obvious moaning starts which does not help players who are having a bad time. It's exactly the same with the players. The pressure makes them react differently to those situations which are just normal practice earlier in the season. Take Northwood for example. One nil up and yet we allowed them to dictate the match by putting six players at the back during the second half. Why? I can only put it down to trying to play safe!... and it didn't work. Last Saturday we were forced to play attacking football during the second half and our positive attitude turned the game.

We must attack sides and play the quality football that has got us into this situation. We've got quality players who can play excellent football that entertained the fans throughout the season. We must take those shackles off and get back to the free flowing football which has brought us success over the last couple of seasons and show

the same spirit as we showed in the second half at Tooting.

We must all think positively because we will never get a better opportunity of gaining promotion than now. Two points in front, a game in hand, better goal difference and Bedford have only got two games left. So near yet so far! They have two so called easy games against Tilbury and Egham which we expect them to win - but, how much pressure is on them chasing us! - especially when they score so few goals, 5 goals in their last 7 games and only 50 all season does not sound like a side challenging for promotion. On the other hand they have only conceded 3 in those 7 games and only 24 all season which is a record I would certainly be very proud of, but I wouldn't change places with them at the moment. Our run-in is obviously much harder, against today's in form opponents Horsham who have won their last 4 games scoring 13 goals in the process, our local derby against Edgware and finally Marlow away. Not easy, but we need five more points to guarantee that third position and we will be going all out for a maximum nine if we can.

I must welcome an old mate whose recent arrival as part of the new management team at Horsham has, not surprisingly, coincided with their change of fortunes. Peter Shaw and I played together for the Ealing District team and for Viking Sports on a Sunday when we were Under-15's... THAT'S NEARLY 30 YEARS AGO!! Peter went on to have a long and distinguished career with Charlton Athletic and is now putting that experience to good use with his coaching duties for Horsham. I must owe him a pint after all that time but I'll make it two or three if we win!!

I will finish by thanking everyone for all their hard work this season and I sincerely hope we can bring you the reward your efforts richly deserve - promotion. No negative thoughts today! We will make it with your support!

administrative excellence.

The Board also recognises the behind-the-scenes work put in by the Smith family, week in week out and by stalwarts, Joe McKeever (so patient in the boardroom), and Roger on the P.A. system and general all-round encouragement to all who will listen! Welcome back to 'Sonic' Steve Hibberd who has much to offer the Club - stick with it mate!!

Beyond the football side of the Club we have that little 'matter' of finding a permanent home for ourselves. Nothing, but nothing is as important as this project. Kip Hewitt has been, and will continue to be, under intense pressure to deliver. His relaxed style masks an inner determination to see this thing through to a successful conclusion. If we fail it will not be for the want of trying against virtually all odds to get this new ground built. There have been enormous frustrations but we knew that this would be the most difficult nut to crack. Currently Kip and others are literally 'cracking' some bureaucratic heads together to drag some sense into an increasingly ridiculous situation. This struggle continues to the bitter end and I wish Kip Hewitt and all connected with our relocation all good wishes, particularly over the next few vital months.

Our very best wishes go out to Layne Patterson as he leaves his full-time position at Wealdstone. Layne has done a magnificent job on the commercial side in what has been, at times, an isolated and lonely responsibility. Layne has all of our support as he pursues his full-time career outside of the Club, but I know he will continue to help us as much as time allows in his 'new' capacity at the Club and he will continue as a respected Director of Wealdstone FC Limited.

Two final thankyou's as we close on another season. Firstly to our Chairman, Paul Rumens, upon whose shoulders the final responsibility rests for guiding us forward through ever more difficult financial waters. He needs all of our support to see us through the new ground conundrum and with continuing moral, and, yes, financial support as ever. We will not be able to continue our progress on the football side without some sacrifice, and difficult days lie ahead around the boardroom table. This will require nerve and patience on the part of his Board colleagues, and understanding from supporters.

Lastly. the Club salutes you the supporters for your excellent turn-outs, particularly away from home this season. As ever it is our unique support at this Club which as Graham Sharpe recently put it "touches a chord in our opponents which other clubs cannot reach" and we surely won't need reminding that we are only here now because of that support.

#### RELOCATION REPORT

Good afternoon and welcome to the last relocation report of the season. Following the AGM in January, I am sorry to say that progress has been slow on our relocation plans. This has been due to major changes that have been taking place within the London Playing Fields Society. It is now our understanding that this situation is now resolved, a new Chairman, Lord Prior, has been appointed and other changes are now complete.

There are many hundreds of acres of playing fields under threat in London and the Playing Fields Society has had to change to be in a position to ensure the secure future of these playing fields. Although the situation is again very frustrating, the difficulties at the London Playing Fields Society have taken priority over Prince Edward

Playing Fields.

Paul Rumens and myself recently had a very positive meeting with Mr David Lawrence of the Sports Council; he told us that he was due to meet with the London Playing Fields Society by the end of April to discuss Prince Edward Playing Fields. He said that following that meeting he expects us to enter into negotiations with the Playing Fields Society to discuss leasing arrangements at Prince Edward. We discussed with David Lawrence our preferred time scales, with a planning application lodged with Harrow Council in July that would be heard by the Planning Committee in September. Mr Lawrence suggested that our time scale was very achievable, let's hope he is right!

Since the AGM we have been putting immense pressure on all the parties involved. Both Harrow and Camden councils have passed recent council motions calling on the Sports Council and London Playing Fields Society to resolve the Prince Edward Playing Fields situation. Mr Trevor Pugh, Director of Environmental Services at Harrow Council, is in close contact with a senior member of the Sports Council and he is hoping to set up a

meeting with him and us as soon as possible.

We have also had regular contact with Mr Tony McNulty MP who is putting pressure on the relevant bodies to move the process forward; he is also attempting to set up a

meeting with Mr Tony Banks (Minister of Sport) and ourselves.

It's just unfortunate that we have got trapped into a situation where the 'bigger picture' took precedent. However, I now feel that with the changes at the London Playing Fields Society in place we are now in a position to make some real progress and get back on track with out planned time scale of a planning application with Harrow Council in July.

But Wealdstone had to do some team strengthening before the game with us, so they signed Andy Peakes and Paul Dobson straight out of the Conference, to help them keep in promotion contention. I must say they played well and looked Conference players. Wealdstone now have a 1st team squad of 23 players, and a wage bill bigger than Doneaster Rovers. Then the farce at Chalfont on Saturday, we get there 2 Coaches, lots of fans who travelled by ear, and we find the game has been called off. Waterlogged. What a farce if you looked at the pitch It was as good as most we have played on all season. Anyway just A BAD WEEK.

### TODAY'S OPPONENTS

Recent research has revealed that the HORSHAM FOOTBALL CLUB was actually founded earlier than 1885 which has been the generally accepted date. The club was certainly playing competitively in 1883, and was soon to rise up to become one of the strongest in the county, dominating the local amateur scene for close on 20 years in the period before and after the 1939-45 war.

Playing in the West Sussex Senior League from its inception in 1896 and taking the championship four times, the club moved on to the Sussex County League in 1926 and enjoyed a period of success. The League was first won in 1932 after successive near-misses, and the title was retained in 1933, 1935, 1936, 1937 and 1938, with the club regularly scoring over 100 goals a season. After the break brought on by the Second World War, Horsham won the first post-war title in 1947 and then only narrowly missed out for four years running. In the years the club missed the title, this was largely due to immense fixture backlogs brought on by successful cup runs which saw the Sussex RUR Cup taken in 1900, 1931, 1932, 1934, 1935, 1936, 1937, 1938, 1946, 1949, 1951, 1952, and 1957, and the Sussex Senior Cup in 1934, 1939, 1950 and 1954. Exciting Amateur Cup runs saw upwards of 5,000 people attending matches at Queens Street, with league fixtures also regularly bringing in four-figure crowds. Numerous minor trophies were also obtained.

By 1951 Horsham Football Club was growing too big for the county scene and the club consequently joined the Metropolitan League. The championship was won at the first attempt, though over the next five seasons only average results were achieved. In 1957 the club found itself in the Corinthian League, achieving modest success, before this league merged with the Delphian and Athenian Leagues to form the new three division Athenian League in 1963. Playing in the First Division, Horsham took fourth place in 1965 yet the following season ended up second to bottom and were relegated for the first time in the club's history. Shaken by this, the team was reconstructed, and after three seasons of almost getting there, the championship was taken in 1970, followed by the Division One title in 1973. Success in the cup competitions also returned and Horsham won the prestigious Sussex Senior Cup in 1972, 1974 and 1976. In 1978 the Sussex Floodlight Cup was taken for the first and only time. Horsham Football Club was elected to the Isthmian League in 1973, joining the then Second Division. In 1995/96 the club achieved its first Isthmian success when the championship of Division Three was won.

Up to this point in its history, the club has reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup on two occasions. In 1947/48 Horsham took a first minute lead against Notts County, before going on to lose 9-1. Some 20 years later, in 1966/67, Swindon Town made the trip to Queen Street and emerged victors by 3-0 in front of an 8,000 record crowd.

Last season Horsham finished fifth in Division Two, failing by just three points from gaining promotion to Division One at the first attempt.



# The Graham Sharpe Column

I didn't realise I had such a high profile sartorial image. How else to explain the mirth and merriment with which I was greeted when I turned up to watch the Wealdstone Juniors Under 13's play their vital match against Premier Wanderers.

With the destination of the Harrow Youth League divisional title riding on the outcome of this game, Layne had managed to arrange for the fixture to be played here at Edgware. With my son Paul in the side, I had decided to demonstrate my support for the boys by wearing a scarf and hat in club colours - but I wasn't prepared for the reaction of a large number of the 105 spectators, who seemed to find my garb as outlandish as if I had turned up clad from head to toe in a Harrow Borough kit!

People guffawed and chortled. Several even rushed to take photographs, ostensibly for future programmes but really, I suspect, so that they would be able at a later date to hand them round to unsuspecting friends and relatives and have a good old laugh at my expense.

Blimey, I began to understand just how old Eric the taxi driver, the late lamented supporter from the sixties who would attend every match dressed in a blue and white suit clanging a great bell, must have felt. Even Joe McKeever, himself resplendent in jeans and trainers, felt the need to snap my image for posterity.

Oh well, at the end of the day it must have been worth it, because the lads duly ran out 17-0 winners, so the mickey-taking was not in vain - but make the most of those pictures if you happen to see one, because I won't be repeating the exercise. Not in public, that is.

But recently for the first time I can recall, I was invited to a fancy dress party. What would YOU go as? I've always thought that if I ever was invited to such a function that I would go as my favourite character in fiction - 'Just' William Brown. I've still got my old school cap and until recently I had my school mac, but I think my mum may finally have chucked it out - and that after I told her I might eventually grow in to it, too! So if I can't go as William, perhaps I'll have to adopt a football theme and go as a Wealdstone Juniors supporter, either that or balance a french fry on the top of my arm where it meets my neck and go as Tony Booth of Harrow Borough FC - a man with a chip on his shoulder!

Sadly my cousin, Dave Evans, who one or two supporters may remember, died recently in his late forties. Dave (a Chelsea fan, but no-one's perfect) was active on the local Sunday soccer scene fifteen or twenty years ago and was an occasional visitor to Stones' games. He was a great lad who will be missed, and who retained his sense of humour to the absolute end. At his cremation the final record played was by Chris Rea - 'Road to Hell'. Bye Dave.

I missed our 4-2 home victory against Egham due to being in Scotland watching Highland League side Keith FC defeat Nairn County by 3-1. I won't comment too much about this as Keif is writing an article on our trip that hopefully will appear in the next Elmslie Ender. What I will say is that the hospitality we received, especially at the football club was incredible, as we were invited into their boardroom and plied with free double scotches all afternoon, which made a mockery of that old wives tale that Scottish people are thrifty when it comes to money. The good word of Wealdstone Football Club was spread about 600 odd miles from home, as we explained to their officials the trials and tribulations of Following our club. The football was also a lot better than I had expected, as the passing and movement were very good taking into account the appalling conditions that the match was played in (freezing cold high winds). A 'thank you' must go out to Darren, who sent us details of goals scored back at the Egham match, although these weren't picked up on Keif's mobile until about 5.30pm due to poor reception in the area. From speaking to various people on my return, and also reading Attic's match report, I gather that Wealdstone's first half performance was excellent. Three goals were scored in the opening forty five minutes by Boreham, Dobson and Jones, and this had put Wealdstone in a commanding position. The two main talking points from the match seemed to be the midfield performance by Dobson and Wealdstone's fourth goal, which by all accounts was a quality strike. Imber played a long ball through to Boreham who finished clinically from the edge of the penalty area. After this Wealdstone must have gone to sleep, as we allowed our visitors to score two goals before the end, although we didn't manage to do a 'Bracknell' that would have caused real panic on and off the pitch.

Today's visitors did us a favour on Easter Saturday by defeating Bedford, and there were a few Stones supporters who added to the attendance due to our 'away' game at Edgware being called off due to a waterlogged pitch. The following Monday saw our home match against Northwood go ahead, with the pitch in surprisingly good nick. Wealdstone started well, and an early attack saw Jones run clear down the right hand side of the pitch only to be blatantly fouled by the visitors goalkeeper just outside the penalty area. The referee made the correct decision to book the goalie, but he was very lucky to stay on the pitch five minutes later when he wrestled Jones to the ground once more, this time inside the area which gave us an obvious penalty. For some reason the Northwood players were furious and about four of them chased the referee towards the corner flag, which maybe took his mind off the fact that the goalkeeper should have been sent off, although I can't help thinking that he would have 'qone' if this incident had happened later in the game. Dennis Greene scored from the spot, but we didn't go on from this, although we continued to be the better side in the first half squandering plenty of half chances. Dennis missed an absolute sitter in the early part of the second half when more good work by Jones set him up five yards from goal, but he tried to break the back of the net and duly sent the ball high over the bar. This would have effectively sealed the contest, but instead of giving us the impetus to continue pushing forward for that killer second goal we fell apart. We spent the rest of the match playing an 8-0-2 formation that handed the initiative back to Northwood who were given carte blanche to come to the edge of our penalty area in every one of their forays forward. Why our midfield weren't hunting in packs to get the ball back high up the field I don't know, and these tactics baffled most of our supporters. It came as no surprise therefore when Northwood deservedly equalised, although the goal did have more than a touch of good fortune to it. Our old boy Terry Hibbert hit a speculative shot from the edge of the penalty area that balloomed up off one of our defenders and over Imber for a freak goal. Even after this Northwood looked the more dangerous side in the last ten minutes, but there were no more goals added so the game ended all square. With Bedford winning by the surprising (not!) margin of 1-0 on the same afternoon our lead over them was cut to two points.

Our next game away at Tooting & Mitcham United was the proverbial Jekyll and Hyde performance, with a completely lack lustre first half performance followed by a barnstorming one in the second half that saw a dramatic end to the contest. We found ourselves a goal down inside four minutes, as Tooting's passing was far more slick than ours, and they continued to look the more likely to score. They had a great chance to

double their lead when they were awarded a penalty after a clumsy challenge by Horner, but thankfully Imber superbly blocked the powerful effort and the rebound was cleared. Even this didn't wake us up, as not long after one of the Tooting players ran down the left and sent in a low shot that beat Imber, and we were staring a costly defeat in the face. In the last ten minutes of the first half we finally sparked into life and won a succession of corners that were defended well by the home side, and our best chance came when McKay took the wrong option from the right hand side of the penalty area and chipped the ball forward instead of drilling it across the six yard box. Our best player in the first half was definitely Ferqus Moore, who did well to continue after a masty collision left him injured for at least five minutes. As I wandered round for the start of the second half I noticed that the majority of Wealdstone supporters had congregated in the big main stand, where they were standing and singing 'Gordon Bartlett's blue & white army' as loud as they could, and I'm sure this gave the players a huge lift as they came back onto the pitch for the start of the second half. The singing continued, and it certainly seemed to do the trick, as Wealdstone were a different team in this second half, laying siege on the Tooting goal. Walton came on as substitute, and he was immediately back to his best, instigating a lot of our best moves. Time after time we came within a whisker of getting a goal back, with Boreham on more than one occasion wishing that he could have some form of leg extension to reach that elusive cross. There were also a number of goalmouth scrambles that always seemed to fall to the boot of a lunting player, and it was beginning to seem like one of those days. Throughout the second half our supporters had been clamburing for the introduction of Simon Garner, and with about twenty minutes remaining he finally entered the fray, but was it too late? Fortunately the answer was no. Finally we got a bit of good fortune that our play in this half had merited, as Walton was sent crashing in the penalty area. It seemed like the referee was going to ignore this but he noticed his assistant who had his flag ncross his chest and suddenly we had the chance to get back into the game. There was a huge sigh of relief when Dennis Greene sent the keeper the wrong way from the penalty kick, and we had about fifteen minutes to get an equaliser or more. As the players ran back for the restart Benning ran towards our supporters in the stand to urge even more noise, and we didn't let him down. In fact his performance in this second half was probably his best since joining the club, as he was battling for everything. We should have had another penalty about five minutes later when Jones was brought down inside the area, but the referee inexplicably waved play on when this decision seemed more obvious than the penalty we did get. As the final minute approached Jonah summoned up some resources of energy to surge forward towards the Tooting goal. As he reached the edge of the area he was trying to find space to shoot, but was surrounded by four defenders. and he noticed Garner unmarked to his left. His pass found its target, and after one touch Garner fired in a shot across the goalkeeper that seemed to go in slow motion but finally nestled beautifully in the bottom corner to send the Wealdstone supporters in the stand into delirium, as everyone was jumping up and down hugging everyone in sight! 
