GOOD AFTERNOON, welcome to the White Lion Ground for our first home league fixture of the 1999/2000 season, the season in which Wealdstone Football Club becomes 100 years old. If there had been any justice in the football world we would have been celebrating our centenary year in the Ryman League (Premier Division), having finished last season in the third promotion spot in Division One a massive 14 points clear of fourth placed Braintree Town. It is now history that the officers who run the Ryman League, supported by the Football Association and the majority of the Ryman League clubs, decided we shouldn't go up as the improvements needed to obtain the necessary 'A' grading for the White Lion Ground were not completed until a few days after the April 1st deadline. One of the reasons for this snub was because the newly installed seats in front of the main stand remained uncovered as at the deadline date. As far as I'm aware there is nothing in the League Rules saying that seats must be covered. It obviously doesn't apply in the Football League as Barnet FC's Underhill ground proves. Behind one of their goals the terrace consists of row upon row of UNCOVERED seats!

As can be seen from the Division One attendance grid elsewhere in this programme we had the best average attendance home and away last season. The likes of Aldershot, Boreham Wood, Harrow Borough, Hendon and St Albans would have had bumper gates had they met us in the league this season, but their loss is Division One's gain as most of its clubs can now look forward to having one of their best, if not the best, gates when we

visit them again this season.

We now have to put the disappointment of the last few months behind us and concentrate on the next nine months. A real crack at finishing in the top three again must be our target but it won't be easy. However, if we show the same fight and determination we saw in the second half of last season then there is no reason why we shouldn't be up there with the best of them come next May. Best of luck to Gordon, Leo and all the players in the months ahead.

We begin today with a visit from Harlow Town who were promoted last May for the second season running. To their players, officials and supporters we say welcome to Edgware, we hope you enjoy your time with us and have a safe journey home later on. Welcome also to our three match officials, Messrs Head, Piggott and Reading who all hail

from the High Wycombe area.

We last met Harlow Town three seasons ago (1996/97) when we were both in Division Three and although we ended the season as Champions our visitors beat us in both league matches that season. They also beat us twice the season before that so they appear to be something of a bogey team as far as we are concerned. Here's hoping we can turn the tables this afternoon and gain our first ever league victory over them.

Our pre-season friendlies have not produced the sort of results we would have liked but two players who have impressed are our new signings Joe Lyons and Dave Tilbury who last season played for Edgware Town and Molesey respectively. We welcome you both aboard





Fortunately Wealdstone have stayed a club with ambition, with a manager in Gordon Bartlett who has the desire to match that ambition and take us on into the Conference, but unfortunately for us we have been held back by the League and clubs with no ambition.

So back to today's game. Did you know that this is our first competitive fixture of the Stones Centenary season, the club having played its first ever game 100 years ago this coming October. #### WIRRAL PROGRAMME CLUB 24th NON-LEAGUE FOOTBALL PROGRAMME OF THE YEAR SURVEY 1998/99

The Wirral Programme Club survey of last season's non-League programmes resulted in ours being placed 33rd nationally out of 1192 entries. We received 153 points. Denaby United (Northern Counties League) were placed First with 199 points, followed by Hoddesdon Town (Minerva Spartan South Midlands League) 192 points, and Evans & Williams Sports (Wales) 191 points. For the first time in at least seven seasons our local rivals Northwood failed to finish in the top three nationally.

In the Ryman League (Division One) we were runners-up four points behind Uxbridge with Barton Rovers third, seventeen points behind us. This meant that in each of our four seasons in the Ryman (formerly ICIS) League we had finished runners-up in the Division we were playing in at the time. Overall in the Ryman League our programme was placed 6th behind Northwood (180 pts), Aldershot Town (179), Dagenham & Redbridge (175), Uxbridge (157) and Bishop's Stortford (154).

It should be noted that the programmes were surveyed, not as many assume voted upon. Marks were awarded to each programme as follows (the maximum marks available in each section are given):- Cover 15 (design 10. match details 5), Page Size 10, Team Layout and position within the programme 10, Results 10, League Tables 10, Price 15, Pictures 15, Printing and Paper Quality 20, Frequency of Issue 20, Value for money 20 (this takes into account the ratio of adverts to content, the clubs league etc.), Contents 105 (other than those listed) taking into account their relevance to the club, its league, environs etc., the size of print used, the spacing between lines, the size of the margins, and if the contents are original or reproduced (from League Bulletins, newspapers, magazines etc.). To gain full marks in the Frequency of Issue section programmes from 10 different current season matches were required for each team entered (allowances were made if ten home games had not been played by the closing date and the Wirral Programme Club had been informed of this), the minimum entry was one programme. As many programmes varied from issue to issue all the programmes received were surveyed, the marks in each section totalled and divided by the number of issues to get the final mark for each section, the marks from each section were then totalled to get the final score. We duly submitted ten, as did the other Ryman clubs mentioned above.

So, dearly beloved, here we are, gathered together again to celebrate the start of another season. What have you been doing since the end of the last one, then? No doubt

you've been off somewhere sunny for a holiday.



#### Relocation Report

If patience is a virtue I guess I must be the most virtuous person here this afternoon.

Since obtaining outline planning last October we were told that as a **matter of course**, because our plans were outside of Harrow's local plan and our proposals included building on playing fields, our application had to be ratified by the Department of Environment, Transport and the Regions (DETR). Harrow planning department informed us that they did not expect problems with our application and that we should expect a reply within 28 days.

After a couple months the DETR, following letters from Harrow Council, replied to our proposals asking for further details on the methodology and assumptions we had made to calculate the provision for car parking at Prince Edward Playing Fields.

Following meetings between Harrow planners and myself a comprehensive reply was sent to the DETR in January explaining our requirement for 400 car parking spaces with 200 overflow car parking spaces. The letter also requested for a decision by mid/late February.

No reply was forthcoming from the DETR and any attempts to contact them by Council members, officers and Tony McNulty MP was met with the response that this was a quasi-judicial procedure and the DETR could not enter into correspondence.

Then, out of the blue, following a telephone conversation to Harrow's Chief Planner, Mr Graham Jones, we were told that the DETR were minded to "Call in" our application. This would mean that DETR would totally review our proposals and this procedure could take up to 2 years. All this because of the number of car parking spaces, which is an issue that no one at all connected with the Prince Edward Playing Field development had objected too. Even those local residents who were totally opposed to the development did not have a problem with the car park in fact, their concerns centred on cars parking on the local streets.

This was obviously a major blow and as far as we were concerned a totally unjust decision. I immediately contacted Tony McNulty MP who in turn lobbied the Minister for Sport and the Minister for the Regions, Regeneration and Planning. The outcome at this stage is that we think we have prevented the application being "called in" and we are expecting confirmation from the DTER that they will accept 100 less car parking spaces.

This change to our original plan will need to go before Harrow's planning committee and the local residents will be notified of the change. I have held a number of meetings with members of the Planning Committee, including the Chairman and Vice Chairman, and atthough the local residents opposed to the scheme will again have an opportunity to voice their opinions the amendment should obtain the necessary permission. Also with the DETR agreeing with the changes prior to the Planning Committee it will be very difficult for the Committee to not to approve the latest scheme.

It is anticipated the Planning Committee will consider our amended application on October 19<sup>th</sup>. In a nutshell bureaucracy has been the cause of this 12-month delay to our plans for Prince Edward Playing Fields, a delay that we can hardly afford.

We are continuing with all the necessary legal agreements that are required for detailed planning and transfer of the playing fields so that we can minimise any possible delays once the 19<sup>th</sup> October Planning Committee has agreed the amendment, and we anticipate going for detailed planning as soon as possible after the 19<sup>th</sup>.

#### RELOCATION REPORT (continued)

As you may well have seen in the local press recently, the current situation at Prince Edward Playing Fields is deteriorating month by month with a serious bout of fly tipping the latest problem to beset the disused playing fields. This is, obviously, incredibly frustrating as we all know a solution to Prince Edward Playing Fields has been on the drawing board for a number of years now. However, Camden Council are now as keen as anyone to see the whole situation resolved as every incident of this nature ends up costing them time and money.

On the brighter side, during this enforced delay we have not been siting on our backsides. A lot of work has gone in to raising funds for the project. We currently have applications for funding in with the Football Association, the Football Trust, the Lawn Tennis Association as well as a number charities and grant giving bodies. We have also opened negotiations with a number of Breweries with a view to them assisting with funding the development. These current applications total nearly £3/4 million and this exercise is still ongoing.

We have received a pledge from Harrow Hockey Club of £10,000 towards the project and we are talking to many other local sporting groups with a view to get football and cricket clubs involved at an early stage. We are also making approaches to local businesses to encourage commercial partnerships and sponsorship within the project.

National Lottery Sports Fund is still due to be the major fund provider for this project and we are planning to put our application to them as soon as feasible after the committee meeting on the 19<sup>th</sup>. The Sports Fund is currently changing its whole application procedure and they are not accepting any applications between June and October so we could not put in our application much earlier.

Our National Lottery Sports Fund application may be delayed by a new National Lottery fund that may well also help towards the funding of Prince Edward. The New Opportunities Fund is the latest National Lottery good cause and within this fund is the Green Space Initiative. This initiative is designed to assist environment projects, green spaces and community projects. Unfortunately the Green Space Initiative is not accepting applications until the end of the year and any application we have with them will have an effect on our Sports Fund application. However the Sports Fund have told us that they have no problem jointly funding the project with the Green Space Initiative.

Wealdstone Football Club's new share issue is now well underway and despite some justified criticism of the initial application literature, share holders are now purchasing new shares and exchanging their current shares for new ones. Don't forget the reasoning behind the new share issue is to raise much needed funds for the new stadium as well as giving you a say and an investment in **your Club**.

We need to raise as much funding from within the Club prior to our Lottery Application so if you considering an investment please complete your application form sooner rather than later. Although these delays are frustrating please don't lose sight of the fact that we are gaining more and more support from the people that really matter and I am still utterly convinced that we can make this happen!





# HARLOW TOWN RG.

Life started for Harlow Football Club on the 18th October 1879, when a friendly match was played against Saffron Walden Town on the college cricket ground. RC Day wrote his name in the club's history books, scoring the only goal of the game in a 1-0 win.

In the early years only friendly matches were played until the formation of leagues towards the turn of the century. In those pioneering days Harlow played in both the Stansted & District League and the East Herts League. The first move towards becoming a senior club came in 1932 when the club joined the Spartan League Division Two (East). After five years of competing in this league the club were granted Senior Status by the Essex County Football Association and the club competed in the Essex Senior Cup and F.A.Cup for the first time. At this time Harlow, still a village, had the smallest population of all the clubs competing in the Senior Cup - a far cry from today with an ever increasing population of around 80,000.

Following the Second World War the club continued to play in the Spartan League and after completing a hat-trick of Epping Hospital Cup wins, the club picked up it's first senior honour in season 1952-53. The Spartan League Division One Cup was won, defeating Bletchley in the Final. Only one more season was spent in the Spartan League before a switch to the more demanding London League.

Six seasons were spent in the London League, winning the League Cup in season 1959-60. This was the last season that the club played it's home matches at the Green Man Field, as in August 1960 the club left it's roots in the old town, moving into the newly built stadium at the Harlow Sportcentre.

The club's improved facilities enabled them to move into the Delphian League in season 1961-62 and just two seasons later became members of the newly formed Athenian League Division Two, following the merger of the Athenian, Delphian and Corinthian Leagues. Promotion was won at the first attempt, finishing in third place in the table. Life proved to be a constant struggle in the early years in Division One, that was until a change of fortunes in season 1971-72. The season proved to be a great success, culminating in the lifting of the club's first ever championship in May. The following season saw the club challenging for the Premier Division title, eventually finishing fourth behind Dagenham, Slough Town and Tilbury. This was to be the only season that the club competed in this division as the following season saw the vast majority of the top Athenian League sides joining the expanding Isthmian League, forming the Isthmian League Division Two. (later to be re-named Division One).

Since arriving in the Isthmian League Harlow have certainly had their fair share of ups and downs. After five years of mediocrity the club took the Division One title by a clear fourteen points in season 1978-79, adding the Essex Senior Cup in the same year. Defeating Tilbury 1-0 in the Final. 
