Hello one and all, welcome to the White Lion Ground for our last home game of the current season. Today's visitors are Leatherhead Football Club and to their officials, players and supporters we extend a very warm welcome and hope they will have a pleasant time in our company. Welcome also to our three match officials, Referee Mr A.K.Osborne from Bushey, and his two 'linesmen', Mr A.P. Connor and Mr C. Lymer from Badshot Lea and Old Woking respectively.

We last met Leatherhead two months ago when two goals from Paul McKay, his only goals so far this season, gave us a much needed win and three points at their Fetcham Grove ground. Having failed to win any of our previous ten league matches this win was

desperately needed in our fight to avoid relegation.

Unfortunately for Leatherhead they now find themselves third from bottom of the division and in danger of being relegated themselves. However, they may be spared this fate as Hemsel Hempstead have failed to obtain a 'B' grading and will not be joining Ford United and Northwood in Division One next season. Unless Hemsel win any appeal they may make, only two clubs will be relegated from Division One and Leatherhead could be saved.

A shaky start to the season saw our visitors pick up just one point from their first five matches, but this was followed by a seven match unbeaten run that took them up to 11th in the table. Two wins and three defeats followed before a disastrous run of 14 games without a win was ended with a 2-0 win at Staines. Their next match was also won (1-0 at Chertsey) but since then six further matches have failed to produce another win. They have to go back to December for their last home victory (4-1 v Braintree) but on their travels they have only lost once (5-0 at Uxbridge) in their last six visits to opponents grounds. Following our thoroughly deserved home wins over Worthing and Oxford can we finish the season with a third successive win on this ground?

Last Monday we visited Staines and I suppose it was inevitable what was going to happen there. We transfer Rocky Baptiste our leading goalscorer to them, he fails to make much of an impression in the games he plays for them before our visit, and then plays for the full ninety minutes against us scoring both goals in a 2-1 victory. One wonders what Lawrence Yaku will do when we meet Northwood next season. Since leaving us

he has found the net over fifty times this season!

As we approach the end of the 1999/2000 season we can but wonder how we would have fared had we been promoted to the Premier Division at the end of last season. Would we have held our own or would we now be in the bottom three about to drop back into Division One? We shall never know, what we do know is that we started this season full of hope that we would be up there once again challenging for promotion, and a good start of three wins and a draw in our opening four games augured well. However a home defeat against Bishop's Stortford, followed by only one win in our next seven league matches, soon upset our plans. Another poor spell between mid-December and mid-February (until we won at Leatherhead) saw all hope of promotion finally disappear. We now found ourselves anxiously looking over our shoulders at the teams below us with our thoughts now on avoiding the unthinkable, that of relegation. Recent results meant we could no longer finish in the bottom two places and Oxford's win at Leatherhead on Thursday ensured we would now finish clear of the three relegation places. It has certainly been a very

I certainly am not looking forward to the trek over to Chesham throughout next winter!

Gordon and Leo have taken it in turns to give us their views which have always made good reading; Graham Sharpe has been as controversial as ever and has ruffled a few feathers along the way; Mike Vincent has covered our previous matches in his own inimitable way (I've had to censor some of his comments from time to time unfortunately); and there have been regular contributions from Nick Dugard, Howard Krais and 'Fingers' Fruin as well as the occasional one from 'The Man In Black'. Manager's view by Leo Morris

Good afternoon everyone and welcome to our last home game of the season against Leatherhead.

Most of us, I think, will be glad to see the end of this season, not one of the Club's most successful and certainly not the sort of season we have become used to over the last four. In those previous years at this stage we have been battling for points to win promotion rather than stave off relegation! Mind you with the League's decision on Hemel Hempstead's ground grading meaning they cannot be promoted, we cannot go down whatever happens in our remaining games. Leatherhead still need points to make sure they don't finish in the bottom two so we know what to expect from them today.

With the news that Whyteleafe cannot be promoted from our division because of their ground grading, it could mean that Carshalton could be lucky for the second season running. They are currently third from bottom of the Premier and if they stay there and Whyteleafe finish in the top three, Carshalton will still be playing Premier Division

football next season. Last year, of course, they escaped at our expense.

After last season we kicked off this campaign with high expectations of repeating a top three finish and after our first four league games we had picked up ten points and were confident of having another good season. But after that burst of three wins out of the first four we have won only 9 more out of 35. It has been difficult to explain what has happened, we retained most of last season's squad adding to it what we thought were

good players, but we have performed way below our capabilities far too often.

It has been mentioned many times through the season in this column that the standard of the division has been very poor and should have been the season to get promotion. The one area that we had difficulty in competing was the physical side, we are not a particularly big side and always struggled against sides who played a more direct style of football and used physical strength to grind us down. If you look at the teams at the top of the table, none of them play a good passing game but they all work so hard and make it difficult to beat them. A good example of that was our recent game against Maidenhead, they never stopped working for the whole game and whenever we got the ball they were on us immediately, not just with one player but two and sometimes three, so we never had time or space to get going. At the back they take no chances, if the ball needs clearing they clear it whether it is 80 yards upfield or 80 yards over the stand!

This is one area we will have to improve next season, we have become too easy to beat, teams used to play us knowing that we would be very difficult to break down but this season we have lost that reputation and conceded far too many 'soft' goals. We should finish the season around mid-table and many teams would be happy with that position. What we must accept is that not every season can be as successful as the last three and we maybe need a season to take stock and rethink a few things. The problem at Wealdstone is that we expect to win all the time and find it difficult to accept when we don't. I'm not complaining about this, I wouldn't want it any other way, I certainly wouldn't want to be involved with a club who were happy with a high mid-table position every year and knowing that they probably won't ever get promoted. There are many teams like that in our division and teams finishing just above us, or around us, will consider their season to be successful.

We did have some success this season and it was probably the most important 'win' the club could get, that was the granting of permission to develop the Prince Edward

Playing Fields for our new stadium. Now all we need is the money!!

I would like to finish by thanking the Board of Directors for their support and all the people who work tirelessly behind the scenes to ensure this is a well run professional club. There are too many to mention individually but I would like to give a special mention to the guy who has the worst job in the club, kit man Graham Smith. He makes a great job of a thankless task and will be difficult to replace if he decides to retire.

Finally I must thank you all for your continued support through a difficult season, without you there would be no Wealdstone Football Club. Let's hope we can give you something to cheer about in this last home game.



MAIDENHEAD UNITED (AWAY)

It was a case of third time unlucky for Wealdstone, as we lost this twice previously postponed league match. We were certainly unlucky to go into the interval two goals down, but the second half was a complete nonentity, as we didn't manage a single worthwhile shot in anger, and therefore can have little complaint with the final result.

We started the livelier of the two sides, and nearly took the lead when Dominic Sterling (not Sterland, as at least two recent away programmes have had his name written) got his head to a cross from a short corner, but unfortunately the effort hit the bar instead of the net. This bad luck was compounded when within five minutes of this the home side took the lead in fortuitous circumstances. Darren Watts went to clear the ball, but instead of it landing safely in the proximity of the half way line, the ball cannoned off an onrushing attacker and looped into the unguarded net. After this we continued to match our promotion chasing opponents, and on 41 minutes we nearly grabbed an equaliser when Swaysland evaded the offside trap, but the keeper came out to block. I say 'evaded', but there is little doubt that he probably WAS offside, though this was missed by the female assistant referee. As with our earlier effort, within a few minutes Maidenhead scored. This time a left foot shot from the edge of the area was well saved by Watts, but the ball fell straight to the feet of a Magpies attacker who coolly prodded the ball in.

If we had to award points out of five for entertainment value, then this second half would have got minus five, as it was truly dire. Maidenhead were clearly the better side, but they cruised to victory without their lead being under threat at any stage in this half. They didn't need to play well either, simply being well organised was easily sufficient to quell a tired looking Stones side. So the game finished 2-0 to Maidenhead, and some of us wished we had stayed at home to watch the entertainment provided by the Manchester United v Real Madrid match instead (apart from those Stones fans who follow the fortunes of the Red Devils of course!).

OXFORD CITY (HOME)

We finally got the victory we all wanted that should all but secure our Division One status next season, though we nearly threw it away in the closing stages. If the second half at York Road merited -5 for entertainment, then this match made up for it

with plenty of goalmouth action.

It didn't start well for us though, as within eight minutes we were behind. An Oxford striker easily weaved his way past several unconvincing challenges before firing past an exposed Watts. "Like a knife through butter" was one comment, and it really was that simple. Instead of giving up though, this was the signal for Wealdstone to roll up those sleeves, and Lamb personified this as he surged forward and came close with a header that went agonisingly wide. A few minutes later Lamb was at it again, this time setting up Jones who shot just wide with a volley. It seemed only a matter of time before Wealdstone scored, and for once we were right. Thirty five minutes of the contest had gone when Swaysland burst through the middle, sidestepped a defender, then wrong footed the keeper with a quality finish. Two minutes later Swaysland nearly did it again, as he again ran through the heart of the Exford defence but chipped the ball over the keeper and over the bar. By this stage our opponents were resorting to foul play, and their number seven was extremely lucky to stay on the pitch after a particularly nasty two footed lunge. We totally dominated the end of the half, as we pushed to get the lead before the break. With five minutes of the half remaining, a cross from the left was met by the boot of Tilbury, but his fine effort was matched by an equally fine save. This obviously gave Tilbury a teste of glory, as a minute later he had another chance, but his header went just the wrong side of the post. Still we continued to press, and Jones made a complete mug out of the away side's number seven on the right hand side, and his cross was met by the head of Swaysland, but his header slid just wide. This really was a bombardment, and we deserved to go into the break in the lead, but it wasn't to be.

The Wealdstone pressure continued early in the second half, as in the fifty second minute a corner was played in, and a fierce shot (I think it was Lamb) hit the inside of the post and then was cleared off the line. This was the signal for Oxford to show their

intentions, as Sterling lost the ball, but thankfully Watts produced a fine save to tip the ball round the post. Then Swaysland had yet another chance, as he found himself clear on the left, but his first effort was saved by the goalkeeper, and his follow up was cleared by the lone defender on the line. On sixty one minutes Swaysland at last doubled his tally for the afternoon, though it was handed to him on a plate by some joke defending. Lamb found himself in the area with only the keeper to beat, but he scuffed his shot appallingly, and it seemed an easy task for the Oxford number four to clear. Inexplicably, he let the ball roll behind him straight to Swaysland, who gleefully slotted the ball home from six yards. It was a funny sight, end you could almost picture the defender with huge jackess ears like in the Tom & Jerry cartoons - Hee-Haw!! We continued to create chances after this, but as we reached the closing stages it was our opponents who looked the more likely to score. Thankfully Watts was in outstanding form, and after a shaky start to his Wealdstone career he really has got better and better with each game. He nearly gifted Oxford an equaliser though, as in the final ten minutes he dropped the ball to clear it, and was harassed by an opponent before finally averting the danger. It was rather too close for comfort though. With five minutes to go Swaysland had a chance to complete his hat trick after Lamb crossed from the right, but again it was just wide. With two minutes to go there was snother close call for us, as a long range effort beat Watts, but hit the top of the bar and bounced over to safety. Eventually the final whistle signalled a 2-1 victory to Wealdstone, and though it could and should have been by a lot more, the three points was all that mattered.

THIS AFTERNOON

Welcome to our last home game of the season, as we play a Leatherhead side who will be anxious to get all three points to aid their bid to beat the drop. I am writing these notes prior to Monday's game at Staines, and after today we conclude our season with two more away matches. I would like to thank Roy for all his assistance, and also thank our supporters for putting up with my ramblings. Last season was a very memorable one on the pitch, but was spoiled by decisions that denied us a deserved promotion. This season has been the opposite for us, as we have struggled around mid-table for most of the season after an awful run of form after Christmas. This summer though we hope to hear good news in relation to our plans to build a new ground at Prince Edward Playing Fields, and though success on the pitch is what we all come through the turnstiles for, the new ground is far more important for the future of this great football club. Enjoy Euro 2000, enjoy the Vinnie Jones documentary, enjoy the cricket season and have a fantestic summer — See ya in the pub and hopefully at a few cricket matches at Lords.

Junior `stones news with Paul 'Fingers' Fruin

Good afternoon and a very warm welcome to all our Juniors who have come along to the White Lion Ground to support Wealdstone in our final home league game of the season.

It doesn't seem that long ago since I sat down to write my first programme notes of the season way back in August. I remember wondering back then how the players and supporters would react to the disappointment of the previous season when the Stones had been denied our rightful promotion place by petty bureaucracy from the league management committee.

There was no way that we could hope to go on the type of run that we had at the back end of that season and no doubt we were due more than our fair share of injuries and bad luck this season, having used most of it up last season. Hopefully the lease here at the White Lion will be sorted out in the next few weeks and we won't have to make the trek over to Chesham every other week. Once I know what is happening I will write to you all to let you know as well.

A Short History of Leatherhead F.C.

In May 1946, two local Leatherhead clubs, Leatherhead Rose and Leatherhead United, merged and, as Leatherhead Football Club, entered the Surrey Senior League.

The Tanners, as they were nicknamed, won four successive Championships, before transferring to the Metropolitan League for one season. In 1951, Leatherhead became founder members of the Delphian League, before

progressing, in 1958, to the Corinthian League. 1963 was the final season of that League, and Leatherhead finished the season as its Champions. The Corinthian League then merged with the Athenian League, and in 1964 Leatherhead won Division One, thus earning promotion to the Premier Division.

In 1969, Leatherhead won its (so far) only Surrey Senior Cup success, defeating Redhill 3-1 at Sutton United's Gander Green Lane ground. Leatherhead also added the Surrey Senior Shield and the Surrey Intermediate Cup that year. This was the first occasion in which one club achieved this feat, and the Surrey FA awarded Leatherhead a special plaque to commemorate this still unique achievement.

The Seventies were nothing short of spectacular for the Tanners. In 1971, Leatherhead reached the first of their two FA Amateur Cup Semi-Finals, losing at Bolton's old Burnden Park ground 2-0 to the eventual winners Skelmersdale United. Two seasons later, the Tanners won election to the Isthmian League, and a year after that, in 1974, Leatherhead again reached the FA Amateur Cup Semi-Final. This time they were beaten at Millwall's old Den 1-0 by Ilford. Ilford then were beaten 4-1 in the Final by Bishop's Stortford in what became the last FA Amateur Cup Final. The 1974-75 season saw Leatherhead reach the FA Cup First Round Preper for the first time, and they the headlines with a bang in so doing.

Bishop's Stortford were beaten in a replay in the First Round, before the Tanners dispatched Colchester United in Round Two. Then, incredibly, Brighton and Hove Albion were beaten by the odd goal at the Goldstone Ground in the Third Round. After that came Leicester City at home in the Fourth Round, a match which was switched to Filbert Street. 32,000 people saw a dramatic match in which Peter McGillicuddy and Chris Kelly put the Tanners two goals up, and then saw a potential third cleared off the line. Leicester City heroically fought back to win 3-2. Further FA Cup victories against a Ron Atkinson managed Cambridge United in 1975 and Northampton Town in 1976 cemented Leatherhead's reputation as a giant killer.

Leatherhead finally reached Wembley in 1978 for the FA Trophy Final, but were soundly beaten 3-1 by an excellent Altrincham side. Micky Cook scored the Tanners consolation goal at the end of the match. That season saw Leatherhead also become losing finalists in the Isthmian League Cup and reach the First Round of the FA Cup for a fourth time, but were beaten by Swansea City. The Second Round was reached in 1979, with Colchester United gaining revenge for their defeat in 1974-75. The First Round was reached for the last time in 1980-81, an away defeat being handed out by Exeter City.

Unfortunately, in 1983, the Tanners endured a wretched season, being relegated from the Premier Division. On the way, eventual champions Sutton United defeated them 11-1. Two seasons later, Leatherhead were denied: premotion on goal difference by Kingstonian. During that season, the Tanners had three points deducted for an ineligible player.

The 1980s as a whole proved to be a struggle, as a succession of worked tirelessly in the name of Leatherhead. Billy Miller, Martin (formerly of Crystal Palace), Keith Mills, Micky Cook, Micky Leach Player). Roger Charland, Keith Oram, Adam Hill, John Cassidy, 1987 Fames all worked hard to achieve some sort of success

as well as avoiding relegation. The only major highlights were a defeat inflicted upon Wycombe Wanderers in the FA Trophy and a Southern Combination Cup Final win in 1990, beating Malden Vale to win the Cup. Unfortunately, that same season saw the Tanners relegated to Division Two. Terry Mills then became Leatherhead's manager.

In June 1995 the club converted to a limited company, and the new board of directors set about improving matters. Significant ground improvements were undertaken and are continuing with an "A-grading" the goal by March 2000. On the pitch results were still only average and as a result Mike Bailey became manager in January 1996. A run of poor cup results at the start of the 1996-97 season saw Keith Wenham taking Mike Bailey's place as team manager. In hindsight, this became an inspired appointment. The club scored 116 goals, finished runners up to Collier Row & Romford and achieved promotion to Division One. Life In the First Division proved to be more difficult, and although a respectable ninth place was achieved, the directors asked Keith to stand down and Gary Richards became the club's 10th manager in as many seasons.

At the end of that 1997-98 season, Leatherhead Reserves were runners-up to Fisher Athletic in the Suburban League South Division, and were winners of the Suburban League Challenge Cup, defeating Chesham United on penalties in the Final.

The 1998-99 season saw Gary Richards' appointment being confirmed, assisted by Ron Wilson, with Trevor Smith appointed as reserve team manager. However, matters failed to improve, and both Ron Wilson and Trevor Smith departed during the season. Keith Wenham re-assumed first team control and the club escaped relegation on the penultimate game of the season.

During the summer of 1999, former Millwall player Tommy Warrilow was appointed first team manager, with Gary Richards remaining at the club as his assistant. The reserves were scrapped and Alex Inglethorpe (Leyton Orient) was appointed as manager of the much enlarged and improved Youth Section of the club.


