

did, most pre-season friendlies are used to give various trialists the chance to show what they can do and the results are of secondary importance. No fewer than 54 players were used in those 9 friendlies and they are listed elsewhere in this programme.

We now get down to the serious business of picking up vital league points and today's visitors. Whyteleafe, will also be looking to open their league campaign with a win. Looking at their line-up at the back of this programme it would appear that they have retained most of last season's squad. Steve Lunn had given our visitors a 52nd minute lead with Brian Jones equalising nine minutes later. With about fifteen minutes to go, and the game heading for a draw, on came substitute Rocky who duly obliged with goals in the 82nd and 88th minutes to give us that win. I'm sure Whyteleafe will give us an equally tough time today, but with your support we have every chance of winning again.

Our next two games are both away. This coming Tuesday, 22nd August, we visit Thame United for a Ryman League fixture that kicks off at 7.30pm, then next Saturday, 26th August, we travel to Braintree Town for our third league match of the season. Our next game here at Edgware is on Bank Holiday Monday, 28th August, when Uxbridge are our visitors. Although this league fixture clashes with the Harrow Show we regret it has not been possible to arrange it for another day. As Uxbridge and ourselves could not agree on a kick off time acceptable to both clubs, it was left to the Ryman League to make the decision. They have decided that it will start at 3.00pm.

Enjoy today's game, let's give our lads every encouragement as they set about bringing us the desired result this afternoon.



MAJOR SPONSORSHIP DEAL FOR STONES

Wealdstone Football Club have secured a major sponsorship deal with Warwick Wright, one of the largest motor dealerships in the U.K.

Building on the successful partnership formed last season, Warwick Wright have agreed to be Stones major sponsor for the upcoming 2000/2001 season. Part of the new sponsorship package, a huge boost for the Stones, will be the provision of a Peugeot car for Stones team manager Gordon Bartlett.

Non-league clubs such as ourselves need to form partnerships with the local business community and there are undoubted benefits for everyone involved. Warwick Wright are part of the Robins and Day Group established in 1913 and the Warwick Wright name is synonymous with Peugeot in London. They have branches all over London but more locally in Edgware, Kenton and Brent Cross.

WIRRAL PROGRAMME CLUB 25th NON-LEAGUE FOOTBALL PROGRAMME OF THE YEAR SURVEY 1999/2000

The Wirral Programme Club survey of last season's non-League programmes resulted in ours being placed 37th nationally out of 1107 entries. We received 156 points. Newton Abbot Spurs (Westward Developments Devon League) were placed First with an astonishing 260 points, followed by Hoddesdon Town (Minerva Spartan South Midlands League) 210 points, and Languey Sports (Unijet Sussex County League) 191 points.

In the Ryman League (Division One) we were runners-up fifteen points behind Uxbridge with Bishop's Stortford third, seven points behind us. This meant that in each of our five seasons in the Ryman (formerly ICIS) League we had finished runners-up in the Division we were playing in at the time. With both Uxbridge and Northwood now in our Division it will be extremely difficult for us to maintain this record this season. Overall in the Ryman League our programme was placed 6th behind Northwood (189), Aldershot Town (177), Dagenham & Redbridge (176), Uxbridge (171) and Hitchin Town (157).

It should be noted that the programmes were surveyed, not as many assume voted upon. Marks were awarded to each programme as follows: - Cover (design, match details). Page Size, Team Layout and position within the programme, Results, League Tables, Price. Pictures, Printing and Paper Quality, Frequency of Issue, Value for money (this takes into account the ratio of adverts to content, the clubs league etc.), Contents (other than those listed) taking into account their relevance to the club, its league, environs etc., the size of print used, the spacing between lines, the size of the margins, and if the contents are original or reproduced (from League Bulletins, newspapers, magazines etc.). To gain full marks in the Frequency of Issue section programmes from 10 different current season matches were required for each team entered (allowances were made if ten home games had not been played by the closing date and the Wirral Programme Club had been informed of this), the minimum entry was one programme. As many programmes varied from issue to issue all the programmes received were surveyed, the marks in each section totalled and divided by the number of issues to get the final mark for each section, the marks from each section were then totalled to get the final score. We duly submitted ten, as did the other Ryman clubs mentioned above.

Gratitude also goes to Pan Symeou and his new board of directors at Edgware Town FC for their professionalism in handling our groundshare problems. For the next two seasons until the new stadium comes to fruition we very much look forward to cementing

our relationship with the new regime.

The biggest problem other than financial has as I say been the effect on team planning and has set us back at least three weeks from where we would like to be and has

been a very frustrating time for Gordon, Leo and Chris.

You, the supporters, wanted us to stay at the White Lion and we as a Board have always listened to your views even if sometimes we have not, through pressures imposed upon us, always communicated as effectively as we would have wanted to. We have done what you wanted and I am now asking you to help us again to sustain our finances and help us to get back what we have lost. In the practical sense this means sponsoring matchballs, filling the kit grid and boosting the Teamdraw memberships etc, etc.

Elsewhere in the programme you will read about the latest developments regarding Prince Edward Playing Fields. The workload on Kip and all the directors over the last few weeks has been overwhelming. An example of this was last Monday when Nick DuGard decided to register the number of incoming calls to his home. It was more than 40!

So on to a new season and without doubt the most important one of our 100 years

existence

Finally, let's now drive the Club forward to better things and really get behind the boys on the park - starting today. Thank you for your fantastic support.

Manager's view by Gordon Bartlett

Welcome to the White Lion Ground for our first home league match of the 2000/01 season against a Whyteleafe side who I'm sure are looking to build on their good league position and excellent FA Cup run last season. Their pre-season results also look pretty healthy so I'm sure we are in for a difficult afternoon.

It seems incredible that our 'home ground' situation was only finally sorted out last Saturday which has not only caused major problems for the Club, but also caused me many headaches in trying to sign players. The uncertainty has undoubtedly cost us the services of four individuals, but especially disappointing is the departure of Paul McKay after four years at the club. He certainly didn't want to go but his reason for leaving... the travel problems caused by our move to Chesham! (He works in London but lives in Leatherhead). How do we feel now that we are back at Edgware and he has already signed for Leatherhead!!

Other departures are Andy Peaks (Stamford), Dave Tilbury (Boreham Wood), Dominic Sterling (Hayes), Phil Dicker (Hampton) and Paul Benning (retired). I must mention my holiday again this year as it seemed so popular with the likes of Brian Jones and Lee Walker last season. 

STONES TO PRESS MINISTER FOR HELP TO SAVE PLAYING FIELDS

Wealdstone Football Club are stepping up their campaign to save the derelict Prince Edward Playing Fields and provide a new home for the currently homeless Ryman League club.

Along with Harrow East MP Tony McNulty they will meet with Minister for Sport Kate Hoey MP early on September 6th at the House of Commons. The Club will take the opportunity to put the case in detail for the Prince Edward Playing Field Project that is currently awaiting a decision from the National Lottery Sports Fund on their £3.1m application.

Project Director Kip Hewitt said, "We are delighted to be able to talk directly to the Minister and it will give us the opportunity to explain all the various aspects of the project and its benefits for the community in detail. We are grateful again for the support given us by Tony McNulty in helping to arrange this meeting that we view as very important."

The scheme, which has been described by the Football Association as "the most significant grass roots development in the Country", will provide multi-sport facilities for local clubs and individuals of all age groups, especially the young.

It is also proposed that this facility will act as a proactive link, with local schools using the facilities for both extra curriculum sport and education.

The project has gained planning permission and support from all the relevant governing bodies of sport, the Local Authority and Sport England.

WHYTELEAFE FOOTBALL CLUB BRIEF HISTORY 1946 - 2000

Affiliated: Surrey County Football Association

The club was reformed in 1946 after World War 11, as Whyteleafe F.C., previously being known as Whyteleafe Albion. They commenced Junior football as members of the Caterham and Edenbridge League, Thornton Heath & Dist, and Croydon League's. Season 1951-1952, was the most successful, being Thornton Heath League Champions, Winners of two local Charity Cups and runners up in the Surrey County Junior Cup and League Cup.

In 1954 they progressed to The Surrey County Intermediate League (Eastern) and—were Div.1. Champions in Season 1955-56. 1958 saw the transition from Junior to Senior status, and entry into the Surrey Senior League, this change required the club to move from the New Barn Lane School Ground, as it was inadequate for Senior Football. So with a dynamic Committee under the leadership of Secretary Dick Baxendine, the club purchased approx. 4 acres of farmland in Church Road, which is where they are today. Many man hours of voluntary work was required by the committee and the members to raise the funds to not only purchase the land but to finance the change of the ground to a football pitch, as well as convert the existing Farm buildings into a Clubhouse with Bar and Dressing rooms. The original scheme was to include a running track and a cricket table, but unfortunately this did not prove to be a viable proposition.

Play commenced on the ground in season 1959-60, and in the early 60's the club gained minor rewards with the reserve team playing under the guidance of Roy Greenwood (ex Palace), the next success came in 1968-69 as Surrey Senior League Champions, and were runners up to Bracknell Town in the League Cup. This was under the guidance of Tom Sweetman, Manager, with Les Brown the ex Wimbledon and Guildford City, Amateur International as Player/coach, Les went on to become manager for a short while. In the 70's the Floodlight training area and stand were built, and in 1975 after 17 happy years with the Surrey Senior League the club moved into the London Spartan League, where the best they achieved was 3rd place on two occasions in the six years of their membership, and in 1981 the club joined the Athenian League. It was at about this time in the early 80's that the Floodlights were installed and the dressing rooms were moved to a new location on the top bank, this enabled the clubhouse to be extended. In 1980-81 the club reached the 5th round of the F.A Vase losing to Basildon Utd. Season 1984-85 saw the club move with the amalgamation of the Athenian League and the formation of Division 2 North and South of the Isthmian League, becoming members of the Southern Division, 1985-86 saw another 5th round F.A. Vase defeat at the hands of Stevenage Borough.

In November 1986 Steve Kember joined the club as Football Manager having been associated with the club for some years previously when with the Palace, and in two successive seasons engineered the club through to the 3rd Qualifying round of the F.A. Cup, Loosing to Woking in 1988-89, and Wokingham in 1989-90, after having held them to a 1-1 draw at Wokingham. In 1988-89 the club gained promotion as Runners-up in Div.2 South to Div 1. During this period the Youth Team had a number of successes in the Southern Youth League and the League Cup, in season 1989-1990.

Steve resigned in July 1993 returning to Crystal Palace as a coach. Paul Hinshelwood was appointed manager and following the resignation of his assistant Keith Wilkinson in October 1993, Lee Richardson became assistant Manager/coach. August 1994 saw Lee Richardson appointed manager, this was a very popular appointment, as Lee been associated with the club on and off since 1975, he played in excess of 400 games for the Club, and whilst he spent time at various other clubs in the area, he always returned to the Leafe, his first season in charge must be seen as a successful one finishing mid table in Division 1, The 1995-6 season saw the reserves win the Southern Div of the Suburban League, under the guidance of Bernie Donnelly, who is now assistant manager.

November 1993 saw the sudden death of President and past Chairman Fred Ovenden, a sad loss to the Club. Tony Lidbury was confirmed as President, and Paul Owens as Chairman. In 1995 Club Patron and founder Harold Cowie passed away, he will always be remembered through the 'Cowie' Clubman of the Year Trophy.

The club in the past ran junior teams on Sundays, In 1996 this was resurrected, Mark Coote became Youth development officer, with Graham Douce the Youth and Junior Secretary. The club has continued the ground development with the covered section behind the bottom goal.

Season 1998-99 proved to be very mixed, with the club achieving good cup results loosing to Welling United in sight of a first round visit to Bristol Rovers in the F.A.Cup, and winning through to the last 32 in the F.A.Trophy, going out to the eventual winners Kingstonian in front of a record home crowd of 945. A season of chronic injury saw us struggle to survive in the league and avoiding relegation by winning the last game of the season.

Buoyed by the Cup successes of the previous season 1999-2000 proved the most momentous in the club's history. For the first time ever the club reached the 1st Round proper of the F.A Cup when a crowd of 2164, easily beating the previous season's record, saw them hold league opponents Chester City to a 0-0 draw before going down 1-3 in a replay at Chester. The impressive Church Road stand was completed in time, thanks to a superb effort from all involved with the club, andto a program of continued ground improvement undertaken. To cap this a highest ever league position of 7th was attained.

DANNY ROSE. GOALKEEPER. With The Leafe since 1993, started in the reserves before making his Isthmian League debut against Staines in Jan 1994, has been regular first team since, only missing a few League matches through a damaged wrist during season 1997-98, but broke a bone in his foot in the Cup match versus Dulwich Hamlet causing him to be sidelined for many weeks, previously with Croydon Athletic.

DEAN HOWLAND. MIDFIELD/DEFENDER. A local product of the very successful youth teams from seasons 1988-89 and 1989-90, who progressed through the reserves to command a regular first team spot over the past few seasons, Dean is a very versatile team member who again last season suffered a number of injury problems which hopefully are now behind him.

NIGEL GOLLEY. MIDFIELD. Signed from Sutton United at the start of 1996-7 season coming in October 1996, after making some 680 appearances and scoring some 84 goals for the United, he returns to the Leafe where he started as a Youth. The club enjoyed his experience and ability which resulted in becoming Players Player and Player of the year 1997-98. A member of the Sutton Utd. team that knocked Coventry City out of the F.A Cup

DUNCAN ALGER. MIDFIELD. Progressed through from the reserves at the end of the 1995-96 season, and has further developed over the past seasons to command a regular first team place, a previous Selsdon Junior, and a player who has yet to achieve his full potential.

DAVID McSHERRY. FORWARD. Another who progressed from the reserves and one who made quite an impact during the course of 1996-7 season, most especially in scoring a hat trick against Worthing in the early part of the season. Has been racked by injury for the last 2 seasons.

PHIL DAWSON. PLAYER / COACH. Joined the Leafe season 1997-98 and became an integral part of the team, so much so that has been appointed to the position of coach in the Summer of 1998 season, previously with Sutton United and also a member of the victorious team against Coventry

MATT MARTIN Reserve keeper, signed from Chipstead at the start of last season but has performed well in when recently standing in for the injured Rose

GARY ELLIOTT. DEFENDER. Has been with the Club for five seasons since signing from Carshalton Athletic, had been out of the game for some period due to injury, his long throws and accurate free kicks are a speciality.

DANNY ARKWRIGHT. CENTRAL DEFENDER. Danny returned to the club at the start of the 1998-99 season having spent 1997-98 season with Epsom & Ewell, Danny originally progressed through the Junior and Youth teams with the Leafe as well as playing for the Reserves in the Suburban League before going to Epsom.

MATT KEMBER. MIDFIELD. Mat returns to the club having played for Molesey in season 1998-99, he has had a number of seasons with the club starting when father Steve was our Manager.

LEION DILLON. FORWARD.. Signed for the club at the start of Season 1998-99, previously with Palace Youth and Baldock Town, and very short periods with Crawley and Croydon. Useful goal getter, just returning to fitness having been absent since July with a knee injury.



Wealdstone Youth Team 2000/01

The summer may be the close season for the first team, but it's been a summer of hard work with the youth team boys. As many of you will already know last season saw Wealdstone Football Club enter into the PASE (Programme for Academic and Sporting Excellence) scheme set-up. PASE is a national scheme run by Bedford College which offers students the opportunity to become involved in football and study for an academic diploma at the same time. Students have 15 hours of academic study along with another 15 hours of coaching, football related matters and a match each week. The course can be taken for one year to give a student a B-Tsch first diploma or for two years which leads to a B-Tech national diploma.

Last year we ran with 20 or so boys on a one year course with the option to keep them on to study for the B-Tech national this coming year. On the footballing front the club entered the Allied Counties Youth Leaque for Under 18's, playing home games on a

Wednesday evening at Viking Greenford Football Club.

Around March time this year the Club took the decision to run both a one and two year course this coming year. That meant we needed around forty new boys coming in and allowing for the students from last year to stay with us or move on to other things.

About ten of last year's intake are staying on.

At the same time the Club were invited to become founder members of the Nationwide Conference PASE Youth League. Three trial nights were held in June with over 120 players attending them. Forty were chosen by Gordon, Francis Joseph and John Smith, plus another three lads who have still one more year at school and were offered a place for next

Pre-season training started on the 31st July and the first friendlies were played on Wednesday & Thursday of this week against Kingsbury reserves and Hendon reserves Tomorrow (Sunday) we play Wembley Youth at Broadfields with a 2pm kick off and this coming Wednesday (23rd) we play SFC Wealdstone, again at Broadfields, kick off 6.30pm.

The boys are also in action the following night with another away fixture.

Kingsbury Town FC is the venue for all our home fixtures this season. Our Nationwide Conference games are played on Wednesday afternoons (please check for kick off times) and the league gets under way week commencing 2nd October. The league is split into Northern, Midland and Southern Conference; we play in the Southern and are joined by Dagenham & Redbridge, Dover Athletic, Gravesend & Northfleet, Hitchin Town, Kingstonian. Stevenage Borough and Welling United.

The Allied Counties games are due to start in early September and are played on Wednesday evenings with a 7.30pm kick off. Fixtures, kick off times and league tables

will appear in this column.

In the FA Youth Cup we have been given a bye in the 1st Qualifying Round and will travel to the winners of Soham Town Rangers or Histon in the 2nd Qualifying Round, again midweek.

We will be using coaches for most of our away games and if you wish to travel with

us please see Graham Jones or myself ('Fingers' Fruin) for details.

I'll end with a quick introduction to our backroom team. Stephanie Chittenden and Jason are our tutors for the year and without them we could not run PASE. Francis Joseph our coach played for the Stones before going on to make a career for himself in the pro-game. Francis will take the day to day running of the football course and holds a UFFA B licence. John Smith will assist Francis. He is a qualified up and coming coach who also works with Barnet. Finally Graham Jones and myself will act as joint secretaries, who between us will look after both the academic and football administration side of the course.

Ryman league news

Isthmian League takes re-structuring issue to the FA

The usual peace of the close season was shattered on Friday 14th July when Ryman League Chairman Alan Turvey was read a prepared statement from the Football Conference while he was attending an FA seminar. The statement revealed the Conference plans to recognise only the Northern Premier and the Southern Leagues as feeder competitions from the 2002/3 season.

Within 24 hours of the Conference making their announcement publicly the League's Management Committee had met to discuss the issue. League Secretary Nick Robinson has written to Steve Parkin, the newly appointed Director of the National Game Board - which has the task of restructuring the game below the Nationwide League.

The Ryman League has been actively involved in discussions with both the Northern Premier and Southern Leagues over the restructuring of the football pyramid, and in particular looked at ways of dividing the south of the country between the Isthmian and Southern Leagues. The Southern League eventually withdrew from the discussions when an agreement in principle was about to be reached. It is now known to the Isthmian League that the Conference have had additional meetings with the other two leagues, to which the Isthmian League was not invited.

The Conference plan has not been sanctioned by the Football Association, and the Isthmian League Chairman Alan Turvey, recently elected to the main board of the FA, is taking the issue to the highest levels within Lancaster Gate. He hopes to get all the issues debated in an open and democratic way to ensure the best interests of all clubs, both within this League and non league football as a whole, are served.

Since the initial announcement by the Conference they have made no further public statements and while the Isthmian League plan to hold a meeting for all its clubs, at present there are no definitive matters to discuss.

League welcomes two new clubs

The Annual General Meeting of the Ryman Football League confirmed the promotion of Arlesey Town and Ashford Town (Middlesex) and the return of Sutton United to the League after a season in the Football Conference. The meeting, held at Yeading FC, also elected Chairman and Managing Director Alan Turvey as President of the League. The post has been vacant since the death of Barry East in 1997. Alan, who will continue with his current roles, was first connected with the League as a match official in 1961 and has been an officer since 1978. He succeeded Mr East as Chairman in 1982. Nick Robinson was elected a Life Member of the League In recognition of his 25 years service to the competition - the last 18 as Secretary. The meeting elected Ryman Group Chairman Theo Paphitis and Marketing Director Malcolm Cooke as Vice Presidents.

QPR stalwart arrives at Wingate

Wingate & Finchley have announced the signing of Clive Wilson, ex-Q.P.R. & Spurs as player/coach for 2000/2001. The club believes Wilson will bring class in the midfield and having played under such as Terry Venables, George Graham and Ray Wilkins will bring a wealth of experience to the Blues

Beveree pitch work faces cash drought

Hampton & Richmond Borough commenced work on their Beveree pitch to install a drainage system in May and contractors E & S Sportsground Contractors were well into the work when news came through that the club's grant application had been refused. Hampton & Richmond had approached a local charity, the Hampton Fuel Allotments for £30,000 to install a complete drainage and irrigation system at the ground. The Fuel Allotments Charity have assets of £40m and are allowed to issue up to £1.5m per year in grants to worthy causes in the Hampton community. Having believed they could expect a favourable decision, the club went ahead and ordered the works to be done mindful the pitch needed to be fit for use at the end of July. The news that the grant had been refused meant a quick re-appraisal of the works in hand had to be carried out as the club was now faced with covering the total cost out of its own resources. The additional irrigation system has been cancelled but the club have at least been able to install drains, a soakaway and sand slits which should improve pitch conditions at the Beveree. However the club will now be unable to extend its successful Saturday Mini-Soccer Coaching School and in fact will have to reduce the age grouping from 5-11 years of age to 5 to 10 years.

Carshalton hit by fire

Fire has destroyed the club house at Carshalton Athletic's Colston Avenue ground. The blaze was contained to the offices and boardroom, but the dressing rooms and function room were spared. Then Chairman Andrew Hay described it as a disastrous day for the club, but was thankful no-one was hurt in the blaze. He also paid tribute to the fans who had given their help in the clear up operation and neighbouring clubs who have also offered assistance. The club had spent around £20,000 in recent years on improving the parts of the ground which have now been destroyed. Also lost in the fire were a number of irreplaceable items from the club's past. With the stands and dressing rooms still intact the club are confident they will be able to stage league games at home when the season starts in August.

Howse takes charge at Leatherhead

Leatherhead have appointed Clive Howse as their new boss and he will be assisted by his long-time friend Alan "Chick" Botley. Howse is the former number two to non-league football's most successful manager of all time Kingstonian's Geoff Chapple. Howse also brings Ryman League experience with Chertsey Town and Bracknell Town. Together with Botley the pair will be a formidable team to reckon with in non league football. Botley recently took Hampton to three promotions in five years. Howse joins the Tanners who only a couple of months ago were saved by a dedicated group of supporters and the formation of a brand new management board. Howse stressed: "The players will consist of a lot of youth and older heads to keep the team up. I have got a list as long as my arm for new players" said Howse. "But nobody will make a decision this early on. The team that plays in our first preseason friendly will probably be very different to the one that will start the season." Howse is said to be thrilled with his new appointment and believes that the club will go a long way.

Capacity grows at York Road

Maidenhead United have completed the restructuring of the Canal End of the ground. The whole terracing was replaced increasing the ground capacity by 1,000. Planning permission to build an enclosure for 500 fans has been lodged. Funds for the new project have been raised by a supporters organisation known as "Standald". A new pitch perimeter fence has also been installed. The new playing surface was not guite ready for the start of the pre-season campaign and friendlies against West Ham and Brentford were called off.

Hemel keeper moves north

Albanian international Lulian Gieloshi, a keeper at Hemel Hempstead Town last season, has been given a tryout at Scotlish side Partick Thistle. The 25-year old arrived in the UK last September. His application for political asylum was granted and he has also been given a work permit, allowing him to play professional football. Gjeloshi played 15 games with Hemel on their way to winning Division Two. In his native Albania he can also claim 10 caps at under-21 level, three callups to the squad and has also played for the under-16s and under-18s.

Windsor team boss steps down

After five and a half years Alan Davies has indicated that he wishes to take a break from the pressure of football management and has tendered his resignation as manager of Windsor & Eton. The Board, in accepting his resignation, have expressed their appreciation for the support given to the club during that period, which has seen a significant advancement in the fortunes of the club. Having gained promotion from the Third Division scoring more goals than any other club in the Ryman League in the 1995/6 season, the club has since reached the final of the Vandanel Trophy, the quarter finals of the Berks & Bucks Cup and fifth in the Second Division in the last two seasons. In resigning Alan Davies said that he wished to thank the club, its directors and members for the support which has been given to him and for the enjoyment which he has gained from rebuilding the team to one now capable of winning promotion. Assistant Manager Byron Walton has taken the step up to Caretaker Manager for the time being.

Crowds flock to Worthing

A crowd of over 3,200 attended Worthing's opening pre-season friendly against Brighton & Hove Albion's first team. This is the third successive year that the Albion have played Worthing in a pre-season match and the club was delighted that last year's attendance of 2,450 was well and truly beaten. Worthing have played hosts to the Albion Reserves for the past three years, while the club goes through a difficult period. with the first team playing at Gillingham and then Withdean, the Brighton Athletics Track. During this time, Worthing have built up a "special relationship" with the Albion and thanks to the support of the Ryman League, they can look forward to a fourth year of holding Avon League Matches for the Albion Reserves.


