Hello one and all, welcome to the White Lion ground for our first league fixture of the 2001/02 season. Our visitors this afternoon are Bromley who we met in our final game last season. To their players, officials and supporters we extend our usual warm welcome and hope they will have a pleasant time whilst in our company. This welcome is also extended to our three match officials, referee Ian Whan and his two assistant referees, Richard Sidlin and David Carman.

As mentioned above our final Ryman League match last season was against Bromley. On that occasion we visited them at their Hayes Lane ground where we were comprehensively beaten 4-0. This gave the Kent club ample revenge for the 4-1 defeat we inflicted upon them when they visited us in mid-April and at the same time lifted them above us in the final league table.

At the time of Bromley's last visit to us they had lost six league matches in a row with us making it seven. Worse was to follow as they lost the next three to complete ten gemes without a point. The threat of relegation was now a real possibility, but a 1-1 draw at home to Thame stopped the rot and was the start of an unbeaten run of three wins and two draws in their final five league fixtures. So, like us, they breathed a huge sigh of relief as the threat of relegation was finally overcome. Bromley finished the season in 18th spot, just three points and one place above us, with Leatherhead. Romford and Barton Rovers the three immediately below us being relegated.

For the last two seasons Fergus has been with Hemel Hempstead Town and three of his colleagues there have now signed for us as well, Andy Carter (a former Edgware Town goalkeeper), Vinny Somers and Richard McDonagh.

Another former player we welcome back is Bryan Hammatt. He was with us for the 1996/97 season playing in 48 of our league & cup matches and finishing leading goalscorer with 28. We need someone up front who can score regularly and Bryan has proved in the past that he can do just that. Making his first appearance of the season in our friendly at Berkhamsted last Saturday he delighted the Stones fans present by

scoring both our goals in a 2-2 draw.

Other additions to our squad are Danny Gibbs who was with Edgware Town last season, Ricky Pither (Wembley), Jason Shaw (Hampton & Richmond Borough), Tom Bryson (Hayes), Ocatunji Bamgbola (Maidstone United), Shayne Chandler (Enfield), Tom Hupe and goalkeepers Nathan Cobb and 17 year old David Godfrey. We hope that they will all have a happy and successful time with the Stones.

Among last season's squad no longer with us are Brian Jones who has joined Boreham Wood, Carl Holmes (Stamford), Wayne Carter (Northwood), Perry Norman (Dulwich Hamlet)

and goalkeeper Darren Watts.

In three days time, on Tuesday 21st August, we visit Walton & Hersham for our second Ryman League fixture of the new season, the match kicking off at 7.45pm. This means that our first two league matches will have been against clubs we met in our final two games last season, Walton & Hersham having visited the White Lion ground just two days before we travelled to Bromley for our final game. Last season we picked up six points from Bromley's visit to us and our trip to Walton, so let's look for a repeat performance over the next few days.

#### From the Chairman Paul Rumens

Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen, and welcome back for a new season along with the trials and tribulations that inevitably go with it. Unlike this time last year with the problems over where we would be playing, Gordon, Leo and Chris have been able to prepare properly for the new campaign and the early indications over performances and results have been encouraging. In light of there being no relegation this season the club are embarking on a 2-year rebuilding programme with the expressed aim of having a team challenging for trophies when we take up residence in our new home. Once all the finances and legal agreements have been put together for the stadium, Gordon will sign a new 3-year contract and take on the role of Director of Football.

The work load during the close season has been immense off the field, so I, and my fellow directors, have made some timely and strategic changes to the Board. Roger Slater, Howard Krais and Paul Fruin have been appointed in key areas. Firstly Roger, although for the time being remaining as football club secretary, has taken on the role of media/public relations coupled with stadium development. By profession Roger is a building services project manager. Secondly, Howard Krais has joined to fill the short term role of commercial director with the longer view of overseeing all marketing areas of the club in the lead up to the stadium and beyond. Howard's work background is in internal marketing and communications. Lest, but by no means least, Paul Fruin has been chosen to bolster the line-up as Director of Youth Football encompassing both the PASE set-up and improving our links with Wealdstone Juniors.

In addition to our new directors, the club has received enormous ongoing contributions from Patrick O'Neill and Ray Kemp as unpaid consultants to the stadium project. Patrick's occupation is as a financial director specialising in new company start-ups, whilst Ray's expertise lies in the field of projects and human resources. I truly now feel we have the best professional team off the pitch since I took over the

reigns in early 1993.

On a personal level, many of you over the years have known how difficult it has been for me to combine my role as chairman of the club and continue to run my business as an insurance broker, and at times it has involved a considerable amount of soul searching. On many occasions I have even put the club before my family, which I am hardly proud of. My tenure at the club has been further undermined with the devastating news of the death of my only business partner Alan Wisbey on June 22nd. Alan and I started Jardine Faber 18 years ago and have worked with each other for over 24 years, so effectively my right arm to the business has been severed. Alan leaves behind two sons, David and Peter, and his fiancee Elaine. The repercussions of Alan's loss has been dreadful to all concerned to say the least. The resultant consequences have left me with no alternative but to temporarily stand down as chairman and take a sabbatical away from football affairs for a few months which I am sure you will all understand. I will still be consulted on all major issues and will still make major decisions. In the interim Nick DuGard will be heading up all non-football related tasks, while Nick Symmons will be in charge of all football related issues. As ever I thank you on behalf of the club for all your support.

#### PRINCE EDWARD PLAYING FIELD PROJECT

In October 2000, as I'm sure most of you know, we were informed that the National Lottery were changing the way that they would grant assist new, grassroots, football specific projects. The National Lottery would part fund the Football Foundation, and that organisation would then be the funding body that football based schemes would apply to for funding assistance.

As our initial discussions with the Football Foundation progressed it became clear that they would not accept any applications for grant funding in excess of £1m. This left the Prince Edward Playing Field Project with a serious funding shortfall and a solution had to be found and had to be found fast. We needed a solution that would not only provide the necessary funding to ensure the progression of the project, but it would also need to fit with the remit laid down by the Local Authority to provide

affordable and accessible community sport, leisure and recreation. We also had to find a solution that could be achievable in planning terms.

Following extensive negotiation, consultation and research, it was concluded that a health and fitness facility could provide the answers. It could provide substantial private investment, it could add to the leisure provision on the site and hopefully it would be acceptable to the local residents and planning authority.

After discussing the project with a number of consultants and operators we felt that a 30,000 square foot health and fitness facility could provide the required funding as well being achievable within the tight planning constraints of the playing field site. Consequently, we again headed down the well trodden path of obtaining the relevant planning consent. After much lobbying and consultation with local residents, councillors and planning officials, Harrow Council's planning committee granted outline planning permission for the inclusion of a 30,000 square foot health and fitness facility on Wednesday 2nd May 2001.

With the planning permission in place we then had to embark on the task of turning this planning gain into the financial investment we required to progress the project. We have, to date, had discussions with over twenty-five different health and fitness operators, leisure consultants and development professionals. During all these discussions we had to ensure that the long term viability and security of the football club was paramount. We had to secure the football club and its ability to generate income for the next 125 years (the period of the lease on Prince Edward Playing Fields) and provide extensive community facilities.

Many of these operators fell at the first hurdle; they were looking at a straight rental/lease situation, and were reluctant to commit to a capital investment. We investigated the possibility of raising finance on the back of a lease covenant but this proved not to be a viable option.

following very careful analysis of all the available options, we have for the last six months been working very closely with a company called Stadia Management. Based in Edinburgh they have close links with the Bank of Scotland. We are currently negotiating a unique partnership agreement with Stadia Management that, we believe, is far superior to anything that has been proposed by any other operator. Once negotiations are complete we will explain the proposals at the next AGM or if necessary at an EGM.

We are working hard with our lawyers to finalise a set of proposals to produce 'Heads of Terms' and a viable business plan. These proposals will be presented to the Bank of Scotland and the Football Foundation this month to verify that the structure and business plan is acceptable. We will then call an EGM and fully present the proposals to members and shareholders.

You may think that it's taking forever to conclude any agreement with a potential health and fitness operator/partner, but please don't forget that any decision made today will have ramifications for the Club for the next 125 years. We are determined to provide the club with the best possible future we can, with the time constraints we have set ourselves.

By the time this article is published we will have had our final pre-application meeting with the Football Foundation and our application will be submitted by the end of the month. The application is due to be determined by the end of October.

I have received notification from the New Opportunities fund that the Prince Edward Playing Field Project is one of their preferred schemes in London and we have finally been invited to submit our Expression of Interest Form. This will then determine whether we will be invited to make a formal application for funding. It may well seem long-winded; well let me tell you it is. Because this scheme is not an 'open application' process, once you have been invited to make the formal application the likelihood of a successful outcome is increased. However, as ever, there are never any guarantees with such a process.

We continue to work with Sport England to progress an application to the National Lottery for top-up funding for the non-football elements of the project. Progression is also engoing with other grant giving organisations such as the John Lyon Charitable Trust, the London Marathon Charitable Trust, the Lawn Tennis Association and others.

Further updates will appear in this programme as matters progress.



### WIRRAL PROGRAMME CLUB 26th NON-LEAGUE FOOTBALL PROGRAMME OF THE YEAR SURVEY 2000/01

The Wirral Programme Club survey of last season's non-League programmes resulted in ours being placed 37th nationally out of 1103 entries. We received 161 points. Hoddesdon Town (Minerva Spartan South Midlands League) were placed First with 217 points, followed by Northwood (Ryman League) 209 points, and Langney Sports (Unijet Sussex County League) and Bryntirion Athletic (Wales) 199 points.

In the Ryman League (Division One) we were third behind Northwood and Uxbridge. From my point of view being placed third in our division was the best I had hoped for as Northwood always finish near the top nationwide and Uxbridge had finished top of Division One the previous season, Northwood were of course in Division Two then.

Overall in the Ryman League our programme was placed 6th behind Northwood (209), Aldershot Town (184), Uxbridge (179), Arlesey Town (177) and Sutton United (174).

When one considers that most clubs have their programme printed professionally by outside companies I don't think we do too badly considering ours is compiled, printed

and collated by my brother and myself at home.

It should be noted that the programmes were surveyed, not as many assume voted upon. Marks were awarded to each programme as follows:— Cover (design, match details), Page Size, Team Layout and position within the programme, Results, League Tables, Price, Pictures, Printing and Paper Quality, Frequency of Issue, Value for money (this takes into account the ratio of adverts to content, the clubs league etc.), Contents (other than those listed) taking into account their relevance to the club, its league, environs etc., the size of print used, the spacing between lines, the size of the margins, and if the contents are original or reproduced (from League Bulletins, newspapers, magazines etc.). To gain full marks in the Frequency of Issue section programmes from 6 different current season matches were required for each team entered (allowances were made if six home games had not been played by the closing date and the Wirral Programme Club had been informed of this), the minimum entry was one programme. As many programmes varied from issue to issue all the programmes received were surveyed, the marks in each section totalled and divided by the number of issues to get the final mark for each section, the marks from each section were then totalled to get the final score.

We duly submitted six, as did the other Ryman clubs mentioned above. Three areas where we fail to pick up points are Price, Pictures and Team Layout not being on the back cover. I'm afraid there is nothing I can do to rectify these three areas.

Our record in this Survey since rejoining the Isthmian League six years ago is as follows:-

#### **Wealdstone Youth Team 2001/02**

Good afternoon and welcome back to Wealdstone FC for our first league game of the 2001/02 season.

The first question I ask myself is when did last season end and the new one begin for the youth set-up? The youth team played their last game of the season on Thursday, 7th June, when we went down 4-1 to Edgware Town in the final of the Middlesex Senior Youth Cup. Work on putting together this season's PASE squad had started about a month before that with trial invites being sent out to something like 120 players. Just four days after the final we held our Open Evening at Broadfields for all those players interested in joining the PASE scheme and our thanks go to Simon Stewart and David Bass from Bedford College for putting on an excellent presentation.

A week later we held two trial nights from which we took 60 players onto a final trial night ten days later. At that final trial we took on 32 players to take our youth team squad back up to some sixty odd players for this coming season. On Monday, 16th July, the young Stones were back in pre-season training.

My personal thanks, and indeed those of the board of directors, go to one of our unsung heroes, Graham Jones, who has put a tremendous amount of work into the youth set-up over the closed season. #### **Ryman league news**

Season end brought forward

Following the decision by the Football Association to stage the FA Cup final on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> May, the last day on which league fixtures are planned in the Ryman League 2001-2002 season will be Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> April. As has been the custom in past seasons the League Cup final will be played during the week following the final Saturday of the League campaign.

Seven former Ryman Refs make the grade

The first 24 match officials selected to become full time officials by the Football Association, seven have progressed to the top of their trade via the Ryman League. Graham Barber, Steve Bennett, Andy D'Urso, David Elleray, Mark Halsey, Graham Poll and Rob Styles have all been on the League's list during their career. Under the new scheme they will be paid a retainer and undertake regular training courses as well as officiating in the Premier League, Football League and some FA Cup ties.

#### Roberts out of the Wood

Boreham Wood Manager Graham Roberts has left the club just weeks before the start of the new season. He tendered his resignation earlier in the summer but had a change of heart and stayed on after reaching agreement with Chairman Danny Hunter on various issues. He has now finally left the club who are now actively searching for an experienced Manager to guide them in their return to the Premier Division."

New ground hopes for Wokingham

Newspaper reports have given Wokingham fans some hope that the club will return to the town from its ground share at Windsor. Woodcray Manor Golf Course – a mile from the club's old home in Finchampstead Road – has recently experienced planning problems with its 18 hole course, with some holes being out of action. The plan is to make the course into a 9 hole, freeing up land for houses and sports clubs in the town, including the cricket, tennis and football clubs.

Earlsmead visited by Blair and Brown

Just days before the General Election, the Labour Battle Buses rolled into Harrow Borough for a surprise visit by the Prime Minister Tony Blair and Chancellor of the Exchequer Gordon Brown. The visit, part of the party's campaign to shore up one of the most marginal Labour seats in the country was arranged by Harrow West MP and firm Boro' supporter, Gareth Thomas. Club officials had been informed on Sunday evening that a cabinet minister could be visiting on Monday with Mr Thomas but it was not until early evening that the details were finally released from Labour Party HQ as to who the special guests were to be. The more astute may already have been suspicious following visits by Special Branch officers to look over the club. So just a few days after the club's car park was filled with television vans filming the Carlton Television drama Without Motive, starring Ross Kemp, the TV crews were back, although this time from ITN, Sky News and BBC News. Just before 9pm two of the familiar Battle Buses drove into the car park, one containing the ministers and party officials while the other contained members of the press. Harrow's commercial director Jim Haves introduced the quests to a packed front bar at the club with all three making a small speech. Gareth Thomas did not miss the opportunity to plug "the finest football club in the area!" What followed was a touch surreal as the two ministers wandered into the main hall where Earlsmead was hosting its regular Monday evening Quiz Night. Tony Blair apologised for interrupting the evening as the politicians went round each table in turn, followed by a swarm of TV crews and photographers, shaking hands with some rather shell-shocked quiz nighters.

Athletic snap up in Saints sell-off

Croydon Athletic took advantage of the closure of Southampton's ground The Dell and went along to the auction where almost everything was being sold off with the proceeds going to three different charities. Club Secretary Dean Fisher went along on the Saturday to view items to bid for and was successful in acquiring everything on the Sunday that he had his eye on. "We have purchased all of the furniture from the Saints Social Club which will enable us to refurbish our clubhouse. In addition to this, we bought numerous commercial catering appliances, three turnstiles, the physio massage table from the home dressing room and the entire contents of the Ted Bates suite which will replace our Boardroom furniture. We are currently building a new turnstile block which will house 3 turnstiles, so we needed to get hold of some quickly as we had originally bid for some from Wembley, but who knows when we would have received them due to the ongoing problems of their redevelopment. The Management Committee have been working hard during this summer break to ensure that the facilities are able to conform to a 'B' grading, and are hoping they will have all the necessary works completed by August 18th in order to apply for a regraded by the League."

Turvey wins overwhelming support

League chairman and managing director Alan Turvey has been re-elected as chairman after beating former Chesham United chairman David Pembroke in a secret ballot at the Annual General Meeting. Mr Turvey, chairman since 1982, was returned by 47 votes to 8. Speaking to the meeting after being declared the winner, Mr Turvey thanked the clubs for their continuing support and asked for their unity as the League works with the FA and others to restructure the national game.

New Ryman structure approved

The League's Annual General Meeting approved the restructuring of the divisions for the 2002/03 season. The new structure, which had been agreed at an EGM just after Christmas, will consist of a Premier Division of 24 clubs, First Division North, First Division South, also both 24, and 16 in the Second Division. Following discussions regarding promotion and relegation at the AGM the Management Committee has voted in favour of leaving the matter as originally put forward i.e. that only one club be relegated from the Premier Division and that the usual three clubs be promoted from Division One. This was the proposal at the time of the EGM and was given in answer to a question from The FA Leagues Sanction Committee in February 2001.

Tractor Boys give a helping hand

Next season footbailers at Beveree Stadium, home of Hampton & Richmond Borough, will run onto the pitch through a new players tunnel. Instead of the old metal barriers a plastic covered tunnel which will concertina out to the edge of the pitch has been installed at Hampton's ground. This welcome improvement to the club's facilities has been obtained at no cost from Ipswich Town. Ipswich, already regarded as one of the friendliest football clubs among the professional ranks, offered the tunnel to chairman Victor Searle. All the club had to do was find the necessary transport to take it away. General manager Les Rance said " the 'tractor boys' really came through for us. The tunnel has already been installed, it just needs a spring clean to be ready for use - it will improve the access for supporters to the Simpson Stand and the clubhouse while presenting an attractive entrance for the players to enter the pitch. An additional bonus is that it bears the former Ipswich Town sponsor's name Greene King, which just happen to be the brewery that supplies our bar".



#### BROMLEY FOOTBALL CLUB - A BRIEF HISTORY

Bromley Football Club was founded in 1892 and in the first season played friendly games against mainly local opposition sides. Their first competitive football came in the South London League, which was won at the first attempt. However, they moved frequently between Leagues in those early days. Two seasons in the Southern League were followed by a spell in the London League, which they won in 1897. After a brief interlude in the Kent League, they returned to the London League but were expelled in 1900. They then competed in the Spartan League, and after winning the title in 1908. they had their first spell in the Isthmian League and won the Championship in each of their first two seasons. After the First World War they joined the Athenian League, winning the title in 1923.

Although the 1930s were successful on the Cup front, League honours eluded them until 1949 when they lifted the Athenian League Championship, to go with the FA Amateur Cup. Three years later they rejoined the Isthmian League, and again made an immediate impact finishing runners up at the first attempt, and going one better in 1954, reversing the previous season's six point margin over Walthamstow Avenue, who were again runners up when Bromley were Champions again in 1961. The following season they had only two Clubs below them. and in thirteen subsequent seasons only twice finished in the top half, culminating in relegation in 1975, the second time they had finished bottom.

They were promoted in 1980, and during an up and down period they went down again in 1984, came back up two years later and were runners up to Yeovil in 1988 – the highest League position for over 25 years – before being relegated for a third time two years later. Regaining Premiership status at the first attempt, they remained in the top flight until 1999 when, after their best start to a season for many a year – 13 points out of the first five games – they only won four of the remaining 37 League games, and as a consequence were relegated for the fourth time since Promotion and Relegation was introduced to the League.

Last season was the same mixture of results as the previous one, losing more games than were won. A run of eleven consecutive defeats towards the end of the season dragged them into the relegation zone, before three victories in the final three games helped them finish in 18<sup>th</sup> position in the League table. Early exits were made from most of the Cup competitions, although the Semi Final of the Kent Senior Cup was reached.

After playing at White Hart Field, Widmore Road and Plaistow Cricket Ground, Bromley moved to Hayes Lane – some 300 yards from their present ground – which was purchased in 1938. They had to leave the ground when fire destroyed the main stand in October 1992, but returned in September 1993. The record attendance stands at 12,000 for a game against Nigeria in 1950, but the capacity is now much reduced.

Bromley won the FA Amateur Cup three times, the third being in 1949 when a then record crowd of 96,000 watched them beat Romford in the first Wembley Final. In 1911 they beat Bishop Auckland at Herne Hill, and in 1938 were victors over Erith & Belvedere in the only all-Kent Final. All three Finals were won by the same 1-0 scoreline, and the goal in each game being scored by the player wearing the Number 8 shirt. Since entering the FA Trophy in 1974 - following the cessation of the Amateur Cup - they have not gone beyond the Second Round until last season when they reached the Third Round after the competition had been revamped. Either side of the Second World War they played in the Second Round of the FA Cup three times, with First Round appearances on a further six occasions, but the appearance in the competition proper in 1996 was their first in 19 years. They have won the Kent Senior Cup four times, most recently beating Dover in 1997's Final, and the Kent Amateur Cup has been won on twelve occasions. The London Senior Cup has been won on three occasions, with the London Challenge Cup coming to Hayes Lane in 1996.
