KICK OFF 3.00PM

Well another season draws to an end for us, our eleventh 'homeless' one since being forced to sell our beloved Lower Mead home in 1991. At long last the prospects of a new home being built at the derelict Prince Edward Playing Field site look good and a start date of June 10th this year has been mentioned. Nick DuGard brings us up to date elsewhere in this programme following a meeting with Harrow Council on Monday.

This has not been one of our better seasons with far too many goals conceded and not nearly enough scored by our lads. Our home results in the league have been most disappointing with only one win coming in the last 15 games here at the White Lion Ground. To prove my point about us not scoring enough goals, in only four of those 15 games have we scored more than once!

Today we welcome our friends from Staines Town Football Club for our final Ryman League match of the 2001/02 season and we will be hoping to end with a win. Although neither of us are likely to improve our league position it would be nice to go out with three more points under our belts. Staines come here today having lost their last six league matches scoring 5 goals and conceding 15. This sudden loss of form comes after having been unbeaten in their previous 12 league matches! Whereas we have recorded very few 'clean sheets' this season, our visitors have managed no fewer than 13 in their 41 league matches. This includes 6 goalless draws at home, 4 of them in succession!

When the two sides met earlier this season at Walton & Hersham's ground (our

visitor's home this season) we drew 1-1. We scored first through Winnie Somers (now with Hemel Hempstead Town) four minutes before half-time with Mark Butler equalising for Staines three minutes after the break.

Last Saturday we visited Tooting & Mitcham United for the final competitive game to be played at their Sandy Lane ground. Next season they move into a new home at Bishopsford Road. We, of course, did the decent thing and let them mark the end of their 80 year stay at the ground with a final 3-2 win. The Division's second best crowd of the season, 968, saw Steve Symes open the scoring for the home side in the 9th minute with Matt Perry bringing us level from the penalty spot after 52 minutes. Nigel Webb, with goals in the 59th & 69th minutes, put Tooting 3-1 ahead but Bryan Hammatt had the distinction of scoring the very last competitive goal at Sandy Lane when he netted four minutes from the end.

On Tuesday we visited Uxbridge in the semi-final of the Middlesex Charity Cup and came away with a 2-1 victory. The game started in dramatic fashion with the Uxbridge goalkeeper being sent off in the second minute for catching the ball outside his area. Fortunately for the home side they had another experienced goalkeeper as one of their substitutes and he took over in goal. We weren't making much impression against ten men so it came as no surprise when Lee Tunnell gave Uxbridge the lead in the 34th minute. Our second half performance was much better and after 55 minutes Fergus Moore equalised. With 13 minutes to go our hosts were awarded a penalty but Andy Carter brilliantly saved from Lee Tunnell's spot kick. Five minutes later we scored what proved to be the winner when Matt Perry scored our second. We now meet the winners of next Tuesday's tie between Ashford Town (Middx) and Enfield Town in the final due to be played at Brook House FC on Bank Holiday Monday, 6th May. However, if Enfield reach the final a new date will have to be found as they are playing in the Essex Senior League Cup final that day and that takes precedence over the Middlesex Charity Cup.

Although our First Team have not had as good a season as we would have liked the same cannot be said of our Youth Teams in the Allied Counties League, Nationwide PASE Conference and Marathon Sunday League. Francis Joseph has done a wonderful job with those sides and several very promising youngsters have been involved. In fact no fewer than eight have already made at least one appearance in the First team this season. The good news is that next season we will be having a Reserve Team competing in the Suburban League with home matches at Kingsbury Town FC. We need this facility if we are to keep our promising youngsters when they become too old to play for the Under 18's & 19's yet are not ready for First Team football. Many feel the step up from Youth football to First Team is too big a jump for them to take all at once so, hopefully, a Reserve side will bridge the gap for them and at the same time give First Team players a game when returning from injury etc.

Last Wednesday our U/19's strolled to an easy 5-0 win over Bedford College in the Nationwide PASE Conference at Ruislip Manor FC. In the evening the U/18's were denied the chance of going second in the Allied Counties League when they were held to a 1-1 draw by Wembley at Kingsbury Town FC. Alec Gediking got us off to a great start with a goal after five minutes but several chances of increasing our lead were wasted. Wembley who hit the woodwork twice and forced David Godfrey into several good saves eventually equalised in the very last minute. We now need to win our final game at home to Brook House on Monday and hope that St Albans fail to beat Ruislip Manor at St Albans on Wednesday, 8th May, if we are to finish runners-up to champions Hayes.

Today we will know which of the top seven in our Predict-a-Score competition will qualify for the prize money. The cheques for the lucky winners will be posted to them during the coming week. The Club would like to thank all of you who entered this season's competition and hope you will do so again next season. By taking part you helped to raise £1,000 for the club.

At this stage we do not know who we will be playing against next season. All we do know is that the Ryman League are reorganising the divisions into a Premier, 2 Regional Firsts and a Second. The Premier and Firsts will consist of 24 clubs each (this means 46 league matches instead of the usual 42), with the remainder plus Leyton from the Essex Senior League forming the new Second Division. How the two First Divisions will be made up is anyone's guess, could be a north/south split or maybe east/west split. We will be playing in one of the new First Divisions but which one we will have to wait and see.

Finally, my thanks to those of you who have bought programmes this season and

Elsewhere you will have read Nick DuGard's notes thanking all connected with the club which I duly endorse. Without all these helpers there would be no club. Incredible work goes on week in, week out, not just during the season, but 52 weeks a year.

Last week, in conjunction with our partnership with Stadia Management Ltd., the club received considerable good news that we have been successful so far in the first three panel stages with the Football Foundation. Our case officer has reliably informed me that the first three hearings are the most important, notwithstanding that, we are taking nothing for granted with the final director's panel hearing on May 1st. The character and commitment of the lads was a credit to everyone and the scenes at the end with about 24 players hugging and bouncing up and down when Guled scored the last penalty, showed what this game is all about. Passion, hard work and a strong desire to win will reap it's rewards and there is no substitute for winning. It's a great feeling and one I personally can't wait to get back. Three years without success is a bitter pill to swallow and the sooner it changes the better!

There are too many to mention individually but my thanks go to everyone involved at the club this year for all their hard work throughout a difficult and frustrating season.

STUART REMEMBERS HIS ROOTS

An interesting article appeared in the Sunday Express on the 7th April in which John Richardson wrote about Stuart Pearce. Part of what he wrote went as follows:- Now playing at Manchester City, Stuart says he has his manager Kevin Keegan to thank for his first championship medal since 1982 with Wealdstone.

Now almost 40 years of age Stuart will, if he hasn't already done so, sit down with Keegan to decide whether to quit playing and remain as a coach or have one last crack at the Premiership. "I will talk to Kevin regarding the situation here and if there is something City and I find favourable, then fine," he said. "If not then Kevin, the chairman and the board of directors owe me nothing."

Recalling his time with Wealdstone, Stuart said, "A First Division championship medal is very nice because these things don't seem to come around that quickly for me. In fact, the last championship I won was in 1982 when Wealdstone landed the Southern League."

The non-League days helped lay the foundation for a headlining career which encompassed 78 England caps and prepared him for life with Brian Clough at Nottingham Forest.

"I remember those days at Wealdstone as if they were yesterday," said Pearce. "A manager called Alan Batsford came in with a strict reputation. He was a great influence on me and he taught me to grow up straight away. During one of the first days he came to me and said, 'Get out of your pram, son'. I had never heard that statement before but when you go away and think about it, you know exactly what it means."

No doubt Stuart did get out of his pram and has gone on to great things since leaving Wealdstone for Coventry City in 1983. I'm sure all Wealdstone supporters will continue to wish Stuart every success in whatever he decides to do in the future.

Congratulations to our Under 19 players on reaching the National Final of the PASE Conference League Cup. What a great way to start these notes.

The Southern Regional Final tie with Stevenage Borough was a real thriller with our visitors taking a two-nil half time lead after the young Stones had enjoyed 90% of play in the first half, only for two bits of terrible defending from Guled Adan to prove our undoing.

Extra time saw the Stones take the lead for the first time, only for Stevenage to draw level this time (our goal coming from Tunji Bangbala) to send the game into penalty kicks.

After a titanic 2-1 semi-final win over the uncompromising Enfield side Northmet Riverside at Birkbeck College last Sunday, SFC Reserves now take on Apex Bulldogs in the Middlesex Junior Cup Final at Hayes' Church Road ground on Sunday May 5, KO 11am... a deserved reward for Stones' old stagers Gordon McKay, Tim Parks, Sudhir Rawal and Mickey Kane who all starred in the semi-final and total a combined 2,000-odd games for SFC.

Tim and Gordon made their debuts for the club in 1978, Kane in 1984 and Sudhir a year later.

It should be another cracking game. Apex, top of the Hendon Sunday League Division Three, saw off the Wealdstone Youth side's old rivals Artstone Reserves 1-0 in the other semi-final and will be tough opponents for SFC Rubs who have come through against FC Hatton 4-1 (rd 2), Spotted Dog Harefield 5-3 (rd 3), The Lane 1-0 after 2-2 draw (rd 4), Chiswick Prolifics 7-6 on penalties (rd 5) and then Northmet Riverside 2-1 (semi-final) last week.

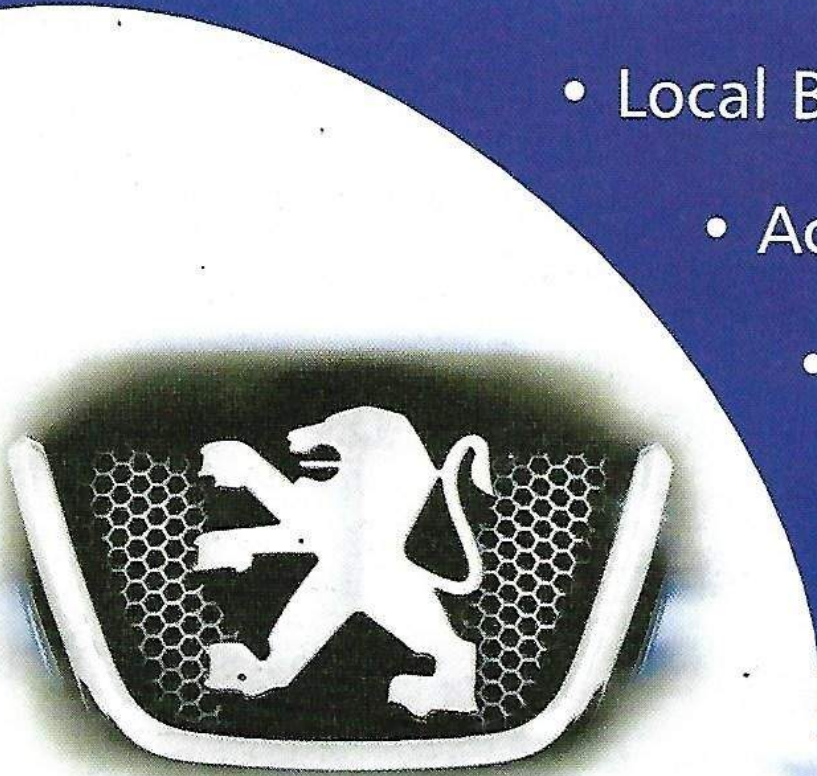
