

# Stones mourn tragic death of former player

Both teams kicked off with draws on Saturday so there is no doubt an equal sprinkling of optimism from both camps.

Immediately prior to the kick off this evening there will be a minute silence. As a number of people may already be aware, Jomo Faal-Tomas passed away earlier this month at the tender age of just 21. Jomo played for us in the 2007/08 season at Northwood, and was also part of our Youth set up earlier in his career. It is very hard to put into words ones feelings when an occasion like this comes about. His whole life was in front of him, yet this absolute destroyer of a disease has sought him out so soon. The Club would like to offer it's sincerest condolences to Jomo's family at their time of loss. Elsewhere in this programme is a condolence page with a selection of messages from fellow players, staff and supporters. A Charity collection is to be arranged at either tonight's game or as soon as can be arranged, and we ask you to consider a donation in his memory.

# Cash strapped now, but we will build up solid base for the future

A warm welcome to this new season here at Grosvenor Vale. As always the summer weeks pass so quickly, and it hardly feels like there has been a break. I guess the weather doesn't help much and I for one have gone searching for some better weather and therefore am conspicuous by my absence at tonight's game due to a 'poorly' timed summer holiday.

Not that the summer has been quiet, the Vinnie Jones day, all the plans for the Watford and Leeds games, the building of the new stand and the struggle to channel as much money as possible to the playing side are just some of the headlines.

To this latter point first. We have great faith and confidence in the players we have and we are excited about the season ahead. However, let's be clear about this. The budget has been cut considerably from last season. This has meant Gordon has (as always) needed to 'wheel and deal' to bring in the players he needed, but there are some players he has simply had to say "no" to because of funds. My own worry is that this will hit us in terms of depth of squad. That said, I believe completely that we have a squad which has strength in all departments this season and will compete.

We are doing everything we can to try and increase the income into the Club and ultimately to the playing budget. But as I have said many times before we will not do anything foolish to chase success. This summer we have seen countless clubs in financial trouble, some going under. Everything we do at this Club must be built on solid foundations and while we are ambitious and hungry for success on the

pitch we must continue to be prudent financially.

The job that Dennis and Leo are doing on the commercial front is crucial and needs everyone's support. 100:400 remains important and if you have committed to this scheme and not yet paid then we do need to collect the money in now. If you have not yet pledged then it is certainly not too late and please see Nick Dugard or Jez Albert tonight.

We have a number of plans in place for growing income and you will see the fruits of these in the coming weeks. Income generation really is our number one short term priority—particularly if we want to enjoy another season like last year.

All the big events this summer were not only highly successful, they were also most enjoyable and thanks to everyone involved in organising them. Vinnie Jones' return to Wealdstone was a memorable day, both on the golf course and here in the evening; Watford FC honoured Gordon by bringing a full first team here for his testimonial match and the Leeds friendly was a night enjoyed by over 1,100 people.

If only that was our regular crowd, it would certainly go some way to helping our financial issues. All in good time perhaps. Last season our home crowd rose by around 40% so the pressure is on to maintain this growth this season. Another 40% might be optimistic, but who knows, if we keep playing attractive football and reaching out to the local community we will continue to offer a product that more and more people will want a piece of. Whether it was through the sterling efforts of some supporters one

hot day early in July, manning a stall at the Ruislip Manor Funday or our scheme to offer half price admission to servicemen, particularly those at RAF Northolt, where we will be training this season, our commitment to the locality should not be open to question.

On a sadder note, we were all shocked recently by the news of the tragic death of Jomo Faal-Thomas, at such a young age, and only a year or so since this strapping, talented if slightly shy right full back looked as if he had the footballing world at his feet. We will remember Jomo properly tonight and I am pleased that there are plans in place for us to respond through further sup-

port of an appropriate cancer charity as well.

This is a time of the year when all our dreams for the season remain in place (notwithstanding whatever happened on Saturday). This is the same for our opponents Tooting as much as for us. Based on two very competitive matches last season I am sure it will be a tough encounter tonight and I look forward to getting the reports by text or online (from 5,000 miles away) and being back in a week or so.



Tooting and Mitcham F.C. were formed in 1932 when two clubs who were local rivals decided to amalgamate, the idea being discussed for the first time at a Christmas London League match in 1930. *Tooting Town* originated in 1887 as Tooting Graveney F.C. The first ground was at Figges Marsh, but in 1905 the Club moved to an enclosed ground at Lonesome. This was unsatisfactory so in 1907 another enclosed ground was obtained called "The North Surrey Poultry Farm" in Gorringe Park.

In 1913 came another move, this time to a ground in The Ridgeway, beside the railway line. Then came the First World War and in 1915, after a club now called Tooting had tried to continue a Metropolitan League with Old Kingstonians, South Tooting, Summerston, West Norwood and Wimbledon, attempts to carry on were abandoned and the players joined a munitions firm called Darraq for the duration.

During this period the Club had absorbed, by amalgamation, Tooting Bec F.C. in 1896 and Balham St Johns in 1902 and many successes were achieved. In the 1914-15 season came the ultimate success when the Club was elected to the Athenian League and, indeed, one game was played before War broke.

In 1919, at the cessation of hostilities, the Club revived with the name Tooting Town, a ground (two pitches) were rented at Tyrell's Poultry Farm, and admission regained to the South Suburban League. Success came easily and in 1921 the Club was accepted into the London League and efforts made to secure a ground of their own.

The Sandy Lane site was purchased in February 1922. (The ground was an unfenced agricultural field). The next ten years consisted hard work on the ground and moderate success on the field. The Town team played in the London League as did their neighbours over the other side of the fence, Mitcham Wanderers. It soon became obvious that two first class amateur sides could go no further existing side by side in competition, yet those who remembered the Christmas games between the two clubs could see how difficult amalgamation, the only answer, would be.

In spite of its success, the Club, like its neighbours from Tooting felt the need for amalgamation which was effected in 1932. On amalgamation, Tooting & Mitcham United remained in the London League but moved upwards into the Athenian League in 1937. Although their League form was disappointing it was compensated for by a first win in the Surrey Senior Cup in 1938 when Dulwich Hamlet were beaten 2-1 at Selhurst Park. Tooting & Mitcham were the Athenian

League Champions in 1950 and 1955, then were invited into the Isthmian League in 1956. They proved themselves good enough to hold their own against the strongest opposition, winning the Championship in 1958 and again in 1960.

In season 1958-59 the club reached the 3rd round proper of the F.A. Cup for the first time in its history, beating Bournemouth and Northampton Town. In the 3rd Round proper they were drawn at home again this time to Nottingham Forest and led the First Division side 2-0 at half-time, but an own goal and a very controversial penalty for handball saw Forest scramble a draw. In the replay Forest won 3-0 and went on to lift the Cup at Wembley.

Their best ever run in the F.A. Cup came in the season 1975-76 when under the guidance of Roy Dwight they reached the 4th Round proper. After beating Romford and Leatherhead they had to travel again in the 3rd Round to Swindon Town and soon found themselves 2-0 down, but a dramatic fightback saw Tooting score twice in the last four minutes to force a draw. In the replay at a packed Sandy Lane Tooting scored a great 2-1 victory with Alan Ives scoring the winner after a great solo run. In the 4th Round Tooting made the long trip to Bradford City and despite a brave performance went down to a 3-1 defeat. The club has also reached the competition proper on seven other occasions.In

In season 1983-84 Tooting finished in the bottom two of the Isthmian League but were saved from the drop as Staines Town did not have the required ground grading. There was no reprieve in season 1988-89 when the club were relegated for the first time in its history. They won the Full Members Cup beating Dorking 1-0 in the final at Kingstonian F.C.

Season 1995-96 saw the club flirting with disaster again, and season 1996-97 proved to be one of the worst in the Club's history, resulting in relegation to the Second Division for the first time.

Season 2000-1 was the club's best for many years. The 6th round (last eight) of

the F.A. Carlsberg Vase was reached which equalled the club's best ever run in a national cup competition, and defeat only came at the hands of eventual winners Taunton Town.

Even more importantly, the Ryman League Second Division Championship was won despite an horrific backlog of fixtures, the club's first league title since 1960. In addition the Surrey Senior Cup Final was reached, although Crystal Palace proved too strong by three goals to nil in the final at Gander Green Lane. Season 2001-2 was one of consolidation, with a mid table finish. Ten years of frustration and setbacks finally ended with a move to the club's new Imperial Fields ground for the start of season 2002-3.

After a promising start results tailed off and Manager Ian Hazel resigned, to be succeeded by former Falkirk and Millwall striker Richard Cadette. A finish of 11th place in the next season was a disappointment, but in 2004-5 the club were within striking distance of second place in February, only to finish out of the play off places after only picking up ten points in the last ten games.

Season 2005-6 proved to be a re-run. Second in February, the club ended up scraping into the play-offs and were beaten by Tonbridge in the semi-finals, Richard Cadette was replaced as manager by the hugely experienced Billy Smith for the start of 2006-07. Eighteenth in the league in early December, the club embarked on an incredible unbeaten run of over thirty games in the new year, winning the Surrey and London Senior Cups in the space 48 hours, and finishing just one point behind champions Maidstone United. Unfortunately the play off final against Hastings United proved to be a game too far, ending in a 2-0 defeat.

In 2007-08 the club celebrated its 75th anniversary, inviting past players back for a series of special events culminating in a club dinner featuring our most famous old boy Alex Stepney, the legendary manchester United and England goalkeeper, as guest of honour

# ON THIS DAY

### with Tim Parks

8 YEARS AGO

Saturday August 18 2001:

Ryman League Division One: Wealdstone 4 Bromley 1

THIS demolition of Bromley at the White Lion ground was the perfect to start to a season.. all the sweeter as it followed a wretched 2000-01 campaign that had begun with Gordon Bartlett scratching around for a team in the final 48 hours before the big kick-off.

No surprise that that season had been a struggle from first to last. We finally missed relegation by one place. But the summer of 2001 had been very different: Four players had been signed from the successful Hemel Hempstead side, Fergus Moore, Richard McDonagh, goal-keeper Andy Carter and Vinny Somers, while goal ace Bryan Hammatt re-joined the Stones and netted twice in his first game back, a friendly at Berkhamsted.



Even the ground looked smarter: the adjoining hotel had finally been completed with its new car park and access road, while inside the new turnstile block, walls and terracing on the stand side had been completed. Confidence was high all around the club and we prepared his for this opener with a morning's training at Broadfields followed by tea and toast. More Gordon Bartlett than Gordon Ramsay, but it did the trick as we had an understanding, pattern of play and genuine threat up front throughout the game.

Bromley had assembled an expensive new side in the wake on a season similar to our own but the pattern was set when the returning Fergus Moore-who had been allowed to leave three years earlier as we leapfrogged up the divisionscracked in the opening goal from a 25-yard freekick after just five minutes. All the more satisfying as it was a routine worked on in training just a few hours before. Bromley hit back to level after 16 minutes but the Stones were rampant with Lee Walker and Hammatt's Little & Large act up front causing the visittors all sorts of problems, while new midfield capture Jason Shaw (from Hampton & Richmond) bossed that department alongside McDonagh and Danny Tilbury, Add tricky winger Somers to the mix and it was no surprise when we stunned the South Londoners with two goals just before the break.



Shaw banged in our second from the edge of the box following a slick passing move, while Somers gave keeper Danny Harwood no chance from close range to make it 3-1

at half time. Fergus Moore, fired up on his return, saw red for a late challenge in the second half but even that failed to stop our ten men taking control - and centre-back Danny Reeve hit the fourth from the penalty spot after the livewire Hammatt took a tumble in the box. A crowd of 304, about fifty up on the previous average, celebrated noisily all the way to the Change of Hart.

So a great start. And it was followed by an excellent 2-1 win at Walton & Hersham three days later to put us top of the table. But... well, you know the rest of the story. We stayed in the top five until mid-October, when a quite astonishing run of ineptitude saw the Stones win just one game (at Bromley, funnily enough) in 23. Yes, TWENTY-THREE! And that ended, typically, with a 1-0 win over leaders Aylesbury on March 9. We just missed the drop, again, and so ended another season that flattered to deceive.

Through the summer our 100:400 fund has been creeping up to the point where we are in touching distance of our goal, of raising £40,000—money which will go directly to the playing budget. We are doing all we can through our commercial operation and through all other means to bring new funds into the Club but your individual contributions help no matter how big or small. Remember 100:400 was set up to encourage 100 people to donate £400. But we will accept donations of whatever level, whether £400, more or less. It all helps and we are very grateful to everyone who has contributed.

Secondly, whilst achieving the £40,000 mark will be a great result and a wonderful boost for everyone we won't stop there and will look to carry on to make the fund as big as we can – so we can channel more funds into the playing budget.

Please don't wait to be asked—come forward and contribute—it does directly influence what you will see on the park this season. Thanks for your continued support


What are your expectations for the coming season? My heart says we'll be champions, my head says play-offs. I think Gordon and the gang have got something special lined up.






