

There was a time when Alan Massey scored plenty of headed goals so it was with understandable pleasure he celebrated the equaliser. Fatique? Amazing what a goal does to one!

Hopefully Gordon Bartlett was able to blank out team tactics for the vital end of season games during his Testimonial Dinner on Wednesday, A comfortable sell-out for the night with Steve Perryman starring. There is no doubt Gordon's testimonial was richly deserved. 



Mill Lane Mission was founded in 1903, originally for local boys and it wasn't until 1905 that they formed a senior side and were officially registered as Mill Lane Mission FC with the Surrey FA. Mill Lane Mission joined the Croydon & District League and amalgamated with Carshalton St. Andrews (known as the Robins and formed in 1897) in 1908. Before the start of the 1908/09 season, Mill Lane Mission changed their name to Carshalton Athletic Football Club.

The present ground at Colston Avenue has been

used since 1921 after previous pitches at Carshalton Recreation Ground (1907-14) and Culvers Park (1919-20). The ground was dedicated in 1921 to the memory of those killed in the Great War and is known as the War Memorial Sports Ground.

The early years were spent in the Southern Suburban League, the Surrey Senior League, the London League and the Corinthian League where consecutive Championships were won in 1952/53 and 53/54.

The Robins were elected to the Athenian League in

1956-57 and a year later they reached the Surrey Senior Cup Final for the first time, losing 1-0 to Dulwich Hamlet.

In 1973 they became founder members of the new Isthmian Division Two and in 1976-77 the Robins gained promotion to the Premier Division. That season they also won the Surrey Senior Shield.

They reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup in 1969/70 and 1987/88. In 1982/83 they progressed to the Second Round before losing 4-1 to Fourth Division Torquay United.

In 1988/89 Carshalton won their first major honour for many years when they defeated Woking 4-2 in the final of the Surrey Senior Cup. This was the Robins' first ever triumph in the County Cup and they also recorded their highest ever final league placing in the Premier Division of fourth. The following season Carshalton repeated their Surrey Senior Cup victory this time defeating Dorking 4-2.

In 1993/94 the club had an excellent FA Cup run reaching the First Round Proper before losing to Barnet 2-1. In 1994/95 the Robins again reached the Surrey Senior Cup Final losing to Sutton in the final minutes.

In the summer of 2000 the club was plunged into turmoil when it was sold twice in a matter of weeks. Shortly afterwards the clubhouse was completely destroyed in an arson attack. Manager Gary Bowyer was sacked and two further changes of manager followed but it came as no surprise when Carshalton were relegated to Division 1 after 24 years in the Premier Division.

In 2002 Graham Roberts was brought in as manager to turn the tide and he guided the Robins back to the Premier as champions. However, his term proved to be short lived and he left the club by mutual consent and Billy Smith was reappointed as manager in June 2003. The Robins eventually ended the next season in

Most of these encounters took place when both clubs were amateurs playing in the Athenian League between 1956 and 1964. During the 1963/64 season, our last as members of the Athenian League, we met Carshalton in the 1st Round of the FA Amateur Cup. A Matt Farrell goal earned us a 1-1 draw at Lower Mead but we lost the replay in Surrey by three goals to one, Viv Evans scoring our goal.

Since we turned professional in 1971 there have been ten games between us with the following results:-

F.A. Cup 2007/08 (2nd Qfy Rd) Away W1-0

Friendlies 1978/79 Home L0-1 1990/91 Away D3-3

7th place which was enough to clinch qualification to the new Conference South.

With rejection by the Council of an ambitious £12 million rebuilding project, popular Chairman Steve Friend relinquished his position. The subsequent changes off the pitch including financial restructuring saw manager Billy Smith struggle and he stood down in January 2005.

Goalscoring legend Jimmy Bolton was appointed manager and he secured the Robins' survival in the Conference South, with a memorable win on the last day of the season away to Eastbourne Borough.

A winless start to 2005/06

saw Jimmy relieved of his duties and the board brought in Dave Garland as manager. However, it wasn't until 10th December (18 games) that Carshalton finally won a league match, their worst ever run for 100 years. Despite an impressive performance against Accrington Stanley in the FA Trophy, Carshalton were still caught up in a relegation battle on the final day of the season and with Hayes winning 2-1 at home to Sutton United, Carshalton were relegated to the Ryman Premier for 2006/07 season.

During the summer of 2006 the club was reborn as Carshalton Athletic FC Limited. Under the guidance of directors Harry Driver, Roger Searle & Les Withers, shares in CAFCL were offered to club supporters. The club also managed to secure its future at Colston Avenue, obtaining a 50 year lease from the Council.

Carshalton finished mid table in 06/07 but by October 2007 results were disappointing and Dave Garland of the club. First team the layden Bird was apto take the helm.

Halfway through the 07/01 season, the board welcomed a new director, local businessman Paul Dipre. Paul has instigated a programme of improvements at Colston Avenue, including new spectator and commercial facilities, a new Academy and backing for the first team.

In 2008/9 this investment clearly had the desired effect as the Robins had one of their most successful seasons ever in the Ryman Premier, finishing fourth in the table and in the playoffs, the Robins won a thrilling semi final at Tonbridge Angels 3-2 but were then defeated 1-0 by second-place Staines Town after

extra time.

Despite this loss Robins' supporters were confident that the club were moving forward and exciting times lay ahead. After just a few games of the new season. however, Bird tendered his resignation. The board moved quickly and appointed Francis Vines, a Carshalton old-boy with management experience at Crawley, Farnborough and Basingstoke. However, Francis failed to deliver the results that were required and with only 4 league wins from 18 games he was sacked in February and Ian Hazel took charge of what had now become a relegation fight.

Ian Hazel (Manager)

Appointed manager for the remainder of 2009-10 following the sacking of Francis Vines in February. Ian played for, amongst others, Wimbledon, Bristol Rovers, Maidstone and Carshalton before becoming player/coach and then manager at Tooting. He has also had spells managing at Sutton and Leatherhead. He is now also the Head of the Academy at Carshalton Athletic.

Nick Hamann (Goalkeeper)

Signed from Hamburg SV after a long spell at Chelsea. Came through the youth team set up at Stamford Bridge before moving back to Germany in 2008.

David Ray (Defender)

Signed from Farnborough Town, David started his career at Crystal Palace, spending six years at Selhurst Park before moving to Basingstoke Town and then Bognor Regis Town.

Justyn Roberts (Defender)

Signed from Sutton United after a period on loan. Finished last season with Tooting & Mitcham. A former trainee with Nottingham Forest, he has also played for Weymouth and Rushden.

Lewis Gonsalves (Defender)

Signed from Sutton United midway through 2008-9, Lewis was quick to show why he was revered at Gander Green Lane. Although not tall, Lewis is an imposing figure in the air, has great pace and is a very good tackler.

Rob Watkins (Defender)

Signed from Basingstoke in October 2009. A left sided defender who started his career with Fulham. Has also played for Gravesend, Crawley and Merstham.

Kenny Beaney (Midfield)

Recently signed permanently after a period on loan from Sutton United. Began his career with Dulwich then joining Fisher in 2007-2008. Finished last season with Bromley after a brief spell with Grays

Adrian Toppin (Midfield) Now in his third spell at Carshalton, he has previously played for Bromley, Staines, Met Police and Dulwich Hamlet.



In a great four man passing move up the slope with fine work from Ngoyi and Spendlove, the lack of a cutting edge was again evident but at least the screw was being turned on the Darts who were now having very little effective possession.

Marvin McCoy attempted to take matters into his own hands and showed the forwards how it should be done but moves broke down in the final third but still Stones pressed forward

regardless in the hope of a lucky break.

Charlie Mpi entered the fray for a tiring Chris O'Leary and his athletic presence served to put even more pressure on the Darts back line. Mpi was unlucky to see his instant strike flash just over the bar after a great headed flick on by Ngoyi

With 10 minutes left on the clock and pressure mounting up strode the ebullient Lee Chappell for another of his extraordinary torpedo like throws. Summoning more power than usual Chappell propelled the ball at pace into the Dartford box and Alan Massey managed to get the faintest of touches to the ball as it flashed into the far corner with Greg Ngoyi following up; but it was Massey's goal and it was enough to keep Stones in the play -off hunt.

There was still time for cool Man of the match Sean Thomas to somehow stop Rob Howarth's late effort with his chest but Stones held on for the draw.

More than 2,000 people have attended a Kent football match dedicated to a soldier who died in Afghanistan. Rifleman Peter Aldridge, 19, died on 22 January while on foot patrol with 3 Rifles Battle Group in Helmand. His family were at Folkestone Invicta FC's ground for its game against Croydon Athletic on Tuesday evening, as they have

connections with both towns. More than £10,100 was raised at the event for the service charities Help for Heroes and Care for Casualties. Rifleman Lee Rackham was one of several soldiers collecting money in memory of his fallen friend.

He said he remembered Rifleman Aldridge as being "passionate about his job and always smiling". Entry to the game was free to enable the crowd to donate money.

Bill Hewson, president of Folkestone Invicta FC, said

the Cheriton Road ground was the busiest it had been in more than 20 years. "I've been here since the year dot and I'm in my 89th year. It's the biggest thing Folkestone Invicta's ever done," he said. Mr Hewson added that it was apparent that people appreciated soldiers like Rifleman Aldridge who had given their lives for the benefit of others. The Aldridge family live in Folkestone and had previously lived in Croydon.

EVER get the feeling you're having a hint dropped at you without the words actually coming out of someone's mouth?

The Wembley pitch has been the focus of many a frustration as the ropey turf almost ruined FA Cup semi-final weekend.

Naturally, as the blame game gets cranked up a notch, out comes the list of up-coming events under the Arch.

"...and there's those two Non-League games before the FA Cup final," PFA chief executive Gordon Taylor said when questioned by Sky Sports about the state of the mega-money venue.

There's little doubt his tone wasn't sympathetic for the surface Barrow, Stevenage, Whitley Bay and Wroxham will be walking out on next month.

Of course, Taylor and the media wouldn't ever admit publicly that the FA Vase and FA Trophy are an inconvenience on an already congested calendar.

The FA themselves wouldn't ever dream of shifting the showpiece finals away from their historical home, would they?

And that's where the problem lies. The colour of outside cash has been blinding the football Association from the minute the stadium opened.

Forget "those two Non-League finals" that have been hosted there forever and a day and focus more on the little matter of a totally needless Saracens v Harlequins Guinness Premiership league match at the weekend. No, not a cup final. A run-of-the-mill league match. And that's before we get to the motor racing and pop concerts!

Yes, Wembley needs the money these events generate. But we're all paying the price and if we're not careful the call for

Non-League's big days to be moved back to the Midlands may just grow a little louder.

Perhaps football and Wembley should be taking a leaf out of Rugby's book.

Twickenham refuse to even discuss the idea of hosting any other sport but their own. It's not totally down to NIMBY pressure, nor is it purely turning their nose up at a lower class competition. The RFU simply know how to preserve their biggest asset.

Maybe that, or the FA should pick up the phone and drag the Arsenal head groundsman kicking and screaming for eleven miles for a handy bit of overtime?

#### A cure for that II-feeling

I can certainly sympathise with the chairman of Ryman North Ilford, Roger Chilvers.

He has watched on helplessly as his side were deducted nine points for fielding a player they didn't know was banned. Now they're in the relegation race.

John Hughes played in eight games but he wasn't aware he was suspended until the debt he was saddled with after his Saturday side folded was paid up – all £88 of it.

The same thing happened to my West Middlesex Sunday League club, London Falcons. The loss of our three points may still wreck our title chances.

It's time for a national database so that managers like myself can tap in a name and get the all-clear in an instant.





One way could be to allow the wider community to use our facilities and thus get people into the building that may never have set foot in it before. Partnerships with extended schools co-ordinators, partnership development managers from our local sports college would be partnerships with people who have a vast local network at there finger tips.

Offer to run one of their sessions at the Vale and maybe local people would associate the Vale with the wider Community than just football?

How do you view our prospects this season?

As this is the last game of the season the fact that I can still comment on potential prospects (just after Horsham away) is a sign of a good season. Especially if come 4.45 we are in the play off places. A 1st round FA Cup appearance, a cup final and a play-off place is great progress indeed. If come 4.45 we are not in the play off places I cannot help but feel disappointed. I know the cups were good for the club, I know that circumstances conspired against us however, given where we found ourselves at

Christmas, I will still be very disappointed if we miss out on the playoffs. This team was good enough to make it. Some of the football we witnessed earlier in the season was the some of the best from a Wealdstone side for many years. If we keep the majority of this team together with just 2 or 3 additions the prospects for future seasons are very bright.

Where do you think will the club be, status wise, in five years? For the 1st time in many years I am becoming more and more optimistic about the future of our club and the progress that we can make on the field. The number of barriers that stood in our way seems to be diminishing. Our own ground, a strong youth set up, increasing crowds etc have lead to steady progress. However I believe the barriers that remain still have the potential to impact on our future. So if we sort out the lease, come to some sort of satisfactory conclusion with Barnet and the Football Foundation we will be in Blue Square South in 5 years, if not I hate to think of the level we could find ourselves at.

And finally... when did you last see the Pope? I met John Paul II in February 2004. It was a truly moving and blessed experience. A group from school were in Rome to mark the 40th Anniversary of our school and to visit the tomb of Nicholas Breakspear (The 1st and so far only English Pope) The one surprising part of the visit was that the Pope hadn't heard of Harrow Borough. After all those years of singing that song.....

# Bittersweet day out at Worthing

IN THE 25 years since the Stones tasted that incredible 'double' glory there have been just a handful of seasons when the team have entered the last week of the season with something positive to play for.

This current season (hopefully) is one of them; the early Ryman promotions seasons ditto; the Dulwich play-off naturally; and then the nail biters of the 2005, 2006 and 2007 when the Stones finished just clear of relegation.

But what of 1999? Shouldn't we have been partying like the Prince song of the same name? Well, yes. A sensational end to that campaign, our first in Div One after successive promotions, saw Gordon Bartlett's team put together a run of 17 wins, one draw and one defeat in our last 19 games. From mid-table obscurity to third place in nine exhilarating weeks.

Third place, behind Canvey and Braintree and Canvey, was of course a promotion spot.. except that the Ryman committee decided that, due to a ground-grading technicality (a bit of roof over the extra seating at the White Lion Ground being completed a few days late) the Stones would be denied the Premier Division place their heroics deserved.

This news was leaked out by smirking Canvey Island officials when we had visited them a couple of weeks earlier. Wealdstone officials were in the dark. And so, of course, we appealed the decision and its laborious

process was still underway when 200 Stones fans make the trek in bright sunshine to the South Coast for this Worthing game, knowing that victory would seal 3rd place.

There was a seething undercurrent of unjustice as you knew, just knew, that our appeal was far too sensible to be listened to. And so we settled down to win a game of football and Carl Holmes, our excellent midfielder of that era (who lived near Stamford but travelled hundreds of miles every week for the Stones) blasted us ahead with a snap shot from the edge of the box just before half time.

A war of attrition developed, with few chances, but as we played out time 45 minutes later the referee stepped in to ensure the most memorable of finishes. It was a bit like the Arsenal-Man Utd Cup Final of 30 years ago when all the action happened in the last few minutes.

The ref decided to add a couple of hours of stoppage time, and as the familiar music of 'Sports Report' could be heard ringing out from the clubhouse, he deemed that a Worthing player had been fouled in our box. 'Soft' is not a suitable adjective. The home side levelled at 1-1, the Worthing fans celebrated with near delirium and a great deal of taunting of the large Stones following.

Our misery, it seemed, was complete. But no - we kicked off and Noel Imber launched a huge punt downfield which the home keeper, Phil Reid, gathered under pressure from the onrushing Brian Jones. Last chance gone, we thought... but then Jonah, passing the keeper, suddenly fell to the ground clutching his face. Did Reid lift

an elbow? The referee (now our dear friend) must have seen something for he astonishingly awarded us a penalty and showed Reid the red card! He also then sent off the Stone's Phil Dicker, but never mind.

Rocky Baptiste (yes, the same one, who was a star for us at the fag end of the old Millennium) was remarkably laid-back as he stroked in the resultant spot kick, prompting much celebrating and mutual taunting of the home support, who then were then dismayed at hosting the travelling army in their bar. So much so that we left to spend

£100s elsewhere.

Such are the highs and lows of watching Wealdstone - and knowing that you are going to be stitched up, anyway, in the end. Does it make us bitter? Only till the next time.
