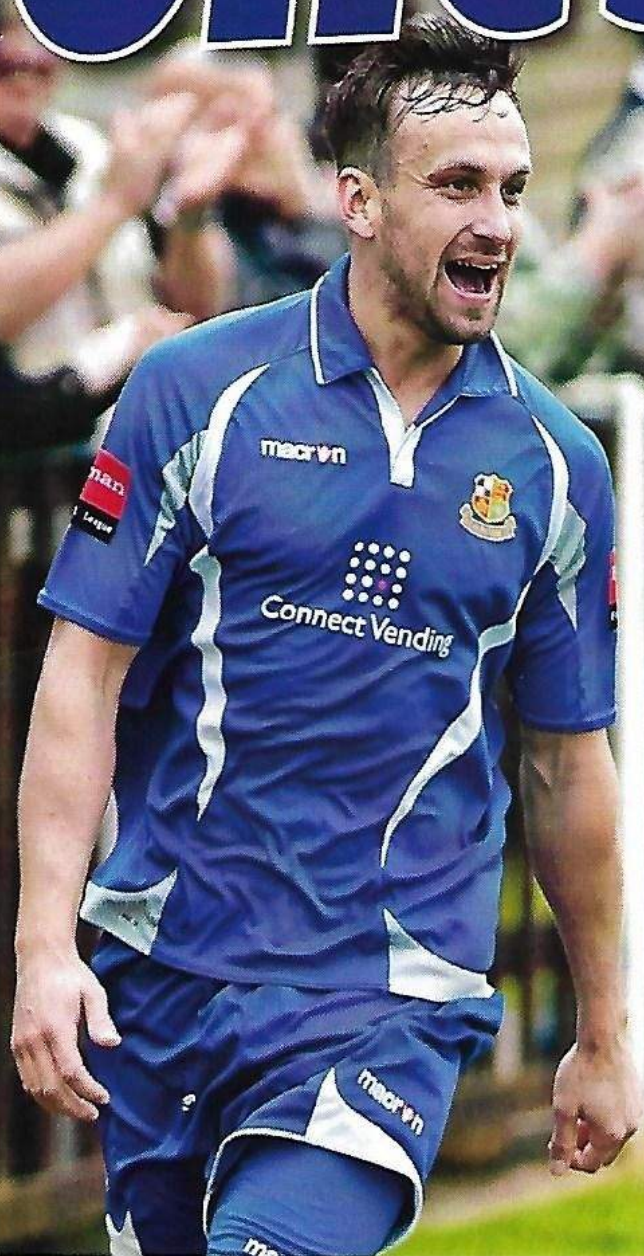

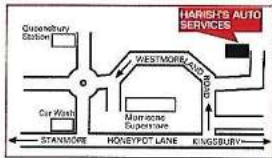

We still want to beat last year's points haul



Good afternoon to you all and a warm welcome to The St George's Stadium for our last home fixture of the season and our traditional tussle with our near neighbours Harrow Borough to whose players, management and officials that courtesy is extended as well as to today's match officials.

These notes have been written prior to last weekend's fixtures and, despite a heavy reverse at Lowestoft, our visitors find themselves still in the thick of the play off race. Many congratulations to Dave, his staff and his players for their achievements this season thus far and they will no doubt be wanting to avenge their home defeat to us a few weeks back as well as furthering their claims for one of the coveted play off slots in today's game.

It seems unbelievable that the season is almost over already. Pre-season only seems a few weeks ago when we were full of hope and anticipation. On reflection that was fully justified. We'd made a few additions to the spine of the team with the additions of Northy, Wes, Sean Cronin, Kurtney, Fitzy and Peter. All have proved their worth to the side over the season whilst Fitzy has had, and is still having, a desperate time with injuries preventing him from having the influence on the side that we'd all hoped for.

Overall it's safe to say that we're disappointed with the season. It's easy to find reasons for that—almost a new side barring a handful getting to know one another, the injuries to Fitzy and Chris, the loss of Kieran and Marvin at crucial times are all factors that have hindered our progress to a certain degree. Two pivotal periods spring to mind as defining moments of our season for me.

The first was the three weeks of inactivity over the Christmas period after the heart-break of the Newport County defeat which

was followed by three defeats in a row and the three defeats that followed the Folkestone draw after "that run". Combined, those 7 games gleaned a solitary point and have cost us dearly.

That said I feel there is still much cause for optimism and hope. A victory at Horsham on Saturday would still leave us able to better our points tally of last year and it looks like the goals conceded column will have improved over that period too. In Jonathon we have, in my opinion, as good a goalkeeper as there is in this league and with Sean pushing him all the way we have two outstanding stoppers on the books. Wes has brought a calmed assurance to the back four and is a fantastic competitor as well as an intelligent footballer. James Hammond is developing into a full back more than capable at this level whilst the blossoming partnership of Alex and Kurtney in the middle of the park has brought many admirers and positive comments from both within the club and from outside.

Sean has proved to be extremely versatile over the season and can always be relied upon to give his all whilst Pete returned to the club as a much more mature player and person and has weighed in with an excellent goal return despite playing wide right on many occasions. Throw in the likes of Chaps, Mass & Spends with the qualities they possess and I genuinely believe there is much grounds for optimism on the playing front if we can keep this group together and a chance for some silverware too! Off the pitch, as it were, crowds are still very healthy despite the economic situation and your continued efforts both vocally and financially never ceases to amaze me. This afternoon's match ball has been donated by brothers Roy & Alan Couch who have supported Wealdstone since the 1940s.

Roy was first taken to Lower Mead by a school friend and his father during the second world war but doesn't remember who was playing that day. Alan's first visit to Lower Mead was on March 23rd 1946 where he saw us draw 3-3 with Finchley in an Athenian League match. It was Finchley's home game but their ground was still unavailable due to bomb damage caused by the Luftwaffe during the war so the game was switched to Lower Mead. As the club's unofficial statistician, Roy has been supplying various statistics for the match-day programme since 1974. He was also the programme editor from 1992 to 2003. Two years ago he produced a 42 page booklet entitled Wealdstone FC "Facts and Figures" and an updated version up to the end of the present season will be available in our club shop at the start of next season.

Alan is currently our Match Secretary, a position he has held since we were at Watford in 1991. He is also the Administration Secretary of the Capital Football League and has been since 1993.

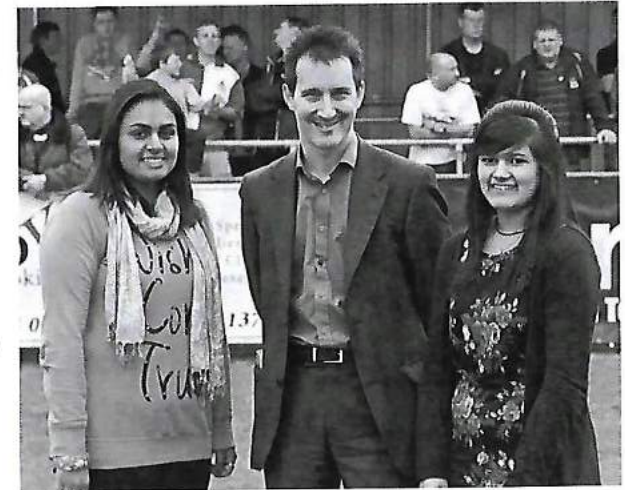

That other Harrow team

Roxonian FC was founded in the summer of 1933. The Club spent their first season in the Harrow and District League (playing their home games at a ground on Northolt Road), finishing runners-up in Division 1. They were accepted into the Spartan League, which coincided with the move to Earlsmead.

1938 saw Roxonian finish runners-up in Division 2 (West) but they had to wait for promotion until the following season, as only the champions went up. This was achieved under the new name of Harrow Town. War intervened though the Club continued to play in, first, the West Middlesex Combination, then the Middlesex Senior League. Peace brought a return to the Spartan League until 1958 when runners-up spot enabled the Club to move to the Delphian League. Five seasons were spent here, until mergers in 1963 saw Town accepted into Division 2 of the Athenian League.

In their first season at this level they finished runners-up, denied the championship only by goal difference. However, only three seasons were spent in Division 1, whence a name change to Harrow Borough coincided with relegation in 1967. Eight seasons were played as occupants of Division 2, during which it seemed that the club might withdraw from senior football, and only the efforts of a few hardy individuals kept the Club alive.

Negotiations with the local council saw the Club sell its second pitch, now the site of a school, and build a new clubhouse, floodlights and terracing. This progress was matched on the field; Boro' were elected to the Isthmian League in 1975 after having to wait a year for the complex to be completed. Four years later they won promotion to the Premier Division as runners-up.

The early 1980s saw the Club's most successful spell so far. The Middlesex Char-

ity Cup was won in 1980, the Middlesex Senior Cup three years later. Also in 1983 Harrow Borough reached the semi-finals of the FA Trophy, losing to the eventual winners, Telford United, over two legs.

A year later, the Club's Golden Jubilee was celebrated with a drawn match against Manchester United, Harrow's best FA Cup run so far, losing to Newport County (then of the old Football League Division 3) in the second Round Proper and best of all, winning the Isthmian League Premier Division championship by a staggering 17 point margin.

Under astute manager Micky Tomkys, Harrow had enjoyed continuous success but his retirement in 1986 saw a gradual decline in the Club's fortunes. On three occasions a win in the final game of the season has been required to enable the club to retain their treasured Isthmian Premier Division status.

1992/93, however, saw a

We first met in May 1941, a friendly played at our former Lower Mead home which ended in an 8-1 win for the Stones. At that time our near neighbours were known as Harrow Town, eventually changing to their present name in 1967.

It wasn't until Saturday 25th September 2004, the 49th match between our two clubs, that we were to meet for the first time in a league match. It was a Ryman League (Premier Division) fixture at the White Lion Ground in Edgware where, at the time, we were playing our home games. Our friends from South Harrow came out on top that day with a 3-0 victory thanks to a Fabio Valenti hat-trick. Since then we have met in a further ten Ryman League (Premier Division) fixtures. The results of these eleven games, with Wealdstone's score shown first, are as follows:-

dramatic improvement, with both the Middlesex Senior Cup and Middlesex Charity Cup returning to Earlsmead. The semi-final of the latter saw Chelsea defeated 4-1. A league placing of eighth was also their best for six seasons. This form continued over the next three seasons under the management team of Harry Manoe, with the Club finishing ninth in 1993-94, tenth 1994-95 and ninth again in 1996-97. A dip in the Club's fortunes saw his departure, to be followed by a succession of managers. A disastrous run of form during the 1999/00 season saw the Club avoid relegation by just a single goal.

Despite an encouraging start to the season to the

2000/01 season, which saw Boro' reach the 1st Round Proper of the FA Challenge Cup for only the second time (losing 0-3 at Wycombe Wanderers), a poor run of performances after Christmas saw the Club finish 4th from bottom again with just two points to spare.

2001-02 saw the club commence a long-term plan, targeting youth development. As well as fielding a young side, which managed to retain Premier Division status once more, close partnerships were formed with local youth football clubs. The summer of 2004 saw the formation of an Allied Counties under 18s squad, designed to bridge the gap between youth and

senior football.

Under the stewardship of manager David Howell Boro' have continued their youth and community development and they now have links with a number of local youth football clubs and schools.

Season 2006/07 saw Boro' finish in a relegation position only for their Premier Division place to be saved by Lancaster City whose financial difficulties saw them being relegated instead.

On a more pleasant note season 2005-06 saw Boro' win the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup for the third time with a 2-0 success over Enfield Town. Season 2006-07 saw the feat replicated with victory over Brook House 5-4 on penalties following a 0-0 scoreline with that game being played at Staines Town FC. Season 2008-09 saw Boro' finish as Runners-Up in the Isthmian League Cup, losing out to Tilbury 2-0 in the Final played on the ground of Staines Town FC. That season also saw Boro' reach the Semi Final of the London Senior Cup, a competition which they had entered for the first time in a considerable number of years.

Enforced cost cutting during the summer of 2008 saw the Club resigning its membership of the Allied Counties Youth League. This proved to be only a one season absence from youth team football as Boro' entered the expanded

Ryman Youth League for the 2009-10 season.

Season 2009-10 saw Boro' finish in a very creditable 14th position in the Ryman Premier Division, At Reserve Team level Boro's Capital League side, under the stewardship of Stuart Crawford, brought much success to the Club by winning the double of the Capital League: Western Division Title to go along with that of Capital League: President's Challenge Cup winners. Added to the fact that Boro' have now cleared their longstanding debt with HM Revenue & Customs and the Club enter the 2010-11 season with new found optimism.

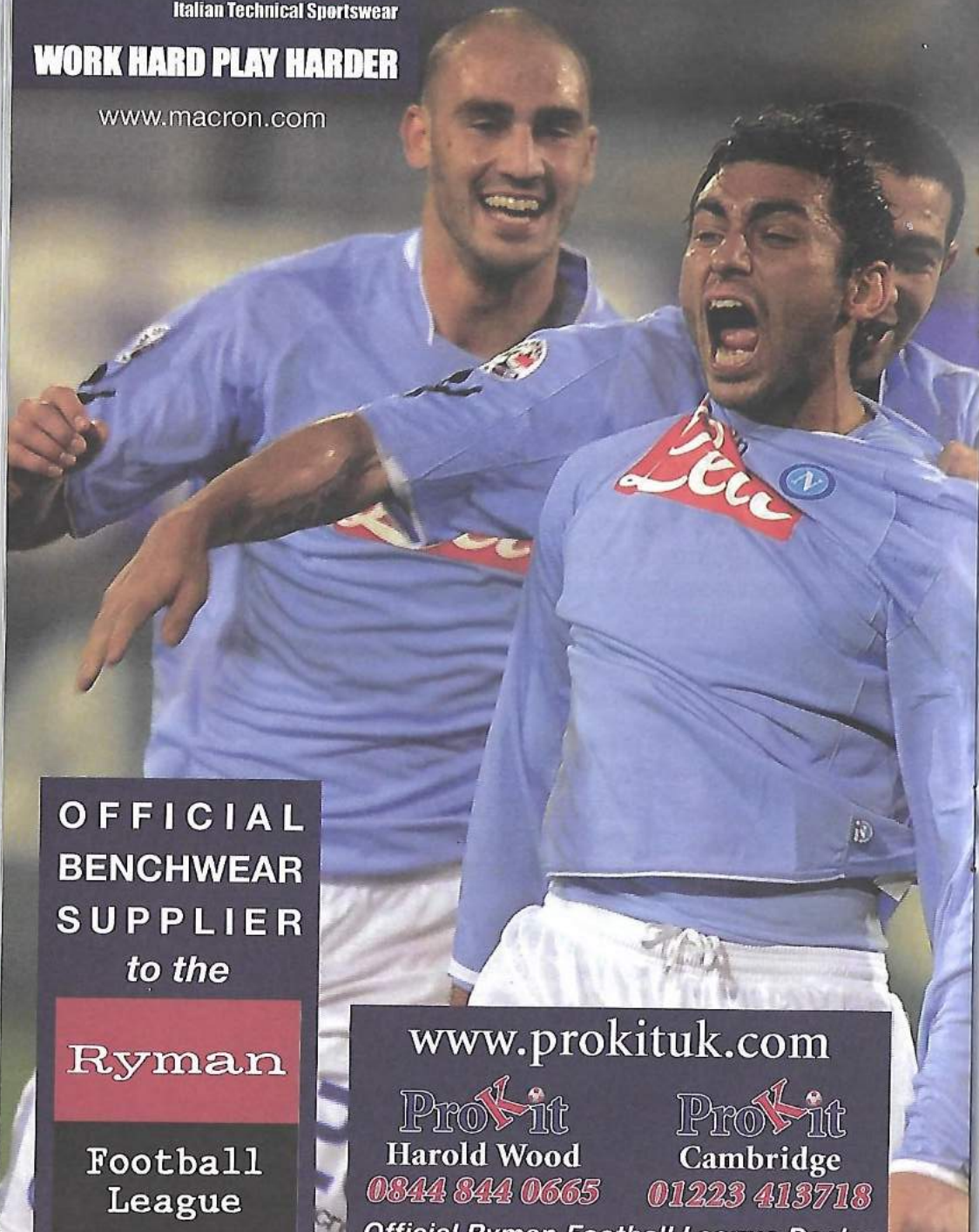

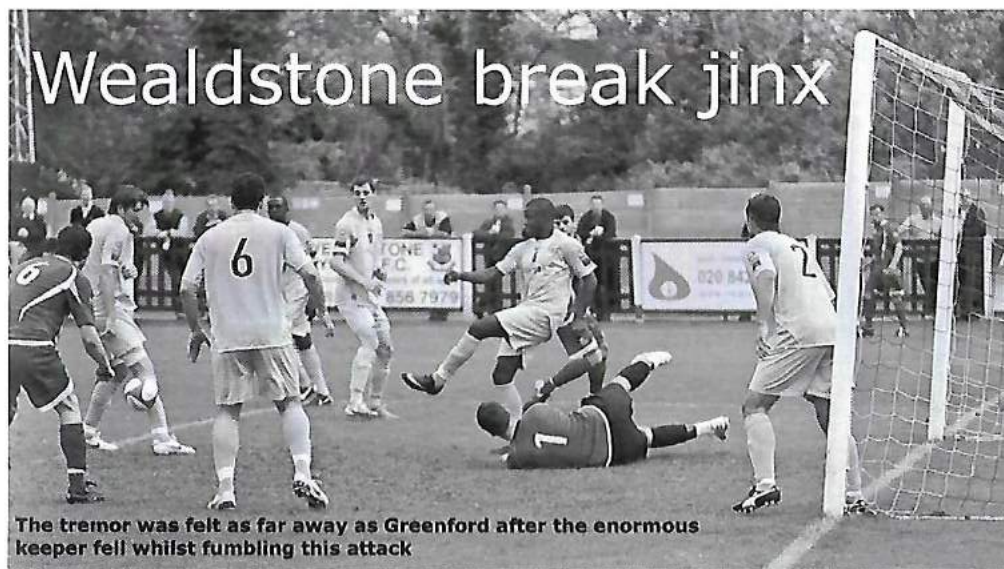

Gavin Massey had looked particularly lively for Wealdstone, and he came close on 75 minutes when his low drive from the edge of the box was well saved by Morgan.

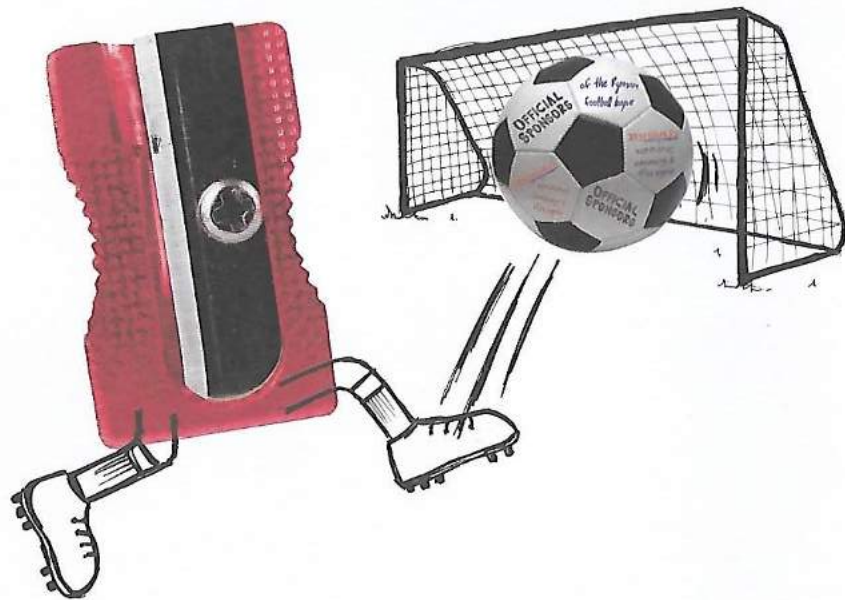

In his recent column in a national paper, former Premier League referee Graham Poll gave his view on Wayne Rooney's F-word outburst down the camera lens at Upton Park a fortnight ago.

Poll recalled his past dealings with Rooney's mouth, called for a three game ban and quotes part of Law 12 from the FA rule book.

It reads as follows: A player is sent off and shown the red card if he uses offensive or insulting or abusive language and/or gestures.

Quickly in your head, and it is pretty unlikely you can remember every occasion, count up how many times you've heard or seen a player or manager from your team fall foul of that rule.

Now count up how many times you've seen the first part of that rule—the red card bit—enforced. Not many I'd wager.

In fairness to Poll he has admitted in the past he has

been guilty of not going to his back pocket in that situation. A lot of column inches are filled with talk of footballers acting as role models – but what about referees? They need role models too.

If a referee at a Non-League game today sends a player off for foul and abusive language it is unlikely that player's manager will come out and say, 'Yes the referee was right to go by the book'.

However if officials at the top of the game start acting then referees learning their trade further down will feel confident in sticking to the rules.

A high-profile referee taking the correct course of action at a Premier League ground on live TV will go a long way to providing young, upcoming referees the support they need.

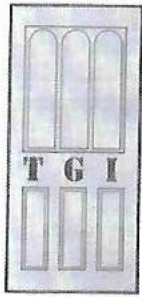

On this Day... 30 Years Ago with Tim Parks & Mick Fishman

**Saturday April 25th, 1981,
Alliance Premier League:
Kettering Town 0 Wealdstone 1**

It was the best of times; it was the worst of times, wrote Charles Dickens in A Tale of Two cities. And the end of the 1980-81 season was equally bittersweet for Stones fans as our club finished a rollercoaster season with the ultimate indignity: Relegation from the Conference National (or APL as it was then known).

It was the first time it had happened in our history. And it was all the more galling as Allen Batsford's side had put together a run of wins in the final month to have us all believing that we could escape the dreaded drop - and this victory at Kettering, who were going for the title, galvanised that belief.

Batsford, who had replaced previous boss Ken Payne in November after a disastrous home FA Trophy defeat by Oxford City, was putting together an excellent team.

The formidable Dennis Byatt had joined from Northampton's 1st XI (ironically turning down Kettering) and formed an impenetrable defence alongside Steve Perkins, Colin Hardman and Stuart Pearce this cold, wet, blustery Spring afternoon at Rockingham Road. The Kettering massive in the 2,500 crowd were expecting us to roll over. The Poppies needed two wins from their last two games to win the title but blew it big time in the face of the Stones' steely determination in awful conditions - driving sleet and a slippery surface - and the home team's only real chance came on 12 minutes when Byatt slipped to allow the

league's top scorer Nicky Evans through on goal. But he lobbed the ball over the bar. The hard-working Stones increasingly caught Kettering on the break with Fred Barwick, Clevere Forde and Robin Wainwright supplying the fast-raiding Neil and Alan Cordice. Three minutes from half time Alan Cordice was tripped on the right of the penalty area and Stuart Pearce curled a beautiful free kick which keeper Peter Walters got a hand to but could not keep out. The home fans were silenced. The 100 or so travelling Stones leaped about in disbelief. And while Kettering were expect to flood forward after the break, the second half saw Wealdstone frequently catch the hosts with cleverly-constructed attacks. Jimmy Sweetzer (another recent capture, from Millwall) and Alan Cordice were denied by fine saves from Walters - and then Neil Cordice characteristically blasted the ball over the bar from a Wainwright nod down.

Considering their title chances, Kettering were surprisingly subdued and the final whistle brought boos and cat-calls from the home fans, while we streamed out looking forward to a final two games that could save our season: home to Barrow on the Tuesday night, and then home to relegation favourites Leamington on the Saturday.

WHAT HAPPENED NEXT?

Well, you could understand our belief in avoiding the drop. We went into Kettering game on the back of three excellent results: a 2-2 league draw with Scarborough, another 2-2 friendly draw with Isthmian champions Wycombe Wanderers and a 7-0

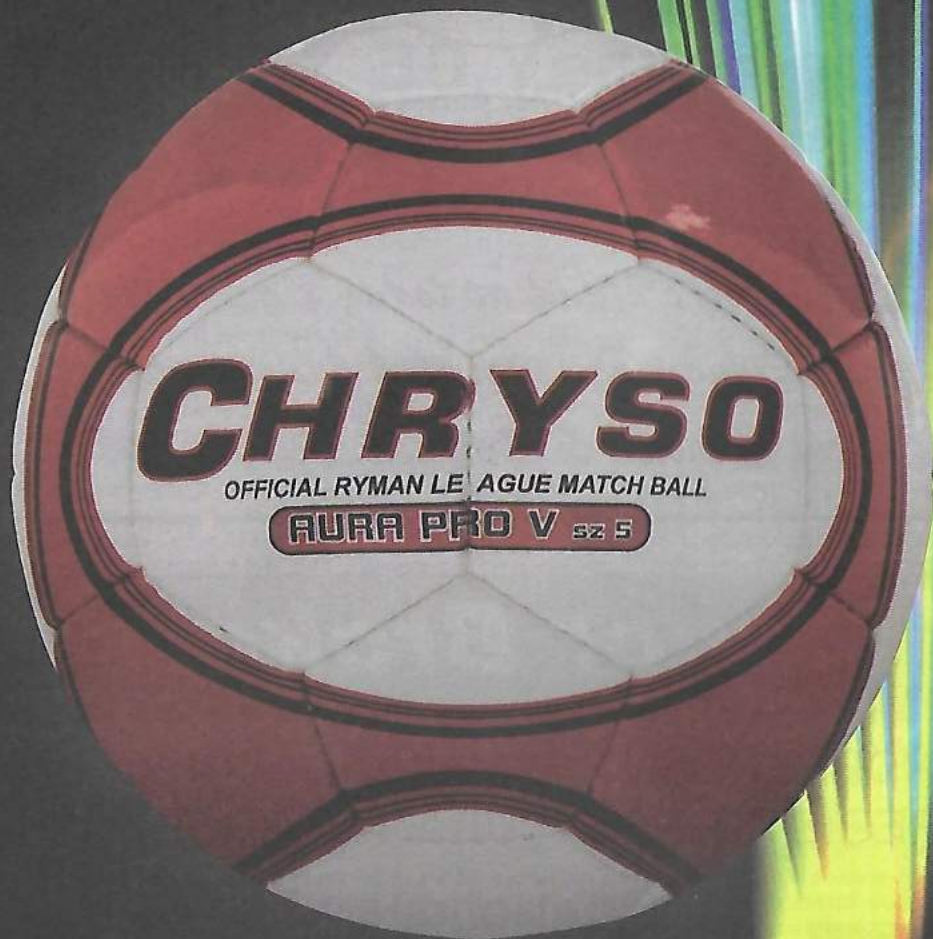

obliteration of a young Wimbledon side in another friendly. Thus there were over 700 at Lower Mead for the visit of Barrow (up almost 50% on the previous home crowd) and a cracking atmosphere as another Stuart Pearce freekick and a Sweetzer penalty wrapped up a 2-0 win.

Victory over Leamington seemed a formality. Especially when Robin Wainwright gave us a half time lead, and then earned a second-half spot-kick that seemed certain to wrap up the points. But Jimmy Sweetzer struck his shock wide of an upright and suddenly 'The Brakes' sensed salvation. They had nothing to lose: they were bracketed together with us on points, and with an identical goal difference, and poured forward in the last 10 minutes as the Stones fans pleaded with the referee to blow his whistle.

But Leamington found a way through to equalise. A draw would have saved us, but it was not enough for the Midlanders and, heartbreakingly for the home crowd, Stones keeper Ian Cranstone inexplicably rushed out into no-man's land for a late freekick and was beaten to the ball by Doug Hickton, who looped his header on into the net.

There was abject silence a few moments later when the referee ended the game. Uncomprehending misery. Our APL life had ebbed away in the space of ten minutes and Stones boss Batsford was left to rue his decision to stick with the error-prone Cranstone until the summer. As it was, he made former Orient and Wimbledon keeper Ray Goddard his first signing of pre-season and

the club roared back into the Conference by winning a Southern League 'clean sweep' in 1981-82. Worst of times; best of times. It certainly got better after that, with seven of the team going on to Gola League glory a few years later and one, Stuart Pearce, on to even better things....

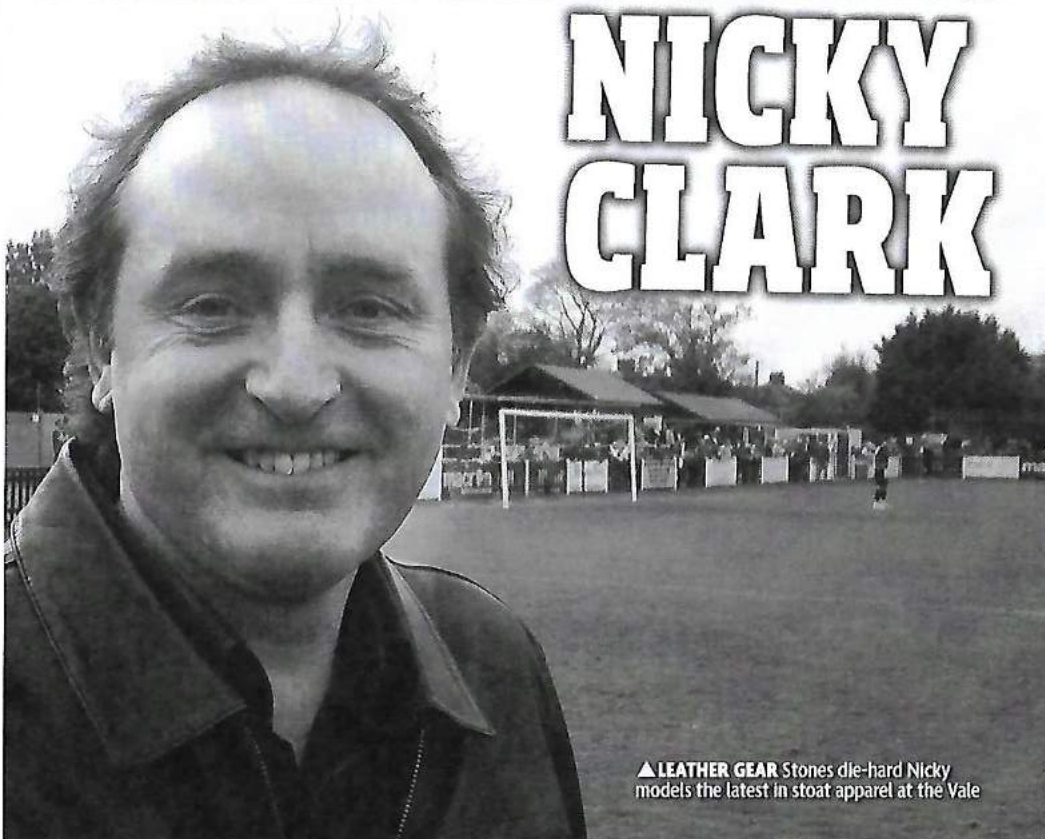
