t has been very pleasurable getting to know many of you personally either at the friendly games or Sunday evening's Q & A.

I would reiterate that although I am new to Wealdstone I am very conscious of and fully appreciate all the hard work that has gone on behind the scenes for years to get the club to where we are today - in a home of our own and playing at a decent level.

I cannot thank enough our army of unpaid volunteers who really are the lifeblood of this famous old club.

I am sure the message has already got out loud and clear that I am keen to give Gordon Bartlett every practical help in putting together a very useful squad - winning games and bringing in the fans is a useful bedrock to help build the club in other ways.

I would like to take the opportunity to reemphasise 2 topics that I dwelt upon at the Q & A

Manor Čhamber of Commerce very kindly came along as my guests. It was very interesting talking to both gentlemen and I sensed that they felt the club has not done enough to win the hearts and minds of the local residents and businesses.

It was suggested amongst other things that we could hold a Ruislip Manor Fair on our

grounds close season, that we could offer our clubhouse facilities to allow occasional local community meetings and that the pitches could be used for charity football events and good causes in general

By getting the club known as a 7 days a week hub for all the local community (not just the 3,00 on a Saturday afternoon footy lovers) will lead to all sorts of interesting and beneficial spin offs. For instance I suspect it will be easier for our commercial people to 'sell' to local businesses who want to be part of a community feel good factor. Also with the club a source of civic pride and much greater use by the local populace it will make it that much harder for the club to come off worse in our lease renewal negotiations as I suspect the freeholder will not want to antagonise local sensitivities.

Next I want to talk about Wealdstone Youth and indeed our relationship with the youngsters of Hillingdon. Nothing would give me greater pleasure than to see as many fresh faced kids at our games as us old 'wrinklies' (me very much included I)

I know we have all manner of largely free initiatives for youngsters but I think we are perhaps a little too complacent in thinking that just because they are 'out there' the kids are bound to pick up on it.

These days kids are bombarded with so many things to do. We need to keep repeating the message that kids are very much welcome at Wealdstone and also to keep reinventing the

message in interesting and unusual ways.


I have already told the Wealdstone Youth set up to come back to me with an achievable working plan to get as many of their 300/400 players to come along on match days.

We will also be seeking to spread the Wealdstone message to





A SEVEN-GOAL thriller saw Marathonbet's Premier League Legends come back from 3-0 down against the Stones

The former Fulham goalie made up for his howler five minutes later when Hutchinson raced through from a brilliant chipped ball over the top of the Legends backline. This time though Taylor won his duel smothering the ball first to deny Hutchinson his second.

Legends gaffer Alan Curbishley paced the touchline anxiously mid-way through the first half - but he would have been delighted with his team's response.

A barrage of attacks from the former Premier League stars soon followed - kick-started by a whipped ball from Frank

Sinclair into the back post which just missed a leaping Teddy Sheringham.


A minute later Darren Anderton hooked up with ex-Arsenal man Ray Parlour on the edge of the box, but the Romford Pele blazed over with a first-time shot.

Taylor made another fine save to deny Hutchinson down the other end before Legends turned the screw further.

Bolton big-man Kevin Davies found himself on the end of a Sheringham cross and was moments from pulling the trigger at the back post - but impressive Stones keeper Liam O'Brien was all over it like a rash.

O'Brien made the difference again when pulling off a fine save from a Matt Holland drive





the Legends skipper finding himself through on goal with iust the keeper to beat - before Kevin Davies picked up the rebound and fired another bullet for O'Brien to save.

Stones' box was like a pressure-cooker - a goal surely inevitable - but heroic O'Brien was having none of it. He denied Darren Anderton as he raced through on goal before saving again from the former Spurs man when he jumped highest in the box from a corner.

Stones doubled their tally completely against the run of play in the 38th minute when Ricky Wellard picked out Josh Hutchinson with a cross from the right to glance past the stranded Maik Taylor.

And three minutes later the tie looked dead and buried when Hutchinson netted his hat-trick. Former Cardiff star Danny Gabbidon lost possession clumsily on the left to allow Hutchinson to cut inside and bury an unstoppable shot off the post into the net.

The Legends had it all to do after the break.

Sheringham, Holland, Winterburn and Anderton created a host of chances for the visitors but it took them until the 73rd minute before Ruel Fox raced to the byline and pulled it back for Dion Dublin to pass into an empty net.

And in true London-bus fashion, the rest of their goals quickly followed.

Two minutes later Sean Cronin who swapped his Wealdstone top for a Legends jersey scored the goal of the game with a delightful chip over the rushing goalkeeper to make it 3-2.

And the equaliser came almost immediately afterwards when Dion Dublin picked up a Matt

Holland square-ball to fire into the top corner from 12 yards.

The Wealdstone faithful sung their hearts out - all too aware of what was unfolding in front of

But their war cries were of no use to their heroes, who finally surrendered everything when quick-footed Sean Cronin floored three Wealdstone defenders with a tasty turn before firing a screamer into the top corner.

The Wealdstone Raider made a cameo appearance in the final minutes - duly obliging when the crowd begged him for a wave.

But despite all he's done for the club, he could not stop the Marathonbet Premier League Legends running out 4-3 winners in what was a day to remember.



Gordon Bartlett. More successful than the past 7 England managers

ince Gordon Bartlett took the Wealdstone job in 1995, no fewer than eight individuals - each among the hottest managerial properties at the time of appointment have coached England.

And a fat lot of good they've done us. All the while Gordon Bartlett, unlike England's lamentable shower of overpaid incapables, has been racking up a wealth of promotions and league titles against the odds.

The sheer paucity of England's results is frightening. Since Gordon first sat on the White Lion Ground bench back in August 1995, the England team has reached one European Championships semi

(with home advantage) and two quarter finals. Keep in mind that until Euro 2016, reaching a Euros quarter final just meant getting out of the group. Meanwhile, in the World Cup, all we have to show for it are two second round ties and two quarter finals.

Knock-out numpties

More amazing is that, since the dawn of the Bartlett era, the England team has won just two competitive knock-out matches. Two! None in the Euros, and just Denmark (2002) and Ecuador (2006) in the World Cup. Sure, we've usualy managed to qualify for tournaments; but when it comes to the business end, when we're called

on to actually win a game or go home, we've been appalling.

And now, following the most humiliating of exits to a country with a population only marginally greater than that of the London Borough of Hillingdon, here we go again. Nothing against Sam Allardyce, good luck as ever to the new man. If enthusiasm won tournaments, we'd be odds on for Russia 2018. But look at Sam's predecessors and you realise all we ever do is try out whichever character type and skill set the last bloke wasn't.

Forget the FA's structural defects, our record of reacting against whichever incumbent type is dismally predict-

able. When jack-the-lad, skeletons-in-cupboard Terry Venables offended the FA's commercial boys, tactical superstar Glenn Hoddle succeeded him. When Hoddle went off the rails after some absurd bit of afterlife mysticism, the bloodand-guts passion monster Kevin Keegan came, burnt brightly and left in a pool of deeply felt but tactically inept tears. It was surely only right that a cool, calm, urbane sophisticate was brought in next time as his polar opposite; so hello Seven Goran Eriksson, a man to whom all eyes turned for his pearls of calmly considered Swedish wisdom. And then, eventually, success having alluded us over three

more tournaments, that whole lack of passion thing bit again and the call went out for another red blooded Englishman. Next was another manager who'd done reasonably in the Europa League, Roy Hodgson, an Englishman who'd also been an international manager before, don't you know. But yet again, this time against Iceland for God's sake, we had in place an England manager more concerned wirh being caught on camera looking like he hadn't a

clue than someone who, you know, actually had a clue.

So now it's Allardyce. What kind of reaction against type is Sam to his immediate predecessor? Big Sam got the gig "following a comprehensive and structured process". Well, yeah, you'd like to think. And Allardyce, says the FA press release, "arrives with a track record of getting the best results out of the teams he has managed and a strong reputation as a forward-thinker



There is always a buzz in the air when Wealdstone nd St Albans take the field. This is the scene last April when the Saints came to Grosvenor Vale in a rich seam of form and held us to a 1-1 draw

Over 70 years of facing each other, but are Stones & the Saints genuine rivals? Probably not as much as we SHOULD be

IVALRY in football is a wonderful thing that runs through football from top to bottom. Location is the usual foundation for rivalry on the pitch, but occasionally it is the school playground approach to football of "we've won more trophies then you", with Manchester united and Liverpool being a case in point.

For Wealdstone it has always been about geographical location and the formation of the leagues in which we competed.

In the old amateur days our main rivals were Hendon, a rivalry that ended when the Stones joined the semi-professional Southern League in 1971. Barnet replaced the Greens as our main rivals during our Southern League stint in the 1970s, with Enfield taking on the mantle during the Conference years in the 80s.

What added to the spice of the rivalries was that they were conducted between clubs of equal status and tradition. Without wishing to be patronising (but still managing to be so) the "rivalry"

with Harrow Borough never really sustained the same intensity due to the differing size and status of the clubs. The rivalry was by and large one way.

Other clubs have played their part over the years in getting under the skin of Stones supporters. Bath City, Harlow Town, Braintree Town and Concord Rangers spring to mind; but despite the close geographic proximity of St Albans to Wealdstone, the fact that the two teams have only competed in the same league in nine out of the last 71 seasons has prevented any denuine rivalry emerging and being sustained. This is a real shame as the clubs have always been big hitters in the nonleague game with the potential to attract large crowds.


This is not to say that St Albans have failed to register on

the Wealdstone radar. Following the Stones' election to the Isthmian League in 1964, The Saints became by and large difficult and irritating opponents. For example, the glorious 1965/66 season in which Stones lifted the FA Amateur Cup, The Saints registered the double over us, 1-0 at Clarence Park and 3-0 at Lower Mead (just a week before the Wembley final), in which the balding, veteran ex-Enfield and Barnet midfield maestro, Roy Agar, played us off the park hateful little man.


The very next season St Albans handed out a 6-1 thrashing at Lower Mead having already won 2-0 earlier in the season. The Saints were then a solid mid-table side so there was no particular reason for them to hand out such annoying defeats, but they did and continued to inflict the odd and highly irritating defeat on The Stones for the rest of our amateur days.

Between 1967 and 1970 Wealdstone were by and large

We had a very good side, but despite enjoying a home draw were unable to see off a well drilled and dangerous Prosser inspired side. A 1-1 draw at lower Mead in front of 3.500 spectators was followed with a 1-0 defeat at Clarence Park in a highly charged atmosphere generated by a crowd of 5,000 plus. We reproduce the Times report of the game (right). Those were great days to be following top amateur teams and it wasn't unusual to find match reports in the national newspapers.

■ ealdstone's final season as amateurs saw the club at a low ebb, managed by a man floundering in the task, Alan Humphries, and fielding a young and inexperienced side. The saints dispatched us 3-0 at Lower Mead and by a hugely dispiriting 5-0 at Clarence Park, with the home side seemingly not feeling the need to move up beyond second gear. We left the Isthmian League behind with our ears ringing from the St Albans faithful chanting "Wealdstone are a load of s**t". At the time, cruel but true.

The two clubs then became largely strangers to each other. Just one meeting was recorded in the FA Cup 1st Qualifying Round in September 1989 at Clarence Park in front of 526 spectators, a far cry

ST. ALBANS IN SECOND ROUND

IN their 60th year, St. Albans could achieve the rare distinction for an amateur club of reaching the FA Cup third round for, at Clarence Park last night, they won their way to a home tie on Dec. 7 against Walsall, who beat Leytonstone only by the odd goal.

A Tony Lynch goal three minutes into injury time saw Wealdstone through in a nailbiting finale to this F A Cup first qualifying round tie.

Yet just thirty seconds earlier a very different result had seemed on the cards.

At a very low ebb after letting St Albans steal an equaliser they never appeared capable of, Stones' defence again opened invitingly and allowed City striker Shaun Bryant to carve his way through their ranks until he was left with only Kevin Foster to beat.

It seemed curtains for Stones when he fired past the exposed keeper but fortunately Rod Findley was on hand to cap a magnificent performance by saving his side from disaster with a goalline clearance. And as an added bonus he unwittingly began the move which seconds later ended with the ball in the City net for Westdstone's winner.

The ball was fed out to Sea Norman who broke away down the left and found John Margerrison on the edge of the penalty area, Margerrison's cross was inch perfect and Lynch stormed in to glance a perfect and Lynch stormed in to glance a perfect stores' army of 300 traveiling fans into ecstasy.

The drama of the finish however was in complete contrast to the rest of the metch which had little to offer. Wealdstone were clearly the better side and started brightly and should have settled the issue in the opening exchanges.

A great bail from Mark Harrison put the elusive Lynch in to round former Stones defender Doug McClure but his shot was half stopped by keeper Bozier and Paradise completed the clearance as the ball rolled towards the not.

Far too often Lynch's excellent work down the wing was wasted by profligate forwards.

Soon after Tony Keily nodded down a cross from Lynch and Paul Wilkins rattled an upright with a fierce drive.

But Stones then lost their way and it was not until the start of the second haif that they egain posed any real threat with Steve Browne having a low shot turned away by Bozier and Lynch voltaying over fron close range.

They had a narrow escape in the 50th minute when Herrison carelassly lost the ball to Williams in his own area but Bryant blazed hopelessly over when presented with the clearest of chances and St Albans were made to psy for that miss when Stones went ahead two minutes later.

A great run from Norman made the chance and with the home defence waiting vainly for an offside decision he put Kelly through to slip a low shot past Boziar into the corner of the net, it was the £10,000 striker's first competitive goal for Stones and one that will no doubt start a rush on the "I sew Tony Kelly score a goal" badges in the club shop.

That solitary strike looked more than enough to take Stones through until with seven minutes to go sloppy defence let Bryant in to beat Foster and set up an exciting climax.

from the 5,000 plus crowd 20 years earlier. It was not a game blessed with enormous quality but did enjoy a dramatic finale. With the Stones appearing to comfortably see out a 1-0 win, sloppy play allowed St Albans to equalise in the second minute of injury time and almost snatch a win seconds later. It was a goalline clearance by Rod Findlay that set off an end to end move that resulted in Tony Lynch heading in a winning goal.

There were no further meetings between the two clubs until 2014 when both gained promotion to the Conference South, St Albans from the Southern League and Wealdstone from the Ryman League. All was set for the formation of a keen rivalry, particularly as The Saints were by now fielding ex-Stones players and being co-managed by an ex-player, Jimmy Gray.
