

The first of our ten previous matches against Margate took place on Saturday 31st August 1974, just four days after we had beaten Bury Town 7-1 in a Southern League Cup match. Any thoughts the Lower Mead faithful had of seeing another big win for the Stones was soon to disappear as the seasiders left Lower Mead with a 3-0 victory under their belts. This first meeting came as a result of us having gained promotion to the Southern League Premier Division for the first time by winning the First Division South the previous season. Our team that afternoon was:- John Morton, Derek Evans, John Watson, Eric Burgess, John McCormick, Ray Fulton, Jim Godfrey, Terry Evans, Bill Byrne, George Duck, John Henderson, with Paul Fairclough as substitute. Later on that season we were to lose 2-1 at Margate's Hartsdown Park but all things considered we fared reasonably well that season finishing in eighth position, one place behind Margate.

The following season, 1975/76, Margate again completed a league double over us, winning 2-1 down by the sea and 4-1 at Lower Mead. Margate finished in 11th place in the final table while Wealdstone, who finished 19th, were only saved from relegation by the enforced demotion of Dunstable Town.

We began the 1976/77 season by visiting Hartsdown Park for our opening league fixture and goals by Keith Lawrence (17 mins) and Stuart Woolgar (32) paved the way for a 2-0 victory, our first ever over the Kent club. Although Margate were to draw 1-1 at Lower Mead later in the season it was nt enough to prevent them finishing bottom of the table and being relegated. Wealdstone managed to finish in 14th place.

Season 1978/79 saw Margate back in the Premier Division once more and their league matches with us resulted in both sides gaining 1-0 wins on their respective home grounds. Wealdstone finished in 15th place and were to become one of the founder members of the newly formed Gola League. Margate, in 19th place, were to become part of the new Southern Division of the Southern League. (Correction: For Gola League read Alliance Premier League).

Our paths didn't cross again until the 1981/82 season when, having been relegated the season before, we were to meet Margate (by now known as Thanet United) in the Southern League's Southern Division. The fortunes of both clubs were to be complete opposites. We finished the season as league champions while or visitors finished bottom of the table in 24th place. During the season we recorded our biggest win over the seasiders, winning 6-1 at Lower Mead. Neil Cordice scored one of our goals, the others coming from his brother Alan with two, Colin Hardman, Nigel Johnson and Robin Wainwright. On Saturday 20th April 1982 we travelled down to Hartsdown Park for what was to be our last meeting until this afternoon. Goals by Paul Bowgett (25 mins) and Alan Cordice (77) earned us a 2-O victory, the teams that day being as follows:- MARGATE: Colin Page, Neville Hemmings, Mark Dixon, Gordon Bines, Andrew Jackson, Bob Walter, Alan Fagan, Wayne Godden, Lennie Lee, Karl Lloyd, Mark Harrop, with Tony Smith (substitute). WEALDSTONE: Ray Goddard, Steve Perkins, Stuart Pearce, Dennis Byatt, Paul Bowgett, Fred Barwick, Paul Waites, Robin Wainwright, Alan Cordice, Ray Knowles, Roy Davies, and John Morris as substitute.

WEALDSTONE APPEARANCES 1991/92 SEASON

Wealdstone used 50 different players in the 78 league and cup matches played last season. Jim Watson started in 62 matches and came on as sub in one. He was followed by Neil Cordice, who missed only one Beazer Homes League match, with 61+2 sub appearances. Other players to make 20 appearances were Paul Goyette 48+6, Leo Donnellan 46+12, Tiv Lowe 45+1, Andy Hedge 44+11, Steve Tapley 42, Peter Bartlett 40+2, Wayne Roach 37, Sean Pearson 31+8, Mark Hopson 31+7, Russell Wilson 29+9, Dermot Drummy 29+1, David Hudson 29, Johnson Hippolyte 26+14, Martin Blackler 23, Martin McGuire 20+6, Steve Browne 18+4 and Mark Harrison 17+4.



MARGATE FOOTBALL CLUB

Margate FC was formed in 1896. They played at various grounds, including Northdown Road and the Nargate College grounds. They won the Kent Junior Cup in 1902 and joined the Kent League in 1911/12. After the Great War, the club turned professional and used grounds at Dreamland Amusement Park and Garlinge. The club was suspended by the football authorities for 1923/4, but were runners up in the Kent League in 1927/8. However, heavy debts caused the club to close down at the end of that season. Margate FC reformed in 1929 and moved to the new Hartsdown Park ground. The club then began it's fine record in the FA Cup, in which victories have been achieved over Gillingham, QPR, Crystal Palace, Bournemouth and Swansea City, Having won the Kent League in 1932/3, Margate joined the Southern League and were runners up in their first season. Margate became the nursery club to Arsenal in 1934, with many Arsenal players coming to Margate. They even played a home FA Cup tie at Highbury. This was the club's most successful period. In 1935/6. Margate reached the FA Cup 3rd Round, losing 1-3 at Blackpool. They were Southern League champions, having won the Eastern Division and beaten Western champions Plymouth Argyle Res. in the decider. Margate also won the Southern League Central Section, the Kent Senior Cup, Kent Senior Shield and Kent League Cup. The following season, Margate won the Southern League Midweek Section. Heavy costs saw the club return to the Kent League in 1937/8 and they finished as champions. However, the Arsenal nursery arrangement ended and heavy debts caused the club to close down. Margate FC was reformed for the 1939/40 season, but them war broke out again. The club was reformed again after the end of the war. Many honours were won in the 'Kent League Days', including the 'double' in 1947/8. Most of the success was under the management of Almer Hall, the former Brighton, Spurs and West Ham player. He was manager from 1950 until 1970. Having played in Amber & Black for many years, the club changed to Blue & White in the late 1940's - one of the club officials was a Huddersfield fan and suggested their colours! In 1959, along with several other Kent clubs, Margate joined the expanding Southern League. In 1961, there was a sensational 3-0 win in the FA Cup 1st Round at Bournemouth, who, until then, had been undefeated at home in Div. 3. Nargate were Div.1 champions in 1962/3, but were relegated from the Premier Division in 1965/6, returning as runners up the following season. Margate beat neighbours Ramsgate Athletic in the Southern League Cup Final, in 1967/8. They were runners up in this cup in 1962 and 1975. In 1971/2, Bournemouth had revenge in the FA Cup, beating Hargate 11-0 at Dean Court, with Ted McDougal scoring a record nine goals. The following season, Margate reached the FA Cup 3rd Round again, losing 0-6 at home to Tottenham Hotspur, before a record 14,500 crowd. Margate were relegated again in 1976/7, but were champions of Div.1(South) the following season. In 1981, the club changed it's name to Thanet United, hoping to attract sponsorship from a wider area. The club finished bottom of the league in it's first season and struggled to avoid relegation in the following two seasons. Promotion was narrowly missed in 1984/5, while in 1987/8, Thanet finished 5th. They again struggled against relegation in 1988/9, towards the end of which, a new Board of Directors was appointed. The club reverted to it's better known name of Hargate FC for the 1989/90 season, on a firm financial footing, hoping to see a return to the kind of success which has been enjoyed at Hartsdown Park in the past. Over 40 players have joined League clubs from Margate, including: Mal Griffiths (Leicester City & Wales), Horace Cumner (Notts Co., Arsenal & Wales), George Thompson (Linfield & Northern Ireland), Reg Lewis (Arsenal & England) and George Marks (Arsenal & England). MARGATE FOOTBALL CLUB - PEN PICTURES 1992/3 LEE SMELT (Joint Manager) - Began his career with Colchester Utd and joined Margate at the start of 76/7. He moved on to Gravesend & N. and joined Nottingham Forest in June 1980 for £15,000. He later played for Peterborough Utd, Halifax T., Cardiff C. and Exeter C. Back in non-league football, he played for Maidstone Utd, Welling Utd, Thanet Utd and Herene Bay, Joining Hythe Town as player-coach in 87/8. After a spell as 'Team Manager', he became Margate's manager in Nov. 1991. Soon to join the Police, he now shares the manager's role with Mark Weatherly, MARK WEATHERLY (Joint Manager/Defender) - Began with Canterbury City, before joining Gillingham and making over 500 apps for them between 74/5 and 88/9. After 14 seasons with Hythe Town, he joined Margate in March 1991. 'Player of the Year' last season. IAN YOUNG (Midfield) - Signed in the summer of 1989 from Bromley. Had 7 years at Gillingham, begining as an apprentice and made one 1st team app. He joined Margate after 4 years with Bromley. Currently the longest serving Margate player. He made a brilliant penalty save against Abingdon last season, as a substitute 'keeper! BRIAN FRAMPTON (Defender) - Signed in the summer of 1989 from Bromley. Formerly with Coburg (Australia). Missed most of 90/1 with a broken ankle. KEVIN HUDSON (Goalkeeper) - Signed in December 1990 from Folkestone Town. He began with Dover Athletic, rising through the youth and reserve sides to the 1st team. A Kent youth and schools player, he later played for Canterbury City, Herne Bay and

Folkestone. He had a loan spell with Dover, last season.

MARTIN BUGLIONE (Forward) - Began with Enfield, appearing during their GMVC winning season 1985/6. He later played for Boreham Wood, Walthamstow Avenue, Dagenham and Tonbridge, Welling Utd He joined Nargate at the start of 90/1 and was top goal scorer last season.

TONY HARMOOD (Defender) - Began as a trainee with Coventry City, before turning professional. He had a loan with Maidstone Utd, before joining Margate at the start of last season.

STUART REED (Defender) - Began with Folkestone FC, where he was a regular in their BHL team. Joined Margate at the start of 1991, following the demise of Folkestone.

BILL ROFFEY (Defender) - Over 400 appearances for C.Palace, Orient, Brentford and Millwall. Had 3 years with Leixoes(Portugal) and a short spell with Barnet, before retiring from senior football. Made a come back with Margate last season, when he was

PETER JARVIS (Midfield) - Signed from Hythe Town in February 1992. Formerly with Sheppey United, Chatham Town, Ashford Town and Chelmsford City.

the 'Players' Player of the Year'.

GRAHAM BRENTON (Midfield) - Began as an apprentice with Gillingham, later playing for Sheppey Utd, Bromley and IFK Marishamn(Finland). Had two games for Hargate during 89/90, before returning to Marishamn. Rejoined Margate in September 1991.

SHAUN PILBEAM (Forward) - Signed in December 1991 from Dover Athletic, where he had been a consistent goal scorer in the youth and reserve teams.

PAUL UNDERWOOD (Forward) - Originally joined Margate in the summer of 1991 from Corinthian. Formerly with Gillingham, Dartford and Gravesend & Northfleet. In he was Margate's only ever-present player, top scorer with 26 goals and 'Supporter's Player of the Year' in 91/2. Margate received a club-record fee for him, from Fisher Athletic in August 1991 but he returned to the club in March.

MARC SHELT (Forward) - Rejoined the club for his 3rd spell, this summer. He has our sucplayed for many clubs, more recently Sittingbourne, Canterbury and Ramsgate.

MARTIN WEATHERLY (Defender) - Signed from local football this summer.

TIN PAGE (Defender) - Played for Folkestone in the BHL before joining Margate during 91/2. He has featured in the reserves and U18s teams. making his 1st team debut in

the home match with Bury, last season.

It may even get worse on the pitch before it gets better, I know it is a well worn cliche, but very appropriate in the circumstances. Patience will be a virtue.

That is not to say that success on the pitch can not be achieved. Many still contend that on playing ability alone, last season's team should have finished in the top half of the Premier division, not being relegated. Challenges for the title will many, but that should not deter our own ambitions. Sittingbourne, who sold their ground for £6m as we did but still have some £4m left accruing interest, will be strong favourites. They have bought a number of players will great experience, but as other clubs have found this does not always achieve the desired result. Sudbury Town, who consistently do well in the F A Vase, should figure strongly. They are a side with good support, that as yet failed to live up to expectations. Could this be their year? Of last year's other relegated teams, Gravesend, who finished bottom, have probably the best hopes.
