Good evening ladies and gentlemen and welcome to the officials, players and

Weymouth are having a tremendous season and look certain to be at least runnersup in the League to Bath City, and by this evening we will know the result of their Southern League Cup Final second leg game against Gravesend on Saturday, and whether they won or lost it is certainly an achievement to reach the final, and for this and their league performances this season they are certainly to be congratulated.

On the subject of congratulations they are certainly due to Alan Fogarty and the team for such a wonderful run recently now gong unbeaten for 14 league games, a club record in the Southern League, obtaining 23 points from a possible 28.

Since writing the last programme notes we have played three games, against Yeovil I ower Mead and away to Bedford and Barnet.

Against Yeovil we had the worst of the exchanges in the first half not least of which comisted of Steve Brinkman being forced to leave the field after a particularly vigorous tackle.

In the second half we got on top and when George was clear through it looked like a roal, but Duminey the Yeovil centre-half had other ideas, and a "professional" foul on the edge of the penalty box halted George and Duminey was shown the yellow we failed to make anything from the free kick and soon afterwards Yeovil scored a roal.

Dave Parratt was injured trying to stop the goal and later two Yeovil players led and needed attention, these stoppages plus add-ons for Yeovil time wasting led minutes being added by the referee and it was in the fifth minute of this added that we were awarded a penalty for a foul on George which he duly converted, justice.

I did not see the game against Bedford but fellow Director Robin Blanchflower tells me I missed one of our best performances all season, albeit against a poor side.

Two fine goals from full back Alan Fursdon plus a superb volleyed goal from George Duck and a well taken Steve Briscoe goal gave us four goals to Bedford's single

one from player manager Barry Fry.

Against Barnet last Tuesday we had a 2—1 defeat at Lower Mead on Boxing Day to avenge, which we duly did by the same score, but not before some Barnet players had found their way into the referec's book, which just about calmed things down. Jimmy Greaves (who else) opened the scoring for Barnet, soon afterwards George Duck was laid out by Underwood (son of Barnet chairman and ex-Wealdstone manager Dave Underwood) in a bad off the ball attack. Happily George's answer came in the most appropriate manner, he scored both our goals one in each half to give us a well deserved victory.

This evening is the last time we shall be at home and therefore I must pay tribute to the whole team for such a wonderful cup run which has made history for Wealdstone Football Club, and also for their fine league performance (and I hope by the season's end we could finish as high as sixth) and finally to Alan Fogarty who has worked so hard in his first full season as Manager and who has laid fine foundations for next season.

On Wednesday 26th Deanes F.C. the youth team which will be our youth team next year will be playing Poplar Boys F.C. one of the top youth teams in London, so come along at 7.30 p.m. to see the possible Wealdstone players of the future.

In closing I would like to thank all those, too numerous to mention, who have contributed so much to Wealdstone Football Club this season and look forward to their, and your, continued support. Thank you.

Record Breaking Win at Barnet

"Records are made to be broken" would appear to be Wealdstone's motto as one record after another has tumbled during this amazing season. The latest to go was set up during our championship season of 1973/74 when we had a run of 13 successive league matches without defeat. Now as a result of our splendid win at Barnet on Tuesday we have remained unbeaten in our last 14 **Premier Division** matches (9 wins, 5 draws) to establish a new club record. Earlier this season we completed 14 **league and cup** matches without defeat for the first time when we drew at Kettering, and in November George Duck broke Viv Evans all-time club goal scoring record of 216 goals. In the F.A. Cup several records were broken as we recorded our first ever victories over Football League opposition whilst proceeding to the 2nd and 3rd Rounds of the competition for the first time in the clubs history. Unfortunately another record was established in January when we lost eight consecutive **league and cup** matches, our longest run of defeats since turning professional in 1971.

In one of last season's programmes Tim Parks supplied statistics showing that the majority of goals scored at Lower Mead since we joined the Southern League have been at the cinema end of the ground. Now Bill Cowan, a supporter for the past 30

years, has come up with some more interesting facts about the 80 goals scored during the 34 First XI matches played here this season. During the first half of these games Wealdstone and their opponents have hit 33 goals with a further 47 coming after the break and once again the cinema end has come out ahead, 45 of the 80 goals being scored that end. Out of this total of 80 the 'Stones have scored 49 goals, 29 at the Cinema End and 20 at the Elmslie End. Breaking these figures down still further we find that our lads have hit the target 19 times in the first half (Cinema 6, Elmslie 13) and scored another 30 after half-time (Cinema 23, Elmslie 7). One other statistic Bill has provided which again favours the cinema end concerns the first goal to be scored in each half. In the opening 45 minutes the first goal has been scored at the Cinema end on 17 occasions and at the Elmslie end 11 times, with the first goal of the second half arriving at the Cinema end 21 times and only 4 times at the Elmslie end.

This evening we wind up our home fixtures with a visit from Weymouth, Southern League Cup finalists and most likely runners-up in the league this season. Since losing 7—2 at home to leaders Bath City on Boxing Day Weymouth have been beaten only once in their last 21 league games. As our only defeat in our last 16 games was against Italian club Udinese this evenings clash should be a keenly contested encounter.

In the league this season our visitors have won at Dover (1-0), Minehead (2-0), Dartford (2-1), Maidstone (2-1), Yeovil (3-1), A.P. Leamington (3-1), Grantham (1-0) and Atherstone (2-1), and drawn at Hastings, Cheltenham, Worcester, Hillingdon, Bath, Nuncaton and Telford.
