In the second half although territorially on top Hillingdon didn't look like scoring and it looked as if we were going to snatch a victory but with twenty minutes to go they scored with a low long range shot, and then with only five minutes to go they scored again with a similar shot.

So now Ian Cranstone who has kept goal so well can try to set another record in goal after his run of not being on the beaten side (when he was in goal) for twenty two games.

Steve Hockham missed Saturday's game with a ham string strain sustained against Maidstone last Tuesday, and Steve Brinkman also missed the game after being taken to hospital on Friday for pains in his legs, we wish him well and will keep you informed of his progress.

As you have probably read in the National Press the 1979/80 season will see the creation of a top tier League made up from the Northern Premier League (7 teams) and the Southern League (13 teams).

The top 13 from the Southern League (subject to ground facilities) will be based on last season and this season, with the League positions of each season being added together and divided by two, so our eighth position last season stands us in good stead and gives us an excellent chance of being in the 13 from the Southern League.

No I haven't forgotten that last Tuesday evening saw us beat Maidstone 3—1, in the second leg of the 'Stones Trophy', this giving us a 4—1 win on aggregate. All three goals were scored by George Duck, the first a penalty after Steve Brinkman was tripped in the area, the second was a defensive error which George joyfully latched on to and the third was created by Alan Doyle who worked the ball then unselfishly gave it to George. This ensured that the Trophy stays with us for at least the first year of its existence. Well done lads, both games were truly team efforts, when Steve Hockham went off injured during the second half of Tuesday's match the ten remaining players never faltered and it was a smiling John Watson who stepped up to receive the cup from Bill Dellow, secretary of the Southern League.

Finally I cannot let the occasion pass without congratulating Frank Harbud who next week will be 80 years old and has been with the club now for over 50 years as player and official and latterly a Life Vice-President, best wishes to you Frank, long may you continue.
