First XI News

This is the last bulletin concerning first team activity for this season, but with the inevitable timelag for printing purposes, the most recent matches upon which to comment are our two home engagements against Northwich Victoria and Bath City respectively. In the interim they will, of course, have received full coverage in the local press. I do not therefore propose to deal with these games in detail. In both games there was a common factor in that we did an immense amount of work midfield, and got through a large amount of running, but in the end, earned scant reward for our labours, because of our lack of cutting power in the vital six-yard area. Against Northwich we were possibly a shade unlucky to concede both points. With a reshuffled side, and players playing out of position, we still managed to build up a fair degree of cohesion, and defended stoutly throughout the encounter. We conceded the all important vital goal, at the worst time in a match—just two minutes from the break.

The most important fact from our shared points with Bath City was the certainty of eluding the relegation zone of the League, and suffering the indignity of relegation after the first season of Alliance soccer. For the second game running we looked fated to a half-time deficit, when Bath took the lead five minutes to the interval, but within two minutes we earned a penalty, when Neil Cordice was shoved off the ball in the box, and Seamus Horgan converted to square the issue.

Congratulations to Ian Cranstone who passed John Morton's previous record of 120 appearances "between the sticks" in this game. I will not venture into the field of statistics, because Roy Couch is so much better at it than I, but just for the record in A.P.L. league and cup encounters Stuart Pearce was the only player whose name was on every team sheet in the 39 matches played to date. He played in 38 and was substitute for the opening game. Robin Wainwright and Neil Cordice missed one match each, and just to round off, in the 39 matches under review we called upon 23 players, including nomination as substitute. Naturally, this does not take into account Saturday's game at Northwich.





Bobby Brown. Another player in his fourth season at York Street and the owner of two consecutive Northern Premier League Champions medals. A prolific scorer who has had Football League experience with Sheffield Wednesday and Aldershot.

Neil Callery. In his fifth season at York Street after a lengthy career with Buxton. A fast raiding winger who also knows where the target is.

John Moyes. Bostons longest serving player, signed seven years ago from Chesterfield where he made a number of Football League appearances. Known as 'Mr Utility' man at the Club because of the many positions he has played in. Holds a Northern Premier League record that will probably never be equalled, four Championship medals for one Club.

John Froggatt. The 'Pilgrims' latest signing, returning to the Club after an absence of five years. He first joined Boston in the early seventies from Buxton who were then in the Cheshire League, having previously been with Notts County. After several very successful seasons at York Street he was transferred for around £6,000 to Colchester United at the end of 1974 season. During his spell at Colchester he helped them gain promotion to the Third Division. From there he moved to Port Vale for a fee of £10,000, and in August 1978 he was transferred for £10,000, this time to Northampton Town where he was an ever present.

Gary Mallinder. Signed in June from Third Division Barnsley, who gained promotion at the end of last season. Gary is twenty years old and made two substitute Football League appearances for the Yorkshire Club.

Phil Hubbard. A very experienced utility player, signed from Fourth Divison Lincoln City at the end of November 1979.

About 30 of those members took part in a grand challenge match at Roxeth Rec, South Harrow, before the Bath City game last week—and it finished with a final score: SFC Wealdstone 6, Rest of the World XI 1. Mick Fishman gave the "World" team an early lead, but SFC came back strongly in the second half to score through Pete Hurford, Donald Cross (2), Justin O'Brien (2) and A. N. Other.

SFC were at it again last Sunday when they beat Moss Motors, from the Watford Sunday League, 4—0 at Mill End. Scorers were O'Brien, Dylan Cross, Martin Allen and Dave Heath (?) from the penalty spot. An evening match versus Watford Supporters—to be played at Lower Mead on May 8th—is in the pipeline so watch the local press for details.
