ENFIELD

Andy Pape (Goalkeeper). Signed for Enfield in July 1985 from Harrow Borough upon his return from the Four Nations Semi-Professional Tournament in Holland. Ended the competition as England's first choice. He was previously with Fel.ham, QPR, Charlton, Ikast (Denmark) and Crystal Palace. A 23-year-old with three caps.

Keith Barrett (defender). A stylish right-back or central defender, Keith has 16 England caps. He joined the E's in 1980 from Barking where he had spent five seasons after signing from Spurs Youth. 28 years old, has also played for F.A. XI's and the Middlesex Wanderers. An assistant accountant.

Phil Stacey (defender). Joined the Southbury Road club from Leytonstons-Ilford, having been on the books of Cambridge United, Epping, Bishops Stortford and Walthamstow. 23 years old, he makes up for his lack of height with some keen tackling. An electrician.

Nigel Gray (defender). A close-season signing from Swindon Town after many years of League football with Orient. He has also played for Aldershot, Blackburn, Brentford and Charlton (all on loan). Aged 28. Nigel has appeared in an F.A. Cup semi-final.

Dave Howell (defender). Last season's player of the year and now a regular member of the England non-league squad. Aged 26, he joined Enfield in August last year from Harrow Borough. Was formerly with Fulham, Hillingdon and Hounslow. A superbly fit player, he made 58 appearances last term and has two caps.

John Docker (midfield). Made the short trip from Barnet to Enfield in 1984 and made the England squad without actually appearing. 24 years old, John was earlier at Queens Park Rangers and he interested Bournemouth last season.

Dermot Drummy (midfield). Moved across Middlesex during the 1984 close season from Hendon, where he had been captain and player of the year. Previously with Arsenal for three years (one as a professional), he had a loan spell at Blackpool. Five Republic of Ireland Youth caps.

Martin Duffield (midfield). Signed from Queens Park Rangers during the close season and has shown good form in the pre-season friendlies. Six Football League appearances to his credit.


Noel Ashford (striker). Club captain and the current skipper of England. He has 12 caps and is 26-years-old. Left Barking for Enfield in 1980 after a spell with Fulham. Sixteen goals last season from 60 appearances. Noel has also played in midfield.

Peter Hinds (midfield). Born in Barbados, Peter was thrown in at the deep end for the F.A. Trophy Semi-Final second leg at Wealdstone four months ago and emerged with great credit. Deceptive ball skills and very strong in the air, he is 23 and has a great future ahead of him in football.

Steve King (striker). The longest-serving player on the staff with 121 goals from 447 appearances up to the start of this season since his transfer from Leytonstone in 1978. Steve has played for Middlesex Wanderers and the F.A.

Dave Flint (forward). Joined the club from Leyton County in 1979. Last year he made more appearances than any other player except Carl Richards (equal on 64) and was leading goalscorer with 25. An enthusiastic performer, he has represented Middlesex Wanderers.

Carl Richards (striker). Burst onto the non-league scene with four goals in 25 minutes as a sub for Dulwich Hamlet against Walthamstow in the Isthmian League. Scored 21 goals last term, the same number he had scored the year before. Joined Enfield before the start of the 1984-85 season, Carl can also play in midfield. He made 64 appearances last season. Age 25.

Bob Iles. Goalkeeper. Joined Wealdstone in August 1983 after five years at Chelsea. Previously with Bournemouth, Poole & Weymouth, Bob, aged 29 is an insurance salesman and to 1st August 1985 had played 89 games. Made his league debut at Derby on 7th October, 1978.

State Perkins. Defender. A 30-year-old restauranteur who, whilst captain of Chelsea's combination side, suffered a fractured spine which put him out of the game for two years. Fought back to make league debut for Q.P.R. v Middlesbrough on 1st April, 1978. Moved to Wimbledon from whom he joined Wealdstone in January 1981. To 1st August 1985 had made 182 appearances for 'Stones scoring two goals.

Steve McCargo. Defender. A 25-year-old graduate in International Business Studies who signed in March 1983 direct from University. To 1st August 1985 had played 66 games scoring 7 goals, but was unfortunately injured towards the end of last season.

Dennis Syatt. Defender. 27-year-old who made his league debut for Peterborough at Swindon on 17th October 1978. Moved to Northampton Town before joining Weald-stone in March 1981. To 1st August 1985 had made 228 appearances scoring 19 goals.

Paul Bowgett. Defender and captain. Signed from Wimbledon in August 1980 having previously been at Tottenham, making his league debut v. W.B.A. Arguably the most consistent centre-half in non-league football, Paul is a 30-year-old sales manager in the entertainment industry. To 1st August 1985 had made 274 appearances for Stones scoring 58 goals.

Robin Wainwright. Midfield. Signed from Hillingdon Borough in August 1979. Gained league experience with Luton, Cambridge, Millwall and Northampton before joining Dunstable. A 34-year-old assistant manager at a sports centre he had played (to 1st August 1985) 281 games scoring 22 goals.

Brian Greenaway. Midfield. Made league debut for Fulham at Plymouth in November 1976. Was at Fulham for six years before going to Greece to play for Apeol. He signed for Wealdstone in August 1983 and is a 27-year-old painter and decorator. To 1st August 1985 had played 95 games scoring 20 goals.

Lee Holmes. Midfield. Has the distinction of winning F.A. Trophy medals with both Wealds.one and Enfield. His only league club was Brentford. A 29-year-o.d civil engineering technician, Lee joined the Stones in August 1984. To 1st August 1985 had played 52 times, scoring 16 goals, one of those being the winner in the F.A. Trophy tinal.

Alan Cordice. Striker. A 29-year-old glazier who signed from Norwich in August 1980. He is a current member of the England Semi-Professional squad having made his debut against Italy in 1983. To 1st August 1985 had played 260 games scoring 94 goals.

Mark Graves. Striker. A 24-year-old financial consultant who joined from Plymouth Argyle in August 1982. He made his league debut in December 1977 while still an apprentice. To 1st August 1985 had played 153 games scoring 102 goals.

Garry Donnellan. Midfield. A 23-year-old button salesman who joined in August 1983 from Reading having made his league debut at Southend on 27th November 1981. To 1st August 1985 had made 98 appearances scoring 19 goals.

Neil Cardice. Striker. Alan's brother, he joined Wealdstone in August 1979 from Northampton where he made his league debut. A 25-year-old fitter, Neil had (to 1st August 1985) played 237 games scoring 82 goals.

Vince Jones. Defender/midfield. A 20-year-old painter and decorator who joined in August 1984 from Herts County League side Bedmond, having previously served his apprenticeship at Watford. To 1st August 1985 had played 23 games scoring 4 goals.

Brian Hall. Manager. Was with Walton, Wimbledon, Slough and Wycombe prior to joining Wealdstone as coach in November 1980. Took over as manager at the beginning of the 1983-84 season and had faith in his squad rewarded by last year's remarkable double-winning achievement.


