- Using obscene or offensive language (racial or otherwise) likely to cause offence to others;

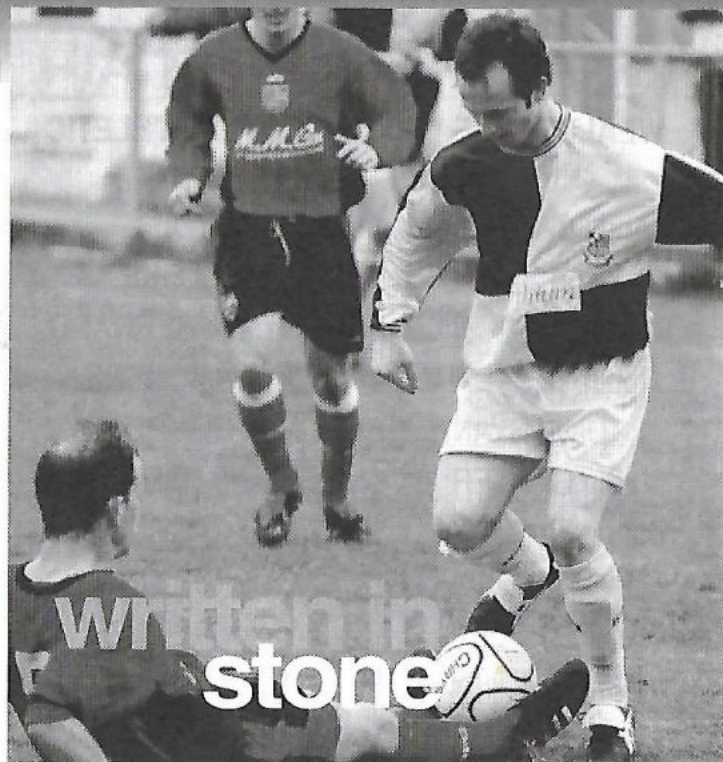
- Using violence of any nature.

Good afternoon and welcome to the White Lion Ground for our last home League match of the season against Dover Athletic. May I extend our welcome to our match officials and wish them a safe and pleasant journey home.

Dover's 3-2 defeat against Tonbridge Angels last week put an end to any hopes of survival this season just when it looked like they may have performed 'the great escape'. I'm sure everyone at Dover will be absolutely gutted about relegation although I feel that off-field activities may have had more to do with it than performances on the pitch.

We last met Dover at their Crabble ground back in December last year and on the day gained a very useful 4-2 win. Goals from Jermaine (2), Richard Jolly and a goal of the season contender from Robin Tucker gave us the points in a game that we looked unlikely to get anything from for the first seventy minutes.

Talking of relegation, we may well be joining Dover in Division one next year. Our form over recent weeks has left us extremely close to that final relegation place and needing two points from our final games to ensure safety. To most of us we looked pretty safe a few weeks ago but gaining

only two points in the last seven games has seen us slide down the table and we are now looking over our shoulders as Folkestone, Cheshunt and Harrow have begun to pick up points!

There appears to have been more delays on the new ground front and although at the moment there is a lot of speculation and rumours going about nothing official has been announced as of yet, although I believe a press statement is imminent.

On the subject of new grounds two clubs from this season are hoping to be playing in new stadiums next season, firstly Hendon will be leaving Clarendon Road (there ground for over 80 years) to set up home at Cophall. Secondly work has begun on a stadium for Chelmsford City although this project is already subject to delays and November is now when they finally expect to move in. We have had our fair share of ground problems so I would like to wish both Hendon and Chelmsford the best of luck.

I'm sure you will have heard by now about the sad passing away of Folkestone Invicta player Paul Sykes. Paul who had played for many of the Kent sides collapsed on the pitch thirty minutes into the Folkestone v Margate County Cup match last week. Our thoughts go out to his Family and friends. We have included a tribute later in this programme.

So what is happening at Prince Edward and why no news recently? The trouble is that the events are, to a large extent, outside of our control. Decisions (widely and correctly rumoured) made by Scarborough, our joint venture partners, to pull out of the project have been the latest in a long line of unwanted surprises. It is true to say that work has again ceased on site, in this case almost before it was started.

When we reported 2-3 months ago that work was restarting this was correct and indeed, over £70,000 worth of remedial work was carried out getting the site ready for proper work to recommence. However, this restart obviously did not happen.

Events have been moving very fast. The council in particular are considering what involvement they wish to have in the project now and reviewing their options in terms of how they want to go forward. Whatever that decision it seems that the Council are keen to be far more 'hands on' and introduce more of a community aspect to the scheme. We cannot forget that Harrow Council are the ultimate landowners of the Prince Edward site - it is not ours to decide what we want to do. The lack of news has been because of a desire by the Council to ensure that the relevant councillors and officers are all aware and involved in the site's future and this should have been achieved this very week.

Despite the obvious downside of further delays - and at present it is impossible to predict any timings - there are potential long-term upsides to this.

The deal we were forced into with Scarborough meant the opportunities to develop new and profitable income streams were possible but not guaranteed and not without a huge effort and investment of time and money on our part. It is too early

at present to say how things will differ with the Council, but currently they recognise the time, money and effort the football club have put into the project getting this far, and also they acknowledge the importance to the site of a healthy Wealdstone FC going future.

If all goes to plan the story will break in the local press this coming week and we should be able to start discussing some of these issues more publicly.

Through the summer you will need to call the Soccerline, look at Roger's website (which we plan to turn into an official club website at some time in the near future) or read the local press to keep up to date. We will also shortly be calling the Club's AGM, hopefully in May or early June.

So in the meantime we will continue working for a speedy resolution of this situation, with the same objective as we have always had, to safeguard the Club's long-term future and to enable us to grow our income opportunities so as to enable us to enjoy good football at a good level.

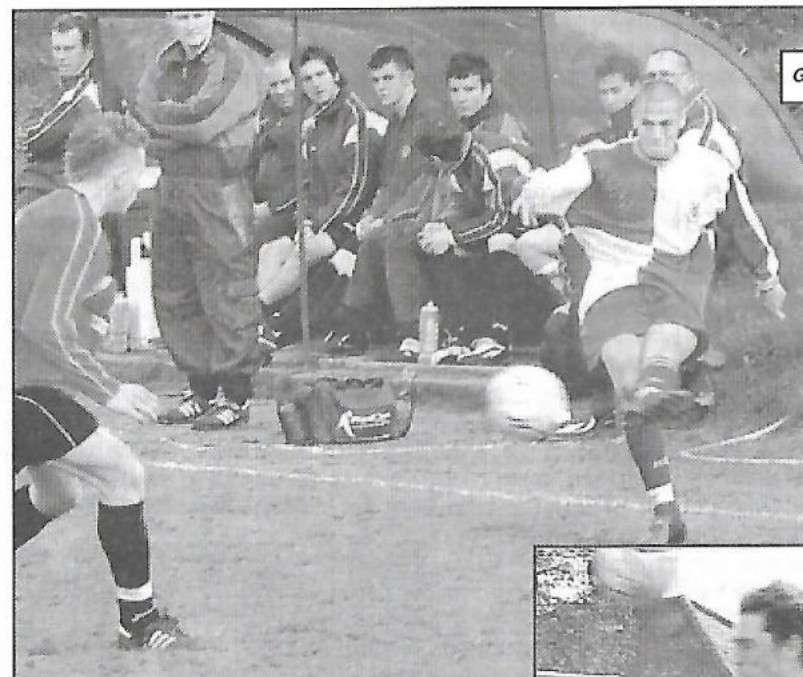

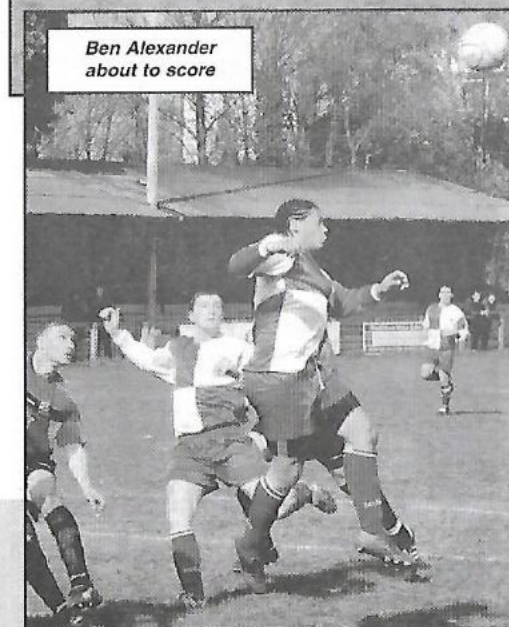

The end of each season is always a time to reflect. What has been achieved over the last year? Where are we now and what does the future hold?

Unless your team wins a league or a major cup I suppose any given season will be a rich mix of the good and the bad. We certainly had our fair share of both.

So what was good about season 2004/2005? Well, first and foremost we must keep our fingers crossed that we retain our Ryman Premier status. A very poor run in has left us still one win short of mathematical certainty of survival. It should not have come to this but just getting edged in so many recent games has been deeply frustrating. But let us not forget that we only qualified for this league by the skin of our teeth. We had just scraped into the last play off position. We were then 4 minutes away from defeat at Dulwich until a pile-driver of a free kick from Dave Ryan rescued us and forced a penalty shoot out which, astonishingly, we won.

Having just scraped in to this league any neutral observer would have made us favourites for the drop unless we invested heavily in improving the playing squad. As we all know, our playing budget was not increased. Survival, should it be achieved, is therefore something in which we should take pride. Given the playing budgets of some of the clubs in our league, the fact that we have been comprehensively outplayed on so few occasions is also heartening. So many of our defeats were, frustrating-

ly, by the odd goal. Yet again we must be grateful to Gordon and his team for shuffling the pack and achieving this on an absolute shoestring.

Where we can take some genuine pride and encouragement is the continued success of the club's playing strength below the first team. The reserves comfortably established themselves in the Suburban League Premier Division and won the Suburban League Champions Cup. The Under 18s retained the Middlesex Junior Cup, finished in the top three in the Allied Counties League and got to the first round of the FA Youth Cup before being well beaten by Liverpool. And let us not forget the Under 19s who beat Barnet in the final of the Conference Academy Cup. In doing so they inflicted the only defeat the Barnet lads suffered during the season. Anyone who was present would agree that it was a superb performance of great character and no little skill.

Another genuine positive was the establishment in the first team squad of several current and for-

mer youth team players, most notably Jermaine Beckford, Ben Alexander, Joe Sparrowhawk, Gary Burrell, Carl Martin, Lee Holland and Alick Gedeking. This is really exciting and must be good news for the future development of the club. And we should not forget that Callum and Carl Martin both represented England at Under 18 level.

So what was bad? On the pitch I believe it is fair to say that we too often clutched defeat from the jaws of victory. To my mind only Billericay, Leyton and Folkestone completely outplayed us on any given occasion. Leyton managed to do so twice.

Deeply disappointing were the two defeats against Harrow Borough and the home matches against local rivals Hendon and Northwood. Both defeats against Braintree were barely deserved and in different ways left a sour taste in the mouth. The FA Cup exit at the hands of Histon was a real pain as, on the day, we effectively outplayed our visitors. Unfortunately Marv in his last outing for us managed to miss a hatful of chances.

Off the pitch the stop/start nature of the new ground development has been depressing and frustrating. How many more obstacles can be placed in front of us? With both main backers dropping out for different reasons it is a miracle that there still seems to be every chance of completing the development. We shall not be in for the start of next season but does that really matter? Let us just get in there. We now have a terrific football set up from the young kids, through the scholarship scheme and into the reserves and first team. In our own home with state of the art facilities we could become a local footballing centre of excellence. Unless a sugar daddy turns up with many millions to chuck at the club, developing our own talent must be the way forward for Wealdstone.

In looking to the future we, as a serious football club, must also celebrate our past. 11th May will be the 20th anniversary of our victory over Boston United in the FA Challenge Trophy at Wembley Stadium. In so doing we of course became the first team to complete the "non-league double" of FA Challenge Trophy and Gola League (now Conference) champions. Others have achieved that since, but we were the

first. Our fortunes have gone into decline since then but it is an important part of our heritage and its memory, and many other great memories, have sustained us during these difficult times. A football club of significance is the sum of its parts incorporating its past, present and future. There are a number of clubs currently progressing through the leagues on the back of large infusions of cash, some even embracing full time football, that do not have a past as long or as glorious as ours. One or two may achieve their goal of sustainable success over a period but I am unconvinced. We may be competing at a lower level in the pyramid than some of these clubs just now but to my mind we have been and can be again a bigger club!

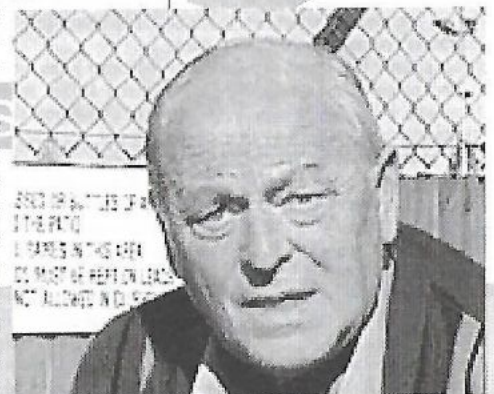
Finally, let us give ourselves a pat on the back. We have been effectively homeless now for 15 years yet we are still in existence and competing at a senior level in non-league football with crowds comparable to most in our league. Without the passion and dedication of us supporters the club would by now have been long gone. Pop along to any reserve team, under 19s or under 18s

match and there will be a small gaggle of Stones supporters present. The Under 19 Cup Final at North Greenford and the Under 19 triumph over Barnet at Ruislip Manor attracted Stones supporters in the sort of numbers other local clubs

would have welcomed for their first team fixtures. We may be loud, aggressive and abusive (but not racist whatever George Borg might claim!) but we are passionate about our club and, I believe, increasingly if grudgingly admired by opposition clubs.

Wealdstone football club has become an integral part of our lives, none more so I would venture than Lew Sheppard who has supported The Stones since he was a young boy before the war. He saw the pre-war side of Charlie Bunce, the 1952 Athenian League champions side, the 1966 amateur Cup winners, the 1974 and 1982 Southern league champions, the 1985 double winners and the Ryman Division 3 championship winning team. Go to any first team match and Lew will be there. Any reserve match when the first team is not playing, Lew will be on the sidelines. Under 19 and under 18 games will often find Lew in attendance. 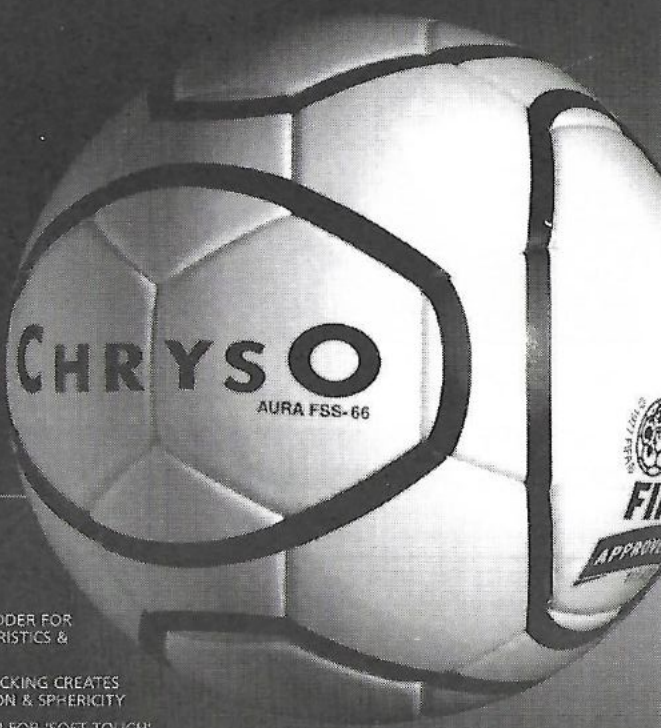

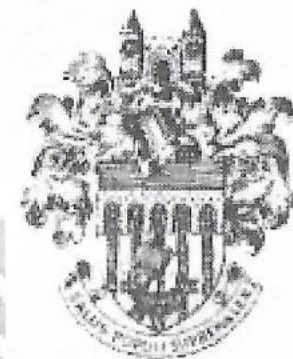

Dover Athletic F.C. was formed by a group of local businessmen in the summer of 1983 to replace Dover F.C., which had folded that May. The new Club was able to replace the old one in the Southern League Southern Division. The new Club's first competitive match was at home to Crawley Town on August 20th, 1983, and it ended goalless. The first win did not come until mid-October (2-0 against Thanet), and by the end of the season, Dover Athletic had risen to 13th. in the table. The first manager was Allan Jones, who had been a prolific goal scorer with Dover F.C. in the early 1960s, but after a poor start to the 1984-85 season, his services were dispensed with. Steve McRaye took over, but defeat after defeat followed, and at the end of that season only Erith & Belvedere were below us in the League table. The playing staff was considerably strengthened for the following season, but we still under-achieved until fullback Chris Kinnear took over as manager. We challenged for promotion going into the last month of the season, but finished fourth. We beat Dartford of the Gola League (now the Conference) 2-0 away in the Kent Senior Cup semi-final, but lost 2-0 to Premier Division champions Welling in the final at Gillingham.

1986-87 saw us again going for promotion, but a crowded fixture list saw us run out of steam towards the end, and we finished fifth. We reached the Eastern Floodlight Cup final, but lost 3-2 on aggregate to Chelmsford. We did gain promotion to the Premier Division in 1987-88, finishing as Southern Division champions, and we also won the Knight Floodlight Competition, beating Harlow 2-0 in the final at Grabbie.

Up in the Premier Division for season 1988-89, we topped the table for a while, but fixture congestion - we played 75 competitive games that season - again took its toll, and we finished sixth. We again won the Knight Floodlight Competition, winning 2-1 at Saffron Walden in the final. We made no mistake the following season, winning the first ten, some in between, and the last eleven Premier Division games to top the table with 102 points, a record

that still stands. However, the deserved promotion to what is now the Conference was denied, due to strict and inflexible ground-grading regulations. We had it all to do again, but fixture congestion again hit us in the 1990-91 season, and we finished fourth. We did win the Kent Senior Cup, beating Gravesend 1-0 in the final at Gillingham, and also the Premier Inter-League Cup, beating Southport 3-2 in a marvellous final at Aylesbury.

Season 1991-92 saw us again challenging for promotion, but we lost out to Bromsgrove in the last few weeks of the season. The 2-2 draw at Grabbie between the clubs that April, which finished 2-2, attracted a then record attendance for Dover Athletic of 4,035. We did win the Southern League Cup, beating Dorchester 4-0 on aggregate in the final. We won the Premier Division title again in 1992-93, finishing 13 points ahead of runners-up Cheltenham. This time there were no problems with the ground, and we took up our rightful position in the Conference. Still under the managership of Chris Kinnear, we showed up well in our first season at the top level of the non-League game, and finished eighth. We struggled the following season, and in the January it was decided that a change of manager was needed. John Ryan took over, and at the end of that season we were 16th in the table.

A dreadful start to season 1995-96 saw the departure of John Ryan, and Peter Taylor took over. We finished that season 20th, and were only spared relegation because no club was promoted from the Northern Premier League.

With Peter Taylor leaving to take over as manager of the England Under-21 team, his newly appointed assistant, Joe O'Sullivan, was quickly promoted. We struggled through to January 1997, when O'Sullivan resigned, and manager Bill Williams and Coach Clive Walker were appointed. We finished that season 17th. 1997-98 proved to be a better season, as we were placed 13th. In the Conference, and were within a whisker of reaching Wembley in the F.A. Trophy, losing 4-3 on aggregate to Cheltenham in the semi-finals. In 1998-99, we were third in the table in February, but then dropped down to finish eleventh. It was the same the season after; we were challenging at the top in February, but eventually came sixth - our best Conference final placing. Season 2000-01 saw us come 15th, but Bill Williams let in the summer, and Gary Bellamy was appointed manager. November 2001 saw a cash crisis at the Club, and Bellamy was sacked. Neville Southall took over in the hot seat, but he was shown the door in March. Clive Walker was then appointed manager, but it was too late to save the Club from relegation, and we finished bottom of the Conference. The money problems led to many changes at boardroom level, and a Supporters' Trust was firmly established together with a new set of directors, giving the Club a firm base on which to build for the future.

In the 2002-03 Season, history was made when Dover Athletic reached the First Round Proper of the F.A. Cup for the first time, losing to Third Division Oxford United by the only goal of the game at Grabbles. A new Dover Athletic record attendance was present at this match, when 4,186 fans went through the turnstiles and the end of the season saw us finish third in the Dr. Martens Premier Division.

After changing management in October 2003, Dover had a great spell and reached 6th in the table in early January with manager Richard Langley winning the League Manager of the Month Award for December 2003. However, the season ended disappointingly with us dropping to finish fourth from bottom, not helped by a period of horrendous injuries and suspensions. Several senior players were released due to financial constraints and the Club was restructured with the emphasis based on producing our own Youth players. This season sees us facing a new challenge, having been transferred to the Ryman Isthmian League Premier Division. After a long spell of disappointing results a caretaker manager, Gary Whittle, was appointed in September followed by Manager Steve Browne, assisted by Troy Townsend, in October 2004. A lack of results and another change of directors dictated that things must change and Clive Walker returned to the Club as Manager in January 2005.

Wanderers in 1993 after playing for Hillingdon and Hayes. Followed Martin O'Neill to Leicester before joining Leyton Orient. Assistant Manager from May 2002 - October 2003.

WALID MATATA - Aged 22 - A forward formerly at Milton Keynes FC.

DEAN READINGS - Aged 22 - Another product of the Youth programme. The tall centre back was a regular in the 02-03 season but missed most of last season after receiving a late tackle which broke his leg. Dean is now gradually getting back to full fitness.

VICTOR RENNER - Aged 25 - A forward signed in October 2004 from Leyton FC. A former Wimbledon junior and Gravesend player.

JAMES ROGERS - Aged 19 - Joined the Under 16 Team and progressed through the Youth programme. A left-sided player who has recently broken

into the 1st team squad.

DALE SKELTON - Aged 20 - A midfielder who played for the Reserves and has now made the step up to the 1st Team. **MICHAEL SMISSEN** - Aged 20 - A product of DAFC PASE scheme, he also had a brief spell with Crystal Palace. Prolific goal scorer at junior levels. Re-signed after a spell at Sittingbourne FC.

Was manager at Dover between March 2002 and October 2003 and was head coach at Dover prior to this. Previously the manager at Chatham Town he returned to the Whites in January 2005.

NARADA BARNARD - aged 24 - A left back who started his career at Spurs, then moved to Arsenal. After spells with several other clubs he left Farnborough Town in February 2005 and joined the Whites in March.

SHANE HAMSHARE - Aged 18 - A midfielder player who has progressed from the Youth and Reserves. His father Chris played for Dover FC from 1971 to 1980.

ALASTAIR HESELTON - Aged 21 - A forward signed from Northwood FC.

TOM HICKMAN - Aged 24 - signed from Ramsgate FC. Also played for Margate Youth Team and Herne Bay and has recently broken through from the Reserves into the 1st Team.

So here we are, last home game of the season and we are still not sure of avoiding relegation. Providing we win one of our last two games, or Harrow or Cheshunt lose one of their last two, we stay in the Premier Division. If we do, then we can consider it a successful season. What's successful about finishing just above the relegation places? Well, before a ball was kicked to start the campaign, our target was for Wealdstone to still be playing Premier Division football next season, so if we do make it, we've achieved our target. Not much of a target I hear you say, well let's just try and put things in a bit of perspective. Last season we were a mid table first division team, but we had a bit of a late run to finish 7th and nick a play-off place against Dulwich which we managed to win. So we get promoted bottom of the slots available.

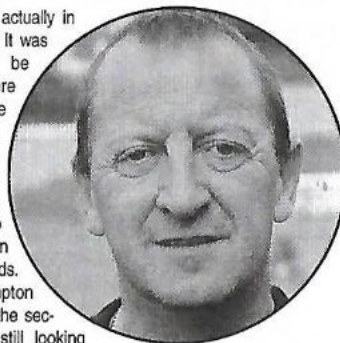
During pre season Gordon tries desperately to strengthen the squad, and you can ask him how many people he spoke to, but gradually as player after player turns us down or tells us what they want to join us, it's confirmed, what we probably already knew, we were bottom of another pile, yes, the playing budget. It's not as though we can meet a player and impress him with the ground and training facilities either! If you had gone to the bookies before the opening game against Worthing, you would have seen that we were very hot favourites to come straight back down again, so why then was there this expectation that we would finish at least in the top half of the table and probably in another play-off place? No, the realistic target, as I said at the start of this, was to make sure we stayed in the division. We needed to consolidate, give a few of the reserve and youth team players a bit of first team experience, continue to develop and strengthen our already superb youth set up and take things forward in to the new ground at the start of the 2005/06 season.

What has actually happened though, as we've gone through the season, everyone's realised that the division is not that good and so our expectations have risen, but that doesn't hide the fact that we are a pretty average team prone to make more individual errors than any other team we've seen, and throw in the occasional abysmal performance, hence we are where we are.

All of that sounds pretty negative I know, but we have to be realistic about what we can achieve considering everything we are up against, and I don't mean to be disrespectful to our players when I say they are pretty average, but I'm afraid they have brought that upon themselves. I honestly believe that no player ever goes out for a game with the deliberate intention to not try, or to go out and deliberately make mistakes but you have to say that sometimes this season that's what it's looked like, particularly when you consider the performances at home to Harrow, away at Folkstone and the recent horror at Northwood. Then you think about the number of individual mistakes that have cost us throughout the season. At the start, we were playing really well but making errors which were costing us games, the problem is we don't seem to have learnt from this and even in last weeks game at Hampton, mistakes led us to throwing away the points. There's no doubt about it that we are capable of putting in good performances, look at the performances away at Eastleigh, the two FA cup games at home to Grays and Boreham Wood and more recently home to Staines, but they have been few and far between this season.

Going back to last Saturday's game at Hampton, we looked very solid

in the first half and actually in control of the game. It was obviously going to be tough as they were pushing to secure their play-off place, but early on we looked the more dominant force and when Tucks scored to put us in front, an upset was on the cards. Even though Hampton came back at us in the second half we were still looking good, but then as I said above, we made a couple of mistakes and bang, the game was lost.



It was good to see Tucks getting back in to scoring form again just in time for today's game with Dover, who will ever forget the 'wonder' goal he scored against them in our 4-2 win at their place earlier in the season. It was a special goal by anyone's standards, and I'm sure Jols would have been more than happy to score it, but the fact that Tucks did it, made it such an exceptional effort!!!

It's now been 7 league games without a win and only two points out of the 21, all we needed was one win out of the other 5 and our relegation problems would be non existent, but we didn't and we find ourselves having to get something out of the last two games, at least we have still have a chance to do something about it, unlike today's opponents, Dover, who were relegated last weekend following a last minute penalty defeat at Tonbridge, I'm sure Dover would much rather be in our position. When we beat them back in December, the 4-2 score line somewhat flattered us, and there were probably those among the Dover people who thought that even a Wealdstone win of any sort was a little unjust, but although they had plenty of possession we took the chances we were given and stopped them from taking theirs. I have fond memories of playing at Dover for Hounslow in the Southern League, not because I ever put in a particularly great game there, and we probably lost more than we won, but it was great going to what I call a proper football ground with a real crowd and terrific atmosphere. It is sad to see these big clubs in decline.

Actually, with the restructure, this season has seen us playing a few more of the clubs I played against in the Southern League, such as Folkstone, Tonbridge, Salisbury and Chelmsford, a lot of years ago now I'm afraid, but brilliant times. What players should think about is making the most of every single game they play in, because you are a very long time retired, and there is nothing like playing!!

I would just like to end by saying thanks to everyone including the Board (a special mention for Dominic Whytey who I work with so closely) supporters and players for sticking with us throughout what has been yet another difficult season.

Let's just hope that we are not travelling to Salisbury next week having to win to avoid the drop, now that would be a bit lively, never mind last season's play-off!!!

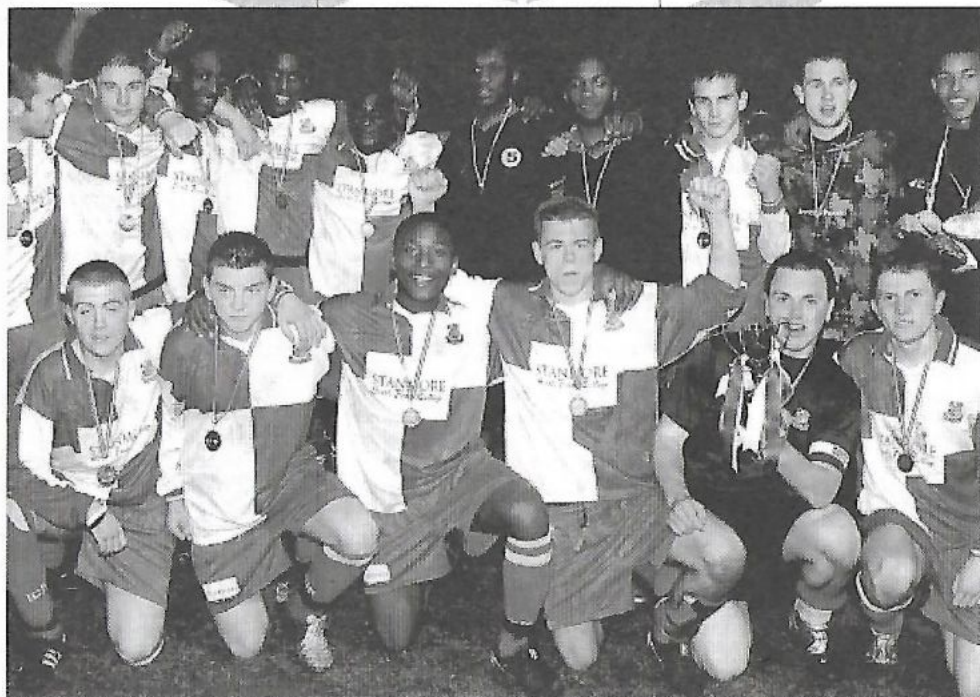

paul sykes

As you grow up following football at any level you begin to realise who your footballing heroes are. Over time these heroes grow in number. They don't necessarily have to be the best player, the biggest player, the loudest player or the strongest player. They don't have to be the player who appeals to everyone else. They just have to mean something to you.

In supporting Dover I had many such heroes. Injury put paid to the first. Left back Jason Bartlett. I only really liked him because he was the first name I heard and understood at a Dover game. Such acclimation that eventually earned him the prize of being the inspiration for the naming of my 2nd hamster. David Leworthy, another favourite, and others such as Matt Carruthers, Darren Williams, Paul Hyde and Simon Wormull eventually took their place in the archives of greatness.

But one player, one special player, in this archive is Paul Sykes. Syko was not just a favourite of mine he was a favourite of so many people in South East Kent. He embodied all the characteristics of greatness, mentioned in the first paragraph but he was more important than that. He touched the hearts of so many. He worked tirelessly so often. He wore his heart, and the heart of every club he played for, on his sleeve and embraced the badge when he scored. He was a real footballer. He lived the dream.

On Tuesday 12th April 2005 Paul was taken from us. He died doing the thing he loved; playing football for one of the teams he loved. For somebody who lived and died for

his football there is a sense of pathetic irony in that. But to die at 28 does not give justice to a life, which filled so many other lives with immeasurable joy. Neither does the suddenness of his death fully state what he meant to so many people in the non-league, and greater, footballing community.

Never before, in my years of watching football, have I seen such an outpouring of grief at the death for a player who was by no means an international superstar. He was however a Kent football star. For Kent football has lost one of its greatest, brightest stars and Kent football mourns. And it is tribute to the man that in only 28 years on earth he touched more hearts than several people have managed in 100. The news of his death has been greeted with such a sensational level of grief that I doubt even Paul would have possibly have believed what an impact he could have had on people's lives.

The fans of Gillingham, Welling, Margate, Dover, Dartford and Folkestone, as well as many people from the wider footballing family, who only know of the legend of Paul Sykes through others, have all expressed a level of love for the man. For he was a man who gave everything he could for their clubs. If nothing else it is enough to show that in an age of big business ruling the game we love there is still room for well placed sentiment.

I only got to see a season of Sykes in a Dover shirt. But from what I can gather the 100% effort he gave to the club was a standard performance level for all his

clubs. And on Thursday 14th April my shirt, from that season, will be placed at Cheriton Road as a memorial to the man.

But being a Dover lad he always would mean something to the Crabble faithful. His golden years remain, however, with Margate where he helped them claim their place in the Conference. But he also touched the hearts of Gillingham, Welling, Dartford and, for his final season, Folkestone. He has become immortalised as a symbol at all these clubs.

And on May 2nd Paul Sykes is remembered. Dover, his hometown club, take on Margate, the club which immortalised him, in the Kent Senior Cup final at Cheriton Road, Folkestone, the ground where he played the final games of his life. What is for sure is that he loved each club and, given the response to his death, they clearly loved him too.

the line following a goalmouth scramble. Powerful shots from

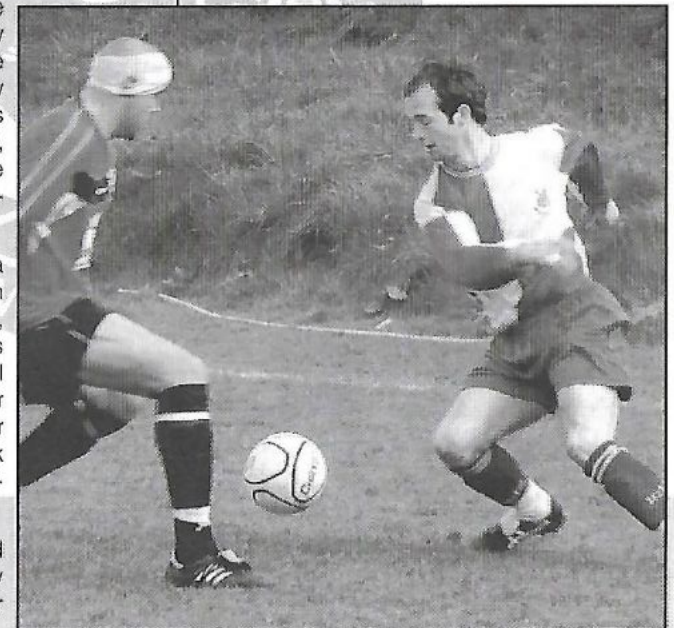
Richard Jolly and Alexander brought out diving saves from Turner and things looked set for a Wealdstone victory.

Another in the series of interviews with our advertisers. Steeven Sharpe recently spoke to Steve Muscat from local estate agents Kris Adams Partnership.

The Kris Adams Partnership has firmly established itself in Middlesex, operating with four Estate Agents and a fifth branch in Stanmore soon to follow. Steven Muscat is the man responsible for this growth and it is no surprise considering how driven he is to succeed in the business. When Steven has some free time he likes to spend it with his family and he also enjoys keeping fit.

SS (Steeven Sharpe): How long have you been based in Burnt Oak with this business?

SM (Steven Muscat): Only since August of last year here, but we do have three other shops with a fifth opening shortly in Stanmore.

SS: How long have they been running?

SM: They were previously called David Conway and Company, based in Pinner Road, Harrow and Kenton. Since then I've split with David and revamped them as Kris Adams. The branch in Harrow has been going for roughly 5 years and approximately 3 years in Kenton. We also have a branch behind the station at Harrow-On-The-Hill.

SS: So this is your business?

SM: Yes, at the moment I'm a Director.

SS: When did you get involved with Wealdstone?

SM: We had a call when we were called David Conway and Company in Kenton. Someone came into the office and asked whether we would be interested in sponsoring the club. At the time we decided to advertise ourselves via a couple of boards at the ground.

Since then we've done a couple of things in the programme. We do as much as we can as obviously we want to put our name about and we also sponsor schools, whereby we can put a Kris Adams board outside a person's house, school fetes or events.

SS: You're very much a local company then?

SM: Yes definitely.

SS: Do you have any other sponsorship deals?

SM: Great Ormond Street Hospital, we always like to help out there and also support the blood campaign. We contribute to lots of initiatives, we get so many calls here, when people get my name and call me up we try to get involved with as much as we can. At the moment we've narrowed the focus of advertising down to schools, hospitals and Wealdstone.

SS: How is business at the moment?

SM: Business is tough. It has been

as that is what has worked for me, but at the moment the market is very tough. For example, someone wanted to put their house up for £275,000, I recommended £265,000 and an offer came in for £250,000. It's hard, there are a lot of estate agents about, but we offer a great deal for a sole agency fee structure of £2,000 plus VAT.

SS: Have you had any customers from your links with Wealdstone at all?

SM: Possibly, but not that anyone's actually said. I try and ask as many people we do business with where they saw the advert. Nine times out of ten it's the local paper, Yellow Pages and/or recommendations.

SS: How's the new branch coming along?

SM: It should be ready soon we've refurbished the inside and are just awaiting the sign. That will be a network of five offices.

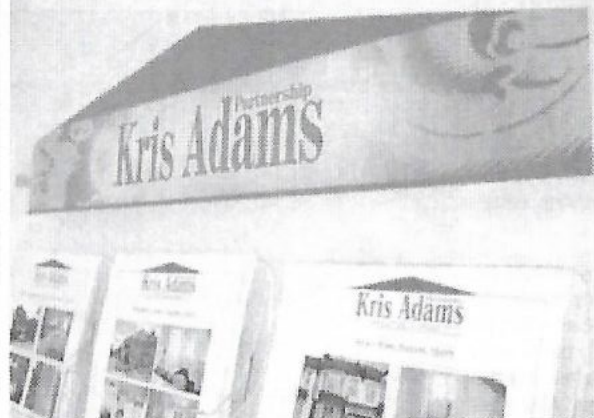
SS: You have different Managers for each?

SM: Yes, although I want to do all valuations myself. It kills me but I try to drive around everywhere to put my face about and tell people who we are. Everyone is frightened of a new name, they think, "who are these idiots", but I can come in and tell people we are formerly David Conway and Co and have been around for a long time. There are so many Estate Agents about and the way we get in the front door is with our fees. £2,000 is a terrific deal, we still advertise in colour, including advertising in the local paper, display in our shop windows, plus access to four websites including our own (www.krisadams.co.uk). There are no catches it's just a good deal.

very hard recently.

SS: What are the reasons for that?

SM: There are a lot of properties on the market but not a lot of buyers. People will ring up and ask for a price and we will advise a realistic price because otherwise it stands no chance of selling. I will be honest when people call,



SS: That's how you advertise yourself?

SM: At the minute yes, it has worked so far. I get calls that I wouldn't otherwise have got because of it. We might have got the calls, but let's face it – if I'm going to an Estate Agent in my area I would probably go to the most established. However if I was then shown the deal we offer, I know I'd be interested.

SS: So you're building a good reputation?

SM: Yes. Hopefully it will continue as long as the bank doesn't come knocking then I'll be happy! But it's hard work.

SS: Going back to your sponsorship of Wealdstone, is that because the club is nearby or do you like to involve yourself with football?

SM: Well it seems the right thing to do. I'm not going to get a call from Arsenal, so Wealdstone is a good option. I'm not sure it gets us ourselves much immediate business, but it helps because psychologically people will keep seeing the name. I have had lots of good reports and plenty of recommendations in the short time that we have been established. I like to think I'm a friendly person to do business with. People are naturally wary of Estate Agents, the person who comes and knocks on your door – they haven't got good names! If I can put people's mind at ease then that is good.

SS: Being locally based you're going to get a good reputation through offering a friendly service.

SM: Although by the nature of this business, things are going to occasionally go wrong. If someone pulls out of buying a property at the last minute there is nothing I can do about it.

SS: Do you have any sporting interests – do you follow football?

SM: I'm not a great lover of football.

When England play on television I'll watch it. I've just found that it has all gone too...over the top.

SS: In what way, the media coverage?

SM: I think it's ridiculous; the money that the players are on, every other picture in the paper is of a football player. You watch a match and all you see is the players spitting, swearing and then moaning that they've got to have a rest between games. I mean for what they're earning...

SS: It's not too great a hardship.

SM: Exactly. I mean the men and women go out and fight all over the place in the army and they don't complain. But that seems to be the world at the moment; it's all about money. That is what aggravates me, I used to play a little bit of football, but I don't anymore. I play badminton at the moment.



where the 'Adams' in the name for the business came from. I went through all the names in the book and this is the one that felt right. It sounds catchy too.

SS: What are your long-term aims for the business?

SM: There's no easy way. I've got a tough 5/6 years ahead but I think the work will pay off. I'd like to tie-up the area in the long-term. I want to make people's choice easier, maybe a little bit like Easyjet. They have certain colours and uniforms that we like to do, we haven't got rid of the ties yet – I will wear a tie for valuations.

SS: Looking at your advertising it's bold and noticeable.

SM: Yes, it's fun. I could introduce you to five or six Estate Agents and a) they wouldn't have time to do this interview and b) you might think of me as an odd

guy! No, seriously, I grew up doing the markets, I went to school in the area and I'm proud to have built a business here. I just want to build it up I've built a reputation on being honest. There's no reason why people should go elsewhere when they know that I advertise properties as much if not more than everyone else in the papers and over the internet. Why would someone want to phone another agent?

SS: Have you had a chance to see Wealdstone at all?

SM: No, I work on Saturday's and I'm generally too busy to get a chance to watch. I keep up-to-date with how the club is getting on in the papers.

SS: Are you happy with the relationship you have with the club?

SM: Yes. Being honest, if someone walked in from the club I probably wouldn't recognise them! But I like to do something with the local club, support local people, yet at the same time get our name noticed.

SS: Thanks Steve, good luck for the future and lets hope for continued growth for Kris Adams and Wealdstone FC – hopefully together.
