POINTS in our League Championship marathon are important today, especially as Altrincham dropped points against Weymouth recently. The position at the top of the table is tightening, and with six clubs from the top nine positions still involved in the F.A. Trophy, an air of excitement is evident, none more so than here at Wealdstone. I suspect there may be just a whisp of excitement at Telford!

To Stan Storton and the boys, our sincere congratulations and best wishes for their fifth-round tie at Everton. When a Gola League club can win by three goals against Canon League opposition, I don't believe any more that it is 'cup magic', nor 'luck', nor 'giant killing', etc.

It would appear to me that the gap between non-league and Football League is not closing, but has already levelled, indeed in some cases, overlapped. Telford's result against Darlington must not overshadow their defeats of Lincoln City, Bradford and Preston in previous rounds, also the fact that last year they reached the fourth round.

There is surely evidence that the standard of Gola League football warrants further investigation into the question of Football League entry. Meanwhile, our next home games are important, with a trip to Kidderminster to follow. We must STAY WITH THE PACK UP FRONT, we must WIN THE RACE, we must KNOCK ON THE DOOR OF THE FOOTBALL LEAGUE.

TELFORD UTD. being humbled at home by little Fisher Athletic, and then 48 hours later pulverising Fourth Division promotion aspirants Darlington 3-0 to earn a visit to mighty Everton at Goodison Park in the 5th round of the FA Cup!

Of such stuff are dreams made \dots Obviously Telford decided to sacrifice the F.A. Trophy (which is, of course, not to denigrate Fisher's performance) and wouldn't we all, given the same

All Gola League clubs can bask in the reflected glory of manager Stan Storton and his team, and I do not suppose for one moment that Telford will be disgraced or embarrassed by Everton on the great day. Remember Wimbledon and Leeds Utd. a few years back – Don Revie has never ever

Certainly all of us at Wealdstone wish Stan and the Telford boys a memorable day at the First Division leaders, and congratulate them on a stunning run in the sport's major competition.

For this season, at least, we shall have to settle for somewhat more modest targets, but are delighted at having another home draw in the F.A. Trophy. We shall entertain Southern League Premier outfit Welling a fortnight today, February 23rd (3.00pm), following their 2-0 win in Tuesday's replay at Merthyr Tydfil, watched by manager Brian Hall. I have not had the benefit of hearing Brian's views at the time of writing, but Fleet Street contacts tell me that Welling are a good side, and should not be under-estimated. Certainly they have a lofty league position, and I would caution those of our supporters who feel a quarter-final place is a foregone conclusion.

Far from it, although I must say I have a premonition that come May, and chairman David Morritt will achieve ONE of his ambitions for this Club by watching Wealdstone from the Royal Box at Wembley, in the final. Given the choice of prize, I'd opt for the League title, naturally, but, at worst

(and if pressed) will settle for the Middlesex Senior Cup!

Whatever happens though, we're having a wonderful season, never being out of the top four in the league since last August and so we can only look forward to what would be a great bonus. Incidentally, late on Thursday I learned that Telford's Stan Storton has been named Real Mackenzie Whiskey manager of the month for January – even before his latest triumph.

With Maidstone's 2-0 Trophy replay win at Isthmian's Worthing on Wednesday the Gola League have nine clubs in the third round. Did you notice Altrincham's excellent result by winning at Burton

Albion before a gate of 2,460?

Dagenham's amazing habit of conceding late goals is continuing, and on Saturday they let in three goals to lowly Barrow in the last 27 minutes after leading 1-0. Dartford were losing at Worcester, and then ran in five second half goals without reply! Incidentally, Wealdstone's official paying gate of 852 against Wycombe was the 5th lowest of the 10 ties affecting Gola League clubs. After Burton Albion Telford topped the list with 2,032. All in all, if Telford DO have any problems, a cash shortage is surely NOT one of them!



GRAEME CRAWFORD (Goal): Signed from Rochdale in the summer of 1983 after making 430 Football League appearances for Sheffield United, York City, Scunthorpe and Rochdale. An everpresent for the boro last season, he was appointed Assistant to John Cottam during the summer.

RICHARD DAWSON (Defender): Made 45 appearances for York City before signing for the Boro in 1983. Missed only one Alliance game last season.

NEIL THOMPSON (Defender): Joined the Boro in the summer of 1983 from Hull City for whom he made 31 appearances. Made 36 Alliance appearances last season.

HARRY DUNN (Player/Manager): Recently re-joined his local club from Frickley Athletic on his appointment as Player/Manager. In his first spell with Boro' he made 858 league and cup appearances including four F.A. Challenge Trophy finals at Wembley, two of which he captained. On his release from Boro at the end of season 1982/83 he joined Frickley Athletic with whom he has been an ever present member of the first team up to his return to Boro'.

KENNY DENNIS (Defender): A local full back who has been a regular member of the side for the past four seasons. Player of the Year in 1983.

GRAHAM HARTLEY (Defender): Another product of local football who enjoys playing for his local club. Played regularly up to the end of season 1983/84. Recently joined Boro' after a short spell in local League football.

BRENDAN PHILLIPS (Midfield): Joined the Boro from Nuneaton in the summer of 1983. The holder of four semi-professional caps, he had previous experience with Peterborough United, Kettering, Boston and Mansfield. Made 37 Alliance appearances last term.

MARSHALL BURKE (Midfield): Signed in August 1984. Formerly with Burnley, Leeds United, Blackburn Royers and Lincoln City.

DAVID BOWMAN (Forward): A local youngster and the son of the Boro trainer, he has made 63 Alliance appearances over the past five seasons.

TRENTON WIGGAN (Forward): A former England schoolboy international whose transfer from Gainsborough Trinity in 1983 cost Boro £2,500. He began his career with Sheffield United for whom he made 24 first team appearances.

NEIL SELLERS (Midfield): Signed from Goole Town in 1979 for a £5,000 fee. Was voted Player of the Year in 1980 and 1981 and is the only player to have won the award in successive seasons. For the past three seasons he has been a regular member of the England semi-professional team.

NIGEL ROSE (Forward): Commenced his career with Boro' as a teenager. Was released at the end of season 1982/83 when he joined Frickley Athletic. Returned to his native team on the appointment of the present Player/Manager.

PETER SUTCLIFFE (Midfield): Released by Bangor City at the end of season 1983/84. Previously with Manchester United, Port Vale and Chester.




