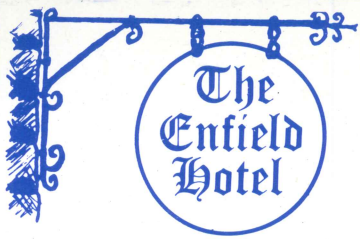

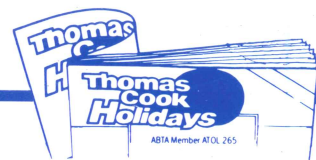

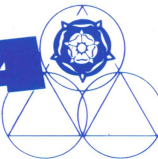

OUR THIRD TROPHY SEMI-FINAL

We warmly welcome our friends from Wealdstone F.C. to Southbury Road today and congratulate them on reaching this stage of the competition for the first time. Their previous best was in 1973-74, when they reached the fourth round before losing to South Shields.

For our part, this is our third such situation, yet never before have we been at home in the first leg. In 1975-76, we travelled to Scarborough and lost a hard-fought battle 1-0 to an 85th minute header from Boro substitute Jeff Barnsby. In the return leg a week later, we drew 0-0 here despite intense pressure by our forwards. In 1981-82, the season we won the F.A. Trophy, we drew 0-0 at the Drill Field, Northwich. The second leg produced a 1-0 victory with a goal from Lee Holmes, who is in Wealdstone's squad today. It is clear, then, that a single goal in 180 minutes football can be crucial. In any event, there will be no foregone conclusion for either side in the second leg, whatever today's result.

Our Middlesex neighbours are currently riding high at the top of the Gola League, following five wins in succession. Because of Easter printing deadlines, I am unable to refer to our match at Telford or Wealdstone's game at Runcorn last Tuesday. The "Stones" went to the top of the table for the first time since November with a 1-0 home win against Scarborough on Sunday morning. Alan Cordice scored the goal. Our own performance against the same opposition the previous day was bizarre, to say the least. Trailing 0-2, leading 3-2, then finally losing 3-4. While this all was going on, Wealdstone were recording another 1-0 home victory, this time against Runcorn, with Cordice again on target in the first half. Although Mark Graves heads the "Stones" goalscoring chart, the presence of England international Cordice makes the Lower Mead outfit a formidable proposition. We did manage a 2-1 victory at Lower Mead in November in the Bob Lord Trophy and a 2-0 home league victory in the same month, but these results will count for nothing today. Neither will past results, which currently stand at:

The postponement of Monday's Middlesex Senior Cup Final until the start of next season will help both teams recuperate from today's clash and enable better preparation for the second leg next Saturday. Although the team has been blowing a little hot and cold recently, we have proven ability and, on our day, can beat any non-league team in the country. So give an extra cheer today to push us into our sixth Wembley final. See you at Lower Mead!

A VIEW FROM THE PRESS BOX:

"OUTWARDLY ENFIELD, INWARDLY WEALDSTONE"

AS sports editor of the Enfield Gazette I will, to all appearances, be rooting for the Es in today's titanic semi-final first leg.

But inwardly, I'm afraid, it's a different story. As most of you will know by now — especially Eddie McCluskey who never tires of reminding anyone who'll listen — Wealdstone are my first love.

They've not been this close to Wembly since April 1968 when, as one of the leading amateur clubs in the country, they were astonishingly dumped out of the FA Amateur Cup by little Chesham United in the semi-final at Fulham's Craven Cottage ground.

As a boy of 10, I well remember running down the Fulham Palace Road to get to the game after the supporters' coaches got stuck in heavy traffic — and arriving just in time to see the 'Stones go 1-0 down.

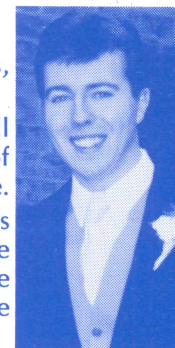
Two years earlier, shortly before England captured the World Cup beneath the twin towers, Wealdstone *did* reach the Amateur Cup final for the first and only time, and scored a memorable 3-1 win over Hendon.

And the parallels between 1966 and 1985 are remarkable. In '66, Wealdstone reached the Final without leaving London, drawn at home three times and once away at Barking before beating Alvechurch 1-0 in the semi-final at Stamford Bridge.

And this season they have again had the luck of the draw. Only once have they been drawn away — at Harlow in the First Round — before beating Wycombe Wanderers, Welling United and Frickley Athletic in successive rounds at Lower Mead.

And now, of course, they only have to travel the 12 miles to Enfield for the semi.

So is fate on their side? All I know is that Wealdstone or Enfield will be at Wembley on May 11 . . . and either way I'll be a more than interested spectator.

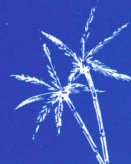
